THE TWINS: The Twins have won two consecutive games coming off a nine-game losing-streak...the Twins are 2-1 on this three-city, seven-game road trip after splitting in Seattle and winning the first game in Oakland last night...today, the Twins will play the second game of a two-game series at Oakland...they conclude the trip as interleague play begins, with a three-game series against the Diamondbacks in Arizona (May 20-22), before returning to Target Field for a six-game homestand with three vs. Seattle (May 23-25) and three vs. the Angles (May 27-29)...the Twins are 4-11 at home and 10-16 on the road this season.

PAVANO SHARP, PLOUFFE ADDS OFFENSE: The Twins beat the Athletics 4-3 in 10 innings last night...Carl Pavano was the starter but did not factor in the decision, allowing three runs (one earned) on six hits in 7.0 innings...he did not walk a batter and recorded two strikeouts...Glen Perkins tossed 1.1 scoreless innings, allowing one hit with two strikeouts...Joe Nathan (1-1) recorded the win, allowing one hit with one walk and one strikeout in 0.2 inning...Matt Capps pitched a scoreless ninth for his seventh save of the season...Trevor Plouffe was 2-for-4 with three rbi, including a go-ahead sacrifice fly in the 10th inning...Denard Span was 2-for-5 with a double...Justin Morneau was 2-for-4 with an rbi...the Twins had 10 hits and went 2-for-5 with runners in scoring position.

EXTRA-EXTRA - READ ALL ABOUT IT!: The Twins played their sixth extra-inning game last night and won 4-3 in 10 innings...they are now 3-3 this season in extra-inning games...last season the Twins went 9-5 in extra-inning games and in 2009 they went 7-7...since the start of the 1961 season the Twins have an All-Time extra inning -7...since the start of the 1961 season, the Twins have an All-Time extra-inning record of 365-333-2...Twins Manager Ron Gardenhire has a career-record of 88-60, a .595 winning percentage, in extra-innings (he was hired in 2002).

TWINS VS. THE A's: In 14 games since September of 2009, the Twins have posted a record of 9-5 against the Athletics...in that span, the pitching staff has posted a 2.32 ERA (128.0 ip, 33 er) with seven home runs allowed, 39 walks and 80 strikeouts...Minnesota won their last series at the Coliseum, June 4-6, 2010...lastly, they are 8-6 in their last 14 games at Oakland (since August 29, 2008), with eight of those games being decided by one run.

Individually: Danny Valencia leads all Twins batters in hitting against A's pitching with a .340 average (16-for-47) with two doubles and two home runs...Justin Morneau is batting .313 (65-for-208) with 14 doubles, 14 home runs and 43 rbi lifetime...additionally, he is batting .485 (16-for-33) with five home runs and 13 rbi in his last 10 games at Oakland.

A LOOK AT THE RUNS: The Twins have scored just 127 runs this season, the fewest in baseball (San Francisco Giants have scored the second fewest with 147 runs this season)...the Twins have scored three-or-fewer runs in 28 of their 41 games this season...the Twins have scored three runs-or-less in 11 of their 15 games in May...this season, Twins pitchers have allowed 218 runs, the second most in the Major Leagues (Houston has allowed 224)...the next closest American League team is the Kansas City Royals (205 runs allowed)...the Twins run differential of -91 is the largest in baseball, with the next closest team being the Astros at -51.

PERKINS OUT OF THE PEN: After allowing one hit and recording two strikeouts in 1.1 innings last night, Minnesota native Glen Perkins has allowed just three runs (two earned) in 22.0 innings, covering 20 appearances this season...he has walked eight and recorded 21 strikeouts...Perkins is holding opponents to a .219 batting average (16-for-73)...he is 1-1, 2.66 (74.1 ip, 22 er) in 56 career relief appearances.

CUDDYER CLOSING IN ON 1,000: Michael Cuddyer has 993 career hits, seven shy of becoming the 14th player in club history (since 1961) to have 1,000 career hits in a Twins uniform...he currently ranks 15th on the Twins all-time hits list, six behind Bob Alison (999)...he is also 9th in club history in doubles (214), 10th in rbi (519), 11th in home runs (125), 13th in at-bats (3,685) and runs (548), and 14th in games (1038) and walks (376).

TARGET FIELD WINS AWARD: Target Field was named the Sports Facility of the Year for 2010 by the SportsBusiness Journal/SportsBusiness Daily...the Sports Facility of the Year Award is given to new, renovated or established sports facilities in North America whose primary function is hosting and staging sporting events...Target Field beat out Amway Arena (Orlando Magic), Arrowhead Stadium (Kansas City Chiefs), Consol Energy Center (Pittsburgh Pirates), New Meadowlands Stadium (New York Giants/Jets) and Red Bull Arena (New York Red Bulls)...launched in 2008, the Sports Business Awards were established by SportsBusiness Journal and SportsBusiness Daily to celebrate and recognize the leaders, visionaries, and day-to-day practictioners who personify excellence

LAST START: Did not factor into the decision in the Twins 9-3 11-inning defeat, opposite Jo-Jo Reyes...made his 100th career start...set a career-high with eight strikeouts, passing his previous high of seven, done twice previously in his career...also set a season-high with 7.2 innings, his most since September 11, 2010 at Cleveland when he tossed 8.0 innings...the game remained tied at three until the Jays posted a six-run 11th inning...Blackburn tossed a season-high 110 pitches, 70 for strikes.

