ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a season-high five-game losing streak and have also lost eight of the last 11 games...the longest losing streak last year was six games from September 24 to 29...the losing streak has dropped the A's to a season-low-tying three games under .500 at 22-25...with the loss yesterday, the A's fell into last place in the American League West for the first time since April 6...were in a tie for first place in the West May 17, the day before the losing streak began...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, two days tied for third and five days in fourth...have been exactly .500 a total of 13 times...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times.

DURING THE LOSING STREAK: The A's are batting .191 (33 for 173) during the losing streak with one home run and nine runs scored...A's starting pitchers have posted a 2.55 ERA (7 er in 24.2 ip) and have allowed just one earned run in four of the games...the pitching staff as a whole has a 4.44 ERA (23 er in 46.2 ip) as the bullpen has allowed 17 runs in 22.0 innings (16 er, 6.55 ERA)...the A's have been outscored 25-9.

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's played their fourth extra inning game in the last seven contests yesterday are 5-7 in extra frames for the season...lead the Majors with 12 extra inning games and are tied with Los Angeles (AL) for the lead with seven losses...the 12 extra inning games are one more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11 and the season-high is 12...are 5-10 in games decided in the last at bat...seven of the A's last 10 losses have been by one run and they are 7-11 in one-run games for the season...are tied for second in the American League in one-run games and one-run losses...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (6)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run in each of the last four games and have a 2.04 ERA (4 er in 17.2 ip) and .224 (15 for 67) opponents batting average over that span...have two losses and two no decisions in those four games...this is the **first time in Oakland history** A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in four consecutive games and not picked up at least one win...have a **Major League-leading** 2.67 ERA (89 er in 300.1 ip) for the season...have allowed just 16 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors (San Francisco and Philadelphia, 19)...lead the American league in opponents slugging percentage (.339), rank third in strikeouts (230), tied for third in complete games (3) and fourth in innings pitched (300.1).

PITCHING: The A's **lead the majors** with a 2.87 ERA, which is nearly one-half run better than the next American League team (Seattle, 3.35)...have allowed just 26 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL (Seattle, 25)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.339) and rank fourth in strikeouts (337)...also top the majors with 11 pickoffs and opponents have been successful in just 21 of 40 (52.5%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors.

OFFENSE: Josh Willingham homered in the sixth inning yesterday to snap the A's homerless streak at a season-high six games...the A's have just two home runs over the last 10 games and 25 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 24)...the A's have scored just nine runs in the five games since tallying a season-high 14 last Tuesday against the Angels...have scored 169 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are 15-4 when scoring four runs or more and 7-21 when scoring fewer than four...also have the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.302) and the third lowest batting average (.235) and slugging percentage (.345)...have the second fewest strikeouts (278)...were shutout Saturday for the fifth time this year, which is tied for second most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in three consecutive games and now have 37 for the season, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 29 unearned runs, which is the **most in the majors**...10 of the A's 37 errors have been made by pitchers, which is the **most in the majors**...have turned 49 double plays, which is fourth most in the AL.

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are 3-7 in this stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began May 13...however, have outscored the opposition 40-39 over that span...all 20 games will be played in California...the stretch began with a seven-game homestand, continues with this seven-game road trip and concludes with a six-game homestand against Baltimore and New York beginning next Friday.

WINS AND LOSSES: After beginning the season with 13 consecutive series without a sweep by either team, there has been a sweep in each of the last three series...after sweeping a two-game set from Los Angeles to start last week, the A's were swept a in two-game series by Minnesota and a three-game series by San Francisco...the A's are 9-5 (.643) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are 13-20 (.394) against right-handed starters...have an 11-8 (.579) record in day games and are 11-17 (.393) at night...have the second worst mark at night in the AL (Minnesota, 8-16)...are 6-10 in the first game of a series and 10-6 in the last game.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on this seven-game road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (four games) and have now lost four straight road games...went 3-2 on the last road trip through Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 11-13 on the road for the season...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Chicago (1-2), Los Angeles (2-0) and Minnesota (0-2) and are 11-12 at home...return home following the game Thursday for a six-game homestand against Baltimore (three games) and New York (three games)...the A's are batting .221 (181 for 819) with 76 runs scored in 24 games on the road (3.17 per game) and .251 with 93 runs scored in 23 home games (4.04 per game).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (109)...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

A's vs. ANGELS

The A's lead the season series, 3-2...swept a two-game series in Oakland last week after losing two of three in Anaheim in April...lost the season series last year 8-11...it was their third consecutive season series loss and sixth in the last seven years...are 63-75 (.457) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 368-298 against the Angels...that includes 192-140 in Oakland and 176-158 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 417-375 against the Angels

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has not committed an error this year and now owns a 279-game errorless streak, the longest active streak among Major League outfielders.

Joey Devine has not allowed an earned run in his last 28 games and 28.1 innings dating back to 2008...he also has a 63-game, 62.0-inning, 248-batter homerless streak dating back to 2006.

Ryan Sweeney is a .362 (38 for 105) career hitter at Angel Stadium, which is the second best average in this ballpark among hitters with 100 at bats...has a .333 (52 for 156) average overall against Los Angeles.

