### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost the past four games after winning a season-high four consecutive games...are 5-5 over the last 10 games but are 5-11 over the last 16 games as the A's had a season-high six-game losing streak from May 18-23...were tied for first place May 17 but are now a season-high five games out of first and in fourth place, where the A's have spent 12 of the last 13 days...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 16 days in fourth...have been exactly .500 a total of 14 times this year...last season, were .500 an Athletics-record 33 times.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starters are 1-4 with a 8.65 ERA (25 er in 26.0 ip) and .283 (30 for 106) opponents batting average over the past five games after going 5-5 with a 2.21 ERA and .238 opponents batting average over their previous 16 games...have a **Major League-leading** 2.99 ERA (121 er in 364.1 ip) for the season...have allowed 22 home runs this season, which is the fewest in the majors...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.345), have allowed the third most walks (123) and rank fifth in innings pitched (364.1).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 5.93 ERA (29 er in 44.0 ip) over the past five games but have a 3.08 ERA for the season, which ranks **first in the American League** and second in the majors (Atlanta, 3.01)...have allowed just 34 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL...are on pace to allow 95 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest in a non-strike season is 90 in 1974...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.341), rank fourth in on-base percentage (.313) and are tied for fourth in batting average (.243)...have a Major League leading 12 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in just 36 of 59 (61.0%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...the 23 caught stealings top the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's scored six runs on 11 hits yesterday but are batting .221 (29 for 131) over the past four games after batting .286 over their previous eight games...are now hitting .241 for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...also have the third lowest on-base percentage (.307) and slugging percentage (.353)...have the second fewest runs scored (208) and are tied for third fewest in strikeouts (349)...have eight home runs over the last 12 games but have 32 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL...are on pace to hit just 89 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have been shutout six times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 43 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 33 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Houston, 34)...10 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors...have recorded 63 double plays this season, which is tied for second most in the AL.

**AGAINST THE EAST:** The A's are 3-4 in this stretch of 12 consecutive games against American League East teams (3-0 vs. Baltimore, 0-3 vs. New York, 0-1 at Boston)...following this series with Boston, the stretch continues with a three-game series at Baltimore beginning Monday...it marks just the second time this year the A's have traveled to the Eastern time zone (had a three-game series at Toronto, April 5-7)...are 5-7 (.417) against the East this year.

**WINS AND LOSSES:** The A's have a 13-10 (.565) record in day games and are 14-21 (.400) at night...have the fifth best day record in the American League and the second worst mark at night (Minnesota, 11-21)...are 10-5 (.667) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is tied for the second best record in the AL...are 17-26 (.395) against right-handed starters...are 20-5 when scoring four or more runs and 7-26 when scoring less than four.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on this 10-game road trip to Boston (0-1), Baltimore (three games) and Chicago (four games)...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 13-16 on the road for the season...went 3-3 on their last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (0-3) and are 14-15 at home for the season...are batting .252 (245 for 974) with 114 runs scored in 29 home games (3.93 per game) and .230 (228 for 990) with 94 runs scored in 29 games on the road (3.20 per game).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 5-7 in extra-inning games...the 12 extra-inning games are tied for the most in the majors and the seven losses are second most to the Angels (8)...the 12 extra-inning games are one more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11 and the season-high is 12...are 7-14 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 5-12 in games decided in the last at bat...are 7-11 in one-run games...are tied for third in the American League in one-run losses...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have five players on the DL (Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

**LOCKED UP:** The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

### A's vs. RED SOX

The A's trail the season series 2-1 following last night's loss...are 0-1 in Boston and 1-1 in Oakland...went 5-4 against the Red Sox last season, winning the season series for the first time since going 7-3 in 2006...are now 26-24 (.520) against the Red Sox since 2006, which is the **best record by any American League team over that span**...have swept just three series from Boston over the last 18 years (all in Oakland), most recently May 23-25, 2008...have won 17 of the last 24 games in the Coliseum but have lost 13 of the last 17 at Fenway...are 218-270 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 129-114 in Oakland, 88-155 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 860-1051 against the Red Sox.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**David DeJesus** is batting .319 (22 for 69) over his last 20 games (since May 13) after hitting .217 over his first 32 contests...has not committed an error in 48 games in the outfield and now has a 289-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

**Kurt Suzuki** is a .328 (41 for 125) career hitter against Boston, which is his highest average against any American League team...has hit safely in 15 of 16 career games at Fenway Park (22 for 64, .344).

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** the A's take a 3-0 lead into the bottom of the ninth at Washington before the Senators score three times to send the game into extra innings...the A's finally win with two runs in the top of the 21st inning to win the longest game (by innings) in Oakland history...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches a two-hit shutout in the first game of a double-header at Baltimore for his 100<sup>th</sup> career victory...the future Hall of Famer would go on to win 224 games with the A's and the Yankees.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 13<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 6-6 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and are 43-31 (.582) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in six of his 12 starts, allowed one run or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

**THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Is 0-3 with a 3.51 ERA (10 er in 25.2 ip) and .275 (25 for 91) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...the three-game losing streak is one short of his career high of four from July 27 to August 11, 2009...has walked 14 and allowed four home runs in 25.2 innings during the losing streak after yielding 16 walks and three home runs in 52.1 innings over his first eight starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for fourth in the American League in wins (6), ranks sixth in ERA (2.31) and tied for sixth in winning percentage (.667)...also ranks second in wild pitches (7) and tied for seventh in walks (30)...the seven wild pitches match Henry Rodriguez' team-leading total from last year.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .130 (7 for 54) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is the third lowest mark in the American League...has held the opponents three through six hitters to a .159 (20 for 126) average...has allowed seven home runs and five have been solo shots.

