A's vs. MARINERS

The A's drop to 1-4 against the Mariners this season...they won the season series last year 13-6, with the 13 wins equaling their second most ever against Seattle, trailing only the 17-2 mark in 2006...were 7-2 in Oakland and 6-4 in Seattle last year...each team has two season series wins over the previous four years and the A's are 34-47 (.420) against Seattle since 2007...that is the **lowest winning percentage** by any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 284-211 (.574) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .577)...are 159-90 in Oakland and 125-121 in Seattle.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Daric Barton is a .317 (53 for 167) career hitter against the Mariners with four home runs and 25 RBI...the average and RBI are his best against any team.

David DeJesus has a 258-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders...his last error came on Sept. 15, 2008.

Mark Ellis has 200 career doubles, and is one double away from tying Carney Lansford for eighth most in Oakland history.

Brian Fuentes has recorded five saves this season, which is tied for third most in the American League.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1978** the A's record their second consecutive shutout as John Henry Johnson tosses a six-hit shutout against the Mariners at Seattle in the A's 5-0 win...in **1985** the A's and the Angels combine for 10 home runs, but the A's come out on top 14-9...Mike Davis hits his sixth home run in the first A's first 14 games...in **1988** Dave Stewart goes the distance in the A's 3-2, 10 inning win at Chicago to improve to 5-0...Stewart would go on to win his first eight decisions.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost three straight games and five of their last eight games...are 2-5 in the first game of a series, 5-1 in the last game and 4-9 in all other games...have had their last nine losses decided by a combined 19 runs...have spent each of the last 11 days in third place and 15 days in third overall...have also spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and four days in fourth place.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starters have combined for a 1.56 ERA (9 er in 52.0 ip) over their past eight games and are now 7-5 with a 2.28 ERA (33 er in 130.1 ip) this season...the ERA ranks **first in the Major Leagues** among starting pitchers (LAA, 3.01)...also lead the majors in innings pitched (130.1) and rank second in strikeouts (106)...have not allowed a run in five of their 19 games this season and have allowed three earned runs or less 15 times...have allowed eight home runs this season, which is tied for third fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have compiled a 2.60 ERA (52 er in 179.2 ip), which is the **best in the majors**...also rank fourth in the majors in opponents batting average (.225)...have recorded 150 strikeouts, which ranks fourth in the American League and 10th in the majors.

ON THE BASES: A's pitchers lead the majors with eight pickoffs (Anderson 4, Breslow 3, McCarthy 1)...last year the A's topped the majors with 27 pitcher pickoffs...opponents have been successful in 11 of 16 (68.8%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...the offense has been successful in 14 of 18 (77.8%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the fifth best percentage in the AL...last season, the A's stole 156 bases, which ranked third in the AL and the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout in each of the last two games, the first back-to-back shutouts for the A's since May 13-14, 2008 at Cleveland...are .236 (159 for 673) on the season and the average is the sixth lowest in the American League...their eight home runs are tied for the fewest in the majors, but their 41 doubles are the tied for the third most in the majors...are hitting .201 (36 for 179) with runners in scoring position, the third lowest average in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 11 errors in their past 10 games after going six consecutive games without an error...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...their 20 errors total are the second most in the majors (Houston 21)...last season, the A's were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's dropped their fourth one-run game of the season Thursday night, and are 3-4 in one run games this year...10 of the A's 20 games this season have been decided by two runs or less, and the A's are 4-6 in those games...are 2-3 in extra-inning games...the A's and White Sox played extra innings in each game of their three-game series in Chicago from April 11-13...the last time the A's played extra innings in each game of a three-game series was June 17-19, 1988 against Texas in Oakland.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this seven game road trip through Seattle (0-2) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Boston (1-1)...are 4-5 at home and 5-6 on the road...went 47-34 (.580) at home last season, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006, compared to 34-47 on the road.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 5-2 in day games and 4-9 at night...the day record is tied for fourth best in the majors and the night record is the fourth worst...have a 2.14 ERA (15 er in 63.0 ip) during the day, which ranks second lowest in the majors, and a 2.70 ERA (35 er in 116.2 ip) in night games...last year, they went 35-21 (.625) during day games and 46-60 (.434) at night...the day record was the second best in the American League and the night record was fourth worst.

