OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-14) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (14-10)

WENDESDAY, MAY 4, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:37 PT RHP FRANKIE MONTAS (2-2, 4.25) VS. RHP COREY KLUBER (1-1, 3.05) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A's: The A's have a five-game losing streak, which marks the first time they have lost or won more than two straight games this year...have now lost eight of the last 10 games after winning eight of the previous 12 contests...are a season-low four games under .500 at 10-14...are in fourth place in the American League West for the fifth consecutive day and trail first place Los Angeles by a season-high 4½ games for the third consecutive day... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, four days in fourth and one day tied for fourth...were swept by Cleveland over the weekend, marking the first time they have been swept this year.

OFFENSE: The A's scored seven runs last night...had been held to one run or fewer in six of the previous 11 games...had a season-low tying two hits Monday night (April 22 vs. Texas) and have been held to five hits or fewer five times in the last 10 games...are now batting .183 (58-for-317) with 26 runs scored over the last 10 games (2.6 runs per game) after hitting .226 with 66 runs scored over the first 14 contests (4.7 per game)...have the second lowest on-base percentage in the majors (.273; CIN, .267) and the lowest batting average in the American League (.209)...have the lowest OPS (.608) in the AL and the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.335)...have the second most strikeouts (224) and fourth fewest walks (62)...have 19 home runs, which is fifth fewest in the AL...however, eight of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors...A's pinch hitters are tied for the Major Leauge leade in doubles (3, Rangers), are second in extra base hits (3), tied for fourth in hits (4) and RBI (3) and rank fourth in plate appearances (26)...A's designated hitters are batting .140 (12-for-86), which is the lowest mark in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's have five stolen bases in the last seven games and are 13-for-14 (92.9%) in stolen base attempts this year, which is the best percentage in the majors ahead of the Phillies (92.3%)...A's opponents are 5-for-12 (41.6%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best success rate in the majors...the five stolen bases allowed are tied for second fewest in the majors (Yankees, 4)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is the most in the AL.

PITCHING: Over the last 10 games, the A's have allowed six runs or more six times and three runs or fewer four times...have a 4.90 ERA (49 er in 90.0 ip) over that span...now have a 3.98 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...also have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.240) and are tied for third in most wild pitches (10).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-5 with a 5.73 ERA (31 er in 48.2 ip) over the last 10 games...have walked 19 batters in 48.2 innings over that span (3.51 per nine innings) after issuing just 16 free passes in 69.0 innings over the first 14 contests (2.09 per nine innings)...are 8-10 with a 4.44 ERA for the season...the lossed are tied for second most to the Tigers...the ERA is third highest.

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted 7-of-11 (63.6%) save opportunities and is fifth in the American League in saves...has allowed 6-of-11 inherited runners to score in five games on the homestand after allowing just 6-of-36 to score over the first 19 games...rank tied for first in holds (23)...has yielded just three home runs in the last 15 games (60.0 ip) and has seven for the season, which is tied for fifth fewest in the AL...was charged with the loss in the first two games of the homestand and last night but has just four for the season, which is tied for fifth fewest in the AL...has allowed no earned runs in nine of the last 15 games, but three runs or more in the other fsixcontests over that stretch.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed no errors last night after committing two errors in back-to-back games and have made one or more errors in 11 of the last 13 games (14 errors total)...have 21 errors for the season, which is tied with the Diamondbacks for second most in the Majors to the White Sox...have turned 25 double plays, which is tied for second most in the Majors with the Orioles, one behind the Royals who have turned 26 twin killings this season.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-5 on their second homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Cleveland (0-3) and Tampa Bay (0-2)...went 4-3 on the first homestand and are 4-8 (.333) at home, which is tied for the second worst home record in the American League...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's played 13 of 15 games at home...went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco and are 6-6 on the road...leave following the game tomorrow for an eight-game road trip to Minnesota (three games) and De-

troit (five games)...will bat last in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader at Detroit but the game will be considered a road game in the statistics... are hitting .199 (76-for-381) with 36 runs and six home runs in 12 games at home compared to .217 (88-for-405) with 56 runs and 13 home runs in 12 games on the road.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 37 players, which is second most in the American League to the Rays (39)...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...16 of the 37 players have been rookies after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major League debuts...currently have nine rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers...have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

THIS AND THAT: Beginning Friday, the A's are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days from May 6-18...that includes a single-admission doubleheader on May 10 at Detroit and a day/night doubleheader on May 14 against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. 4-16...the A's are 8-1 (.889) when scoring first, which is the third best record in the American League, but are 2-13 (.154) when the opponent scores first, which is third worst...are 2-6 in the first game of a series, 5-2 in the final game of a series...are tied for third in the AL in losses by two runs or fewer (7) and tied for fifth in one-run loses (4)...are 4-3 (.571) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-11 (.353) when they start a right-hander...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which isfourth quickest in the majors (Tigers, 3:01; Guardians, 2:59; Rays, 2:58).

