BOSTON RED SOX (53-40) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (46-47)

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Red Sox tonight continue a 10-day, 10-game West Coast trip with the 2nd of 3 games in Oakland...The club also has stops in Seattle (7/22-25) and Los Angeles (7/26-28)...This marks the club's 2nd of 3 trips out west in 2010 as they played in Colorado (1-2) and San Francisco (2-1) in June and will return to Oakland (9/10-12) and Seattle (9/13-15) in September.

The Sox went 1-3 on their homestand vs. Texas after the break...Boston has dropped 8 of its last 12 games but have won 16 of their last 28 contests overall.

The Red Sox have lost 9 of their last 15 games away from Fenway Park but are 15-10 (.600) in their last 25 road tilts beginning 5/22, the 4th-best road record in the Majors in that time behind the Rangers (16-9, .640), White Sox (17-10, .630) and Yankees (15-9, .625)...The Sox have won or a split 7 of their last 9 series away from Fenway Park, losing only 6/22-24 at COL (1-2) and 7/5-7 at TB (0-3).

Overall, the club's 23-20 (.535) road mark is tied for 4th in the Majors with the Rangers (also, 23-20), behind the Rays (30-16, .652), Yankees (28-19, .596) and Padres (24-18, .571).

Of Boston's 27 games from 7/19-8/15, 20 are on the road, going 1-0 thus far...The Sox have just 2 off days in the next 37 days (7/29 and 8/16) through 8/25.

WILD WEST: Boston plays each of its 1st 14 games after the break against American League West opponents from 7/15-28, going 2-3 thus far...The Sox are 10-5 (.667) this season vs. AL West opponents, tied with Texas (14-7, .667) for the 2nd-best mark among AL clubs behind the Yankees (15-7, .682).

RECORD LABEL: At 53-40 (.570), the Red Sox have the 6th best record in the Majors, 4th in the American League behind the Yankees (58-33, .637), Rays (56-36, .609) and Rangers (54-39, .581)...Boston is 3rd in the AL East, 6.0 games behind New York for the top spot and trailing the Rays by 3.5 games.

Since the club was a season-high 17 games over .500 after a win on 7/3 and 0.5 game out of 1st place, Boston has gone 4-8 (.333), tied with the Mets (also 4-8) for the 4th worst record in the Majors in that time behind only the Mariners (3-10, .231), D-Backs (3-9, .250) and Pirates (3-8, .273).

The club has won or split 15 of their last 18 series since 5/17 and 20 of 26 sets since 4/20, during which they have the 2nd best record in the Majors at 49-31 (.613) behind the Yankees (49-30, .620).

GOING DEEP: The Red Sox have hit 30 home runs in their last 21 games beginning 6/23 and 44 over their last 32 tilts beginning 6/10, tied for the 2nd-most in the Majors in that time with Toronto, behind only Milwaukee (47)...The Sox 123 homers overall on the season are 2nd in the Majors, trailing only the Blue Jays 141...David Ortiz and Kevin Youkilis are tied for the team lead with 18 homers each, tied for 9th in the AL.

SWEET RELIEF: Red Sox relievers have combined for 7.1 scoreless innings over the club's last 3 games and have not given up a run in 5 of 6 games since 7/11, posting a 1.66 ERA (4 ER/21.2 IP) with a .167 opponent average (12-for-72) in that time.

10 SPOTS: The Sox have not posted 10 hits in a game in a season-high 6 straight tilts but have notched 10-or-more hits in 7 of 17, 9 of 21, 14 of 27, and 17 of their last 32 games dating back to 6/10...The club has 44 games with at least 10 hits overall this season, 3rd most in the Majors behind the Twins (45) and Rays (45).

BUT A NUMBER: At 43 years, 352 days old today, a win would make Red Sox starter Tim Wakefield the oldest pitcher in Red Sox history to record a victory...Dennis Eckersley is the oldest Red Sox pitcher to earn a win, doing so at 43 years and 349 days old in a relief appearance at Baltimore on 9/17/98.

Eckersley is the only other older Red Sox pitcher to appear in a game, at 43 years and 358 days old in his last appearance for the club on 9/26/98 against the Orioles.

THIRD ROCKS: Adrian Beltre went 3-for-4 with his 15th home run of the season last night and has now reached that mark in 10 of the last 12 seasons since 1999, the most among all Major League third basemen in that time...Beltre's 15 home runs are the most among all American League third basemen this season.

Last night's game was his team-leading 10th, 3-hit effort of the season, tied with TB's Evan Longoria for tops among AL third basemen and 1 shy of NYM's David Wright (11) for the Major League lead at that position.

CAMERON COMING ON: Since hitting his 1st home run of the season on 6/26, Mike Cameron has hit safely in 9 of 12 games at a .325 clip (13-for-40) with 4 homers, 10 RBI and 9 runs in that time, including a season-high 3 hits on 2 occasions.

