OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-4) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (5-3)

SATURDAY, APRIL 16, 2022 — ROGERS CENTRE — 3:07 ET RHP PAUL BLACKBURN (1-0, 0.00) VS. RHP HYUN JIN RYU (0-0, 16.20) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost to Toronto last night by a score of 4-1 after winning three of four at Tampa Bay and have now won four of the last six games after losing each of the first two...this is the A's 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4435-4080 (.521) record over the previous 54 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Los Angeles Dodgers, Boston, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9150-9552 (.489) in their previous 121 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City...with this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they began their 55th season in Oakland a week ago in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 43 runs over their first eight games, which is fourth most in the majors...are tied for fourth in the American League in home runs (9)...six of those have come with at least two runners on base and no other Major League team has more than two...are batting a Major League leading .379 (22-for-58) with runners in scoring position...have 84 strikeouts, which is second most in the majors (Padres, 87).

PITCHING: Oakland starting pitchers have all four of the A's wins this year, which is second most in the majors to the Mets (5)...no other American League team has more than two...A's starting pitchers have walked just one batter in the last three games and have issued just nine free passes in 38.2 innings for the season...the bullpen has walked 19 batters in 31.0 innings.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have did not commit an error last night after committing five errors over their previous three games...made just one over the first four...the six errors are third most in the American League...are tied for third with two outfield assists...turned two double plays last night after tallying only three over their first seven games...have now turned five double plays, which is tied for sixth fewest in the American League...the A's are one of two teams in the majors who have not had an opponent attempt a steal (Rangers)

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-4 on this season-opening 10-game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (3-1) and Toronto (0-1)...this will be the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip...following this trip, the A's are scheduled to play 13of their next 15 games at home, with the two road games coming at San Francisco...return home following the game Sunday for a seven-game homestand against Baltimore (four games) and Toronto (three games).

ROOKIES: The A's added two rookies to the roster yesterday (D. Jackson, Logue)...had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Z. Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Moll, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012)...have employed 11 rookies this year after using 13 last year, eight in 2020 and nine in 2019...three of the rookies made their Major League debuts (Lemoine a week ago today, Z. Jackson last Saturday, Oller on Tuesday)... should Logue appear in a game, he would become the fourth.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have outscored their opponents 43-34 and the +9 run differential is third best in the American League to the Guardians (+20), and White Sox (+11)...are scheduled to play 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991...Billy McKinney became the 1,000th player in Oakland history a week ago today...with Christian Bethancourt making his A's debut last night, nine other players have made their A's debut since then to bring the total to 1,009.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's currently have 15 pitchers and 13 position players after starting the year with 14 pitchers and 14 positions players...nine players returned from last years Opening Day roster, eight other players played for the A's at some point last year and one was in the A's farm system...four were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez,

Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free agent...have one player who has played for the A's in each of the last seven seasons (Pinder), two in each of the last six (Blackburn and Montas) and two in each of the last five (Piscotty and Trivino)...only Pinder and Piscotty have been on each of the last five Opening Day rosters and only Montas and Trivino have been on each of the last four...Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization... the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.82 years...Christian Pache, who was 23 years and 140 days last Friday, is the youngest and Jed Lowrie is the oldest (37 years, 356 days last Friday)...five players on the A's Opening Day roster began the season with six or more years of service: Lowrie (13 years, 111 days), Andrus (13 years), Vogt (8 years, 64 days), Piscotty (6 years, 76 days) and Grimm (6 years, 50 days)

