# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (5-10-2) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (8-7-1)

TUESDAY, APRIL 5, 2022 – SCOTTSDALE STADIUM – 1:05 P.M. MST A'S CAST/BLOOMBERG 960 AM

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 3-2-1 over the last six games after losing seven of the previous eight...are 5-10-2 overall entering the Cactus League finale and will finish with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's .294 winning percentage is second lowest in the CL to the Dodgers (4-9-4, .235) and third lowest in the majors (Nationals, 3-11/.214)...need a win today to avoid finishing with the lowest spring winning percentage in Oakland history...went 4-10 (.286) in 1976 and a win today would tie the 1974 club (8-16, .333) for the second lowest spring windrays and the second lowest spring windrays are second lowest spring windrays. The second lowest spring windrays are second lowest spring windrays will be spring windrays are second lowest spring windrays with the second lowest spring windrays will be spring windrays are spring windrays with the second lowest spring windrays will be spring windrays with the second lowest spring windrays will be spring windrays with the second lowest spring windrays will be spring windrays with the second lowest spring windrays will be spring with the second windray will be spring win the second windray will be spring with the second will be sprin ning percentage...are batting .323 (83-for-257) over the last seven games after hitting .228 over the first 10 contests...have hit 11 home runs over the last four games after tallying 12 over the first 13 contests...are tied for third in the CL in doubles (37) and triples (5) and have grounded into the fewest double plays (7)...are tied for the fourth fewest runs (90) and have the fifth most strikeouts (167)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.297), third highest ERA (6.06), OPS (.854) and on-base percentage (.365) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.488)...has the second fewest strikeouts (139)...have committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and are tied for the lead in outfield assists (3)...this is the A's 54th Spring Training in Arizona, their eighth since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36-year absence...are scheduled to play 18 games this spring, which will be their fewest since 1990 when there were 16 games...all 18 games will be in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

A's vs. GIANTS: This is the second and final meeting between the A's and Giants this spring...the A's lost the first game in Mesa yesterday, 5-3...have an eight-game winning streak at Scottsdale and have not lost here since March 21, 2014...the two clubs split two games last spring with the A's winning 9-3 in Scottsdale on March 28 and losing 7-2 in Mesa on March 29...this will mark the second consecutive season and third time in the last 40 years the A's and Giants have not played a Spring Training game in the Bay Area...the Bay Bridge Series began in 1983 and prior to last year, the only other season the two clubs didn't play in Oakland or San Francisco was 2000...the A's have lost five of their last six spring games to the Giants but are 27-17 over their last 44 spring contests against San Francisco.

IN CAMP: The A's have 32 players in camp, which includes 26 players on the 40-man roster (which stands at 38), five non-roster invitees and one on the suspended list...the breakdown includes 17 pitchers, three catchers, six infielders and six outfielders.

COUNTDOWN TO OPENING DAY: The A's open the season on Friday in Philadelphia...it marks the first time the A's will open the season in Philadelphia since April 13, 1954 when the Philadelphia A's defeated the Boston Red Sox 6-4...it will be their first Opening Day against a National League team and the first time they have been the visiting team in an opener since 2009 (were the home team in Japan in 2012 and 2019)...begin the season with a 10game road trip which, barring multiple rainouts, will be the longest seasonopening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995 (in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip).

OPENING DAY MATCH-UPS: The A's open the season with a three-game series at Philadelphia beginning this Friday...Frankie Montas will square off against Aaron Nola in the opener on April 8 at 12:05 PT...it will be the second career Opening Day start for Montas (2020)...Kyle Gibson will start for the Phillies on Saturday at 1:05 PT and Zach Eflin will start on Sunday at 10:05 PT.

HOW THE A'S WERE BUILT: Of the 27 active players on the 40-man roster or suspended list, six were drafted by the A's (Brown, 19th in 2015; Jefferies, competitive balance round A in 2016; Murphy, 3rd in 2016; Pinder, competitive balance round B in 2013; Puk, 1st in 2016; Trivino, 11th in 2013)...four were signed as free agents including two to a Major League contract (Lowrie, Vogt) and two to a minor league contract (Acevedo, Guerra)...one was claimed off waivers (Neuse) and the other 16 were all acquired in trades (A. Allen, Andrus, Blackburn, Bolt, Honeywell, Irvin, Kaprielian, Kemp, Laureano, Moll, Montas, Oller, Pache, Piscotty, Smith, Snead).

