ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their season high six-game losing streak with yesterday's 8-1 win...need to win each of the remaining three games to avoid posting their fourth consecutive losing season...have four or more consecutive losing seasons just twice in Oakland history (6, 1993-98 and 5, 1982-86)...however, will finish with their best record since 2006 when they won the American League West with a 93-69 mark...were swept by the Angels to start the week, which dropped the A's into third place in the West for the first time since August 17...however, following yesterday's win and the Angels 3-2 loss at Texas, have moved back into a second place tie...trail Texas by a season high tying 11 games for the second consecutive day and for the third time this season (also June 25)...have been exactly .500 21 times since the All-Star Break and 32 times this year, which is an on-going Athletics record...are 24-27 in the first game of a series, 24-26 in the second game and 27-21 in the third game...have a 43-54 record against opponents that were at or above .500 when the A's played them and 35-27 against teams that were below .500...have 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 72 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 59 days in third and one day in fourth.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.46 ERA (38 er in 62.2 ip) and allowed a .310 (81 for 261) opponents batting average over the past seven games (1-6)...have a 3.27 ERA (223 er in 614.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.85 ERA before the break...the A's post-break ERA is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (San Francisco, 3.20)...have a 3.59 ERA for the season (561 er in 1404.2 ip), which is the **lowest in the AL** and fourth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in shutouts (16), opponents slugging percentage (.380) and pickoffs (26), rank second in opponents batting average (.245) and third in opponents on-base percentage (.313)...the 16 shutouts are the second best total by an A's team over the last 20 years (had 19 in 2002) and tied for the third best total in the designated hitter ERA (since 1974).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-3 with a 4.40 ERA (21 er in 43.0 ip) and .291 (51 for 175) opponents batting over the last seven games...however, are 38-31 with a 3.19 ERA (192 er in 541.2 ip) over the last 85 games (since June 25) after going 23-27 with a 3.92 ERA over the first 74 contests...have a 3.51 ERA (380 er in 973.0 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest mark in the AL and second lowest in the majors** (San Francisco, 3.50)...since 1992[S1], the only American League team to have an ERA under 3.62 is the 2002 Boston Red Sox (3.53)...starters also have the lowest opponents batting average (.243) and slugging percentage (.374) in the AL and the second lowest on-base percentage (.308).

ON THE BASES: The A's stole two bases yesterday and now have 153 stolen bases for the season, which is the ninth best single season total in Oakland history...it is the most since the 1989 club stole 157 bases, which ranks eighth on the single season charts...rank third in the American League and the majors in steals and top the AL in stolen base percentage (80.5%)...the percentage is second [S2]best in Oakland history (80.7%)...lead the majors with 36 stolen bases in September and 88 since the All-Star Break...the last time the A's stole at least 36 bases in any month was in May, 1992 (39)...the post-break steals are the most by an A's team since 1989 (90)...have a record of 56-30 when stealing at least one base and are 22-51 with no stolen bases.

STOLEN BASE TRIOS: Rajai Davis (48), Coco Crisp (32) and Cliff Pennington (28) have combined for 108 of the A's 153 stolen bases...those are the most steals by three Oakland teammates since 1983 when Rickey Henderson (108), Mike Davis (32) and Bill Almon (26) combined for 166...have two players with 30 or more stolen bases for the first time since 1995 and three with 20 or more steals for the first time since 1992...the only time in Oakland history the A's had more than two players steal 30 bases was in 1976 when they had six[S3].

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on the final road trip of the season against Los Angeles (0-3) and Seattle (1-0)...went 3-3 on the last road trip and have lost 20 of their last 30 road games...are 31-47 (.397) on the road and have clinched a losing road record for the fourth consecutive season...the A's need to win two of the final three games to avoid finishing with their worst road record since 1997 (30-51)...went 3-4 on the final homestand against Chicago (2-1) and Texas (1-3) and finished the season 47-34 (.580) at home...that was the A's best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006...posted a 3.02 ERA at home and have a 4.23 ERA (314 er in 668.2 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the majors (San Diego, 2.92)...the home ERA was the lowest by an AL team since the 1992 Milwaukee Brewers posted a 2.74 ERA...allowed 62 home runs at home, which is tied for second fewest in the AL, and 90 on the road, which is tied for third most.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 34-21 (.618) record during the day compared to 44-60 (.423) at night...the day record is third best in the AL and the night record is fourth worst...have a 3.03 ERA (165 er in 490.1 ip) during the day and a 3.90 ERA (396 er in 914.1 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit two home runs yesterday and now have 102 for the season, which ranks third fewest in Oakland history...the fourth lowest total is 104, which came in the strike-shortened 1981 season...the fourth lowest in a non-strike season is 108 in 1979...the 102 home runs are the second fewest in the majors (Seattle 100)...since 1993, the only American League team to finish with fewer than 105 home runs in a non-strike season is the 2007 Kansas City Royals (102).