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list five times this year...have added Bolt and Piscotty since the season started after beginning the year with three players on the IL (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)...used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's .278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was .286 (4-10) in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had 16...tied for second in the CL in triples (6), ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...tied for the third fewest home runs (23) and scored the fifth fewest runs (97)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.298), third highest ERA (6.12), OPS (.852) and on-base percentage (.367) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.486)...has the second fewest strikeouts (152)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3)...played all 18 games in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's dropped game one of this three-game set last night by a score of 4-1...lost the season series last year, going 2-5 against the Blue Jays...split four games in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Toronto...have lost 11 of the last 13 games and are 15-24 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2015...have won just one season series over that span (7-0 in 2018)...have a seven-game losing streak at Rogers Centre, which is the A's longest road losing streak against the Blue Jays (April 23, 2016-July 27, 2017 and May 23, 2014-Aug. 13, 2015)...are 5-19 in Toronto dating back to 2014...are 226-207 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 114-102 in Oakland, 112-103 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 71-71 in Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Domingo Acevedo has struck out two batters in each of his first four appearances and his eight strikeouts are tied for second most among American League relievers...*Elvis Andrus* has scored at least one run in six of his last seven games and is tied for fourth in the AL in runs scored (7)...had the most runs by an Athletic over the first seven games since 2013 (Crisp 9, Lowrie 7)...Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the AL in RBI (8)...the eight RBI are tied for second most by an Athletic over the first seven games over the last 19 years (Khris Davis, 9 in 2019)... Tony Kemp has reached base safely in all seven of his games after hitting safely in nine of his 11 games this spring... Kevin Smith has three hits over his last two games after starting the season going 0-for-16...over his first six games, he struck out eight times and walked zero...over his last two games, he has one walk and one strikeout.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1969 Sal Bando hits the first grand slam in Oakland history in the A's 6-1 win over California at the Coliseum...in 1984 Dave Kingman becomes the second player in Oakland A's history to homer three times in one game in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle...he has a grand slam in the first, and two-run shots in the third and fifth and drives in eight runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (1-0, 0.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...begins his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster...joins Frankie Montas and Chad Pinder as the only players to play for the A's in each of the last six seasons...pitched in 30 games over his first five seasons with Oakland, all but three of which have come as a starter.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-2 win at Tampa Bay on Monday...Oakland scored four times in each of the first two innings and he blanked the Rays on three hits and a walk while striking out a career-high seven in 5.0 innings...allowed just one base runner as far as second base... was relieved by Jackson to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 9-0.

BLACKBURN vs. TORONTO: Is 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA (10.2 ip, 11 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 3 hr) in two career appearances, both starts at Toronto...the loss came in his last start last year on Sept. 4, a 10-8 loss at Rogers Centre... allowed

three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...surrendered solo home runs to Gurriel in the second and Jansen in the third, and a two-run home run to Valera in the fourth...was relieved by Jefferies with two outs in the fourth and the A's trailing 4-0...his other start was a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Toronto on July 26, 2017...tossed seven scoreless innings and allowed just two hits...just two base runners advanced into scoring position... left after seven innings with a 2-0 lead but Casilla allowed three runs in the ninth for the blown save and loss.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career (10 in 2017)... had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a .319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings (2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 (29-for-94) with an .858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (23-for-69) with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position and he has a .325 career average in that situation ...was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and 1.720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night...allowed a .533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his .311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an .824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 (53-for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his

