**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers suffered a 3-1 loss to Oakland last night, the club's second straight loss. Doug Fister (0-1) took the loss for Detroit despite fanning eight batters and limiting Oakland to one run over six innings. Alex Avila drove in Detroit's lone run with a sacrifice fly. The Tigers continue a nine-game road trip with the final game of a four-game series at Oakland this afternoon. The trip concludes with with a two-game series at Chicago beginning tomorrow evening. Detroit returns home for a five-game homestand with Minnesota and Pittsburgh beginning on Wednesday.

**ON THE ROAD:** Today at Oakland marks the seventh game of a 24-game stretch in which 19 of Detroit's games will be played on the road. The Tigers have posted a 24-14 record in road games dating back to August 11, 2011. Detroit is tied for second among all major league clubs with a .632 winning percentage on the road during that stretch.

**MIGGY'S THE MAN VERSUS OAKLAND:** Miguel Cabrera is hitting .338 (45x133) with 10 doubles, 11 home runs and 34 RBI in 37 games during his career versus Oakland. He is second among active major league players since the start of the 2008 season with a .448 on-base percentage versus the Athletics, while he is third with a .662 slugging percentage and one home run every 12.09 at-bats and fifth with a .338 batting average.

**STARTING WELL:** The Tigers have posted 11 quality starts in the club's last 13 games. Club starters have posted a 2.62 ERA (82.1IP/24ER) and 77 strikeouts during the stretch dating back to April 28, while limiting opponents to a .226 batting average (69x305).

**A LONG STRETCH WITHOUT BEING BLANKED:** The Tigers scored one run last night at Oakland, marking the 101st straight game dating back to July 17, 2011, in which the club has not been shut out. It is the second-longest such streak in Tigers history, surpassing a streak of 100 straight games with at least one run scored by the club May 27-September 9, 1935. The franchise record for the longest stretch of games without being shut out is 110 games established August 28, 1992-June 29, 1993. (Source: STATS LLC)

**PAPA GRANDE CONVERTS HIS SAVE CHANCES:** Jose Valverde has converted 81 of his 86 save opportunities for the Tigers since the beginning of the 2010 season. He is tops among all major league pitchers during that stretch by converting 94.2 percent of his save opportunities. Valverde is 19 saves shy of reaching 100 during his Tigers career as he looks to become the fifth pitcher in club history to record 100 saves for the team.

**JACKSON SWINGS INTO ACTION:** Austin Jackson enters this afternoon's game at Oakland having hit safely in 11 of his last 15 games. During the 15-game stretch, he is batting .386 (22x57) with five doubles, a home run and seven RBI. Jackson is currently eighth in the American League with a .317 batting average this season.

**FLAWLESS IN CENTER FIELD:** Austin Jackson enters today's game at Oakland having not committed an error over his last 103 games in center field for the Tigers dating back to June 30, 2011, a stretch of 243 total chances. He is sixth among all American League outfielders with a .994 fielding percentage since the start of the 2011 season.

**MARTE SEES GAME ACTION:** Luis Marte saw his first game action on Saturday, pitching during an extended Spring Training game against the Braves. He fanned three batters as he allowed one hit in an inning of work. Marte threw 15 pitches in his outing.

**RADIO BOOTH UPDATE:** Tigers radio broadcaster Jim Price, per the club's request, did not accompany the team on the long journey out West. Price will return to the booth when the Tigers host Minnesota on May 16. Former Tigers pitcher Dan Petry will serve as radio analyst and join Dan Dickerson for the entire road trip.

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Jim Leyland is in his seventh season as the manager of the Tigers, compiling a 535-471 record (.532).

- Leyland enters today's game with 1,604 wins during his major league managerial career, 16th-most all-time in major league history. He is 15 wins shy of matching Ralph Houk for 15th-most all-time in major league history with 1,619 wins. Leyland is tops among all active major league managers with 1,604 wins.

- Today's game marks the 3,209th game Leyland has managed during his career, placing him in 15th place all-time in major league history.

- Leyland is one of only five managers in Tigers history to register at least 500 victories with the club. Sparky Anderson (1,331 wins), Hughie Jennings (1,131 wins), Bucky Harris (516 wins) and Steve O'Neill (509 wins) are the four other managers in Tigers history with at least 500 wins with the club.

