Coliseum Accessible Voting Location to Open for Voting on Oct. 31 through Nov. 3

Alameda County voters can vote in person in the Oakland Arena, vote from their car, or drop off a completed mail-in ballot

OAKLAND, Calif. – The Coliseum Accessible Voting Location will open to all Alameda County residents on Saturday, Oct. 31 through Election Day on Tuesday, Nov. 3. The Coliseum Accessible Voting Location will include in-person voting in the Oakland Arena, curbside voting from the car, and ballot drop boxes for individuals to deposit their completed mail-in ballots.

The Coliseum Accessible Voting Location will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Oct. 31 through Nov. 2, and from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day on Tuesday, Nov. 3. Voting services on-site will also include registering to vote in person (including on Election Day), assistance with voting, and replacing lost or damaged ballots. Free parking will be available in D Lot, which can be accessed from the 66th Avenue entrance.

The Coliseum Accessible Voting Location will follow all CDC and public health guidelines regarding social distancing and masks. For in-person voting in the Oakland Arena, voters must follow physical distancing protocols and must wear a face covering when they are inside or within 25 feet of a voting location. Masks will be provided to any voter who needs one.

Announced last month, the A's joined the California Secretary of State Alex Padilla, Alameda County, and the Coliseum Authority (JPA) to ensure Alameda County residents have a safe and easily accessible location to vote in the 2020 General Election. The Coliseum Accessible Voting Location is the largest of the 100 voting centers in Alameda County.
