### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have split their past two games after losing a season-high 10 consecutive games...it was their longest losing streak since they also had a 10-game losing streak from July 28-August 7, 2008...are now 6-18 over the last 24 games (since May 18)...were tied for first place May 17 but are now a season-high-tying eight games out of first and in fourth place, where the A's have spent the last 13 days and 20 of the last 21 days...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 24 days in fourth...have swept or been swept in seven of the past nine series after beginning the season without a sweep or being swept in the first 13 series, an Oakland record to start a season.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 0-9 with a 7.39 ERA (52 er in 63.1 ip) and a .322 (83 for 258) opponents batting average over the past 12 games after going 5-5 with a 2.21 ERA and .238 opponents batting average over their previous 16 games...have a 3.36 ERA for the season, which is tied for the American League lead...have allowed 31 home runs this season, which is the fewest in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.366), rank third in most walks allowed (140) and are sixth in innings pitched (406.2).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.34 ERA for the season, which leads the American League...allowed one or more home runs in 11 of the past 12 games (16 total over that span)...however, have allowed just 45 home runs for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the American League...rank second in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.360) and are tied for fifth in on-base percentage (.319)...have a Major League leading 13 pickoffs this season...opponents have been successful in just 45 of 71 (63.4%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 26 caught stealings are the most in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .239 this season, which ranks second lowest in the American League...also have the second lowest slugging percentage (.347) and third lowest on-base percentage (.305)...have the second fewest runs scored (236) and the fifth fewest in strikeouts (401)...have hit 35 home runs this season, which is the fewest in the AL...are on pace to hit just 86 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have been shut out seven times this season, which is tied for second most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's made three errors last night and have now committed 50 errors this season, which is tied for the most in the American League...the errors have led to 35 unearned runs, which is the second most in the majors (Houston, 36)...11 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...have recorded 76 double plays this season, which is the second most in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-8 on this 10-game road trip to Boston (0-3), Baltimore (0-3) and Chicago (1-2) and have now lost 14 of their past 17 road games...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are now 14-23 (.378) on the road for the season, which is the second worst road record in the American League (Kansas City, 7-17)...went 3-3 on their last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (0-3) and are 14-15 at home for the season...are batting .252 (245 for 974) with 114 runs scored in 29 home games (3.93 per game) and .229 (291 for 1269) with 122 runs scored in 37 games on the road (3.30 per game).

**IN JUNE:** The A's are 1-9 (.100) in the month of June, which is the lowest winning percentage in the American League...have not finished June with a winning record since 2008 (16-10)...however, have had a winning record in June in seven of the past nine seasons...have a 5.34 ERA (52 er in 87.2 ip) this month, which ranks second highest in the AL...have the third lowest batting average (.228) and are tied for fourth fewest in runs scored (36).

**WINS AND LOSSES:** The A's have a 13-12 (.520) record in day games and are 15-26 (.366) at night...have the sixth best day record in the American League and the worst mark at night...are 10-9 in games started by a left-handed pitcher and 18-29 against right-handed starters...are 21-7 when scoring four or more runs and 7-31 when scoring less than four...are 22-11 when scoring first and when the opponent scores first...are 7-15 in the first game of a series and 12-9 in the last game of a series.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 5-8 in extra-inning games this year...the 13 extra-inning games are the most in the American League and the eight losses are second most (Los Angeles, 9)...the 13 extra-inning games are two more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra-inning games have gone 10 innings, one lasted 11, one lasted 12 and the season-high is 14...are 8-15 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 6-13 in games decided in the last at bat...are 8-14 in one-run games...the 14 one-run losses are third most in the AL...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ellis, Harden, McCarthy, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 96 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

**LOCKED UP:** The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

### A's vs. WHITE SOX

The A's trail the season series 5-4...are 3-3 in Chicago and 1-2 in Oakland...went 5-4 against the White Sox last year and have won the season series in eight of the previous 10 seasons...are now 60-36 (.625) against the White Sox since the start of the 2001 season, which is the **best record by any American League team** over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 287-266 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 151-129 in Oakland and 136-137 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 964-1021 against Chicago.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Daric Barton** has played 419 career games at first base, which is one away from tying Scott Hatteberg for third in Oakland history.