OFFENSE: The A's have the second fewest extra base hits in the American League (404), the second lowest slugging percentage (.376) and batting average with runners in scoring position (.241) and the fourth fewest runs scored (645)...over the last 28 years, the only time the A's have scored fewer than 700 runs in a non-strike season was in 2008 (646)...have 518 walks and have not walked fewer than 527 times in a non-strike season since 1985 when they had 508...have 30 triples, which are the most by an A's team since 1987 (33).

ELIMINATED: The A's were officially eliminated from the American League West Saturday in game 154 after being eliminated from the Wild Card on September 18 in game 147...this is the seventh time in Oakland history the A's were eliminated in game 154 or later, most recently in 2005 when they were eliminated in game 157.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 23 times, which is second most in Oakland history (25 in 2008)...have used the DL 87 times since the start of the 2007 season and the only team that has used the DL more over that span is Texas [S4](98)...the 23 players have combined to miss an Oakland record 1371 games (59.6 games per stint)...the previous mark was 1259 in 2007...currently have nine players on the DL [S5]and have had at least five players on the DL all year[S6].

A's vs. MARINERS

The A's have clinched the season series, leading 10-6 with three games to play...had lost the season series in two of the previous three seasons and are 30-43 (.411) against the Mariners since 2007, which is the **lowest winning percentage** by any American League team over that span...have lost 16 of the last 20 games at Safeco Field but have won nine of the last 11 contests in Oakland... all-time, the A's are 280-207 (.575) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .577)...are 158-88 in Oakland and 122-119 in Seattle.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1931 Lefty Grove defeats St. Louis 6-2 in the first game of the World Series...In 1983 the A's use a club record 22 players in a 7-3 loss to Kansas City in the second game of a doubleheader...Oakland uses six pitchers including five (Jeff Jones, Tom Underwood, Dave Beard, Curt Young and Keith Atherton) in the ninth inning when the Royals scored four times to break a 3-3 tie...in 2000 Tim Hudson combines with Jason Istringhausen on a six-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Texas in the final game of the season...it is Hudson's 20th win of the season and it clinches the A's 11th AL West Championship.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 30th start of the season...the A's are 20-9 (.690) in his starting assignments this year and are 36-25 (.590) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 22 of his 29 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 18 times and walked two batters or fewer 19 times.

WINS: Is tied for fifth in the American League with 17 wins...those are the most wins by an A's pitcher since Mark Mulder won 17 in 2004...the last time the A's had a pitcher win more than 17 games was in 2002 when Barry Zito won 23 and Mulder had 19...all of the wins have come since the start of May and in the majors, only Jon Lester (18) has more wins since May 1...his 17 wins match the most ever by an Oakland pitcher who did not win a game in April (Vida Blue, 1974)...the last Athletic to win more than 17 games without recording a win in April is Bobby Shantz, who had 18 for Philadelphia in 1951.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in opponents batting average (.220), is tied for third in opponents grounded into double plays (25), is fourth in on-base percentage (.287), fifth in ERA (3.08), sixth in opponents slugging (.336) and tied for seventh in winning percentage (.680).

LAST SIX STARTS: Is 3-3 with a 6.09 ERA (23 er in 34.0 ip) and .294 (40 for 136) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 6-2 with a 1.46 ERA and .194 opponents batting average over his previous nine starts.

