RUNS SCARCE AS A'S EVEN SERIES

--The Royals and Athletics exchanged zeros last night until Oakland finally broke through with single tallies in the sixth and seventh, which were enough for a 2-1 decision to square this series at a win apiece...Luke Hochevar no-hit the A's until Landon Powell led off the sixth with a solid single, the first of 3 in that frame that led to the first run...trailing 2-0 in the eighth, the Royals finally got on the board thanks to 3 straight 2-out hits, started by a double from the suddenly redhot Alcides Escobar, his third hit of the game...Alex Gordon's infield hit drove home Esky, who had put himself 90-feet closer by stealing his career-best 10th base...Hochevar was the hard-luck losing hurler, allowing 2 runs on 5 hits with 2 walks and no strikeouts, falling to 4-7, while Josh Outman held KC's bats at bay near the bay with 7.0 shutout innings...the loss dropped KC to 3-2 on this trip.

DARE WE SAY "EN FUEGO"

--Kansas City shortstop Alcides Escobar has amazed with the leather from the outset this year, but more recently he has been just as much of a contributor at the plate as he hit safely in his eighth straight game last night, tying a career-best hitting streak set with Milwaukee in

2009...last night was his second consecutive 3-hit effort and gave him a remarkable 12-for-19 (.632) through the first 5 games of this road trip (all multi-hit games), with 6 runs scored and a double in each of the games on this excursion...overall during this 8-game streak, Escobar is hitting .552 (16-for-29) with 8 runs, 5 doubles and 4 stolen bases, giving him 10 steals on the year which already matches a career best set last season in Milwaukee.

RUBBER GAME #9--Today is the ninth time this year that a series victory has come down to the finale, the most recent on Sunday in Anaheim when KC whitewashed the Angels, 9-0...the Royals are 5-3 to this point in rubber games, with this the fourth on the road, as KC has won in Anaheim and Detroit and lost in Arlington...KC has a chance to avenge an earlier rubber game defeat to Oakland in Kauffman Stadium back on May 8...the Royals had 18 series come down to the last game in 2010, going 9-9 in rubber matches.

MEET US IN ST. LOUIE--The Royals wrap up this 9-game tour with the resumption of Interleague play as KC pays a weekend visit to St. Louis beginning tomorrow night...the set against the Cardinals jumpstarts the final 15 games against National League competition for 2011, as the Royals will return home for 3-game visits from Arizona and the Chicago Cubs before heading out to 3-game stops in San Diego and Colorado...KC went 1-2 when the Redbirds stopped by "The K" in May and now trails the all-time body of work by a 27-36 margin, including a 12-12 split in St. Louis and a 7-5 advantage in new Busch Stadium.

PITCHERS PERFORMING WELL--Last night's solid effort from Luke Hochevar marked the sixth consecutive game in which a Kansas City starting pitcher allowed 2 earned runs or less, with last night the first loss in that stretch that is now 4-1...the starters have a collective ERA of 2.35 in this 6-game span that began a week ago today with a win at home over Toronto...in the week, the starters have allowed 10 earned runs over 38.1 innings...overall on the hill during this 6-game span, KC pitchers have compiled a 2.25 ERA, allowing 13 earned runs in 52.0 innings while holding the opposition to a collective .228 average.

JEFF FRANCIS makes his 15th start as a Royal, the 165th mound appearance of his career (164th start) and his second (second of 2011) against the A's... the 30-year-old Canadian was signed by the Royals as a free agent on January 20, 2011...a fan of his hometown Vancouver Canucks, Jeff takes the hill today after his squad dropped Game #7 last night to the Boston Bruins.

ROAD DROUGHT SNAPPED--Francis was sharp last Friday in the opener of this road trip with a 4-2 triumph over the Angels in Anaheim, allowing just 2 runs over 6.1 innings...it was his first road victory since last July 10, when he was at Florida as a member of the Rockies...last Friday, Jeff scattered 8 hits and struck out 3 with only 1 walk, as both Halo runs scored in the sixth inning...he commanded the strike zone all evening, throwing 60 of his 89 pitches (67%) for strikes...he has now earned a victory in 3 of his last 5 starts after going winless in his first 9, going 3-1 with a 3.71 ERA (34.0 IP, 37 H, 14 ER), 16 strikeouts and 8 walks during that span.

