ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have split the first two games of this series in Toronto after winning three of four at Tampa Bay and have now won five of the last seven games after losing each of the first two...this is the A's 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)... have a 4435-4080 (.521) record over the previous 54 seasons in Oakland... only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Los Angeles Dodgers, Boston, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 91509552 (.489) in their previous 121 seasons...that includes a $3886-4248$ record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City... with this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they began their 55th season in Oakland a week ago in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54.
OFFENSE: The A's have scored 50 runs over their first nine games, which is most in the majors...are third in the American League in home runs (11)...six of those have come with at least two runners on base and no other Major League team has more than two....are batting a Major League leading . 379 (25-for-66) with runners in scoring position...have 91 strikeouts, which is second most in the majors (Padres, 98).
PITCHING: Oakland starting pitchers have four of the five A's wins this year... the bullpen won their first game last night thanks to Dany Jiménez's scoreless eighth inning...A's starting pitchers have walked just one batter in the last four games and have issued just nine free passes in 43.2 innings for the season...the bullpen has walked 20 batters in 35.0 innings.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in their last two games after committing five errors over their previous three games...made just one over the first four...the six errors are tied for third most in the American League....are tied for second with two outfield assists.... have turned three double plays over their last two games after tallying only three over their first seven...have now turned six double plays, which is tied for sixth fewest in the American League...the A's had an opponent attempt a steal last night for the first time this season...Vladimir Guerrero Jr. was thrown out at second by Sean Murphy.
HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-4 on this season-opening 10 -game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (3-1) and Toronto (1-1)...this will be the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip...following this trip, the A's are scheduled to play 13 of their next 15 games at home, with the two road games coming at San Francisco...return home following the game Sunday for a seven-game homestand against Baltimore (four games) and Toronto (three games).
ROOKIES: The A's added two rookies to the roster on Friday (D. Jackson, Logue)...had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Z. Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Moll, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012)... have employed 11 rookies this year after using 13 last year, eight in 2020 and nine in 2019...three of the rookies made their Major League debuts (Lemoine a week ago today, Z. Jackson last Saturday, Oller on Tuesday)... should Logue appear in a game, he would become the fourth.
THIS AND THAT: The A's have outscored their opponents 50-39 and the +11 run differential is third best in the American League to the Guardians ( +18 ), and White Sox ( +12 )...are scheduled to play 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991...Billy McKinney became the 1,000th player in Oakland history a week ago today...with Drew Jackson making his A's debut last night, 10 other players have made their A's debut since then to bring the total to 1,010 .
ROSTER NOTES: The A's currently have 15 pitchers and 13 position players after starting the year with 14 pitchers and 14 positions players...nine players returned from last years Opening Day roster, eight other players played
for the A's at some point last year and one was in the A's farm system...four were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez, Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free agent... have one player who has played for the A's in each of the last seven seasons (Pinder), two in each of the last six (Blackburn and Montas) and two in each of the last five (Piscotty and Trivino)...only Pinder and Piscotty have been on each of the last five Opening Day rosters and only Montas and Trivino have been on each of the last four...Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization... the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.82 years...Christian Pache, who was 23 years and 140 days last Friday, is the youngest and Jed Lowrie is the oldest ( 37 years, 356 days last Friday)...five players on the A's Opening Day roster began the season with six or more years of service: Lowrie ( 13 years, 111 days), Andrus ( 13 years), Vogt ( 8 years, 64 days), Piscotty ( 6 years, 76 days) and Grimm ( 6 years, 50 days)
THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list five times this year... have added Bolt and Piscotty since the season started after beginning the year with three players on the IL (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)... used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's 278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals ( $4-11, .267$ )...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was . 286 (4-10) in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had 16...tied for second in the CL in triples (6), ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...tied for the third fewest home runs (23) and scored the fifth fewest runs (97)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the $\mathrm{CL}(.298)$, third highest ERA (6.12), OPS (.852) and on-base percentage (.367) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.486)... has the second fewest strikeouts (152)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3)...played all 18 games in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona $(1981,2021)$...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.
A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's have split the first two games of this series after last night's $7-5$ win...lost the season series last year, going $2-5$ against the Blue Jays...split four games in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Toronto...have lost 11 of the last 14 games and are 16-24 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2015...have won just one season series over that span (7-0 in 2018)...snapped a seven-game losing streak at Rogers Centre, which was the A's longest road losing streak against the Blue Jays (April 23, 2016July 27, 2017 and May 23, 2014-Aug. 13, 2015)...are 6-19 in Toronto dating back to 2014...are 227-207 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 114-102 in Oakland, 113-103 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 72-71 in Rogers Centre.

Elvis Andrus has scored at least one run in six of his last eight games and is tied for fifth in the AL in runs scored (7)...had the most runs by an Athletic over the first seven games since 2013 (Crisp 9, Lowrie 7)...Kevin Smith has four hits over his last three games after starting the season going 0 -for16...over his first six games, he struck out eight times and walked zero... over his last three games, he has one walk and just two strikeouts.

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1968 the A's play their first game in Oakland but lose to Baltimore 4-1... Dave McNally limits the A's to two hits, including a pinch hit single by Tony La Russa in his first at bat a member of the Oakland A's....in 2018, 50 years after their first game in Oakland, the A's celebrate with a free admission game...Lew Krausse, who was the starting pitcher in 1968, threw out the ceremonial first pitch and the A's defeated the Chicago White Sox, 10-2.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Adam Oller (0-0, 33.75 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and his career...was acquired from the New York Mets with J.T. Ginn on March 12 in exchange for Chris Bassitt...was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 7, was on the A's Opening Day roster and made his Major League debut last Tuesday at Tampa Bay....became the 54th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Daulton Jefferies on Sept. 12, 2020 in the first game of a doubleheader at Texas.

