OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-18) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (8-19)

MONDAY, MAY 9, 2022 — COMERICA PARK — 7:10 ET

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept by Minnesota in a three-game series over the weekend to start the road trip and have now lost nine consecutive games...are 2-12 over the last 14 games after starting the year 8-6...are a season-low eight games under .500 at 10-18 (.357)...that is the third worst record in the American League ahead of the Tigers (8-19) and Red Sox (10-19)...it matches the second worst record in Oakland history after 28 games and is the worst since the 2001 club started the year 10-18...with a loss today, the A's would have their worst record after 29 games since 1994 (8-21)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the fifth consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and five days in fifth...trail first place Los Angeles by eight games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West prior to the 30th game of the season since the 2001 club trailed by as many as 12 games as early as game 24.

NINE-GAME LOSING STREAK: The A's have lost each of their last nine games, which is tied for the seventh longest losing streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since 2012 when the A's lost nine straight from May 22-June 1...have not lost more than nine in a row since a 10-game losing streak from May 30-June 9, 2011...have been outscored 45-24 during the streak...are batting .187 (54-for-289) with nine doubles, two triples and three home runs...have been held to one run or fewer five times...the pitching staff has compiled a 4.67 ERA (41 er in 79.0 ip)...the A's last win was a 1-0 shutout at San Francisco on April 27.

LET'S PLAY FIVE: The A's and Tigers are scheduled to play a five-game series, including a doubleheader tomorrow where the A's will bat last in game one...this will be the 18th series of five or more games in Oakland history, the second in the last 26 years...the last was Sept. 7-10, 2020 when the A's won four of five from Houston in Oakland...the last time the A's and Tigers played a five-game series was Sept. 4-6, 1967 when the Kansas City A's lost four of five at Detroit in a series that featured two doubleheaders.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 0-6 against American League Central teams...have a six-game losing streak against the Central, which matches their longest such streak over the last 27 years (last: April 13-May 9, 2013)...have not lost more than six straight to the Central since a 15-game losing streak from July 5-Aug. 8, 1995...went 23-10 (.697) against the AL Central last year, which was the best record in the majors...are 74-32 (.698) against the Central over the last five years.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost all three games at Minnesota over the weekend by one run...were outscored 7-4 by the Twins in the three-game series...are now 2-7 (.222) in one-run games...are tied with the Red Sox for the most one-run losses in the American League and have the second worst record (Rangers, 1-4/.200)...10 of the A's 18 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for second most in the AL (Red Sox, 11)

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .173 (76-for-440) with 30 runs scored over the last 14 games (2.1 runs per game) after hitting .226 with 66 runs scored over the first 14 contests (4.7 per game)...are now hitting .200 for the season, which is the second lowest batting average in the majors (Diamondbacks, .194)...have the lowest on-base percentage (.264) and OPS (.578) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.314) to the Tigers (.305)...have the second most strikeouts in the American League (269), the fourth fewest walks (70) and the fourth fewest doubles (38) and extra base hits (61)...have homered just once in the last seven games and have the fifth fewest home runs in the AL (19)...however, eight of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 16-for-18 (88.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League to the White Sox (15-for-16, 93.8%)...are tied for fifth in the AL in steals...A's opponents are 7-for-14 (50.0%) in stolen base attempts, which is tied with the Orioles for the second lowest success rate in the AL to the Yankees (4-for-10, 40.0%)...the seventh stolen bases allowed are tied for second fewest in the AL (Yankees, 4)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied with the Yankees for the most in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.30 ERA (63 er in 132.0 ip) over the last 15 games after logging a 3.25 ERA over the first 13 contests...now have a 3.81 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...have the third highest opponents slugging percentage (.391), the fourth highest batting average (.238) and fifth highest OPS (.697)...A's starting pitchers are 8-13 with a 4.17 ERA...have the second most losses in the AL, the fifth highest ERA and the fifth most innings (140.1)...A's relievers have four losses and

