### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Snapped their three-game losing streak last night but have lost 13 of the last 15 games...with the win last night, the A's gained a game on Texas in the American League West for the first time since May 27...are 29-40 (.420), which is the second worst record in the AL (Minnesota, 27-39) and fourth worst in the majors...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 7-20 (.259) since then, which is the worst record in the Majors (Florida, 8-20)...have spent each of the last 17 days and 24 of the last 25 in sole possession of last place in the AL West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 28 days in fourth...had a season-high 10-game losing streak from May 30 to June 9...that matched the fifth longest losing streak in Oakland history and it was the longest since July 28-August 7, 2008 when they also lost 10 straight.

**IN JUNE:** The A's are 2-11 (.154) in the month of June, which is the second worst record in the majors (Florida, 1-14)...have a 5.07 ERA (64 er in 113.2 ip) this month, which is third highest in the American League...also have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.287) and are tied for third in most home runs (14)...the offense is batting .221 (97 for 438), which is third lowest in the AL...are tied for the second fewest home runs (6) and have the fourth fewest runs scored (46).

**STARTING PITCHING:** The win by Josh Outman last night was the first by an A's starting pitcher since Guillermo Moscoso defeated Baltimore May 29...it snapped an 11-game losing streak by A's starters, which was second longest in Oakland history to a 13-game streak from July 29-Aug. 12, 1977...starters went 14 consecutive games without a win, which matched the fifth longest streak in Oakland history and was the longest since July 24-Aug. 12, 1997 when A's starters went an Oakland record 18 consecutive games without a win...starters are now 1-11 with a 6.67 ERA (60 er in 81.0 ip), .303 (97 for 320) opponents batting average, 43 walks and 39 strikeouts over the past 15 games...are 22-26 with a 3.39 ERA (160 er in 424.1 ip) for the season...have the second lowest ERA in the American League (Seattle, 3.38) but the fourth lowest winning percentage (.458)...have allowed 14 home runs in the last 15 games after yielding 18 over the first 54 contests...have allowed 32 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.364) but have issued the third most walks (153).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.37 ERA, which leads the American League...have allowed 17 home runs in the last 15 games but have surrendered just 46 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.358)...have a Major League leading 14 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in 49 of 77 (63.6%) stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...the 28 caught stealings are the most in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have hit just 37 home runs, which is the fewest in the Major Leagues...are on pace to hit 87 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have scored 246 runs, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...also have the second lowest batting average (.237) and slugging percentage (.345) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.305)...have been shut out seven times, which is third most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last six games (eight errors total) and have 53 for the season, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors...the errors have led to 36 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors to Houston (37)...12 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank second in the AL in double plays (81).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this six-game homestand against Kansas City (1-1) and San Francisco (three games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (0-3) and are 15-16 at home for the season...went 1-9 on the last road trip to Boston (0-3), Baltimore (0-3) and Chicago (1-3), matching the worst record on a road trip of 10 or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 Aug. 1-10, 2008 and May 12-21, 1981...have now lost 15 of the last 18 road games and are 14-24 (.368) on the road for the season, which is the second worst mark in the American League (Kansas City, 9-18)...are batting .249 (257 for 1034) with 120 runs scored in 31 home games (3.87 per game) and .228 (297 for 1301) with 126 runs scored in 38 games on the road (3.32 per game).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's improved to 9-15 in one-run games with the win last night but the .375 winning percentage is still the worst mark in the majors...are 5-8 (.385) in extra inning games...are tied for the American League lead in extra inning games and have the second most losses...the 13 extra-inning games are already two more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season and the losses are their most since going 3-10 in 2009...10 of the extra-inning games have gone 10 innings, one lasted 11, one lasted 12 and the season-high is 14...are 8-16 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 6-13 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ellis, Harden, McCarthy, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 96 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

**BOB MELVIN:** The A's are 2-4 since Bob Melvin was named interim manager June 9...he replaced Bob Geren, who was relieved of his duties after a 27-36 start...Geren registered a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons with Oakland...Melvin compiled a record of 493-508 in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with Seattle (2003-04) and Arizona (2005-09)...this is the seventh in-season managerial change in Oakland history, the first since Tony La Russa took over in 1986.

### A's vs. ROYALS

The A's lead the season series, 3-2...have split the first two games in Oakland after winning two of three in Kansas City in May...have won the season series from the Royals in each of the previous two seasons and are 15-7 (.682) against the Royals since the start of the 2009 season...have won seven of the 10 games in Oakland over that stretch...all-time, the A's are 294-241 against the Royals...that breaks down to 161-106 in Oakland and 133-135 in Kansas City.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Joey Devine** has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 74-game, 72.2-inning, 292-batter homerless streak.

**David DeJesus** has not committed an error in 54 games in the outfield and now has a 295-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

**Hideki Matsui** has 498 career home runs between the Japan and the United States.

**Ryan Sweeney** has not committed an error this year and now has a 150-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder.

