# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-9-1) VS. COLORADO ROCKIES (6-8-2)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two of the last three games after losing seven of the previous eight...are 4-9-1 overall and have clinched a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's .286 winning percentage is tied with the Dodgers (4-6-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League...it currently matches the lowest spring winning percentage in Oakland history (4-10 in 1976)...collected a spring-high 19 hits yesterday at Chicago (AL) and are now batting .347 (52-for-150) over the last four games after hitting .228 over the first 10 contests...have the third fewest runs scored in the CL (68) and are tied for the third fewest home runs (16)...are tied for the third most triples (5)...the pitching staff has the highest opponents batting average in the majors (.302), the second highest onbase percentage (.372) and OPS (.865) and third highest ERA (6.08)...has the second fewest strikeouts in the CL (110)...have committed 10 errors, which is tied for second fewest in the CL to the Royals (9)...are tied for the lead in outfield assists (3) and tied for fourth in double plays (15)...this is the A's 54th Spring Training in Arizona, their eighth since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36-year absence...are scheduled to play 18 games this spring, which will be their fewest since 1990 when there were 16 games...all 18 games will be in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

A's vs. ROCKIES: This is the only meeting between the A's and Rockies this spring...split two games last spring with the losing a 10-7 decision at Salt River Fields on March 3 and winning 4-1 in Mesa on March 23...the A's have lost each of their last four games to Colorado at Salt River Fields and have not defeated the Rockies in that ballpark since March 20, 2015 (3-2)...have not won at Salt River Fields since a 21-13 win over Arizona on March 7, 2017.

IN CAMP: The A's have 39 players in camp, which includes 28 players on the 40-man roster (which stands at 39), 10 non-roster invitees and one on the suspended list...the breakdown includes 19 pitchers, four catchers, 10 infielders and six outfielders

COUNTDOWN TO OPENING DAY: The A's open the season next Friday in Philadelphia...it marks the first time the A's will open the season in Philadelphia since April 13, 1954 when the Philadelphia A's defeated the Boston Red Sox 6-4...it will be their first Opening Day against a National League team and the first time they have been the visiting team in an opener since 2009 (were the home team in Japan in 2012 and 2019)...begin the season with a 10game road trip which, barring multiple rainouts, will be the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995 (in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip).

HOW THE A'S WERE BUILT: Of the 29 active players on the 40-man roster or suspended list, six were drafted by the A's (Brown, 19th in 2015; Jefferies, competitive balance round A in 2016; Murphy, 3rd in 2016; Pinder, competitive balance round B in 2013; Puk, 1st in 2016; Trivino, 11th in 2013)...four were signed as free agents including two to a Major League contract (Lowrie, Vogt) and two to a minor league contract (Acevedo, Guerra)...two were claimed off waivers (Neuse, Selman) and the other 17 were all acquired in trades (A. Allen, Andrus, Blackburn, Bolt, Honeywell, Irvin, Kaprielian, Kemp, Laureano, Manaea, Moll, Montas, Oller, Pache, Piscotty, Smith, Snead).

MARCH MADNESS: The A's made three trades in March, dealing away three players while acquiring 10 in return...the new acquisitions via trade include five 40-man players (Logue, Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and Oakland has also signed two free agents (Lowrie, Vogt) and claimed two players off waivers (Neuse, Selman)...the three trades netted the A's several top prospects according to mlb.com...have acquired the No. 1 prospect from the Braves (Pache), No. 2 from the Braves (Langeliers), No. 4 from the Blue Jays (Hoglund), No. 5 from the Mets (Ginn), No. 6 from the Braves (Cusick) and No. 9 from the Blue Jays (Smith).

NON-ROSTER INVITEES: The A's have 10 non-roster invitees remaining in Major League camp...six of the 10 have Major League service time (Bethancourt, Grimm, D.Jackson, Jiménez, McKinney, Thames).

COACHING STAFF: Mark Kotsay enters his first season as a manager after being named the 19th manager in Oakland history and the 31st in Athletics history on Dec. 21, 2021...two coaches from last year return in their same capacity as Scott Emerson returns as pitching coach and Marcus Jensen as bull-pen coach...three others return in new roles, including Mike Aldrete (quality control coach), Darren Bush (third base/run prevention coach) and Eric Martins (first base/infield coach)...new to the A's coaching staff are bench coach Brad Ausmus, assistant hitting coach Chris Cron and hitting coach Tommy

SPRING TRAINING MEDIA INFORMATION: The A's clubhouse at Hohokam Stadium will be open to fully vaccinated members of the media with proper

credentials beginning approximately one hour prior to team stretch...stretch time varies from day to day; media are asked to check @AsMediaAlerts on Twitter for daily clubhouse hours...the clubhouse also will open to the media during games for access to players who have completed their work for the day...masks are required for media members while in the clubhouse... prior to the start of Cactus League games, A's manager Mark Kotsay will be available at Hohokam Stadium in the first base dugout during team stretch time...credentials must be requested through MLB's credentialing website at credentials.mlb.com...daily credentials can be picked up at one of the designated press will-call windows to the right of Gate D at Hohokam Stadium beginning approximately two hours prior to game time; prior to that time, credentials can be picked up from the security guard at Gate D...the A's provide complimentary parking to media members in the Center Street Lot (Lot D) located behind home plate and to the right as you enter the parking lot at the home plate entrance.

A's SPRING BROADCASTS: The A's will broadcast every 2022 Spring Training game on Bloomberg 960 AM and will stream each game on A's Cast through iHeart and athletics.com...every remaining home game will be televised by either NBC Sports California (April 3) or streamed on athletics.com and the NBC Sports My Teams app (today and April 4)...Ken Korach and Vince Cotroneo will call the action on radio with Dom Cotroneo and Glen Kuiper filling in on select broadcasts...Kuiper will be joined in the television booth by Dallas Braden for the remaining NBCSCA telecast on April 3...in addition, the A's live sports talk show, A's Cast Live, hosted by Chris Townsend, will air two hours prior to first pitch on Monday, Wednesday and Friday games.
