ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their losing streak to a season-high four games yesterday...have also lost seven of the last 10 games and are 22-24 overall...that marks the first time the A's have been two games under .500 since April 26 (11-13)...have been between two games over and two games under .500 every day since April 9...have been exactly .500 a total of 13 times...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times...despite the four-game losing streak, the A's have lost just one game in the American League West standings...are in third place, one game behind Texas...were in a tie for first on May 17, marking the first time the A's were in first since June 3 of last year...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, two days tied for third and four days in fourth...began the season without a sweep or being swept in the first 13 series, an Oakland record to start the season...then swept a two-game series from Los Angeles to start the week before being swept by Minnesota in a two-game series on Wednesday and Thursday.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 9-4 (.692) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is tied for the second best record in the American League...are 13-20 (.394) against right-handed starters...have an 11-7 (.611) record in day games and are 11-17 (.393) at night...have the third best day record in the AL and the second worst mark at night (Minnesota, 8-16)...are 6-10 in the first game of a series and 10-5 in the last game.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have lost each of their first two games of the 15th season of interleague play, which begins with this three-game series against San Francisco...also host the Giants June 17-19 before traveling to New York (June 21-23) and Philadelphia (June 24-26)...conclude play against the National League with a pair of three-game series against Florida (June 28-30) and Arizona (July 1-3)...went 8-10 (.444) in interleague play last year, their second consecutive season with a losing record...it was just the fourth time in 14 seasons the A's finished with a losing record...are 13-25 (.342) over the last three years and 70-76 (.479) since 2003...however, are 136-114 (.544) all-time, which is the eighth best record.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0 for 3 in the first two interleague games and now have a .091 (23 for 252) average with four doubles, seven RBI, eight walks and 111 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest by an American League team over that span (Toronto, .094)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on August 22, 1971 against Boston and Odom also hit the last home run on September 4, 1972 against California.

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout yesterday for the fifth time this year, which is tied for second most in the American League...have scored just two runs over their last three games and five in the four games since tallying a season-high 14 last Thursday...have scored 165 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...also have the second lowest on-base percentage (.301) and the third lowest batting average (.234) and slugging percentage (.344)...have gone a season-high six consecutive games without a home run and have hit just one over the last nine contests...have 24 home runs for the season, which is tied with Seattle for the fewest in the majors...have the second fewest strikeouts (268).

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with a 2.85 ERA, which is more than one-half run better than the next American League team (Cleveland, 3.39)...have allowed just 25 home runs, which is tied with Seattle for the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 23)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.337) and rank third in on-base percentage (.306).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in four of the last five games and are 1-2 with a 2.16 ERA (6 er in 25.0 ip) and .193 (17 for 88) opponents batting average over that span...the A's have lost four of those five games...have a **Major League-leading** 2.70 ERA (88 er in 293.2 ip) for the season...have allowed just 16 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 18)...lead the American league in opponents slugging percentage (.337), are tied for second in complete games (3), rank third in on-base percentage (.301) and fourth in innings pitched (293.2) and strikeouts (222).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 36 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 28 unearned runs, which is the **most in the majors**...have turned 48 double plays, which is fourth most in the AL...10 of the A's 36 errors have been made by pitchers, which is the **most in the majors**.

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have played three extra inning games in the last six contests and are 5-6 in extra frames for the season...the 11 extra inning games are tied with the Angels for the most in the majors and match the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings and the other lasted 12 frames...are 5-9 in games decided in the last at bat...are 7-10 in one-run decisions...rank second in the American League in one-run losses and tied for third in one-run games...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (6)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this seven-game road trip to San Francisco (0-2) and Los Angeles (four games)...went 3-2 on the last road trip through Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 11-12 on the road for the season...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Chicago (1-2), Los Angeles (2-0) and Minnesota (0-2) and are 11-12 at home for the season...the A's are batting .218 (170 for 779) with 72 runs scored in 23 games on the road (3.13 per game) and .251 with 93 runs scored in 23 home games (4.04 per game).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (109)...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are 3-6 in this stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began May 13...all 20 games will be played in California...the stretch began with a seven-game homestand, continues with this seven-game road trip and concludes with a six-game homestand against Baltimore and New York beginning next Friday.