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1934 Bob Johnson collects six hits in the second game of a doubleheader against Chicago...in 1938 Jimmie Foxx sets an American League record by walking six times in a nine-inning game against Boston...in 1971 Mike Epstein homers in his first two at bats after homering in his final two at bats the day before to give him four home runs in four at bats, tying a Major League record for consecutive home runs...in 1996 Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 10-9 win at Milwaukee, including the game winner in the ninth inning...in that game, he also drove in his 790th career run, breaking Sal Bando's Oakland career record.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 14<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 6-7 (.462) in his starting assignments this year and are 36-34 (.514) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 10 of his 13 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

**MONTH-BY-MONTH:** Is 0-3 with a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) and .264 (19 for 72) opponents batting average in three starts in June and is now 1-7 with a 4.60 ERA (32 er in 62.2 ip) in 11 career starts in the month...went 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the American League...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average over his first five starts in April.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (2.67) but is tied for third in most walks (40)...has allowed just six home runs and his average of 0.67 home runs per nine innings is 10<sup>th</sup> lowest in the AL...has the eighth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.338)...also ranks tied for fourth in wild pitches (6) and hit batters (6) and both figures are already career highs.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received run support of three runs or fewer in each of his last five starts (11 rs in 30.1 ip, 3.26 RSA) and is 0-3 despite a 3.26 ERA (11 er in 30.1 ip) over that span...has run support of three runs or fewer in 10 of his 13 starts this year...now has 25 runs of support in his 25 career losses (123.2 ip, 1.82 RSA)...is 23-1 in 32 career starts with run support of three or more and 4-24 in 38 starts with support of two or fewer.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .134 (9 for 67) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is tied for the lowest mark in the American League...opponents are 3 for 32 (.094) with RISP and two outs and 0 for 6 with the bases loaded...has allowed a .258 (53 for 206) opponents batting average and five of his six home runs the first two times through the lineup and .183 (17 for 93) after that...has surrendered four of his six home runs at home and also has four during the day...four have been solo shots.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 1-4 with a 3.17 ERA (17 er in 48.1 ip) in eight starts on four days rest and 4-1 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts on five or more days rest.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 3-3 with a 2.23 ERA (12 er in 48.1 ip) and .218 (38 for 174) opponents batting average in eight starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 3.31 ERA (12 er in 32.2 ip) and .256 (32 for 125) average in five starts during the day...has the fourth lowest night ERA in the American League.

**2011 START-BY-START:** Earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle **April 3** in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning...combined with Balfour and Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Minnesota **April 9**...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed four of the hits, all singles...had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to Detroit **April 14**...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start...took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat to Boston **April 20**...gave up an RBI single to Crawford in the second, snapping a career high 18.0 inning scoreless streak...was charged with his second loss in a row in the A's 5-0 decision at Los Angeles **April 25**...surrendered two runs in the second and two more in the fourth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory over Texas **May 1** in Oakland...had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Young in the sixth inning...won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-2 win at Kansas City **May 6**...allowed single runs in the first and third and the A's scored three times in the fifth for the win...had his scheduled start **May 11** at Texas rained out...allowed seven runs on six hits and five walks while striking out one in 2.2 innings, including a grand slam by Moreland...however, the game was halted due to rain with the Rangers leading 7-0 after the top of the fourth inning and was cancelled after a 2 hour and 14 minute delay...combined with Breslow and Magnuson on a two-hit shutout in the A's 14-0 win over Los Angeles **May 17** in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...did not allow a runner past first base...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss **May 22** at San Francisco...had a 3-2 lead when he was relieved by Wuertz with two outs in the seventh...however, Balfour allowed two runs in the eighth for the blown save...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-2 win over Baltimore **May 27** in Oakland...walked in a run in the second inning and allowed an unearned run in the fifth inning...left with the score tied at 2-2 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the sixth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to New York **June 1** in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Rodriguez in the first inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first...then surrendered a three-run home run to Swisher in the fourth inning...was relieved by Devine with one out in the seventh inning and the A's trailing 4-2...dropped his second consecutive decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Baltimore **June 6**...allowed a RBI single to Guerrero in the first inning and three more runs in the second...Wieters and Markakis had RBI singles and Reimold added a sacrifice fly...then shutout the Orioles on three hits over his final five innings but the A's were held to just two runs by Matusz and he left after seven innings trailing 4-2

**LAST START:** He extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 3-2 loss at Chicago last Saturday...issued a career-high seven walks in 5.1 innings...also had an intentional walk, a home run, two wild pitches, a hit batter and a balk and is the first pitcher in Oakland history to have at least one of each of those in one game...Ramirez scored on a wild pitch in the third inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...allowed a leadoff home run to Castro in the bottom of the fourth but the A's tied the game again with a run in the sixth...issued a one-out walk to Lillibridge in the bottom of the sixth and was relieved by Ziegler, who allowed the run to score.