**Coco Crisp** has 999 career hits and is one away from the 1,000<sup>th</sup> of his career.

**Joey Devine** has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 73-game, 71.2-inning, 286-batter homerless streak.

**David DeJesus** has not committed an error in 52 games in the outfield and now has a 293-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1975** Billy Williams hits his 400<sup>th</sup> career home run in a 9-7 A's loss at Milwaukee...in **1990** Rickey Henderson steals third base against Texas, his 900<sup>th</sup> career steal...in that game, Dennis Eckersley walks his first batter of the season, snapping a string of 52.0 innings and 186 hitters without a walk...in **2009** Jack Hannahan commits his first error of the season, snapping a 72-game errorless streak dating back to August 10, 2008, which is an Oakland record for a third baseman.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his sixth appearance and fourth start of the season...the A's are 2-1 (.667) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings once, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two batters or fewer twice.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 2-1 with

a 3.38 ERA (6 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 24 and won each of his first two starts...had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2 and pitched in relief on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...matched his career high with three strikeouts in 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4<sup>th</sup>.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .206 batting average against right-handed hitters and .263 against left-handers...opponents are batting .278 (10 for 36) with the bases empty and .194 (7 for 36) with runners on base...including .143 (2 for 14) with runners in scoring position...both of the home runs he has allowed have been solo shots.

**FIRST START:** Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles May 24...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed a career-high 6.0 innings and matched his best with three strikeouts...did not allow a run and just three runners advanced into scoring position.

**SECOND START:** Won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore May 29 in Oakland...allowed a career-high four runs on a career-high five hits in 5.0 innings...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Pie, a bases loaded walk to Reimold and RBI ground outs by Markakis and Guerrero...the A's came back with four runs in the bottom of the fifth for the win.

**LAST START:** Was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Baltimore on Tuesday...allowed a lead-off home runs to Hardy in the bottom of the first and Scott in the bottom of the fifth...those were the only two runs he would allow in 5.0 innings...matched his career high by allowing five hits...Jakubauskas, Rapada, Accardo and Uehara combined to shutout the A's on five hits.

**MOSCOSO vs. CHICAGO:** Has never faced the White Sox in his career.

**VENEZUELA:** Is the first Venezuelan-born pitcher to start a game for the A's since Pablo Torrealba on September 30, 1977...Torrealba made 10 starts and 31 relief appearances for the A's that year but was 0-5 in his starting assignments...prior to Moscoso, the only Venezuelan to start and win a game for the Athletics was Roberto Rodriguez on August 27, 1967 against Detroit...Moscoso is the fourth Venezuelan to pitch for the A's (also Henry Rodriguez)...is one of 18 overall, a list which includes Tony Armas, Ramon Hernandez and Marco Scutaro...the first was Chico Carrasquel in 1958.

**THIS SPRING:** Was 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (10.2 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in five games, including two starts...opponents hit .283 (13 for 46)...both of his losses came in his two starting assignments on March 7 and 12 (5 er in 6.0 ip, 7.50 ERA)...had a 5.79 ERA (3 er in 4.2 ip) in his three relief appearances...was optioned to Sacramento March 20.

**WITH SACRAMENTO:** Was 3-2 with a 4.02 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in eight games, seven starts...struck out 43 in 40.1 innings, an average of 9.59 per nine innings...issued just 13 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just one home run in 40.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-4 (.429) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in three of his seven starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his eight outings and five runs or more in his other three.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Was 1-1 with a 2.53 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in four starts at home and 2-1 with a 5.68 ERA and .253 opponents batting average in four games, three starts, on the road.

**DAY AND NIGHT:** Was 2-1 with a 1.98 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in five starts at night and 1-1 with a 8.31 ERA and .309 opponents batting average in three games, two starts, during the day.

