OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-3) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (4-3)

FRIDAY, APRIL 15, 2022 — ROGERS CENTRE — 7:07 ET RHP DAULTON JEFFERIES (1-0, 0.00) VS. RHP ROSS STRIPLING (0-0, 9.00) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won three of four at Tampa Bay and have now won four of the last five games after losing each of the first two...are 4-3, which matches the A's best record after seven games over the last nine years (2014, 2016, 2019)...this is the A's 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships ... only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4435-4080 (.521) record over the previous 54 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Los Angeles Dodgers, Boston, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9150-9552 (.489) in their previous 121 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City...with this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they began their 55th season in Oakland a week ago today in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 42 runs over their first seven games, which is second most in the majors to the Guardians (45)...are tied for second in the American League in home runs (9)...six of those have come with at least two runners on base and no other Major League team has more than two...are batting a Major League leading .396 (21-for-53) with runners in scoring position...have 73 strikeouts, which is second most in the majors (Nationals, 74).

PITCHING: Oakland starting pitchers have all four of the A's wins this year, which is second most in the majors to the Mets (5)...no other American League team has more than two...starters rank second in the AL in innings pitched (34.1)...A's starting pitchers have not walked a batter in the last two games and have issued just eight free passes in 34.1 innings for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...the bullpen has walked 15 batters in 27.1 innings, which is tied for second most in the AL...first batters faced are 4-for-21 (.190) against A's relievers, which is tied for second most.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors over the last three games after making just one over the first four...the six errors are third most in the American League...are tied for second with two outfield assists...have turned three double plays, which is tied for second fewest...the A's are one of two teams in the majors who have not had an opponent attempt a steal (Rangers).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-3 on this season-opening 10-game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (3-1) and Toronto (three games)...this will be the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip...following this trip, the A's are scheduled to play 13 of their next 15 games at home, with the two road games coming at San Francisco...return home following the game Sunday for a seven-game homestand against Baltimore (four games) and Toronto (three games).

ROOKIES: The A's added two rookies to the roster today (D. Jackson, Logue)... had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Z. Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Moll, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012)... have employed 11 rookies this year after using 13 last year, eight in 2020 and nine in 2019...three of the rookies made their Major League debuts (Lemoine a week ago today, Z. Jackson last Saturday, Oller on Tuesday)...should Logue appear in a game, he would become the fourth.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have outscored their opponents 42-30 and the +12 run differential is second best in the American League to the Guardians (+23)...are scheduled to play 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991...Billy McKinney became the 1,000th player in Oakland history a week ago today...eight other players have made their A's debut since then to bring the total to 1,008.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's currently have 15 pitchers and 13 position players after starting the year with 14 pitchers and 14 positions players...nine players returned from last years Opening Day roster, eight other players played for the A's at some point last year and one was in the A's farm system...four

were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez, Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free agent...have one player who has played for the A's in each of the last seven seasons (Pinder), two in each of the last six (Blackburn and Montas) and two in each of the last five (Piscotty and Trivino)...only Pinder and Piscotty have been on each of the last four Opening Day rosters and only Montas and Trivino have been on each of the last four...Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization... the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.82 years...Christian Pache, who was 23 years and 140 days last Friday, is the youngest and Jed Lowrie is the oldest (37 years, 356 days last Friday)...five players on the A's Opening Day roster began the season with six or more years of service: Lowrie (13 years, 111 days), Andrus (13 years), Vogt (8 years, 64 days), Piscotty (6 years, 76 days) and Grimm (6 years, 50 days)

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list five times this year...have added Bolt and Piscotty since the season started after beginning the year with three players on the IL (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)...used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's .278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was .286 (4-10) in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had 16...tied for second in the CL in triples (6), ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...tied for the third fewest home runs (23) and scored the fifth fewest runs (97)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.298), third highest ERA (6.12), OPS (.852) and on-base percentage (.367) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.486)...has the second fewest strikeouts (152)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3)...played all 18 games in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's lost the season series last year, going 2-5 against the Blue Jays...split four games in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Toronto...have lost 11 of the last 13 games and are 15-24 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2015...have won just one season series over that span (7-0 in 2018)...have a six-game losing streak at Rogers Centre, which matches the A's longest road losing streak against the Blue Jays (April 23, 2016-July 27, 2017 and May 23, 2014-Aug. 13, 2015)...are 5-18 in Toronto dating back to 2014...are 226-206 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 114-102 in Oakland, 112-102 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 71-70 in Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Domingo Acevedo has struck out two batters in each of his first four appearances and his eight strikeouts are tied for second most among American League relievers...*Elvis Andrus* has scored at least one run in each of his last six games and is tied for third in the AL in runs scored (7)...has the most runs by an Athletic over the first seven games since 2013 (Crisp 9, Lowrie 7)...*Seth Brown* is tied for third in the AL in RBI (8)...the eight RBI are tied for second most by an Athletic over the first seven games over the last 19 years (Khris Davis, 9 in 2019)...*Tony Kemp* has reached base safely in all six of his games after hitting safely in nine of his 11 games this spring.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1924** Al Simmons collects his first major league hit off the Senators Walter Johnson in the A's 4-0 loss to Washington on Opening Day...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley records his 100th career save in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle... with 100 saves, he becomes just the sixth pitcher in major league history with 100 saves and 100 victories...in **2006** Eric Chavez, Frank Thomas and Milton Bradley hit back-to-back-to-back home runs on three consecutive pitches off Vicente Padilla in the sixth inning of the A's 5-4 win over Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daulton Jefferies (1-0, 0.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and the third of his career...begins his third season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...made one start for the A's in 2020 and another start along with four relief appearances in 2021...is 2-1 with a 6.00 ERA (8 er in 12.0 ip) in his three starts, 0-0 with a 2.70 ERA (3 er in 10.0 ip) in four relief appearances.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 victory at Philadlephia last Sunday...shut out the Phillies in a career-high tying five innings of work and tossed just 48 pitches...retired the side in order in the first, second and fourth innings...allowed just one base runner to advance into scoring position...was relieved by Moll to start the sixth inning after issuing a leadoff walk to Vierling.