A's IN APRIL: The A's went 10-11 in the month of April and posted a losing record in the month for the second time in the last three April's (were 16-11 last year and 11-15 in 2019)...the 21 games were the A's fewest in April since 2009 when they had 19...compiled a 3.56 ERA, which was their lowest in April since 2014 (2.81)...hit .212, which was fourth lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in Oakland history...it was the lowest since 2012 (.211)...had a .277 on-base percentage, which was third lowest in the AL and second lowest in Oakland history to the 1968 A's (.276).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have four players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. RAYS: The season series is tied 3-3...lost the first two games in Oakland after taking three of four at Tampa Bay in April...have outscored the Rays 39-32 after scoring just 19 runs in seven games against Tampa Bay last year... have won each of the previous two season series (4-3 in 2021 and 2019) and have not won three straight season series from the Rays since winning six straight from 1999-2004...all time, the A's are 116-82 (.586) against the Rays, which is their best record against any American League team...are 62-35 in Oakland and 54-47 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez has not allowed an earned run over his first 10 games (10.0 ip)...is tied for fifth in the American League in saves (4)...**Sam Moll** has not allowed a run over his first nine games (7.0 ip) and opponents are 2-for-22 (.091)...**Sean Murphy** ranks tied for sixth in the AL in extra base hits (12) and tied for ninth in doubles (7) and tied for eighth RBI (15)...**Chad Pinder** extended his hitting streak to nine games last night, which is an A's season high and ties his career high (9, Sept. 24, 2021-April 8, 2022)...is 12-for-34 (.353) with a home run and five RBI during his current streak.

In **1935** Jimmie Foxx scores five runs in the A's 12-1 victory over Cleveland... in **1969** John "Blue Moon" Odom is 3 for 3 with a homer and six RBI in the second game of a doubleheader vs. Seattle and picks up the win in the A's 11-7 victory...in **1980** Mike Norris tosses a four-hit shutout in the second game of a doubleheader against Detroit and Jeff Newman hits a solo home run for the A's only run in a 1-0 victory.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-2, 4.25 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is schedued to make his American League leading sixth start of the season...allowed five runs in last start, five runs in his first start and five runs in three starts in between...is in his seventh season in the majors and he is on his fith Opening Day roster (2017, 19-22).

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out Franmil Reyes to end the fifth inning in his last start for his 500th career strikeout...now has 31 strikeouts for the season, which is sixth in the American League...last year, he struck out 207, which was the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...it was 10th best in Athletics history and second by an A's right-hander to Jack Coombs, who had 224 in 1910...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history and the ninth in Athletics history (14 times) to fan 200 or more in a season... his average of 9.96 strikeouts per nine innings was the best in Athletics history ahead of Sean Manaea's 9.74, also last year...the previous record was 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...now has 500 career strikeouts in 477.2 innings, an average of 9.42 per nine innings...had four games of 10 or more strikeouts last year, which tied for the fourth most 10-strikeout games in a season in Oakland history...now has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .194 opponents batting average, which is 10th lowest in the American League...has held right-handed hitters to a .170 (9-for-53) average compared to .218 (12-for-55) against left-handers... has surrendered all four of his home runs and issued six of his eight walks to lefties...has a .768 OPS against lefties, .422 against righties...three of his four home runs are solo shots...opponents are hitting .186 (8-for-43) the first time through the order, .256 (10-for-39) the second time and .115 (3-for-26) after that...last year, opponents hit .190 the first time through the order, .273 the second time and .224 after that...has allowed a combined .128 (5-for-39) average to the opponents two, three and four hitters...opponents are 6-for-59 (.102) with two strikes, including 0-for-10 on an 0-2 count...had a .164 opponents average with two strikes last year and has a .160 career average in that situation.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 2-0 with a 1.46 ERA (2 er in 12.1 ip) in two starts against American League East teams this year compared to 0-2 with a 6.23 ERA (12 er in 17.1 ip) in three starts against everyone else...now has a five-game winning streak against the AL East dating back to May 3, 2021 and has a 2.23 ERA (9 er in 36.1 ip) and .195 (26-for-133) opponents batting average over that six start stretch...his last loss was on April 27, 2021 at Tampa Bay...is now 6-3 with a 2.69 ERA (20 er in 67.0 ip) in 15 career appearances against the AL East.