Michael Wuertz has allowed a .103 opponents batting average, which is the lowest among American League relievers.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Nap Lajoie receives the American League's first ever intentional walk with the bases loaded in a game against Chicago...in **1983** it takes 17 innings and 5 hours and 17 minutes, but the A's defeat the Milwaukee Brewers 5-4 on Rickey Henderson's two out single in the 17th...Oakland leads 3-0 entering the ninth before the Brewers score four times...Davey Lopes hits his second home run of the game in the bottom of the ninth to send the game into extra innings.

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento today and is scheduled to make his first start of the season...the A's are 9-7 (.563) in his 16 career starts.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: Is making his first Major League appearance since June 19, 2009 at San Diego, a no decision in the A's 7-5 win...left the game after 1.2 innings with a strained left elbow and had "Tommy John" surgery June 30...missed the entire 2010 season as he continued to rehab from the surgery.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE WIN: His last Major League win came June 8, 2009 against Minnesota, a 4-3 A's victory...the victory extended his winning streak to a career-high four games, but he lost at San Francisco on June 13 before being injured June 19.

OUTMAN vs. LOS ANGELES: Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 6-4 loss in Oakland on September 18, 2008...allowed a RBI single to Teixeira in the first inning...was relieved by Casilla with runner on first and second and one out in the fifth inning and Casilla allowed both of those runners to score.

THIS SPRING: Began his comeback this spring by going 0-1 with a 9.82 ERA (11.0 ip, 23 h, 12 r, 12 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 2 hr) in five games, including one start...opponents hit .442 (23 for 52)...tossed a scoreless fifth and sixth inning in his first outing February 27 at Mesa against the Cubs...it was his first appearance against Major League competition since June 19, 2009 at San Diego...then allowed at least two runs in each of his final four outings...including a start March 6 at San Diego (1.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...was optioned to Sacramento March 20.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 4-1 with a 4.78 ERA and .264 opponents batting average in eight games, all starts...was tied for fourth in the Pacific Coast League in wins at the time of his promotion...issued 27 walks in 37.2 innings (6.45 per nine innings) and was tied for third in the PCL in walks...also allowed six home runs...the River Cats were 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in two of his eight starts (his last two), allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer twice.

FIRST FOUR, LAST FOUR: Went 0-1 with an 8.59 ERA and .306 opponents average over his first four starts and 4-0 with a 2.35 ERA and .232 opponents average over his final four starts...tossed fewer than five innings in each of his first four starts and five or more in each of his final four.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .264 opponents batting average broke down to .237 (14 for 59) against left-handed hitters and .282 (24 for 85) against right-handers...yielded five of his six home runs to righties...opponents hit .256 with runners in scoring position, including .188 with RISP and two outs.

THE FIRST INNING: Allowed 12 of his 24 runs in the first inning for a 12.38 ERA and .395 opponents batting average...had a 2.73 ERA and .217 opponents batting average from the second inning on...had 10 walks in the first inning and 17 after that.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 3-0 with a 3.68 ERA in four starts on the road and 1-1 with a 6.32 ERA in four starts at home.

SACRAMENTO HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in each of his first three starts, tossing fewer than 5.0 innings in each outing...walked four batters in 4.0 innings in his first start April 7 against Tacoma...tossed a season low 2.0 innings in his second start April 13 against Las Vegas...then allowed five runs on seven hits in 4.0 innings April 18 at Tacoma...had his first decision April 24 against Tucson when he allowed a season-high six runs (four earned) in 4.2 innings for the loss...then won each of his final four starts...allowed a season high eight hits in 5.0 innings at Las Vegas April 30...surrendered a season high two home runs May 6 against Colorado Springs...tossed 6.0 shutout innings at Memphis May 11 but had season-highs in walks (5) and strikeouts (6)...pitched a season-high 7.0 innings in his final start May 16 at Nashville and allowed just two hits in 7.0 innings.

MAJOR LEAGUE CAREER: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2008 as a September call-up and then went 4-1 with a 3.48 ERA in 14 games, 12 starts, in 2009 before undergoing "Tommy John" surgery in June...missed the entire 2010 season as he continued his recovery...is 5-3 with a 3.77 ERA (39 er in 93.0 ip) in 20 career appearances, including 16 starts...was originally drafted by Philadelphia in the 10th round of the 2005 draft and was dealt to the A's in the Joe Blanton trade in July of 2008.

The A's bullpen has allowed one or more earned runs in each of its past four games (16 er in 19.0 ip, 7.58 ERA) after allowing no earned runs in eight of its previous 10 games (4 er in 24.1 ip, 1.48 ERA)...ranks fifth in the American League with a 3.35 ERA overall...has now been charged with 11 losses, which is tied for the most by a bullpen in the AL...has 11 saves, which is tied for fourth in the AL...however, their six blown saves are tied for fifth most...rank fourth in the AL in opponents batting average (.239), on-base percentage (.319) and slugging (.341)...has allowed four home runs in 19.0 innings over its past four games after not allowing a home run in its previous 23 games and 63.2 innings.