**THE FIRST TWO INNINGS:** Allowed 13 of his 19 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 7.80 ERA (13 er in 15.0 ip) and .302 (19 for 63) opponents batting average...had a 1.78 ERA (5 er in 25.1 ip) and .183 (17 for 93) opponents average from the third inning on.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .231 opponents average broke down to .216 (16 for 74) against left-handed hitters and .244 (20 for 82) against right-handers...surrendered his only home run and issued nine of his 13 walks to lefties...allowed a .236 (21 for 89) average with the bases empty and .308 (12 for 39) with runners in scoring position.

**SACRAMENTO HIGHLIGHTS:** Had a no decision in his first start April 8 against Tacoma, allowing a run in 5.0 innings in a 3-1 loss...the run came in the first inning and he did not allow a run in each of his next two appearances...tossed 6.0 shutout innings in a no decision against Las Vegas April 14 and then pitched 5.0 shutout innings in relief of a rehabbing Michael Wuertz April 20 at Reno...picked up the win against Reno but was charged with his first loss April 25 at Tucson...allowed two runs in the first inning, snapping his scoreless streak at 15.0 innings...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings in his next start, a loss at Las Vegas May 1...had back-to-back scoreless outings again May 7 against Colorado Springs and May 12 at Memphis, both wins...tossed a season-high tying 6.0 innings and struck out a season-high eight in each outing...then allowed five runs on six hits in 3.0 innings in his final start May 17 at Nashville.

## TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Josh Outman (1-1, 4.15):** Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...the A's are 1-3 (.250) in his starting assignments this year and 10-10 (.500) in his career...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 23 and started that night at Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first appearance since June 19, 2009 at San Diego, a no decision in the A's 7-5 win...left that game after 1.2 innings with a strained left elbow and had "Tommy John" surgery June 30...was charged with his first loss off the season in his last start, a 3-2 defeat at Baltimore on Wednesday...allowed three runs on five hits in 6.0 innings...is 1-0 with a 1.13 ERA in two career appearances, one start, against the Royals (8.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...the win came in a 7-2 decision May 13, 2009 at Kansas City when he allowed one run on three hits in 6.0 innings.

**6-14, 3.28 ERA (186.2 ip, 162 h, 84 r, 68 er, 71 bb, 159 so, 14 hr)**

**Save/Save Opportunities: 14/22 (63.6%)**

The A's bullpen has a 3.58 ERA (13 er in 32.2 ip) over its past nine games after allowing one run in 19.2 innings (0.46 ERA) in its previous six games...ranks second in the American League with a 3.28 ERA overall...has been charged with 14 losses, which is tied for the most in the AL...is 14 for 22 (63.6%) in save opportunities this season, which is the sixth lowest percentage in the AL...the 22 save opportunities and eight blown saves are both tied for fifth fewest...are second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.307), are third in batting average (.235) and rank fourth in slugging percentage (.345)...have allowed 35.4 percent of inherited runners to score (29 for 82), which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL.

**First Hitters: 0-5 (0 bb)**

- Pitched a perfect ninth inning Friday to earn his first save of the season...it was his first save since September 17 of last season at Minnesota.
- Has not allowed a run in four of five appearances (1 er in 5.0 ip, 1.80 ERA) since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Has not allowed a run and has a win and two saves in four career appearances against the White Sox (4.2 ip, 1 h, 0 bb, 4 so).
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Earned his fourth win of the season Friday, which is tied for the American League lead.
- Has not allowed a run in his past four appearances (4.0 ip) after allowing five runs in 2.0 innings in his previous two appearances...has not allowed a run in 23 of his 27 appearances this season overall.
- Has a 0.63 ERA (1 er in 14.1 ip) in 13 appearances at home compared to a 5.11 ERA (7 er in 12.1 ip) in 14 appearances on the road...has a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in 16 appearances at night and a 4.22 ERA (5 er in 10.2 ip) in 11 games during the day.