A's vs. GIANTS

The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2011 and now have an eight-game losing streak at AT&T Park...that is the A's longest losing streak ever in San Francisco and their longest at any road ballpark since losing eight straight at Fenway Park, May 19, 1996-July 22, 1997...have not lost more than eight straight games at a road ballpark since a nine game losing streak at Jacobs Field, May 27, 1994-June 11, 1996...the A's and Giants split the season series last year 3-3 with each team sweeping a three-game series in its home ballpark...in the previous 14 season series, the A's have won four, the Giants two and the clubs have split the season series eight times...the A's are 42-40 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 23-17 in Oakland and 19-23 in San Francisco...including 15-20 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in his last 14 games and 14.1 innings...the longest scoreless streak of his career is 14.2 innings from June 8 to July 9, 2008.

David DeJesus has not committed an error this year and now owns a 279-game errorless streak, the longest active streak among Major League outfielders.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1968** Jim Nash homers, pitches a five hit-shutout and strikes out 10 in the A's 2-0 win over Cleveland...the home run is the 5000th in the history of the A's franchise...in **1996** Geronimo Berroa hits three home runs and is 4 for 4 in the A's 5-1 win at New York...it was his first of two three-homer games that year...in **1997** George Williams, Matt Stairs and Mark McGwire deliver consecutive pinch hit singles in the A's 10-7 loss at Texas, tying the ML record for consecutive pinch hits...in **2004** Reggie Jackson becomes the third player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 9.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...the A's are 5-3 (.625) in his starting assignments this year and are 35-30 (.538) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in seven of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 3-0 with a 1.74 ERA (4 er in 20.2 ip) and .145 (10 for 69) opponents batting average in three starts in May...the winning streak is one short of his career high of four (twice, last: Aug. 24-Sept. 8, 2010)...has never won four games in one month...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average over his first five starts in April.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Picked up his fifth win of the season in his last start, which is tied for seventh in the American League...also ranks tied for sixth in strikeouts per nine innings (8.53), eighth in ERA (2.31), ninth in opponents batting (.209) and 10th in slugging (.319).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .133 (4 for 30) average with runners in scoring position and opponents are 0 for 15 with RISP and two outs...has yielded a .179 (12 for 67) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .262 (17 for 65) the second time through and .180 (9 for 50) after that.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of one run or fewer in four of his eight starts but has support of six runs or more in three of his other starts...has run support of one and zero in his two losses this year and now has 19 runs of support in his 22 career losses (105.0 ip, 1.63 RSA)...is 25-4 in 40 career starts with run support of two or more and 2-18 in 25 starts with support of one run or fewer.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Went 1-2 with a 3.16 ERA (31.1 ip, 24 h, 12 r, 11 er, 13 bb, 23 so, 4 hr) in five interleague starts last year and is 1-3 with a 3.86 ERA (15 er in 35.0 ip) in six career interleague starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 0 for 4 with three strikeouts last year, his first at bats in the majors...prior to that his only professional at bats came with Double-A Reading in the Phillies organization in 2006 and he was 2 for 16 (.125) with two RBI, a walk, seven strikeouts and four sacrifice hits.

FIRST START: Earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning before limiting the Mariners to three hits over his remaining five innings...was relieved by Blevins to start the eighth after throwing 67 of his 116 pitches for strikes.

SECOND START: Earned his second win of the season after pitching six shutout innings in a 1-0 victory in Minnesota April 9...held the Twins to four hits, all singles, while walking two and recording four strikeouts...allowed two hits over the game's first four innings before giving up a pair of singles to start the fifth inning...then got a groundout, pop out and another groundout to get out of the inning...pitched a scoreless sixth before giving way to Balfour and Fuentes, who kept the shutout intact.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to the Tigers April 14...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start as he gave up only two hits while striking out six...however, did walk six batters, which matched his career high (also Aug. 15, 2009 vs. CWS)...was replaced by Ross to start the seventh inning after throwing 103 pitches...Ross allowed one run in the seventh and two in the eighth as he went on to take the loss.