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Had his 14-game, 14.1-inning scoreless streak snapped yesterday when he allowed a home run to Schierholtz in the eighth inning...the scoreless streak was 0.1 inning short of the longest of his career (14.2 innings, June 8-July 9, 2008).
- Has not allowed a run in 19 of his 22 appearances this season and has a 2.08 ERA (5 er in 21.2 ip).
- Is tied for first among AL relievers in wins (3), is fourth in strikeouts (26), tied for fourth in appearances (22) and tied for 10th in walks (11).
- Has held opponents to a .192 (15 for 78) batting average...opponents are 0 for 11 with runners in scoring position.
- Has not allowed a run in two appearances against Los Angeles this year (2.0 ip)...however, is 2-3 with a 5.71 ERA in 17 career appearances (17.1 ip, 16 h, 11 r, 11 er, 11 bb, 20 so, 2 hr).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season...the A's are 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments this year and are 43-29 (.597) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in six of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in wins (6), ranks second in ERA (1.79), third in winning percentage (.857) and eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.296)...also ranks second with seven wild pitches, which ties Henry Rodriguez' team-leading total from last year.

ONE RUN OR FEWER: Has allowed one run or fewer eight of his 10 starts this year...the two exceptions came in his two starts against Chicago when he allowed four runs each time...has a 4.63 ERA (6 er in 11.2 ip) in his two starts against the White Sox and 1.17 ERA (7 er in 53.2) in his other eight starts...had a streak of five consecutive starts with one run or fewer from April 17-May, which fell one short of the Oakland record of six.

WINS: Is 24-8 with a 2.52 ERA (72 er in 257.0 ip) and .217 (200 for 922) opponents batting average in 39 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are the most in the majors over that span...the A's are 27-12 (.692) in games started by Trevor Cahill since May 1 of last year and 64-80 (.444) with all other pitchers...is 34-22 (.607) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-0 with a 1.09 ERA (3 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts against American League West competition this year and 3-1 with a 2.93 ERA (10 er in 30.2 ip) in six starts against everyone else...now has a 14-6 record and a 2.19 ERA (38 er in 156.1 ip) in 25 career starts against AL West teams, compared to 20-16 with a 4.18 ERA (132 er in 284.1 ip) in 47 starts against everyone else.

FIRST LOSS: Was the losing pitcher May 15 against Chicago, snapping his season-opening winning streak at six games...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss snapped a seven-game winning streak dating back to October 1, 2010...the winning streak matched his career high (May 21 to July 1, 2010)...posted a 1.52 ERA and .210 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned nine starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.34 ERA (5 er in 33.2 ip) in five starts at home this year and 3-0 with a 2.27 ERA (8 er in 31.2 ip) in five starts on the road...has the fourth lowest home ERA in the AL and the fourth lowest road ERA...is now 21-11 with a 3.00 ERA (81 er in 243.1 ip) in 38 career starts in Oakland and 13-11 with a 4.06 ERA (89 er in 197.1 ip) in 34 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .111 (5 for 45) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is tied for the second lowest mark in the American League...has not allowed more than one hit with a RISP in a game this year...has held the opponents three through five hitters to a .132 (10 for 76) average...has allowed four home runs and three have been solo shots...three have been hit by the bottom three hitters in the order.

THE FIRST INNING: Allowed his first first-inning run of the season in his last start and now has a 0.90 ERA (1 er in 10.0 ip) and .152 (5 for 33) opponents batting average in the first inning this year...has a 1.35 ERA (6 er in 40.0 ip) and .174 (23 for 132) opponents batting average in the first inning over the last two years.

2011 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...earned his first win of the season in a 2-1 victory at Toronto **April 7**...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Chicago **April 12**...surrendered all four of his runs in the second inning...earned the win in a 5-1 decision over Detroit **April 17** in Oakland...allowed his only run when Wells led off the sixth inning with a home run...earned the win in the A's 9-1 victory at Seattle **April 23**...extended his season winning streak to four games in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **April 29**...walked three batters in the first inning, the fifth time in his career he walked three batters in an inning (last: July 17, 2009 vs. LAA)...improved to 5-0 with a 3-1 victory over Cleveland **May 4** in Oakland...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Hafner in the third inning...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings pitched...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9**...the Rangers scored their only run on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...held the White Sox scoreless until Ramirez homered to lead off the fourth...also allowed a Quentin sacrifice fly in the sixth inning and two unearned runs in the seventh.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at San Francisco last Friday...allowed his first first-inning run of the season when Torres waked, stole second, took third on an error and scored on a ground out...then shutout the Giants on one hit over his final five innings before being removed for a pinch hitter in the seventh inning with the scored tied at 1-1.

Was originally drafted by Toronto in the first round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft and spent parts of each of the last three seasons with the Blue Jays...went 4-9 with a 5.81 ERA in 21 games, all starts, over his first two seasons in 2008 and 2009...made 33 appearances, all in relief, in 2010 and posted 3.71 ERA...tied a Toronto rookie record with 11 strikeouts Aug. 27, 2008 at Tampa Bay...led the International League with a 2.69 ERA at Triple-A Syracuse in 2008...was named the Blue Jays fifth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2004 season and the third best in 2005.