**GONZALEZ vs. KANSAS CITY:** Is 2-2 with a 6.39 ERA (25.1 ip, 26 h, 19 r, 18 er, 15 bb, 23 so, 5 hr) in five career starts...is 2-2 with a 5.85 ERA (13 er in 20.0 ip) in four starts in Kansas City and 0-0 with an 8.44 ERA (5 er in 5.1 ip) in one start in Oakland...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 3-2 A's win at Kansas City **May 6**...allowed a solo home run to Gordon in the first inning and an Aviles RBI triple in the third...those were the only two runs he would allow in his seven innings and the A's scored three times in the fifth inning for the win...was 1-1 with a 8.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 14 h, 8 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 4 so) in two starts last year.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Graham Godfrey (0-0, 10.38 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his second appearance and start of the season and his career...had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-5 A's win at Chicago last Friday (4.1 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...the nine hits are the most by an A's pitcher in his debut since April 10, 1983 when Bill Krueger yielded nine at California...combined for a 7-1 record, a 2.32 ERA and a .221 opponents batting average in 10 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...was leading the Pacific Coast League in ERA (2.50) and winning percentage (.875) and was tied for the league lead in wins (7) at the time of his promotion...was 33-32 with a 4.20 ERA in 119 career minor league appearances, including 103 starts, over five seasons...was originally drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays in the 34<sup>th</sup> round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to the A's with pitcher Kristian Bell for infielder Marco Scutaro, Nov. 18, 2007

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

**7-14, 3.32 ERA (195.0 ip, 172 h, 88 r, 72 er, 73 bb, 163 so, 14 hr)**

**Save/Save Opportunities: 15/23 (65.2%)**

The A's bullpen has allowed 17 runs in 42.0 innings (3.64 ERA) over its past 12 games after surrendering one run in 19.2 innings (0.46 ERA) over its previous six games...ranks second in the American League with a 3.32 ERA overall...is tied for first in the AL in losses (14) and has recorded the second fewest wins (7)...has pitched 195.0 innings, which ranks fifth most...is 15 for 23 (65.2%) in save opportunities this season...the 23 save opportunities are tied for seventh most and eight blown saves are tied for fifth fewest...is second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.308), fourth in slugging percentage (.346) and tied for fourth in batting average (.238)...has allowed 31 of 87 inherited runners to score (35.6%), which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL.

**First Hitters: 0-6 (0 bb)**

- Pitched a perfect ninth inning yesterday for his second save of the season.
- Has not allowed a run in five of six appearances (1 er in 6.0 ip, 1.50 ERA) since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Has converted each of his six save opportunities and has a 1.42 ERA in seven career appearances against the Royals (6.1 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 1 hr).
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Had a no decision in his only interleague start this year on May 20 against San Francisco, allowing one run in 6.0 innings...is now 3-0 with a 2.25 ERA (8 er in 32.0 ip) in five interleague starts over the last two years and is 5-2 with a 2.93 ERA (18 er in 55.1 ip) in nine career interleague starts.

**THE FIRST INNING:** Has allowed four runs in the first inning over his last four starts after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...allowed just five runs in the first inning all last year for a 1.50 ERA (5 er in 30.0 ip).

**WINS:** Is 24-12 with a 2.98 ERA (94 er in 283.2 ip) and .228 (234 for 1027) opponents batting average in 44 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...the A's are 27-17 (.614) in games started by Trevor Cahill since May 1 of last year and 70-92 (.432) with all other pitchers...is 34-26 (.567) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24<sup>th</sup> birthday (42, Vida Blue).

**2011 HIGHLIGHTS:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...improved to 6-0 in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9**...the Rangers scored their only run off him on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...that snapped his season-opening winning streak at six games...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...allowed four runs to snap a streak of five consecutive starts with one run or fewer, which fell one short of the Oakland record of six...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-0 loss to New York **May 30** in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...had a no decision in the 9-8, 14-inning loss at Boston **June 4**...the scored was tied at 2-2 when he allowed three runs in the bottom of the sixth...the A's scored four times in the ninth to send the game into extra innings...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 9-4 loss at Chicago **June 9**...allowed a season-high six runs in a season-low 2.2 innings...allowed three runs in the second and three more in the third.

**LAST START:** Lost his career-high fifth consecutive decision in the A's 7-4 loss to Kansas City on Tuesday in Oakland...walked seven batters in 4.1 innings and did not record a strikeout...the only other pitcher in Oakland history to walk seven or more batters in a game without striking out a batter is Mike Norris with eight on April 16, 1979 against Seattle...allowing single runs in the second and fourth inning on ground outs and then yielded a two-run double to Butler in the fifth inning.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
