# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-9-2) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (6-7-2) <br> SUNDAY, APRIL 3, 2022 - HOHOKAM PARK - 1:05 P.M. MST <br> A'S CAST/BLOOMBERG 960 AM/NBCSCA 

ABOUT THE A'S: Have two wins, a tie and a loss over the last four games after losing seven of the previous eight....are 4-9-2 overall and have clinched a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went $14-16-2$...the A's .267 winning percentage is tied with the Dodgers (4-7-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League...the lowest spring winning percentage in Oakland history is . 286 in 1976 (4-10)...are batting 342 ( 64 -for-187) over the last five games after hitting 228 over the first 10 contests... have hit four home runs in each of the last two games after tallying 12 home runs over the first 13 contests...the pitching staff has the highest opponents batting average (.306), on-base percentage (.378) and OPS (.875) in the majors, the second highest ERA (6.42) and the third highest slugging percentage (.497)... has the second fewest strikeouts in the CL (117)...have committed 10 errors, which is tied for second fewest in the CL to the Royals (9)...are tied for the lead in outfield assists (3) and tied for third in double plays (16)...this is the A's 54th Spring Training in Arizona, their eighth since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36 -year absence...are scheduled to play 18 games this spring, which will be their fewest since 1990 when there were 16 games...all 18 games will be in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

A's vs. PADRES: This is the only meeting between the A's and Padres this spring...the A's won both games last spring, winning 5-4 in Mesa on March 12 and 4-2 in Peoria on March 18...have won 16 of their last 23 spring games against the Padres.
IN CAMP: The A's have 37 players in camp, which includes 26 players on the 40 -man roster (which stands at 39), 10 non-roster invitees and one on the suspended list...the breakdown includes 17 pitchers, four catchers, 10 infielders and six outfielders.

COUNTDOWN TO OPENING DAY: The A's open the season next Friday in Philadelphia...it marks the first time the A's will open the season in Philadelphia since April 13, 1954 when the Philadelphia A's defeated the Boston Red Sox 6-4...it will be their first Opening Day against a National League team and the first time they have been the visiting team in an opener since 2009 (were the home team in Japan in 2012 and 2019)...begin the season with a 10game road trip which, barring multiple rainouts, will be the longest seasonopening road trip in Athletics history....played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995 (in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip).

HOW THE A'S WERE BUILT: Of the 27 active players on the 40-man roster or suspended list, six were drafted by the A's (Brown, 19th in 2015; Jefferies, competitive balance round A in 2016; Murphy, 3rd in 2016; Pinder, competitive balance round B in 2013; Puk, 1st in 2016; Trivino, 11th in 2013)...four were signed as free agents including two to a Major League contract (Lowrie, Vogt) and two to a minor league contract (Acevedo, Guerra)...one was claimed off waivers (Neuse) and the other 16 were all acquired in trades (A. Allen, Andrus, Blackburn, Bolt, Honeywell, Irvin, Kaprielian, Kemp, Laureano, Moll, Montas, Oller, Pache, Piscotty, Smith, Snead).
MARCH (AND APRIL) MADNESS: The A's have made four trades since the lockout ended, dealing away five players while acquiring 12 in return...the new acquisitions via trade include six 40 -man players (Logue, Martinez, Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and Oakland has also signed two free agents (Lowrie, Vogt) and claimed two players off waivers (Neuse, Selman)...the four trades netted the A's several top prospects according to mlb.com...have acquired the No. 1 prospect from the Braves (Pache), No. 2 from the Braves (Langeliers), No. 4 from the Blue Jays (Hoglund), No. 5 from the Mets (Ginn), No. 6 from the Braves (Cusick) and No. 9 from the Blue Jays (Smith).
NON-ROSTER INVITEES: The A's have 10 non-roster invitees remaining in Major League camp...six of the 10 have Major League service time (Bethancourt, Grimm, D.Jackson, Jiménez, McKinney, Thames).

COACHING STAFF: Mark Kotsay enters his first season as a manager after being named the 19th manager in Oakland history and the 31st in Athletics history on Dec. 21, 2021...two coaches from last year return in their same capacity as Scott Emerson returns as pitching coach and Marcus Jensen as bullpen coach...three others return in new roles, including Mike Aldrete (quality control coach), Darren Bush (third base/run prevention coach) and Eric Martins (first base/infield coach)...new to the A's coaching staff are bench coach Brad Ausmus, assistant hitting coach Chris Cron and hitting coach Tommy Everidge.
SPRING TRAINING MEDIA INFORMATION: The A's clubhouse at Hohokam Stadium will be open to fully vaccinated members of the media with proper credentials beginning approximately one hour prior to team stretch...stretch time varies from day to day; media are asked to check @AsMediaAlerts on Twitter for daily clubhouse hours...the clubhouse also will open to the me-
dia during games for access to players who have completed their work for the day...masks are required for media members while in the clubhouse... prior to the start of Cactus League games, A's manager Mark Kotsay will be available at Hohokam Stadium in the first base dugout during team stretch time...credentials must be requested through MLB's credentialing website at credentials.mlb.com...daily credentials can be picked up at one of the designated press will-call windows to the right of Gate D at Hohokam Stadium beginning approximately two hours prior to game time; prior to that time, credentials can be picked up from the security guard at Gate D...the A's provide complimentary parking to media members in the Center Street Lot (Lot D) located behind home plate and to the right as you enter the parking lot at the home plate entrance.

A's SPRING BROADCASTS: The A's will broadcast every 2022 Spring Training game on Bloomberg 960 AM and will stream each game on A's Cast through iHeart and athletics.com...the two remaining home games will be televised by NBC Sports California (today) or streamed on athletics.com and the NBC Sports My Teams app (tomorrow)...Ken Korach and Vince Cotroneo will call the action on radio with Dom Cotroneo and Glen Kuiper filling in on select broadcasts...Kuiper will be joined in the television booth by Dallas Braden for the NBCSCA telecast today...in addition, the A's live sports talk show, A's Cast Live, hosted by Chris Townsend, will air two hours prior to first pitch on Monday, Wednesday and Friday games.