2021 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he was 5-1 with a 4.91 ERA in 15 starts...also had two stints with Oakland and went 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA in five games, including one start, before his season ended on Sept. 18 when he was placed on the 10-day injured list with right elbow ulnar neuritis...allowed a .208 opponents batting average with the A's, which broke down to .185 (5-for-27) with a .661 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 (6-for-26) with a .605 OPS against left-handers...had a .296 opponents were 1-for-12 (.083) with runners in scoring position...stranded al live of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250) with a double...tossed 5.0 innings in his start and more than 2.0 innings in three of his four relief appearances...was rated as the A's seventh-best prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His five wins with the Aviators were a minor league career high and he matched his best with 15 starts...also had career highs in ERA (4.91), opponents batting average (.288), hits (90), runs (44), earned runs (42), home runs (13) and walks (11)...had a .316 opponents on-base percentage as he walked just 11 batters in 77.0 innings (1.29 per nine innings)... has walked just 23 batters in 176.1 career innings in the minors (1.17 per nine innings)...struck out 68 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.18...has 189 career strikeouts for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 8.22...based on a minimum of 75 innings pitched, he led Triple-A West pitchers in strikeout-to-walk ratio, ranked second in fewest walks per nine innings, third in fewest pitches per inning (14.9), eighth in opponents on-base percentage and ninth in ERA. ...his opponents batting average broke down to .280 (44-for-157) with a .789 OPS against righthanded hitters compared to .297 (46-for-155) with a .830 OPS against left-handers...allowed 23 of his 44 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 6.60 ERA...had a 3.83 ERA after that, including 1.93 in the third inning...was 1-0 with a 3.58 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 4-1 with a 6.15 ERA in nine starts on five days rest or more...the Aviators were 4-5 in his no decisions and had a 9-6 (.600)́ record in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in seven of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight

times and walked one batter or fewer 12 times...had eight starts without a walk.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Began the season on the Las Vegas injured list with right biceps tendinitis...was reinstated May 21 and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his Triple-A debut on May 24 against Salt Lake (7 h, 1 so)...had a no decision in an 8-5 loss...logged 4.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in his second start on May 29 against Sacramento...was 1-0 with a 1.37 ERA and .225 opponents batting average over his first four starts through June 8...then allowed a career-high seven runs and issued a career-high three walks on June 14 against Reno but had a no decision in a 21-16 Aviators loss...surrendered three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...that began a four-start stretch where he went 1-1 with a 12.33 ERA and .408 opponents batting average...tossed a season-low 2.0 innings June 26 at Salt Lake...went 2-0 in five starts in June but had a 7.25 ERA, .323 opponents batting average and .969 OPS...struck out a career-high nine batters in 4.1 innings on July 3 against Sacramento but was charged with his only loss of the season...then went 1-0 with a 3.75 ERA over his next four starts before his first promotion to Oakland...allowed just one run in a career-high 7.0 innings on July 15 to defeat El Paso 5-1...matched his career high with nine strikeouts on July 20 against El Paso...allowed four runs on 10 hits in 5.0 innings July 26 against Salt Lake and was promoted to Oakland on Aug. 1...picked up his first Major League win that day in a start in the A's 8-3 win at Los Angeles-AL (5.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 3 so) but that would be his only outing before he was optioned back to Las Vegas Aug. 8...went 2-0 with a 4.00 ERA over his final three starts with the Aviators...logged 6.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 15 against Tacoma and tossed a career-high 96 pitches...yielded a career-high tying seven runs on a career-high 12 hits in 6.0 innings in his final start with Las Vegas on Aug. 20 against Albuquerque but had a no decision in a 12-7 win...was recalled by Oakland on Aug. 27 and compiled a 2.70 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in four relief appearances, all in A's losses...pitched in relief for the first time in the majors on Sept. 1 at Detroit (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 2 so)...it would be his shortest outing as a reliever as he logged 2.1 scoreless innings Sept. 4 at Toronto, 3.1 innings Sept. 7 vs. Chicago (AL) and 3.1 scoreless innings Sept. 12 vs. Texas...was placed on the 10-day injured list Sept. 18 retroactive to Sept. 15 with right elbow ulnar neuritis and missed the remainder of the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Paul Blackburn (1-0, 0.00 *ERA*): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...was the winning pitcher in his first start, a 13-2 win at Tampa Bay on Monday (5.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA (10.2 ip, 11 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 3 hr) in two career appearances against the Blue Jays, both starts at Toronto...begins his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster...joins Frankie Montas and Chad Pinder as the only players to play for the A's in each of the last six seasons...was 0-1 with a 9.35 ERA in three games, including two starts, this spring...opponents were 13-for-37 (.351) and he issued five walks in 8.2 innings...began the 2021 season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...allowed a .319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings.

- Begins his ninth season in the majors with his sixth team (Rangers, 2012-13; Cubs, 2013-17; Royals, 2018; Mariners, 2018; Brewers, 2020; A's, 2022).
- Is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2014, 16-18, 20, 22).
- Posted a 3.68 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances this spring...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.
- Last faced the Blue Jays on April 18, 2018 while pitching for Kansas City (0.1 ip, 4 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...had a 12.56 ERA (20 er in 14.1 ip) in five career appearances against Toronto.

Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.

61 RHP ZACH JACKSON