MARCH (AND APRIL) MADNESS: The A's have made four trades since the lockout ended, dealing away five players while acquiring 12 in return...the new acquisitions via trade include six 40-man players (Logue, Martinez, Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and Oakland has also signed two free agents (Lowrie, Vogt) and claimed two players off waivers (Neuse, Selman)...the four trades netted the A's several top prospects according to mlb.com...have acquired the No. 1 prospect from the Braves (Pache), No. 2 from the Braves (Langeliers), No. 4 from the Blue Jays (Hoglund), No. 5 from the Mets (Ginn), No. 6 from the Braves (Cusick) and No. 9 from the Blue Jays (Smith).

SPRING TRAINING MEDIA INFORMATION: The A's clubhouse at Hohokam Stadium will be open to fully vaccinated members of the media with proper

credentials beginning approximately one hour prior to team stretch...stretch time varies from day to day; media are asked to check @AsMediaAlerts on Twitter for daily clubhouse hours...the clubhouse also will open to the media during games for access to players who have completed their work for the day...masks are required for media members while in the clubhouse... prior to the start of Cactus League games, A's manager Mark Kotsay will be available at Hohokam Stadium in the first base dugout during team stretch time...credentials must be requested through MLB's credentialing website at credentials.mlb.com...daily credentials can be picked up at one of the designated press will-call windows to the right of Gate D at Hohokam Stadium beginning approximately two hours prior to game time; prior to that time, credentials can be picked up from the security guard at Gate D...the A's provide complimentary parking to media members in the Center Street Lot (Lot D) located behind home plate and to the right as you enter the parking lot at the home plate entrance.

A's SPRING BROADCASTS: The A's will broadcast every 2022 Spring Training game on Bloomberg 960 AM and will stream each game on A's Cast through iHeart and athletics.com...Ken Korach and Vince Cotroneo will call the action on radio with  $\operatorname{\mathsf{Dom}}\nolimits$  Cotroneo and Glen Kuiper filling in on select broadcasts.

#30 AUSTIN ALLEN: Is 0-for-11 over his last five games after going 2-for-6 (.333) over his first three contests...went 2-for-8 (.250) with a home run and RBI in four games over two stints with the A's last year...spent the balance of the season with Triple-A Las Vegas where he hit .317 with 20 home runs and 53 RBI in 72 games.

**#17** ELVIS ANDRUS: Is 4-for-8 (.500) over his last three games after going 3-for-20 (.150) over his first seven contests...hit .243 with three home runs and 37 RBI in 146 games in his first season with the A's last year after spending his first 12 years with the Texas Rangers.

#11 SKYE BOLT: Is 0-for-8 over his last four games...is tied for fifth in the Cactus League in walks (7)...has appeared in nine games in center field, four in right field and two in left field...hit a combined .088 with a home run and four RBI in 34 games with the A's and Giants last year...also batted .387 with 9 HR and 29 RBI in 51 games with Las Vegas.

#8 JED LOWRIE: Was signed by the A's as a free agent March 26 and has hit safely in each of his three games (4-for-9, .444)...has started two games at designated hitter and one at first base...has never started a regular season game at first base and has 11 appearances there with the last coming on Sept. 6, 2011...batted .245 with 28 doubles, 14 home runs and 69 RBI in 139 games in his third stint with Oakland last year after playing in just nine games over the previous two seasons.

#28 BILLY McKINNEY (NR): Is 6-for-15 (.400) over his last six games after going 0-for-13 over his previous six contests...has appeared in five games in left field, four at first base, three in right field and one at designated hitter...was signed to a minor league contract on March 16...batted .192 with 9 HR and 27 RBI in a career-high 116 games with Milwaukee, New York (NL) and Los Angeles (NL) last year.

#12 SEAN MURPHY: Was 3-for-3 with a walk Sunday against San Diego and has now hit safely in nine of his 10 games...is tied for the Cactus League lead in doubles (6), tied for second in extra base hits (8) and tied for seventh in hits (13)...based on a minimum of 30 plate appearances, he leads the majors in on-base percentage (.567), ranks second in batting (.520) and OPS (1.567) and tied for fourth in slugging (1.000)...batted .216 with 17 HR and 59 RBI in 119 games in his first full season last year...added 40 walks and was hit by a pitch 12 times for a .306 on-base percentage.

#26 SHELDON NEUSE: Had a grand slam and a single Sunday against San Diego for his fourth multiple hit game...is now 11-for-27 (.407) with two doubles, four home runs and eight RBI over his last 11 games after going 0-for-5 over his first three...is tied for third in the Cactus League in home runs (4)...has appeared in nine games at third base and five at second base...was
