ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight, but are winners of five of their last nine games, 10 of the last 15 and 17 of the last 28...Oakland's 17-11 (.607) record since June 25 is fourth best in the American League behind the Rays (21-9), White Sox (21-10) and Yankees (20-10)...are 51-51 overall and 8-5 since the All-Star Break, but with last night's loss, their streak of five straight games over the .500 mark ends...it had been their longest stretch above .500 since May 26 to June 11 (17 straight games) ...dropping two of three in the just-completed Texas series snapped a string of winning a season high four consecutive series...have fallen back to third place in the AL West, now trailing Texas by 8½ and LA by ½ game...have spent 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 28 days in second, three days tied for second, 48 days in third and one day in fourth...are 13-21 in the first game of a series, 15-18 in the second game and 20-10 in the third game...had their season high five-game winning streak snapped July 19...went into the All-Star Break with a 43-46 record.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are playing the fifth game of a six-game road trip in Texas (1-2) and Chicago (0-1, 3 games) tonight...have won nine of their last 14 road games...the A's were 4-2 on their last homestand against Boston (2-1) and Chicago (2-1) July 19-25...are 30-22 (.577) at home this season compared to 21-29 (.420) on the road...have a 2.97 ERA (157 er in 475.0 ip) at home compared to a 4.67 ERA (224 er in 432 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the American League...have allowed 34 home runs at home compared to 66 on the road...have yielded the fewest home runs at home in the AL and the second most on the road...starting pitchers are 22-16 with a 3.06 ERA (109 er in 321 ip) at home compared to 15-18 with a 4.50 ERA (144 er in 288 ip) on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's extended their winning streak in day games to seven Sunday and have not lost a day game since June 23...are 24-10 (.706) during the day, which is the best record in the majors, compared to 27-41 (.397) at night, which is tied for fourth worst in the majors...have a 2.87 ERA (97 er in 303.2 ip) during the day and a 4.24 ERA (284 er in 603.1 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the majors.

IN JULY: The A's are 13-10 (.565) in the month of July, which is the fifth best record in the AL ...have clinched their best July record since 2005, when they went 20-6, and their first winning July since 2006 (14-13)...combined for a 29-49 (.372) record in July over the previous three seasons...the pitching staff has a 3.12 ERA (72 er in 208 ip) this month, second lowest in the majors (CWS, 2.82)...have a .238 opponents batting average, lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors, and have yielded 17 home runs, which is tied for third fewest...the A's offense has 30 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (TB, 34).

AGAINST THE BEST: Beginning with last weekend's three-game series against Chicago, the A's encounter a 15-game stretch where they will play 12 games against first place teams...have a three-game set in Chicago this weekend and have a pair of three-game series against Texas during this span...the A's are 27-35 against opponents that were at or above .500 when the A's played them and 24-16 against teams that were below .500.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two earned runs or fewer in seven of the last 15 games (45 er in 134.1 ip, 3.01 ERA), which has lowered the season ERA to 3.78—second lowest in the American League behind Tampa Bay (3.62)...tied with the White Sox for the AL lead in shutouts (9), while rank first in fewest hit batters (20) and rank fourth in opponents batting average (.249).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in 10 of the last 15 games and are 8-4 with a 3.20 ERA (34 er in 95.2 ip) over that span...have a 3.73 ERA (253 er in 610 ip) this season, tops in the American League...their.248 opponents batting average ranks second in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit three home runs three times in the last 15 games, the last time occurring Saturday vs. the White Sox...did it just once over the first 87 games (4 at Boston, June 3)...have 14 home runs total over that span but just 67 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...are on pace to hit 106 home runs...have hit 108 or fewer home runs three times in Oakland history in a non-strike season (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978 and 108 in 1979).

OFFENSE: Oakland has managed only 266 extra base hits this year, second fewest in the American League...also rank third lowest in slugging percentage (.383) and fourth lowest in runs (427) in the AL...however, are tied for third in the American League with 22 triples, which is one more than the season total from last year...rank second with 34 sacrifice hits, which is three more than last year's season total ...have not had more since 1999 when they had 39...have 310 walks and are on pace for 492...have walked fewer than 500 times in a non-strike season just three times in Oakland history (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968, 482 in 1979)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (12) and are fourth in batting (.250).

ON THE BASES: The A's have 22 stolen bases since the All-Star Break, most in the majors...have been successful in 87 of 109 (79.8%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the second best percentage in the American League (TB, 80.2%) and third best in the majors (Philadelphia, 83.8%)...the Oakland record is 80.7% set in 2008...have a record of 36-17 when stealing a base and are 15-34 with no stolen bases...the A's pitching staff ranks second in the majors with 17 pickoffs (CWS, 20).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-10 (.600) in one-run games, which is second best in the American League behind Chicago (19-12)...have lost eight of their last 13 one-run decisions after winning 10 of the first 12...with Tuesday night's 3-1, 10-inning loss at Texas, they are 4-6 (.444) in extra inning games.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Andrew Bailey on the disabled list yesterday, marking the 20th time they have used the DL this year...have now used the DL 84 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...the only team that has used the DL more over that span is Texas (87)...the 20 players have combined to miss 837 games (41.8 games per stint)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at nine (Bailey, Chavez, Devine, Duchscherer, Jackson, Meloan, Outman, Sheets, Sweeney)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day since April 21 and at least five on the DL all year...have not had fewer than five players on the DL since April 28 of last year when they had four...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of 2006 when they had one.

