## WHITE SOX AT A GLANEE

- The Chicago White Sox have won five of their last seven games and seven of 10 as they continue a six-game, seven-day trip tonight with the second game at the Oakland Coliseum.
- LHP Dallas Keuchel is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who are a season-high tying 22 games over .500 and lead the American League Central by 11.0 games over Cleveland (68-68). - The Sox opened the trip losing two of three at Kansas City over the weekend, including a 6-0 defeat in Sunday's deciding game. - Following tomorrow's series finale at the Athletics to conclude the trip, the White Sox will return home for six games in seven days vs. Boston (9/10-12) and Los Angeles-AL (9/14-16).
- The Sox went 4-1 on their last homestand vs. the Cubs (2-1) and Pittsburgh (2-0) from 8/27-9/1 and 3-4 on their last trip to Tampa Bay (1-2) and Toronto (2-2) from 8/20-26.


## TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are off to their best 138-game start since 2005 (87-51) and are looking to move a season-high 23 games over .500 for the first time since 9/2/06 (79-56).
- The Sox are hitting .289/.369/.490 with 17 home runs and 68 runs scored ( $6.8 \mathrm{R} / \mathrm{G}$ ) over the last 10 games.
- The White Sox are looking to win their first series at the Oakland Coliseum since 4/4-7/16 (3-1 record).
- José Abreu, the reigning AL Player of the Month and MVP, needs two homers to record his fifth 30-HR/100-RBI season. - Yasmani Grandal is hitting .520/629/1.200 (13-25) with five homers, 16 RBI , eight walks, nine runs scored and a 1.829 OPS in eight games since returning from the injured list on 8/27.


## LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Six White Sox pitchers combined on a six-hitter and limited Oakland to just one extra-base hit in a 6-3, series-opening win. - The Sox snapped their eight-game losing streak at the Oakland Coliseum, their second-longest since 1968 (10 from 2001-03).
- Chicago broke a 1-1 tie with three runs in the fifth, including a RBI single by Gavin Sheets and two-run single by César Hernández ... Brian Goodwin added a two-run single in the eighth.
- Jimmy Lambert earned his first career win after allowing one run on three hits in 5.0 IP (retired 11 of the final 12 A's he faced) . four of the five Sox relievers made a scoreless appearance. - Yoán Moncada went 3-5 with two doubles, Leury García was $3-4$ with a double and Luis Robert was 2-6 with a run scored


## POSTSEASON OUTLOOK

- Chicago's magic number to clinch the American League Central division title is 15 (combination of wins and Cleveland losses). - The White Sox currently own the third-best record in the AL, 1.0 game behind AL West-leading Houston (81-57) and 7.5 games behind AL East-leading Tampa Bay (88-51)


## VIEW FROM THE TOP

- The White Sox are in position to make the playoffs in consecutive seasons for the first time in franchise history, and capture their first American League Central title since 2008.
- The Sox have been in first place for 126 days (every day since 5/7), their most since 2012 (also 126) ... the last season they lead the division by more than 126 days was 2005 (182).
- Chicago currently is a season-high tying 22 games over . 500 (third time), and led the AL Central by as many as 12.0 games (8/18) $\ldots$ it has led the division by 9.0 -plus every day since $8 / 1$.


## CUBAN CONNECTION

- CF Luis Robert (1st, .381), 3B Yoán Moncada (7th, .338) and 1B José Abreu (13th, .326) rank among the American League leaders in batting average since $8 / 14$... no other AL team has more than two players in the Top 13 during that span
- Moncada has hit safely in 18 of 19 games, Abreu has hit safely in 16 contests with five homers and 18 RBI, and Robert owns 10 multihit efforts over 19 games since 8/14.


## RBI MACHINE

- Jose Abreu is attempting to join Cecil Fielder (1990-92) as the only AL players to lead the league in RBI three straight seasons. - Abreu is tied for the major-league lead with 103 RBI this season, the sixth time in his seven full seasons he has reached that milestone ... he led MLB with 60 RBI in 2020 after topping the AL (second in MLB) with 123 in 2019.
- Rogers Hornsby (1920-22), Joe Medwick (1936-38), George Foster (1976-78) and Fielder are the only players in history to lead his league in RBI in three consecutive years
- Abreu ranks seventh in White Sox history with 774 RBI (Hall-of-Famer Eddie Collins is sixth with 804).