600 CLUB: Sunday's sellout crowd of 37,431 for Boston's home game against the Rangers marked the 600th consecutive sold out Red Sox game at Fenway Park dating back to 5/15/03, extending the club's all-time Major League record.

HALL MONITOR: With his 1st start of the season at third base Thursday night, Bill Hall has now started at 6 different positions in 2010, including left field (19), center (6), right (4), second base (17) and shortstop (3)...The last Red Sox player to make at least 1 start at each of those 6 positions in 1 season was Damian Jackson in 2003...Hall has also pitched in a game, joining Steve Lyons (1991) and Jack Rothrock (1928) as the only Sox players to appear at each of those 7 positions in a season.

Hall has hit safely in 5 of his last 7 road contests, going 9-for-26 (.346) with 3 doubles, a homer, 6 RBI and 3 runs over the 7-game stretch.

BOLD – Fenway Park

The Red Sox continue a 3-game series in Oakland tonight...The 2 teams play a total of 9 times in 2010 with the Sox up 3-1 thus far...Boston took the series at Fenway in June, 2-1...The 2 clubs meet again with a 3-game series in Oakland, 9/10-12.

Last night, Daisuke Matsuzaka limited the A's to 2 hits over 6.2 innings, the 1st Boston starter to hold the A's to 2 hits or less since 4/1/08, also a 2-1 win in Oakland in which Matsuzaka gave up 1 run on 2 hits in 6.2 IP.

Prior to last night, each of the previous 10 games between the Sox and A's beginning 7/6/09 were played in Boston...It tied for the longest such streak ever between the 2 franchises, also at Fenway from 7/4-8/29/19...The Red Sox have not played 10 consecutive road games against the Athletics since 8/20/71-7/12/72.

The Red Sox have won each of their last 2 but just 6 of their last 19 contests at the Coliseum dating back to 7/26/06.

The Sox have won 7 of their last 10 tilts against the Athletics and 17 of 27 beginning 6/7/07...Boston is 35-26 vs. Oakland since the start of the 2004 campaign and has won or split 5 of 6 season sets in that time.

REHAB UPDATES: Jeremy Hermida, on the 15-day DL since 6/11 (retro to 6/10) with fractured ribs, had his rehab transferred to Triple-A Pawtucket last night and went 0-for-4 as the DH in the PawSox 4-1 loss to Toledo (DET) at home...He is slated to play with Pawtucket tonight and expected to join the Red Sox in Seattle later this week...In 4 rehab games overall between Pawtucket and Double-A Portland, he has hit .200 (3-for-15) with 2 doubles, 3 RBI, a run and a walk, playing left field and DH.

Jed Lowrie, on the 60-day DL since 3/31 (retro to 3/26) with mononucleosis, continued his rehab last night, going 1-for-3 with a double and an RBI while playing shortstop for the PawSox...In 10 rehab games overall with Pawtucket and Short-A Lowell, he's hit .367 (11-for-30) with 9 RBI, making appearances at second base, shortstop, third base and DH.

Mike Lowell, on the 15-day disabled list since 6/24 (retro to 6/23) with a strained right hip, is scheduled to begin a rehab assignment with Pawtucket this Thursday as they complete their series with Toledo.

MOLINA CLEARS: Catcher Gustavo Molina, who was designated for assignment on Sunday, today cleared waivers and was outrighted to Pawtucket.

TONIGHT'S RED SOX STARTING PITCHER

49-TIM WAKEFIELD, RHP

CAREER: 192-170-22, 4.38 ERA (1,475 ER/3,033.2 IP) in 581 G, 436 GS
2010 SPRING TRAINING: 4-1, 3.04 ERA (8 ER/23.2 IP) in 6 G, 5 GS

LAST START: Took the loss as Boston fell 7-2 to TEX at Fenway on 7/15...Went 2.0+ innings, allowing 8 hits and 7 runs (6 ER) with 2 K's and no walks...Was his shortest start since allowing 7 runs in 1.2 IP on 9/6/08 at TEX...Allowed 6 runs on 6 straight hits with 1 out in the 1st, including a 2-run homer to Bengie Molina...Tossed a 1-2-3 2nd inning, but a Nelson Cruz RBI double with no outs in the 3rd ended his night.

► Has allowed at least 1 homer in a career-high 9 straight games since 5/28, tied with DET'S Jeremy Bonderman (6/1-present) and KC's Brian Bannister (4/19-6/1) for the longest such streak in the Majors this season...It marks the longest such streak by a Sox hurler since Roger Clemens allowed homers in 10 straight games from 4/11-6/1/86.

► Earned the win in just 3 of his 8 quality starts this season after winning 9 of 12 in 2009.

AGELESS: At 43 years, 352 days old today, Wakefield would become the oldest pitcher in Red Sox history to record a win...Dennis Eckersley is the only older Sox pitcher to earn a win, last doing it at 43 years, 349 days in a relief appearance at BAL on 9/17/98.