LAST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut last Tuesday at Tampa Bay, a 9-8 A's loss in 10 innings...tossed 1.1 innings, which was the shortest outing by an A's starting pitcher in his debut since Glenn Cox logged 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955...the A's scored three times in the first and he allowed a leadoff home run to Lowe in the bottom of the first...then yielded a RBI single to Walls and a three-run home run to Choi in the second and left trailing 5-3...the A's came back to tie the game in the seventh to get him off the hook.

2021 RECAP: Was named the New York Mets Organizational Pitcher of the Year and a MiLB.com organizational All-Star after combining for a 9-4 record, a 3.45 ERA and .213 opponents batting average in 23 starts with Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse...it was the first time he pitched above Single-A...struck out a career-high 138 batters in 120.0 innings, an average of 10.35 per nine innings...led the Mets farm system in strikeouts... 95 of the strikeouts came with Binghamton, which ranked sixth in the Double-A Northeast...also had career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched (120.0) and walks (47) and matched his high in hit batters (8)...led the Mets farm system in starts and innings pitched (120.0) and tied for the lead in wins...was 4-3 with a 5.12 ERA, .260 opponents batting average and .740 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 15 ...then went $5-1$ with a 1.89 ERA, .161 opponents average and . 514 OPS over his final 11 starts beginning July 23.
OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of . 201 (42-for-209) with a . 630 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to . 223 (51-for-229) with a . 632 OPS against right-handers...surrendered six of his nine home runs to righties...seven of his eight hit batters came against lefties...opponents hit .190 with six home runs with the bases empty, 242 with three home runs with runners on...they were 1-for-10 (.100) with seven strikeouts with the bases loaded...held the seven, eight and nine hitters in the order to a combined .152 batting average...yielded a .141 batting average with two strikes.
THIS AND THAT: Was a combined 3-2 with a 2.91 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in 11 starts in his home ballparks, 6-2 with a 3.92 ERA and . 230 opponent average in 12 starts on the road...his teams were 1-9 in his 10 no decisions and had a 10-13 (.435) record in his starting assignments... did not allow a run six times and allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 23 starts...allowed four hits or fewer 13 times.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Allowed a season-high five runs and a season-high four walks in a season-low 2.0 innings for the loss in his first start on May 7 at Akron...it was his first of four starts with five runs and his first of six with four walks...yielded a season-high eight hits in a 5-4 loss at Erie on May 23... finished May 0-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts...picked up his first win of the season June 4 at New Hampshire ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 3 \mathrm{bb}, 4 \mathrm{so}$ )...had a seven-game winning streak from June 30 to Sept. 4...compiled a 1.39 ERA and .180 opponents batting average during the streak...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings in a $4-3$ win at Altoona on July 15...logged 4.2 scoreless and

hitless innings against Erie on July 23 to begin a seven-start stretch where he went $4-0$ with a 0.44 ERA and .132 opponents batting average...did not allow a run in five of those starts...had three consecutive starts with 10 or more strikeouts from July 30 to Aug. 14 ( 35 so in 20.0 ip)...had 10 strikeouts in 6.1 innings on July 30 at Hartford and 12 in a career-high tying 7.0 scorless innings against Portland on Aug. 5...was promoted to Syracuse on Aug. 9 and fanned a career-high 13 in 6.2 scoreless innings in his first Triple-A start at Worcester on Aug. 14...was $5-3$ with a 4.03 ERA in 15 starts with Binghamton at the time of his promotion...finished the season by going 4-1 with a 2.45 ERA in eight starts with Syracuse...had the second lowest opponents batting average (.179) and slugging percentage (.278) in the Triple-A East from Aug. 8 through the end of the season, the third lowest ERA and the fourth lowest OPS (.568)...allowed just one run in four starts in August and was $3-0$ with a 0.38 ERA and .139 opponents batting average...struck out 34 batters in 24.0 innings....went 1-1 with a 4.71 ERA over his final four starts beginning Sept. 10.

CAREER: Pitched in the Pittsburgh, San Francisco and New York (NL) farm systems prior to being dealt to the A's and is 24-20 with four saves and a 4.05 ERA in 99 games, including 56 starts, in five seasons in the minors... has 395 strikeouts in 380.1 innings ( 9.34 strikeouts per nine innings)...has walked just 115 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.43 ...was originally a 20th round pick of Pittsburgh in 2016 but was released by the Pirates following the 2018 season...nearly retired from the game before signing with Windy City of the independent Frontier League in 2019...signed a minor league contract with San Francisco on May 30, 2019, was selected by New York (NL) in the 2019 minor league Rule 5 draft and was named the Mets Organizational Pitcher of the Year in 2021.

RHP Frankie Montas (1-1, 4.76 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...was the A's Opening Day starter and took the loss on April 8 at Philadelphia...picked up his first win of the season in his last start last Wednesday at Tampa Bay in the A's 4-2 victory ( 6.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 6 so)... was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against the Orioles, a start in the A's 10-3 victory at Baltimore on April 10, 2019 ( $6.0 \mathrm{ip}, 3 \mathrm{~h}, 3 \mathrm{r}, 3$ er, $1 \mathrm{bb}, 3$ so)...was $0-1$ with a 6.35 ERA in two starts this spring...went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts last year...finished with the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...tied for the American League lead in games started, ranked third in opponents slugging percentage (.372) and innings pitched (187.0), fourth in ERA, opponents OPS (.723), strikeouts and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.08) and tied for fifth in wins.