STARTING LINEUPS: The A's have used a different starting lineup in each of their past 11 games and have now used 14 different lineups this season...the only lineup they have used more than one time this year is their Opening Day lineup (Crisp, Barton, DeJesus, Willingham, Matsui, Suzuki, Ellis, Kouzmanoff, Pennington), which they have used six times this season.

LOCKED UP: Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...13 players return from last year's Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Ross, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis was on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...five other players on the current roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy)...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's now have five players on the disabled list after placing Braden (stiff left shoulder) on the 15-day DL April 18, retroactive to April 17...placed Wuertz (left hamstring strain) on the 15-day DL April 6, retroactive to April 2...began the season with three players on the disabled list (Bailey, Harden, Rosales)...Rosales was placed on the 60-day DL retroactive to March 22 with a fractured right foot...Bailey (strained right forearm) and Harden (strained right shoulder) were placed on the 15-day DL retroactive to March 22...Harden was then transferred on the 60-day DL April 18...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...have now used the DL 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to [Texas](#) (103)...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season (one).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...the A's are 2-2 in his starting assignments this year and are 39-27 (.591) in his career...has tossed at least eight innings in two of his four starts this year, allowed one run or fewer three times and has not walked a batter two times.

WINS: Has won 20 games since May 1, 2010, which is tied for the most wins in the Major Leagues over that span (Lester, BOS)...has won 30 games in his career, which is the second most wins in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (Blue, 42).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held opponents to a .177 (17 for 96) batting average, which ranks fifth lowest in the American League...that includes .151 (8 for 53) against right-handed hitters, sixth lowest in the AL, and .209 (9 for 43) against left-handers.

STRIKEOUTS: Has recorded 27 strikeouts this season, which is tied for seventh most in the American League...is striking out an average of 9.59 batters per nine innings, which is second best in the AL...in comparison, he averaged 5.40 strikeouts per nine innings last season.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day in Oakland...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings (Ted Lilly, 9 so in 4.2 ip on July 2, 2003 vs. Seattle and Tim Conroy, 9 so in 4.2 ip on June 17, 1984 vs. Chicago)...walked Suzuki to start the game but then retired each of the next eight batters he faced...walked Cust with the bases loaded in the third inning to make the score 2-1 and was relieved by Blevins with two outs in the fifth inning and runners on first and second...Blevins got the final out but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning for the blown save...it was the first time in his 63 career starts the A's bullpen blew a save.

SECOND START: Earned his first win of the season in a 2-1 victory over Toronto April 7, allowing one run on three hits in eight innings...he had seven strikeouts and walked none, the seventh time in his career he has not walked a batter...gave up a leadoff single to Hill in the second inning and then retired the next 12 batters he faced before Arencibia doubled to start the sixth...Arencibia later scored on a Nix single...was replaced by Fuentes to start the ninth after throwing 68 of 105 pitches for strikes.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Chicago April 12...surrendered all four of his runs in the second inning...Ramirez hit a three-run home run, then Konerko later drove in Pierre by grounding to a force out...retired the side in order in the third and fourth innings before allowing a single to Dunn to lead off the fifth...was relieved by Breslow with two outs after Rios reached on an error...Breslow got Pierzynski to fly out to left to end the inning.

LAST START: Earned the win in a 5-1 win over Detroit Sunday in Oakland...recorded a season-high nine strikeouts and did not walk a batter for the eighth time in his career...allowed his only run when Wells led off the sixth inning with a home run...was replaced by Ross to start the ninth inning after throwing 80 of his 112 pitches for strikes.