► Eckersley is the only other older BOS pitcher to appear in a game, at 43 years, 358 days old in his last appearance for the team on 9/26/98 vs. BAL...At 43 years and 250 days old on his 4/9 season debut, Wakefield became the oldest Sox pitcher to start a game, passing David Wells, who was 43 years and 98 days in his last start for the club on 8/26/06 at SEA.

STINGY WITH WALKS: Ranks 13th in the AL with an average of 2.29 walks allowed per 9.0 IP (26 BB/102.0 IP)...Issued 2 or less walks in a team-high 12 of his 15 starts this year with a 4.27 ERA (37 ER/78.0 IP) in those 12 starts.

100 ON 16: On 7/7 reached 100.0 innings on the year and has now accumulated at least 100.0 IP in each of the last 16 seasons from 1995-2010, all with Boston...He became just the 3rd pitcher ever to record at least 16 straight seasons of 100.0+ IP with 1 AL team, joining Walter Johnson (21 seasons with WSH, 1907-1927) and Ted Lyons (20 with CWS, 1924-42)...Since 1901, 3 other pitchers have accomplished the feat with 1 NL team: Warren Spahn (19 with BSN-MIL, 1946-64), Don Sutton (16 with LAD, 1966-1980) and Phil Niekro (17 with ATL, 1967-83).

FIRST AT FENWAY: Became the all-time Fenway Park leader with his 201st career start at the ballpark on 7/2, passing Roger Clemens (200)...His 202 starts at Fenway are the most by any active hurler at any 1 ballpark...CWS's Mark Buehrle is 2nd on that list with 168 career starts at U.S. Cellular Field.

► Owns 403 career starts with the Red Sox, tops in team history and the most by any active hurler with 1 single team...Andy Pettitte is next on that list with 393 starts for the Yankees...Wakefield became the 13th pitcher ever to start at least 400 games for a single AL team on 6/25 at SF.

INNINGS INFO: Has 3,033.2 career innings...Became the 129th pitcher in ML history to reach 3,000.0 on 6/13...Joins PHI's Jamie Moyer (4,019.1) and NYY's Andy Pettitte (3,042.0) as the only active hurlers to reach the plateau...Finished his start at CLE on 6/8 with 2,777.0 IP in his career with Boston, passing Roger Clemens (2,776.0) for the all-time club record...His 2,813.1 IP with Boston are the most among active hurlers with any single team.

MILESTONE MAN: Owns 192 career wins, 3rd among actives after Jamie Moyer (267) and Andy Pettitte (240)...His 178 wins for BOS are 3rd in club history, 14 shy of Roger Clemens and Cy Young (192 each)...His 92 wins at Fenway Park are 2nd all time behind Clemens, who has 100.

VS. OAKLAND: Makes 2nd start vs. OAK this season...Took the loss at Fenway on 6/3, allowing 6 runs in 6.0 IP...Spun a complete game victory in his last start at OAK on 4/15/09, allowing 2 runs on 4 hits and 2 walks with 4 K's, his last complete game on the road and his 1st win at OAK since 9/7/99.

PREVIOUS START: Took a 6-4 loss to David Price at TB on 7/7...Limited the Rays to 4 hits over 5.2 innings, but gave up 6 runs and issued a season-high 6 walks while fanning 3...All of the runs and walks came in his final 2.2 frames after tossing 3.0 scoreless innings to begin the outing...Left with 2 out and a runner on in the 6th, and that run came around off reliever Dustin Richardson...The Sox fought back for 4 runs over the final 4.0 frames.

MORE 2010 HIGHLIGHTS: Became the all-time Fenway Park leader with his 201st career start at the park, a 3-2 win over BAL on 7/2...Matched a season high with 8.0 IP...Surrendered 2 runs on 7 hits and 1 walk with 4 K's...Gave up a solo shot to Nick Markakis in the 4th and allowed a 2nd run on a 2-out single in the 5th...Daniel Nava's pinch-hit single in the bottom of the 8th put Boston ahead...Papelbon saved it with a 1-2-3 9th...At 2:07, was the quickest 9.0-inning Sox game since 9/25/06 at TOR (2:03) and the quickest at Fenway since 9/17/02 vs. CLE (2:06), both games Wakefield started...Was his 1st home win since 7/8/09 vs. OAK, snapping an 0-5 stretch over 11 appearances (9 starts) at Fenway Park...The 9 straight home winless starts set a career high and mark the longest home winless drought by a Sox starter since Frank Castillo's 12-gamer, 6/23/01-6/7/02.

RELIEF WORK: Has made 4 relief appearances this season, his 1st action out of the 'pen since 2004, with no record and a 6.23 ERA (6 ER/8.2 IP)...Is 3-8 with a 5.59 ERA (58 ER/93.1 IP) in 15 starts this year...Each of his last 10 outings have been starts since his last bullpen work on 5/17 at NYY.