27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, .311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Issued a season-high three walks in his first start on May 9 against Sacramento, his first of four games with three walks...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings May 15 at Reno, his first of five outings of 6.0 innings... picked up his first win of the season May 27 against Sacramento in his only relief appearance of the season...relieved a rehabbing Jesús Luzardo in the second inning and allowed two runs on six hits in 4.2 innings...finished May with a 1-1 record and a 3.74 ERA in four games, three starts...logged a sea son-high 106 pitches on June 1 against Sacramento...picked up his second win June 7 against Albuquerque for his only winning streak of the season.. allowed six runs in a season-low 4.0 innings but had a no decision in a 10-9 loss at Salt Lake on June 25...had a season-high three-game losing streak from July 12-31...posted a 7.08 ERA and .360 opponents batting average during that four-start streak...including July 18 against El Paso when he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 12 hits in a 10-1 loss to Tacoma on July 31 and finished July 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA in six starts...struck out a season-high nine in 5.0 innings in his final Triple-A start on Aug. 13 against Tacoma but allowed four runs in and was the losing pitcher in a 4-3 loss...was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...started that day at Chicago (AL) and allowed three runs on five hits in 5.1 innings in a 3-2 loss...also walked a season-high three batters...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings and struck out a season-high tying five batters in his second start on Aug. 23 against Seattle...also had a season-high 97 pitches.. logged 5.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 29 against New York (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win...left with a 1-0 lead but the bullpen blew the save...went 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA, .250 opponents batting average and .624 OPS in three starts in August...then compiled a 1-3 record with an 8.06 ERA, .359 opponents batting average and 1.060 OPS over his final six starts...allowed a season-high nine hits and surrendered three home runs in a game for the first time in his career in a 10-8 loss at Toronto on Sept. 4...yielded four runs on six hits in a season-low 2.2 innings on Sept. 10 against Texas.. left with a 6-4 lead but had a no decision in the A's 10-5 win...picked up his only win of the season on Sept. 16 at Kansas City when he allowed two runs on six hits in 5.0 innings in the A's 7-2 win...it was his first win since June 29, 2018 against Cleveland and it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 6, 2018...posted an 8.62 ERA and .351 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (eight starts)...matched his season high with five strikeouts on Sept. 21 against Seattle...allowed a season-high six runs and a career-high tying three home runs in 2.0 innings in his final start on Oct. 2 at Houston, a 10-4 loss.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Adam Oller (0-0, 33.75 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and his career...was acquired from the New York Mets with J.T. Ginn on March 12 in exchange for Chris Bassitt...was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 7, was on the A's Opening Day roster and made his Major League debut last Tuesday at Tampa Bay...had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss in 10 innings (1.1 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...was 1-0 with a 9.95 ERA in three Cactus League appearances, including two starts...opponents were 11-for-29 (.379)...struck out nine batters in 6.1 innings...was named the New York Mets Organizational Pitcher of the Year and a Mil.B.com organizational All-Star last year after combining for a 9-4 record, a 3.45 ERA and .213 opponents batting average in 23 starts with Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse...it was the first time he pitched above Single-A...struck out a career-high 138 batters in 120.0 innings, an average of 10.35 per nine innings.

- Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and had three saves and a 4.15 ERA in four relief appearances (4.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 4 so).
- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 17, 2021 and was a nonroster invitee this spring...compiled a 3.00 ERA (3.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 4 so) in three relief appearances before he was reassigned to minor league camp on March
- Has spent parts of the previous two seasons with Colorado and was 1-4 with a 5.79 ERA in 11 games, including 10 starts...his only relief apperance came on Sept. 2, 2020 against San Francisco (2.0 ip, 2 h, 2 so).
- Has never faced the Blue Jays in his career.

Last Year: Made one start with Colorado last year on May 4 (ND, 3.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...spent the balance of the season with Triple-A Albuquerque and went 3-11 with a 6.25 ERA and .256 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 23 starts.

- Begins his ninth season in the majors with his sixth team (Rangers, 2012-13; Cubs, 2013-17; Royals, 2018; Mariners, 2018; Brewers, 2020; A's, 2022).
- Is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2014, 16-18, 20, 22).
- Posted a 3.68 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances this spring...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.
- Prior to last night, had last faced the Blue Jays on April 18, 2018 while pitching for Kansas City (0.1 ip, 4 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...had a 12.00 ERA (20 er in 15.0 ip) in six career appearances against Toronto.

Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.

61 RHP ZACH JACKSON

- Made his Major League debut last Saturday at Philadelphia, throwing one scoreless inning with a walk and a strikeout...fanned Didi Gregorius to end the eighth inning for his first career strikeout.
- Was a non-roster invitee this spring...did not allow a run in five of his six spring appearances for a 1.35 ERA...allowed a .208 opponents batting average and struck out 11 batters in 6.2 innings.