two blown saves during the current losing streak...have converted 7-of-11 (63.6%) save chances overall...have the second lowest batting average (.169), on-base percentage (.257) and slugging percentage (.258) against first batters in the AL...have allowed 13-of-55 (23.6%) inherited runners to score, which is fifth lowest in the AL...the 55 inherited runners are second most to the Red Sox (68)...is tied for second in holds (23).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 23 errors, which is the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors to the Pirates (26)...however, the errors have led to just nine unearned runs, which is sixth fewest in the AL...have turned 29 doubles plays, which is tied with the Royals for second most in the AL to the Orioles (35).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on this eight-game road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Detroit (five games)...went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco and are 6-9 on the road...went 0-6 on the last homestand against Cleveland (0-3) and Tampa Bay (0-3), which marked the first time the A's were winless on a homestand longer than three games since Aug. 10-16, 1956 when the Kansas City A's went 0-6 against Cleveland (0-3) and Chicago (0-3)...are now 4-9 (.308) at home, which is tied with the Red Sox and Rangers for the worst home record in the American League...return home following the game Thursday for a seven-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (four games) and Minnesota (three games)...are hitting .205 (80-for-412) with 36 runs and six home runs in 13 games at home compared to .205 (102-for-497) with 60 runs and 13 home runs in 15 games on the road...have a 3.81 ERA at home and on the road.

ROSTER NOTES: Yesterday, Ramón Laureano became the 38th player to appear in game for the A's this year, which is tied with the Twins for second most in the American League (Rays, 39)...Luis Barrera, who was added to the roster today, would become #39...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...16 of the players have been rookies (Barrera would be #17) after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major League debuts...with the addition of Barrera, the A's currently have 11 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

15 GAMES IN 13 DAYS: The A's are 0-3 in this stretch that began on Friday and runs through May 18 in which they are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days...have a single-admission doubleheader tomorrow at Detroit and a day/night doubleheader on Saturday against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. 4-16.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 16 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Irvin, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's won the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season as they went 6-1 against the Tigers...swept a four-game series in Oakland and won two of three at Detroit...are 24-3 (.889) against the Tigers dating back to 2017, which includes 11-2 at the Coliseum and 13-1 at Comerica Park...have a six-game winning streak in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 276-249 against the Tigers...that includes 151-112 in Oakland, 123-135 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 47-29 (.618) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team...all-time, the A's are 944-1002 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez has not allowed an earned run over his first 11 games (11.0 ip)...is tied for sixth in the American League in saves (4)...**Sam Moll** has not allowed a run over his first 10 games (8.0 ip) and opponents are 2-for-25 (.080).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1972** the A's score 10 times in the fourth inning of the first game of a doubleheader against Milwaukee...the first seven batters reach base and score in the A's 10-2 win...in **1988** Bob Welch and Dennis Eckersley combine on a four-hitter as the A's defeat Detroit 3-1 for what was then a club record 14th consecutive victory...the A's would go on to win an Oakland record 104 games and their first division title since 1981...in **2010** Dallas Braden pitches the 19th perfect game in Major League history in the A's 4-0 win over Tampa Bay on Mother's Day.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (3-0, 2.22 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...allowed three runs in 4.1 innings in his last start after yielding a total of three runs in 20.0 innings over his first four starts...is 3-0 with a 2.22 ERA over his first five starts...the three wins are tied for fifth in the American League and match his career high from 2017...the three-game winning streak matches his career high (July 31, 2017-June 7, 2018)...is in his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster...pitched in 30 games over his first five seasons with Oakland, all but three of which came as a starter.