A's vs. WHITE SOX

The 2010 series is tied, 2-2, with the A's winning two of three in Oakland last weekend, and Chicago winning last night...won last year's series, 5-4...lost two of three in Oakland but won four of six in Chicago...have won the season series seven times over the previous nine years and are 53-29 (.646) against the Sox since the start of the 2001 season...that is the best record by any American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 280-259 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 148-126 in Oakland and 132-133 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 957-1014 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jack Cust is batting .326 (15 for 46) with six home runs and 15 RBI in his last 14 games...his six HR have come in his last 12 games.

Rajai Davis stole his 30th base Wednesday night in Texas, thus becoming only the fifth player in Oakland history with at least two 30-steal seasons (Henderson 13 times, Campaneris 8, North 4 and C. Washington 2)...he now has 32 steals, which ranks third in the American League.

Adam Rosales is hitting .327 (18 for 55) with 11 runs scored and nine RBI in his last 17 games.

Kurt Suzuki is batting .388 (19 for 49) with 10 RBI and nine runs scored in his last 13 games...also ranks second among AL catchers in home runs (12) and is third in RBI (44) despite missing 19 games on the DL and bereavement lists.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1972**, Vida Blue tosses a two-hit shutout as the A's defeat Texas 2-0 in 1:52. Joe Rudi drives in both of the A's runs with sacrifice flies as Oakland is limited to two hits...in **1973**, Ken Holtzman pitches all 11 innings of the A's 4-3 win over Minnesota. Ray Fosse drives in the winning run with a sacrifice fly.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season, his third since coming off the disabled list July 20...the A's are 7-10 (.412) in his starting assignments and are 27-36 (.429) in his 63 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in 13 of his 17 starts, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked one batter or fewer 14 times.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Halted a personal five-game losing streak in his last start Sunday, earning his fifth win of the season...prior to that win, he had posted a 0-5 mark with a 4.10 ERA (52.2 ip, 69 h, 30 r, 24 er, 10 bb, 36 so, 6 hr) and .319 (69 for 216) opponents batting average over his previous nine starts since tossing his perfect game on May 9...however, had received just 12 runs of support over that nine-game span (2.05 RSA)...according to the Elias Sports

Bureau, the nine consecutive starts without a win following a no-hitter or perfect game was the longest streak in major league history...the previous was eight by Mark Buehrle following his perfect game in 2009...the five-game losing streak is the longest by an A's pitcher this year...it was the second longest losing streak of his career to an eight-game streak from April 29 to September 23, 2007.

RUN SUPPORT: Has run support of 3.17 (37 rs in 105.0 ip), which is the second lowest figure in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...has run support of two runs or fewer in 11 of his 17 starts this year...has six runs of support in his seven losses this year (42.2 ip, 1.27 RSA) and 25 runs of support in his 28 career losses (151.1 ip, 1.49 RSA)...is 2-26 in 40 career starts with support of two runs or fewer and zero or one run of support and 16-2 in 23 starts with run support of three or more...has career run support of 3.50 (141 rs in 362.1 ip) as a starter.

DON'T WALK: Has walked one batter or fewer in 14 of his 17 starts and has issued just 19 walks in 105.0 innings, an average of 1.63 per nine innings...that is the third lowest mark in the American League, fifth lowest in the majors...ranks 10th in the AL in strikeout to walk ratio (3.63)...had a streak of 21.0 consecutive innings (79 batters) without a walk from May 3 to 14.

ON THE BASES: Is tied for second in the American League with five pickoffs (Buehrle, CWS 9)...now has 14 career pickoffs, including a career high seven in 2008...the Twins Danny Valencia stole second base in the second inning on June 4 and that was the first stolen base he allowed since Aug. 20, 2008, also against Minnesota (Punto)...had gone 230.1 innings without allowing a stolen base...opponents are 1 for 2 in stolen base attempts off him this year and 4 for 10 (40.0%) in his career.

INNING BY INNING: Has yielded 23 of his 50 runs this year in the fifth and sixth inning (10 in the fifth, 13 in the sixth)...has a 2.38 ERA (18 er in 68.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and a 6.32 ERA (26 er in 37.0 ip) average after that.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed his 10th home run of the season June 17, which is a new career high...yielded nine in both 2007 and 2009...seven of the 10 home runs have been solo shots.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: Is 1-0 with a 3.27 ERA in two starts in July...went 0-2 with a 4.50 ERA in four starts in June...was 1-4 despite a 3.15 ERA in six starts in May and tied for the American League lead in losses...was 3-1 with a 4.20 ERA in five starts in April...started the season 3-0, which gave him a career best four-game winning streak dating back to July 31 of last year...went 4-0 with a 3.58 ERA and .218 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned five starts.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was placed on the 15-day disabled list July 3 retroactive to June 23 with left elbow tightness...it was his second career stint on the DL...made one rehab start for Single-A Stockton on July 15 and had a no decision in the Ports' 10-9 win over Visalia (4.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so).