## WHITE SOK VS. OAKLAND ATHLETICS

- The White Sox lead the season series, 4-1, after winning last night and three of four from 8/16-19 in Chicago... they missed a chance for a series sweep with a 5-4 loss in the finale.
- The Sox are hitting .306/.379/.416 (53-173) with four home runs, own a $2.40 \mathrm{ERA}(12 \mathrm{ER} / 45.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) with one quality start and have outscored the A's by a 27-12 margin.
- The White Sox are 8-16 vs. the Athletics since 2017.
- Chicago and Oakland did not play during the 2020 regular season, but the A's defeated the Sox in the AL Wild Card Series $(2-1)$, winning the final two games after losing the opener.


## LEGENDARY RETURN

- Tony La Russa this week returns to manage at the Oakland Coliseum for the first time since 6/17/07 with St. Louis (10-6 win) - La Russa managed the A's from 1986-95, compiling a 798-673 (.542) record with four postseason appearances (1988-90, '92), three pennants (1988-90) and one World Series title (1989). - La Russa ranks second in Athletics history in managerial wins, trailing current A's manager Bob Melvin (surpassed on $6 / 1 / 21$ ).


## EOLISEUM EONUNDRUM

- The Sox have lost eight of the last nine regular-season games at the Oakland Coliseum since 7/4/17 (outscored 68-35 margin). - The White Sox snapped an eight-game losing streak at the Coliseum last night, their second-longest since the A's moved to the Bay area in 1968 ... they lost 10 in a row from 5/18/01-5/6/03. - Chicago has not won a road series at the Athletics since winning three of four games to open the 2016 season (4/4-7)


## WHO'S HOT?

- José Abreu is batting .315/.379/.615 (41-130) with nine doubles, 10 home runs, 26 RBI and a .995 OPS in 33 games since $8 / 1 \ldots$ he was named AL August Player of the Month
- Yasmani Grandal is batting .318/.453/.710 (34-107) with 13 homers, 36 RBI and a 1.163 OPS in his last 34 games since 6/3 .. he has raised his average from . 131 to .228 during that span. - Luis Robert is hitting .365/.396/.615 (35-96) with six doubles, six home runs, 14 RBI, a 1.011 OPS and 20 runs scored in 22 games since returning from the injured list on 8/9.


## NEXT MAN UP

- Tim Anderson (left hamstring strain), Lance Lynn (right knee inflammation) and Lucas Giolito (left hamstring strain) currently are on the White Sox injured list ... Anderson (3.5), Lynn (3.4)

## YOU CAN PUT IT ON THE BOARD

- The Sox have hit 93 homers in 60 games since $6 / 30$, tied with the Dodgers for the fourth-most in MLB during that span comparison, they hit just 72 homers in their first 78 games.
- During the 60 -game stretch, the Sox have 54 homers in 27 games at home and 39 in 32 road contests ... they have hit fourplus home runs 10 times this season (eight since 6/30). - The White Sox are are 68-23 when homering, 38-5 when hitting multiple homers and 12-35 when going homerless


## GRAB SOME BENPH

- The White Sox lead the major leagues with 10.25 strikeouts per 9.0 IP, which would be the third-highest mark in MLB history behind Houston in 2018 (10.44) and 2019 (10.28).
- The Sox are attempting to join the 2015 Indians and 1980 Yankees as the only American League teams since 1947 with four pitchers ranking among the Top 10 in SO/9.0 IP.
- Dylan Cease (2nd, 11.93) and Lucas Giolito (5th, 10.23) rank in the Top 5 ... Carlos Rodón (1st, 12.64) and Lance Lynn (6th, 10.08) are just shy of the qualifying IP totals for the Top 10.
- Sox starters have struck out 10-plus batters a franchise-record 18 times this season, breaking the mark of 16 set in 2015.


## SWEET HOME PHIPAGO

- The White Sox are 46-24 (.657) at home this season, the best winning percentage in the American League (Tampa Bay is second at .634) and their best 70-game start since 2008 (48-22). - The .657 winning percentage at home would be their sec-ond-highest since 1984, trailing only the 2008 club (54-28, .659).


## WINNING WAYS

- With a 16-12 record in August, the White Sox recorded their seventh straight winning month, their longest streak since a nine-month run from June 1993-August 1994.
- It marks the first time since 2008 they have begun a season with five straight winning months.