IN THE DAYS OF MY YOUTH: The 22-year old has 17 wins, making him one of four American League pitchers since 1986 to win 17 games at the age of 22 years old or younger (CC Sabathia, CLE in 2001; Dave Fleming, SEA in 1992; Tom Gordon, KC in 1989)...the last to win more than 17 is Bret Saberhagen, who went 20-6 for Kansas City as a 21-year old in 1985...the wins are tied for sixth most in Athletics history by a 22-year old or younger and are second best since 1915 to Vida Blue, who had 24 wins as a 21-year old in 1971...his 27 career wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 23rd birthday (Blue, 30)...is just the second pitcher in Oakland history to win at least 10 games in each of the first two seasons of his career (Tim Hudson, 1999-2000) and the eighth in franchise history...has a 3.08 ERA...the last time an American League pitcher 22 years old or younger qualified for the ERA title and finished the season with an ERA under 3.29 was in 1990 when Kevin Appier had a 2.76 ERA at the age of 22.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 6-2 with a 1.99 ERA (13 er in 58.2 ip) in nine starts against American League West teams and 11-6 with a 3.57 ERA in 20 starts against everyone else...is now 10-6 with 2.53 ERA (35 er in 124.2 ip) in 20 career starts against divisional foes and 17-15 with a 4.51 ERA against the rest of baseball.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 11-3 with a 2.18 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in 15 starts at home and is 6-5 with a 4.17 ERA (40 er in 86.1 ip) and .230 (72 for 313) opponents average in 14 starts on the road...is tied for second in the American League in home wins, ranks fifth in ERA and sixth in opponents batting average...his wins were the most in the Coliseum by an A's pitcher since Barry Zito also had 11 in 2002.

NIGHT AND DAY: Went 6-2 with a 2.20 ERA in nine starts during the day and is 11-6 with a 3.47 (51 er in 132.1 ip) in 20 starts at night...ranks **fourth** in the American League in day ERA...

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held right-handed hitters to a .198 (60 for 303) batting average, which is the **lowest** mark in the American League...opponents are batting .210 (39 for 186) with nine walks (.246 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is **third** lowest in the AL and the batting average is **eighth** lowest...has yielded a .185 (43 for 232) batting average the first time through the lineup, which is **fourth** lowest in the AL.

THE FIRST INNING: Has a 1.55 ERA (5 er in 29.0 ip) and .186 (18 for 97) opponents batting average in the first inning this year and has a 2.07 ERA (14 er in 61.0 ip) in the first in his career...allowed a first inning run July 1 at Baltimore, snapping a 15-start stretch dating back to last year where he did not allow a run in the first inning.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 16-9 loss to Texas last Sunday in Oakland...allowed seven runs on a career high 12 hits in just 4.0 innings...allowed at least one run in all four innings...the Rangers scored once in the first on a Francouer RBI single, twice in the second, three times in the third highlighted by a two-run home run by Moreland, and once in the fourth on a Francouer home run.

CAHILL vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-3 with a 3.80 ERA (23.2 ip, 23 h, 11 r, 10 er, 9 bb, 10 so, 3 hr) in four career starts, all last year...was 0-1 with a 5.91 ERA (7 er in 10.2 ip) in two starts in Seattle and 0-2 with a 2.08 ERA (3 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland...the first loss came in a 1-0 loss in Oakland on April 12...no-hit the Mariners over the first 6.1 innings before Beltre singled with one out in the seventh...he scored on a Beltre RBI double for the only run of the game...then had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle on May 2...allowed a leadoff home run to Branyan in the second inning, but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...left with the score tied at 1-1...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Seattle May 27 in Oakland...allowed a run in the second and a two-run home run to Branyan in the sixth inning...lost a 6-4 decision in Seattle on September 29...allowed a run to score on a ground out in the second but then allowed five runs in the fifth inning, including a three-run home run to Griffey.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (6-6, 2.91 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season, his 13th since being reinstated from the disabled list July 30...is 3-0 with a 2.36 ERA (9 er in 34.1 ip) over his last five starts, which is one short of the longest winning streak of his career...won four straight from September 5-24, 2009...is 4-3 with a 2.10 ERA (55.2 ip, 56 h, 16 r, 13 er, 13 bb, 46 so, 5 hr) in nine career starts against Seattle...that includes 0-2 with a 1.08 ERA (3 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts at Safeco Field and 4-1 with a 2.93 ERA (10 er in 30.2 ip) in five starts in Oakland...is 2-1 with a 0.68 ERA (26.2 ip, 18 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 21 so) in four starts this year.