IN CONTROL--Francis enters today fifth in the A.L. in fewest walks per 9-innings at 1.84 and also fifth in fewest walks per batter faced at .047...all told, he has issued 18 walks in 88.0 innings, including a 4-walk start on May 3 vs. Baltimore.

A RETURN OF QUALITY--Jeff has returned to his quality start ways, posting 5 in his last 7 outings, recording a 3.54 ERA (48.1 IP, 52 H, 19 ER) over that span...he also picked up quality starts in each of his first 4 outings as a Royal despite an 0-1 record...his KC initiation came on April 1 in Kauffman Stadium when he held the Halos to a run on 5 hits over 7.0 innings of a no decision that the Royals wound up winning 2-1 on Kila Ka'iahue's walk off homer in the ninth...he now has 8 "quality starts."

SECOND MEETING WITH A'S--The 30-year old has already faced the A's once in 2011, which was also his first career meeting against the squad from the east side of the bay...Francis pitched well on May 8, allowing just two earned runs over 6.1 innings with 2 strikeouts...he departed the game down 3-2 before the A's added single runs in the final 2.0 innings to absorb a 5-2 defeat...today is his debut at the Coliseum.

LOOKING TO START A ROAD STREAK--Jeff takes the hill seeking his second road victory in as many starts for the first time since 2007, when he posted 4 straight wins away from Coors Field from June 30-August 3 as a member of the Rockies...Francis is 1-3 in 6 road starts in 2011, allowing 23 earned runs in 34.1 innings for a 6.03 ERA...he has been able to limit walks in the road, issuing just 5 and striking out 19...he is 26-31 with a 5.05 ERA in 84 career road outings, including 83 starts.

Pitching Notes

Tomorrow's Starter - Felipe Paulino

- Felipe will make his fifth appearance and fourth start with the Royals...he has posted a 1.29 ERA (3 ER in 21.0 IP) without a decision for KC... was 0-4 in 18 relief outings this year for Colorado, posting a 7.36 ERA in 14.2 IP (12 ER)...was acquired from Colorado on May 26 in exchange for cash considerations after being designated for assignment on May 22...he originally signed by Houston as a non-drafted free agent on July 2, 2001.
- Paulino last pitched on Saturday in Anaheim...an error ignited a 4-run second that included 3 unearned tallies as the Halos built a 4-0 lead...Felipe allowed 5 runs (2 earned) on 7 hits and a walk over 5.0 innings...KC knotted the game at 5-5 in the sixth before falling by a 7-5 score.
- Felipe began his KC career with 12.1 scoreless innings before allowing an unearned run in the fourth inning on June 6 vs. Toronto.
- The 27-year old has never faced the Cardinals, though he made a total of 47 appearances (34 starts) for another N.L. Central club, the Astros.

 - A 2010 Rule 5 pick from Pittsburgh, Adcock was 11-7 in 27 appearances (26 starts) in 2010 for Bradenton in the Florida State League.

 - Louis was 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA and 2 saves in 6 outings for Omaha, holding batters to a .167 average with 16 K's in 7.0 innings pitched.

 - Crow began his big league career with a stretch of 15.1 scoreless innings...he also retired the first batter that he faced in each of his first 13 outings.
 - Crow and pitching coach Bob McClure are the only pitchers in club history to begin their Royals career with no runs allowed over their first 13 games.
 - The Mizzou product was KC's first-round pick (12th overall) in 2009...pitched at the High-A and AA levels in 2010, going 9-10 with a 5.73 ERA.

 - He has 18 strikeouts in 14.1 innings...his 6 K's on June 1 vs. L.A. were the most by a KC reliever since John Bale fanned 7 Yankees on September 9, 2007.
 - Holland, who made his Major League debut here on August 2, 2010, earned his first Major League win in his 2011 debut on May 19 vs. Texas.
 - Greg was 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA and 2 saves in 13 games for Omaha...he posted 27 K's in 21.2 IP while limiting opponents to a .176 batting average.