TWO STARTS AGO ...: Did not factor into the decision in the Twins' 2-1 10-inning defeat, May 9 at Boston opposite Josh Beckett...pitched the final game of a four-game series at Fenway Park...lost to the Red Sox for the first time in his career (2-1)...his only run allowed came in the fifth inning on an Adrian Gonzalez rbi-single...Twins eventually lost on a Carl Crawford double to left field off Jim Hoey...Blackburn threw 109

ROUGH ROAD: He is 12-27, 5.19 (322.1 ip, 186 er) in 58 career road games (54 starts)...his last road start was a no-decision, May 9 at Boston (see note above)...he won his last road decision, May 4 at Chicago and is looking to win two straight road decisions for the first time since May 21-31, 2009 when he won at Chicago and Tampa Bay in consecutive starts...Twins are 18-36 All-Time in his road starts.

» Comparatively, he is 22-13, 3.62 (298.0 ip, 120 er) in 50 career home games (46 starts).

TAKING OFFENSE: His 2.59 run support average ranks eighth-lowest in baseball and fourth-lowest in the American League...he has been supported with 14 runs in 48.2 innings pitched...he has left the game with three-or-fewer runs of support in seven of his eight starts and has left with zero runs in three starts.

TWIN KILLINGS: He induced 21 ground ball double plays last season and five this season...he recorded at least one GIDP in 19 of 26 starts in 2010 going 10-5 in those games...his 71 ground ball double plays since the start of 2008 are tied for third-most in the American League with Fausto Carmona and behind Mark Buehrle (90) and Felix Hernandez (79).

» His 31 GIDP's induced in 2008 are the third-most for a single season in baseball since 2008, behind Mark Buehrle's 34 in 2008 and Tim Hudson's 32 in 2010.

WHAT AN A-MAY-ZING MONTH: Last season, Blackburn posted a record of 5-0, 2.65 (37.1 ip, 11 er) with one complete game in five starts during May...he was one of four pitchers in baseball to win five games without a loss, joining Jon Lester, Shaun Marcum and Carlos Silva.

- » With the victory over the White Sox, May 4 of this season, he has now won nine consecutive decisions in the month of May with his last May loss coming on May 5, 2009 at Detroit (he won his final three May starts in 2009).
- » His nine wins in May since the start of 2009 are tied for fourth-most in baseball...his .900 winning
- percentage (9-1) is the highest in baseball.

 » He is 11-3, 2.78 (129.1 ip, 40 er) in 19 career starts in May.

MISC. BLACKBURN:

- His 58 quality starts are 13th-most in the American League since the start of 2008.
- » His 2.04 walks-per-9.0 innings pitched ranks sixth in the American League since 2008...Kevin Slowey ranks third (1.48) and Carl Pavano ranks fourth (1.77)...others on that list include: Cliff Lee (first at 1.30), Roy Halladay (second at 1.37) and James Shields (fifth at 2.00).

2010 QUICK HITS: Went 10-12, 5.42 (161.0 ip, 97 er) in 28 games (26 starts).

- Started the season as the Twins number two starter and tied his career-high with four walks, April 6 vs. Los Angeles (AL).
- Pitched his first complete game of the season (fourth career) May 4 vs. Detroit, allowing 3 runs on 11 hits as the Twins beat the Tigers, 4-3.

 Blackburn finished the month of May going 5-0, 2.65 (37.1 ip, 11 er) with one complete game in five
- starts...he went 7.0-plus in each start during the month...he was one of four pitchers in baseball to win five games without a loss, joining Jon Lester, Shaun Marcum and Carlos Silva.
- Won a career-high five straight games from May 4 through May 27, posting quality starts in each outing.
 Beat the Yankees twice, helping snap the Twins 10-game losing streak at Yankee Stadium on May 16
- and earning the win at home on May 27, went 2-0, 3.21 (14.0 ip, 5 er) in two starts vs. the Yankees. According to Elias Sports Bureau, Blackburn went 101.2 innings without allowing a stolen base until the leadoff hitter, Shane Victorino, stole second base to start the game on June 18 at Philadelphia... prior to Victorino's stolen base, the last time a runner was credited with a steal off Blackburn was Rajai . Davis, September 11, 2009.
- » Was optioned to Triple-A Rochester July 30 to clear a roster spot for Matt Capps...in four starts with the Red Wings he went 1-0, 2.49 (21.2 ip, 6 er)...pitched five scoreless innings, August 13 in the Red Wings 2-0 shutout win over the Gwinnett Braves...he held Triple-A opponents to a .229 batting average (19-for-83). Went 3-5, 3.16 (57.0 ip, 20 er) with 13 walks, 33 strikeouts and an opponent batting average of .221
- (46-for-208) in nine games (eight starts) since returning from Rochester...prior to his stint with the Red Wings, he went 1-6, 10.05 (43.0 ip, 48 er) in 10 games (nine starts) for the Twins since June 1.

 Pitched 8.2 shutout innings with two hits allowed, August 28 at Seattle...relieved by Brian Fuentes who struck out the game's final batter with Chone Figgins on first.
- » His five stolen bases allowed last season were tied for 10th-fewest amongst American League pitchers with a minimum of 150.0 innings pitched.
- Pitched 7.0-plus innings five times in his final six starts.
 Posted 14 quality starts, which ranked third on the staff despite making only 26 starts.
- » His final start of 2010 marked his 100th career appearance