THIS AND THAT: Has walked just three batters over his first five starts (24.1 ip), an average of 1.11 per nine innings...has issued just 13 free passes in 62.2 innings over the last two years (1.87 per nine innings)...opponents are 3-for-17 (.176) with runners in scoring position...is 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA (2 er in 15.0 ip) in three starts on the road, 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (4 er in 9.1 ip) in two starts at home...has not allowed a run in the third inning (5.0 ip)...has a 3.60 ERA (4 er in 10.0 ip) over innings 1-2, a 1.26 ERA (2 er in 14.1 ip) from the third inning on...has a .186 (8-for-43) opponents batting average the first time through the order and .273 (12-for-44) the second time...opponents are 0-for-2 the third time...opponents are hitting .111 with two strikes...they are 7-for-13 (.538) with three doubles and a triple when putting the first pitch in play...the A's are 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignments.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 5.0 scoreless inning and struck out a career-high seven batters in a 13-2 win at Tampa Bay in his first start on April 11...the 5.0 innings pitched were a season high (first of four times)...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win in his second start on April 16 at Toronto...left with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs for the blown save...won back-to-back starts on April 21 against Baltimore and April 27 at San Francisco...combined with five A's relievers on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in the win over the Giants...tossed five of the innings and allowed all three of the hits while walking one...finished April 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA in four starts...walked just two batters in 20.0 innings and held the opposition to a .197 batting average...it was his first career three-win month and he tied for third in the American League in wins in April...based on a minimum of 20.0 innings, he had the second lowest opponents OPS (.459), ranked third in slugging (.239) and was fourth in ERA and on-base percentage (.219).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-7 loss in 10 innings to Tampa Bay last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a season-high three runs on a season-high six hits in a season-low 4.1 innings...yielded a RBI double to Lowe in the first and then surrendered his first home run of the season in the second, a two-run shot by Phillips...was relieved by Jackson with one out in the fourth and the A's leading 5-3.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 0-1 with a 9.35 ERA (8.2 ip, 13 h, 9 r, 9 er, 5 bb, 5 so, 0 hr) in three games, including two starts...opponents were 13-for-37 (.351) and he issued five walks in 8.2 innings...allowed at least two runs in each of his three appearances.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career (10 in 2017)...had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a .319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings (2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 (29-for-94) with an .858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (23-for-69) with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with run-

ners in scoring position and he has a .308 career average in that situation... was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night...allowed a .533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his .311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an .824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 (53-for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, .311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Issued a season-high three walks in his first start on May 9 against Sacramento, his first of four games with three walks...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings May 15 at Reno, his first of five outings of 6.0 innings...picked up his first win of the season May 27 against Sacramento in his only relief appearance of the season...relieved a rehabbing Jesús Luzardo in the second inning and allowed two runs on six hits in 4.2 innings...finished May with a 1-1 record and a 3.74 ERA in four games, three starts...logged a season-high 106 pitches on June 1 against Sacramento...picked up his second win June 7 against Albuquerque for his only winning streak of the season...allowed six runs in a season-low 4.0 innings but had a no decision in a 10-9 loss at Salt Lake on June 25...had a season-high three-game losing streak from July 12-31...posted a 7.08 ERA and .360 opponents batting average during that four-start streak...including July 18 against El Paso when he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 12 hits in a 10-1 loss to Tacoma on July 31 and finished July 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA in six starts...struck out a season-high nine in 5.0 innings in his final Triple-A start on Aug. 13 against Tacoma but allowed four runs in and was the losing pitcher in a 4-3 loss...was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...started that day at Chicago (AL) and allowed three runs on five hits in 5.1 innings in a 3-2 loss...also walked a season-high three batters...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings and struck out a season-high tying five batters in his second start on Aug. 23 against Seattle...also had a season-high 97 pitches...logged 5.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 29 against New York (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win...left with a 1-0 lead but the bullpen blew the save...went 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA, .250 opponents batting average and .624 OPS in three starts in August...then compiled a 1-3 record with an 8.06 ERA, .359 opponents batting average and 1.060 OPS over his final six starts...allowed a season-high nine hits and surrendered three home runs in a game for the first time in his career in a 10-8 loss at Toronto on Sept. 4...yielded four runs on six hits in a season-low 2.2 innings on Sept. 10 against Texas...left with a 6-4 lead but had a no decision in the A's 10-5 win...picked up his only win of the season on Sept. 16 at Kansas City when he allowed two runs on six hits in 5.0 innings in the A's 7-2 win...it was his first win since June 29, 2018 against Cleveland and it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 6, 2018...posted an 8.62 ERA and .351 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (eight starts)...matched his season high with five strikeouts on Sept. 21 against Seattle...allowed a season-high six runs and a career-high tying three home runs in 2.0 innings in his final start on Oct. 2 at Houston, a 10-4 loss.

- Has a 2.25 ERA (1 er in 4.0 ip) and .154 (2-for-13) opponents batting average in four games on the road, a 9.00 ERA (4 er in 4.0 ip) and .412 (7-for-17) opponents average in five games at home.