PERFECT: Pitched the 19th of the 20 perfect games in Major League history on Mother's Day, May 9, against Tampa Bay (includes Don Larsen's in the 1956 World Series)...it was the second by an Athletic and it came 42 years and one day after Catfish Hunter did it against Minnesota on May 8, 1968...he was named American League Player of the Week for his effort...retired the first two batters he faced in his next start May 14 at Los Angeles to extend his consecutive batters retired streak to an Oakland record tying 29 (also Hunter, May 3-8, 1968)...the streak ended on a two-out double by Abreu in the first but he retired 11 straight after that for a stretch where he retired 40 of 41 hitters...please see the expanded game notes at pressbox.oaklandathletics.com or mlbpressbox.com for more information about his perfect game.

BACK-TO-BACK COMPLETE GAMES: Followed up his perfect game with a complete game seven-hitter in the A's 4-0 loss May 14 at Los Angeles...of the 16 perfect games since 1922, only Len Barker followed with another complete game and he also lost...Braden is the first A's pitcher to toss back-to-back complete games since Mark Mulder had three straight from May 9-21, 2004...began his career with 52 consecutive starts without a complete game to set an Oakland record to start a career, topping the previous mark of 51 by Todd Van Poppel from September 11, 1991-September 12, 1995...it was the fourth longest streak at any point in Oakland history.

LAST START: Applied the breaks to a personal five-game losing streak by registering his fifth win of the season in the A's 6-4 decision over Chicago Sunday (6.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...received his best run support of the season, as he exited with a 6-1 lead with one out and two runners on in the seventh...allowed a two-out RBI double to Konerko—the only extra base hit of the game for either team—in the first inning, but Oakland rallied with four runs in the second and single runs in the fourth and sixth...Blevins was nicked for three runs in the seventh in relief, with two of the runs charged to Braden. Wuertz pitched a perfect ninth to preserve the win for Braden.

BRADEN vs. CHICAGO: Is 1-0 with a 4.05 ERA in two starts vs. the White Sox...prior to Sunday, he had a no decision in his only other career start, a 6-4 A's win in Oakland August 15, 2008...in that first start, allowed three runs in the first inning on a solo home run by Pierzynski, a RBI double by Dye and a sacrifice fly by Konerko...blanked the White Sox on three hits, a walk and a hit batter over his final six innings and left trailing, 3-2...the A's scored twice in the eighth and ninth for the win.

Gio Gonzalez (9-6, 3.64 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 22nd start of the season... is 5-0 with a 1.99 ERA in day games this year, the second lowest day ERA among AL starters...earned a no decision in his last start Tuesday in Texas (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so), a 3-1, 10-inning loss... is 0-2 with a 14.05 ERA (13 er, 8.1 ip) in two career starts vs. CHI, both in Oakland (13-1 loss Aug. 17, 2008 and 8-1 loss Aug. 15, 2009).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

14-17, 3.88 ERA (297 ip, 282 h, 140 r, 128 er, 127 bb, 262 so, 38 hr) Save/Save Opportunities: 25/33 (75.8%)

The A's bullpen has allowed one run or less in 25 of the past 30 games and has a 2.73 ERA (24 er in 79 ip) over that span...has posted a 2.34 ERA in 22 games in July (61.2 ip, 49 h, 19 r, 16 er, 24 bb, 56 so)...tied for second in the American League in losses (17), ranks third in home runs allowed (38) and strikeouts (262), is sixth in innings pitched (297) and tied for sixth in wins (14)...has 33 save opportunities this season, which is the third fewest in the AL...has a 2.82 ERA (48 er in 153.1 ip) at home compared to a 5.00 ERA (80 er in 144 ip) on the road.

- Placed on the 15-day DL yesterday with a right intercostal strain, retroactive to July 21.
- Earned his 45th career save July 17, which moved him past Billy Koch and Keith Foulke for seventh place on the Oakland career list...now has 46 saves.
- Has not allowed a run in 13 of his past 15 appearances (1.10 ERA, 2 er in 16.1 ip)...has a 1.56 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest among American League relievers.
- Has a 1.17 ERA (3 er in 23.0 ip) in Oakland and a 2.08 ERA (4 er in 17.1 ip) on the road.
- Has yielded a .154 (6 for 39) batting average with runners in scoring position.
- Is 1-0 with a save in three career outings against the White Sox (3.2 ip, 1 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 4 so).
- Was named to his second consecutive American League All-Star team and appeared in the game for the first time...entered the game in the seventh inning with a runner on second and two outs...walked Furcal but then struck out Phillips to end the inning.
- Made the jump from Double-A to the majors in 2009 and was named American League Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA...set an Oakland rookie record with 26 saves, which tied for the sixth highest save total by a rookie in AL history...ranked third among AL relievers in ERA (1.84).