CAHILL vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-3 with a 2.80 ERA (35.1 ip, 32 h, 12 r, 11 er, 15 bb, 24 so, 3 hr) in six career starts...is 1-1 with a 3.57 ERA (7 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts in Seattle and 0-2 with a 2.04 ERA (4 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland...had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day in Oakland, allowing one run in 4.2 innings while recording eight strikeouts...his only win against Seattle came in his only start in 2010 when he combined with Rodriguez and Wolf on a six-hit shutout in a 9-0 win October 1...yielded five of the hits and walked two...allowed just two base runners as far as third...went 0-3 with a 3.80 ERA in four starts in 2009...including April 12 when no-hit the Mariners over the first 6.1 innings before Beltre singled with one out in the seventh...ended up taking the loss in a 1-0 decision.

AGAINST THE WEST: Went 7-2 with a 1.78 ERA in 10 starts against AL West competition last season and was 11-6 with a 3.57 ERA in 20 starts against all other teams...is 11-6 with a 2.38 ERA (36 er in 136.1 ip) in 22 career starts against the West, 19-15 with a 4.36 ERA (128 er in 264.1 ip) against everyone else.

OPENING DAY STARTERS: Made his first career Opening Day start against Seattle...became the sixth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last six years (Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...only two pitchers in Oakland history have been younger – Vida Blue at the age of 21 years, 251 days in 1971 and Catfish Hunter at the age of 22 years, 2 days in 1968.

2010 RECAP: Began the season on the disabled list and was optioned to Sacramento before returning to Oakland April 30 to lead the A's with 18 wins...posted an 18-8 record in 30 starts with a team-leading 2.9 ERA...his wins were the most by an Athletic over the last eight years...all of his wins came after May 1 and he had the most wins in Oakland history by a pitcher who did not win a game in April...the last Athletics pitcher to win as many as 18 games without winning one in April was Bobby Shantz, who had 18 for the Philadelphia A's in 1951...matched Jon Lester (BOS) and CC Sabathia (NYY) for most wins in the majors beginning May 1...went 1-2 with a 4.37 ERA over his first four starts, 13-3 with a 2.10 ERA over a 19-start stretch from May 21 to Aug. 25 and 4-3 with a 5.05 ERA over his last seven starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranked third in the American League in opponents batting average (.220), fourth in ERA (2.97) and opponents on-base percentage (.287), tied for fourth in wins (18), tied for fifth in winning percentage (.692) and sixth in opponents slugging (.332)...also tied for second in grounded into double plays (27), tied for third in shutouts (1) and tied for sixth in pickoffs (5).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (1-1, 1.63): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...his 1.63 ERA is the third lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the Major Leagues among starting pitchers...in his last start, earned his first win of the season in the A's 5-0 victory over Boston on Tuesday (8.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 8 so)...allowed only four hits and one walk while recording a season-high eight strikeouts...gave up one hit over the first seven innings and then allowed three hits in the eighth...is 5-3 with a 1.97 ERA (68.2 ip, 65 h, 19 r, 15 er, 15 bb, 57 so, 5 hr) in 11 career starts against Seattle...that includes 1-2 with a 1.13 ERA (4 er in 32.0 ip) in five starts at Safeco Field and 4-1 with a 2.70 ERA (11 er in 36.2 ip) in six starts in Oakland.

The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 12 of the last 17 games and has a 2.79 ERA (13 er in 42.0 ip) over that span after allowing three earned runs in each of the first two games of the season...the 3.47 ERA ranks fifth among American League relief corps...has been charged with six of the team's 11 losses, which are the most losses by relievers in the majors...have converted five of eight (62.5%) save opportunities, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...the three blown saves are tied for third most in the AL...rank sixth in the majors in opponents batting average (.206) and 10th in on-base percentage (.307)...last year, compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the AL...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities, which was third best in the AL.