- Wilson has yet to appear on the trip...he snapped an 0-for-12 spell with a double last Thursday vs. Toronto, his 99th career two-bagger.
 - Is hitting .347 (25-for-72) on the road and .322 (19-for-59) with 2 outs.
 - He hit .400 (18-for-45) during his career-high 13-game hitting streak from April 2-22 with 4 doubles, 11 RBI, 8 walks and 7 runs scored.
 - Hitting .304 (42-for-138) vs. right-handers and .370 (17-for-46) with runners in scoring position.
- Billy Butler** *This Series:* 1-for-7, 2B, 2 RBI, 2 BB *This Trip:* 6-for-19 (.316), 2 runs, 2 2B, HR, 5 RBI, 4 BB *Hit Streak:* 0 g (0-5)
- Billy snapped a 7-game hitting streak (.346, 9-for-26) here last night by going 0-for-3 with a walk...he is still hitting .345 (30-for-87) with a .441 on-base pct. in 23 games since May 22.
 - He recorded the first walk-off home run of his career on June 1 vs. Los Angeles, giving KC a 2-0 win with a 1-out shot in the ninth.
 - He is third in the league in OBP (.405), tied for sixth in walks (42) and tied for eighth in multi-hit games (21)

3-2 START TO EXTENDED ROAD WORK--Despite last night's loss, the Royals are 3-2 thru the first 5 games of this 9-game journey, taking 2 of 3 from the Angels and splitting the first 2 here...KC is in a stretch in which 18 of 24 games will be contested on the road...after being at home for 41 of the first 63 games of the season, Kansas City will play 59 of its final 99 contests away from home...the Royals are now 9-18 on the road, while posting a 21-20 ledger in Kauffman Stadium.

REHAB ROAD CONTINUES FOR CHEN & K.D.--Kansas City starting pitchers Bruce Chen and Kyle Davies, both currently on the 15-day disabled list, will each get at least one more minor league injury rehab start this Saturday...Chen, out since May 6 with a left lat strain, will make his third minor league start on Saturday with Omaha (AAA) in an 80-90 pitch appearance at Round Rock...Davies, out since May 17 with right rotator cuff inflammation, will make his third rehab appearance (second start) on Saturday for the Northwest Arkansas Naturals (AA) at home against Springfield.

PEN SHOWING IMPROVEMENTS--Kansas City's youthful relief corps consisting of 6 rookie hurlers, is well ahead of the pen of a year ago, as this year's group has compiled a 14-11 record and 3.73 ERA in 66 games while holding opposing hitters to a collective .238 batting average...after the same number of games a season ago, the pen had a 4.16 ERA, a 10-14 ledger and opponents BA of .263...in recent work, KC relievers have allowed just 3 earned runs in its last 13.2 innings.

RUNNIN' ROYALS--With 6 thefts in the last 3 games, the Royals have reassumed the top spot in the Major League stolen base race with 67, two up on both the Texas Rangers in the A.L. and New York Mets, the N.L. leaders...Kansas City is way ahead of its running pace of a season ago when the club pilfered just 44 bags through the first 68 games (44 thru 69 games as well)...KC is currently on a pace to steal 159 bases which would be the highest total since the '96 club stole 195.

YOUNG SQUAD GETTING YOUNGER--The Royals opened the year with the youngest roster in baseball but last Friday the ninth rookie on the active roster got his big league initiation when Mike Moustakas arrived from AAA...Moose joined a roster that also includes rookies Eric Hosmer, Nate Adcock, Louis Coleman, Tim Collins, Aaron Crow, Danny Duffy, Greg Holland and Everett Teaford...in up-to-the-minute information from the Elias Sports Bureau, the Royals have the youngest active roster in the Majors by nearly a year and a half at 26 years, 152 days (Florida is 27 years, 327 days).

HOLLAND FINALLY SCORED UPON--The leadoff single by Hideki Matsui in the eighth inning here on Tuesday night snapped Greg Holland's streak of consecutive batters retired at 11, spanning 3 appearances...later in the eighth inning, the A's plated a pair of runs, one of which was earned, for the first tally Holland has surrendered since joining the club on May 19, spanning 10 appearances...despite the run scored last night, he has held opponents to a .157 average (8-for-51).

NED AT THE HELM--The 16th full-time manager in franchise history, Ned Yost, was named to his post on May 13, 2010...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he has a lifetime mark of 542-612, including a 85-110 ledger with the Royals...a catcher during his playing days, his coaching career began in the Atlanta organization, including 12 seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).