FOURTH START: Took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat to Boston April 20...recorded a season-high nine strikeouts and only walked one...however, allowed four runs on eight hits over six innings...gave up an RBI single to Crawford in the second, snapping a career high 18.0 inning scoreless streak...Youkilis homered to lead off the fourth...allowed two more runs in the sixth in the form of a Lowrie home run...gave way to Blevins to start the seventh inning.

FIFTH START: Was charged with his second loss in a row in the A's 5-0 defeat in Los Angeles April 25...allowed a season-high five runs, four earned, over five innings, his shortest start of the year...surrendered two runs in the second on a Wells single, one in the third on an Abreu double and two more in the fourth when Kendrick came in on a Crisp error and Aybar scored as Mathis hit into a double play...then threw a scoreless fifth before he was replaced by Purcey after throwing 95 pitches.

SIXTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 win over Texas May 1 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Young in the sixth inning...was relieved by Ziegler with runners on first and second and two outs in the seventh and Ziegler allowed one of those runners to score.

SEVENTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-2 win at Kansas City May 6...allowed a solo home run to Gordon in the first inning and an Aviles RBI triple in the third...those were the only two runs he would allow in his seven innings and the A's scored three times in the fifth inning for the win.

RAINED OUT: Had his last scheduled start rained out May 11 at Texas...allowed seven runs on six hits and five walks while striking out one in 2.2 innings, including a grand slam by Moreland...however, the game was halted due to rain with the Rangers leading 7-0 after the top of the fourth inning and was cancelled after a 2 hour and 14 minute delay.

LAST START: He combined with Breslow and Magnuson on a two-hit shutout in the A's 14-0 win over Los Angeles last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...retired each of the first 11 batters before walking Izturis with two outs in the fourth...surrendered his only hit when Kendrick singled to leadoff the fifth...neither base runner advanced past first base.

GONZALEZ vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Is 1-2 with a 4.24 ERA (17.0 ip, 18 h, 10 r, 8 er, 7 bb, 15 so, 3 hr) in three career starts...went 1-1 with a 2.70 ERA (4 er in 13.1 ip) in two starts last year...the win came on May 22 in Oakland when he combined with Bailey on a three-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed two hits while walking one...allowed a two-out single to Sanchez in the first and a one-out walk to Huff followed by a Torres single in the second...then retired each of the final 20 batters he faced before he was relieved by Bailey to start the ninth...the loss came in a 6-2 decision in San Francisco on June 11...the A's scored a run in the first, but he allowed a two-run home run to Burrell in the third and a two-run home run to Molina in the sixth...was relieved by Ziegler following the Molina home run with the A's trailing 4-1.

5-10, 3.23 ERA (122.2 ip, 107 h, 60 r, 44 er, 56 bb, 106 so, 9 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 11/16 (68.8%)

The A's bullpen has allowed one or more earned runs in each of its past three games and a total of 13 earned runs in 15.1 innings (7.63 ERA) over that span...however, has allowed one earned run or fewer in 25 of its past 30 games (28 er in 86.0 ip, 2.93 ERA) and now has a 3.23 ERA for the season, which is fourth best in the American League...has been charged with 10 losses, which is tied for second most by a bullpen in the AL...has 11 saves, which is tied for fourth in the AL...has five blown saves and is tied for the fourth best save percentage (68.8%) in the AL...allowed season highs in runs (10) and hits (15) Thursday after Ross left the game after facing one batter...it was the most runs allowed by an A's bullpen since it also allowed 10 runs August 25, 2007 at Tampa Bay...it was its first time allowing 15 hits in a game since surrendering 16 hits August 29, 2008 against Minnesota...also had its 23-game, 65.0-inning streak in which it did not allow a home run snapped Thursday when Purcey allowed a home run to Rivera in the second inning.

- Made a rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento on Friday and did not allow a run in one inning (0 h, 0 bb, 1 so).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