THE THIRD INNING: Has allowed eight of his 15 runs in the third inning for a 14.40 ERA (8 er in 5.0 ip)...has a 1.80 ERA (2 er in 10.0 ip) over innings 1-2 and a 2.45 ERA (4 er in 14.2 ip) from the fourth inning on...last year, he allowed 20 of his 79 runs in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS...had a 2.53 ERA, .182 average and .586 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.15 ERA, .232 opponents average and .647 OPS from the fourth inning on.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start on April 8 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss...his other Openign Day start came in 2020 and he is now 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 r, 4 bb, 11 so) in two openers...the loss was his first since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high five hits in 5.0 innings...then won consecutive starts on April 13 at Tampa Bay and April 18 against Baltimore.. struck out a season-high eight batters in a season-high 7.1 innings on April 23 against Texas but took the loss in a 2-0 decision...it was his first start over 7.0 innings since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay when he pitched 8.0 innings and it snapped an Athletics record streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer...also tossed a season-high 96 pitches...did not allow a hit until K. Calhoun singled in the fifth and had a one-hit shutout entering the eighth inning...retired the first batter before allowing back-to-back singles to Garcia and W. Calhoun...was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed both runs to score...Perez and three Texas relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...finished April 2-2 with a 4.25 ERA but held the opposition to a .194 batting average...tied for third in the American League in strikeouts (31) and had the sixth lowest opponents batting average.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Cleveland last Friday in Oakland...walked a season-high four batters and matched his highs in runs (5), home runs (2) and pitches (96)...allowed a solo home run to Ramirez in the first but the A's scored four times in the bottom of the first...then surrendered his first career grand slam, a two-out shot by Gimenez in the third inning, before retiring seven of the final eight batters he faced...Oakland scored twice in the fourth and he was relieved by Moll to start the sixth with a 6-5 lead...the pen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Made just two starts in Cactus League games this spring and was 0-1 with a 6.35 ERA (5.2 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...opponents went 10-for-25 (.400)...the outings came on March 22 at Kansas City and March 27 against Seattle.

2021 RECAP: Went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts... his 32 starts doubled his previous career high of 16 in 2019 and his 187.0 innings pitched nearly doubled his previous best of 96.0 in 2019...had career highs in every category...had his second lowest ERA, opponents OPS, batting average and on-base percentage to his numbers in 2019 (2.63, .646, .230, .282)...tied for the American League lead in games started, ranked third in opponents slugging percentage (.372) and innings pitched (187.0), fourth in ERA, opponents OPS (.723), strikeouts and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.08), tied for fifth in wins, seventh in batting average (.232), on-base percentage (.294) and winning percentage (.591) and eighth in strikeout-towalk ratio (3.63)...also ranked third in pitches (3,028) and tied for fourth in wild pitches (11)...led the A's in wins, ERA, strikeouts and innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...finished sixth in AL Cy Young balloting and received 11 votes (2 third, 6 fourth, 3 fifth)...was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents batting average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 100.0 innings and 18 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-2 with a 2.17 ERA, .199 opponents average, .575 OPS and six home runs in 87.0 innings and 14 starts . after the break...had the lowest opponents OPS, slugging percentage (.303) and batting average after the break in the AL, ranked second in ERA, third in strikeouts (102) and fourth in on-base percentage (.272)...the strikeouts were fourth most in Oakland history after the break...his opponents batting average broke down to .225 (78-for-346) with a .665 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .238 (86-for-361) with a .667 OPS against right-handers...held the opponent's number three hitter to a .171 batting average, which was the lowest mark in the majors...was 5-2 with a 2.41 ERA in 11 starts during the day compared to 8-7 with a 3.91 ERA in 21 starts at night...his day ERA was third lowest in the American Leagu...had seven starts of 7.0 innings and was 5-0 with a 0.73 ERA and .130 opponents average in those starts.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Cole Irvin (2-1, 2.93 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has allowed one run or fewer in each of his last three starts (2 er in 16.0 ip, 1.13 ERA) and is now 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA (5 er in 22.1 ip) over his last four starts after taking the loss in his first start...has won three straight decisions just once in his career (June 5-27, 2021)...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss to Cleveland on Saturday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against th Twins, a start in the A's 5-4 loss at Minnesota last year on May 15 (6.2 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...begins his fourth season in the majors, his second with the A's... is on his third straight Opening Day roster...went 1-1 with a 6.43 ERA in four starts this spring...went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts last year...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the American League.

- Has not allowed a run in eight of his last ten games...allowed multiple runs for the blown save in the two exceptions on April 16 at Toronto and April 29 vs. Cleveland.

- Faced Tampa Bay earlier this season on April 12, allowing two hits and an earned run in 2.1 innings of work...struck out two and walked none.
- Begins his second season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...compiled a 5.79 ERA and .263 opponents batting average in four appearances this spring, including one start.

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

- Has pitched in eight games...has retired the first batter faced in each of
- his appearances and has stranded seven of eight of his inherited runners.
- Faced Tampa Bay earlier this season on April 11, throwing one scoreless inning with a hit and two strikeouts.
- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 7 and was on his sixth Opening Day roster...this is his ninth season in the majors with his sixth team.
- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 29, 2021 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...posted a 3.68 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.

Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.