**WINS:** Is 24-10 with a 2.64 ERA (79 er in 269.2 ip) and .221 (214 for 969) opponents batting average in 41 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are tied for second most in the majors over that span...the A's are 27-14 (.659) in games started by Trevor Cahill since May 1 of last year and 69-86 (.445) with all other pitchers...is 34-24 (.586) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24<sup>th</sup> birthday (42, Vida Blue).

**FIRST LOSS:** Was the losing pitcher May 15 against Chicago, snapping his season-opening winning streak at six games...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss snapped a seven-game winning streak dating back to October 1, 2010...the winning streak matched his career high (May 21 to July 1, 2010)...posted a 1.52 ERA and .210 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned nine starts.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-2 with a 2.01 ERA (9 er in 40.1 ip) in six starts at home this year and 3-1 with a 2.63 ERA (11 er in 37.2 ip) in six starts on the road...has the third lowest home ERA in the American League...is now 21-12 with a 3.06 ERA (85 er in 250.0 ip) in 39 career starts in Oakland and 13-12 with a 4.07 ERA (92 er in 203.1 ip) in 35 starts on the road.

**2011 START-BY-START:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...earned his first win of the season in a 2-1 victory at Toronto **April 7**...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Chicago **April 12**...surrendered all four of his runs in the second inning...earned the win in a 5-1 decision over Detroit **April 17** in Oakland...allowed his only run when Wells led off the sixth inning with a home run...earned the win in the A's 9-1 victory at Seattle **April 23**...extended his season winning streak to four games in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **April 29**...improved to 5-0 with a 3-1 victory over Cleveland **May 4** in Oakland...allowed just one run in 7.0 innings, a RBI single by Hafner in the third inning...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9**...the Rangers scored their only run off him on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...held the White Sox scoreless until Ramirez homered to lead off the fourth...also allowed a Quentin sacrifice fly in the sixth inning and two unearned runs in the seventh...that snapped a streak of five consecutive starts with one run or fewer, which fell one short of the Oakland record of six...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at San Francisco **May 20**...allowed his first first-inning run of the season when Torres waked, stole second, took third on an error and scored on a ground out...then shutout the Giants on one hit over his final five innings before being removed for a pinch hitter in the seventh inning with the scored tied at 1-1...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles **May 25**...allowed a RBI single to Bourjos in the second inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the fifth...allowed three runs in the bottom of the fifth on back-to-back home runs by Hunter and Callaspo and a RBI double by Willits...it was the second time in his career he allowed back-to-back home runs (Aug. 30, 2010 at New York).

**LAST START:** He extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-0 loss to New York last Monday in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...Teixeira hit a two-run home run and Cano added a RBI double...blanked the Yankees one hit and one walk over the next five innings before allowing a Jeter sacrifice fly in the seventh...left trailing 4-0 as Colon shutout the A's on four hits.

**CAHILL vs. BOSTON:** Is 1-2 with a 5.19 ERA (17.1 ip, 17 h, 10 r, 10 er, 7 bb, 11 so, 3 hr) in three career starts...including 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA in two starts last year...the loss came in an 8-3 decision at Fenway July 27...Pedroia had a solo home run in the first and a sacrifice fly in the third...he then allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a LaRoche RBI double and RBI singles by Varitek and Ellsbury...yielded one more run in the fifth inning on a Bay RBI single...the win came in Oakland on September 10 when he combined with Breslow and Rodriguez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win...tossed 7.0 innings, allowed all three of the hits and walked one...the only time the Red Sox had runners in scoring position was in the second inning when Lowrie walked with two outs and Reddick doubled...then got Hall to ground out and end the inning...lost his only start in 2009, a 5-4 decision at Fenway July 8...did not allow a hit until Pedroia double with one out in the fourth and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Drew in the sixth...followed that with a Pedroia infield single, a Youkilis walk and an Ortiz three-run home run.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Brett Anderson (3-5, 3.68 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 13<sup>th</sup> start of the season...is 1-4 with a 5.36 ERA (26 er in 43.2 ip), 19 walks and six home runs allowed over his last seven starts after going 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA, four walks and no home runs over his first five starts (34.2 ip)...his five losses are tied for seventh in the American League...is 2-3 with a 2.35 ERA (10 er in 38.1 ip) in six starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 4.95 ERA (22 er in 40.0 ip) in six starts at home...is tied for the third best road ERA in the American League...4-1 with a 2.08 ERA (39.0 ip, 28 h, 9 r, 9 er, 12 bb, 36 so, 3 hr) in six career starts against Boston...lost his first decision but has won each of his last four, which equals the third longest winning streak by an Oakland pitcher against the Red Sox.

**Save/Save Opportunities: 13/20 (65.0%)**

The A's bullpen allowed three runs in 5.1 innings last night...however, has allowed four runs in 25.0 (1.44 ERA) over its past six games after allowing 23 runs in 26.0 innings (7.96 ERA) over its previous eight games...ranks third in the American League with a 3.30 ERA overall...has been charged with 13 losses, which is tied for the most in the AL...is 13 for 20 (65.0%) in save opportunities this season, which is the sixth highest percentage in the AL... the save opportunities are tied for sixth most and the seven blown saves are tied for sixth fewest...rank second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.308), third in batting average (.229) and fourth in slugging (.333).

- Began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento May 20 and did not allow a run in four appearances (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 3 so, 2 hb).