**INJURY UPDATE:** RHP **Albuquerque** (right elbow surgery, 60-day DL on April 4), RHP **Luis Marte** (left hamstring strain, 15-day DL on April 4), **C Victor Martinez** (left knee surgery, 60-day DL on March 12), **LHP Daniel Schlereth** (left shoulder tendinitis, 15-day DL on April 21).

## TODAY'S TIGERS STARTER - JUSTIN VERLANDER

'12 Season (Detroit): 3-1, 2.63 ERA, 7 G, 7 GS, 1 CG, 0 SHO, 0 SV, 51.1 IP, 37 H, 17 R, 15 ER, 11 BB, 48 SO.

'11 Season (Detroit): 24-5, 2.40 ERA, 34 G, 34 GS, 4 CG, 2 SHO, 0 SV, 251.0 IP, 174 H, 73 R, 67 ER, 57 BB, 250 SO.

**JUSTIN'S CASE:** In his seventh full season at the major league level, Verlander will make his eighth start of the season this afternoon at Oakland.

**LOOKING AT THE LEADERS:** Verlander enters his start this afternoon at Oakland fourth among all American League pitchers with 48 strikeouts, while he is fifth with 4.36 strikeouts per nine innings, tied for fifth with a .198 batting average against, is eighth with 6.49 hits per nine innings, tied for ninth with 1.9 walks per nine innings and is 10th with 8.4 strikeouts per nine innings.

**QUALITY WORK AGAINST OAKLAND:** Verlander is making the 12th start of his career versus Oakland this afternoon. He has posted a quality start in nine of his previous 11 outings against the club.

**ROAD WORK:** Verlander enters this start today at Oakland having won each of his last 12 decisions on the road dating back to July 10, 2011. He has compiled a 2.82 ERA (92.2IP/29ER) and 96 strikeouts over the 13-start stretch. It marks the longest road winning streak by a Tigers pitcher since Denny McLain won 16 straight on the road April 21-August 16, 1968.

**MASTERING THE MONTH OF MAY:** Verlander is making the 38th start of his career during the month of May this afternoon at Oakland. In his previous 37 outings during the month, he is 22-8 with a 2.75 ERA (258.2IP/79ER) and 214 strikeouts.

**GETTING THROUGH SIX IS BECOMING AUTOMATIC:** Verlander has worked six-or-more innings in each of his last 49 starts for the Tigers dating back to August 22, 2010. It marks the longest such streak by a major league pitcher since Mark Buehrle also did so in 49 straight starts May 11, 2004-July 26, 2005. Steve Carlton was the last major league pitcher with a longer such streak as he worked six-or-more innings in 69 consecutive starts September 13, 1979-April 13, 1982. Verlander's streak of starts in which he has worked six-or-more innings is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since at least 1918.

**MOVING UP THE TIGERS ALL-TIME STRIKEOUTS LIST:** Verlander enters his start this afternoon versus the Athletics seventh in Tigers history with 1,263 strikeouts during his career. With 117 more strikeouts, he would tie George Mullin for sixth on the club's all-time list with 1,380 strikeouts.

**RECORD AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM:** Verlander is making the ninth start of his career at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum this afternoon. In his previous eight outings, he is 3-4 with a 2.62 ERA (55.0IP/16ER).

**OPENING DAY NOD:** Verlander made his fifth career Opening Day start on April 5 against the Red Sox. He is the first Tigers pitcher to start five consecutive Opening Days since Jack Morris started 11 straight (1980-90).

**PUTTING UP BLANKS ON OPENING DAY:** Verlander fired eight shutout innings on April 5 versus the Red Sox, but did not factor in the decision in Detroit's 3-2 win. He is the first Tigers pitcher to toss eight-or-more shutout innings on Opening Day since Mickey Lolich went the distance in a 5-0 win at Washington on April 6, 1970.

**HIS 200TH CAREER START:** Verlander made the 200th start of his major league career on April 5 versus the Red Sox. He became the 19th pitcher in Tigers history to start at least 200 games for the club.

**GOING WITHOUT A LOSS:** Verlander did not suffer a loss over 14-start stretch July 21, 2011-April 5, 2012. His streak of 14 consecutive starts without a loss marked the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Jeremy Bonderman did not suffer a loss in 17 straight starts September 10, 2006-June 20, 2007. Bobo Newsom holds the club record with 18 straight starts without suffering a loss April 25-July 17, 1940.

**PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS EARLY IN THE SEASON:** Verlander fanned seven batters on May 2 versus Kansas City, marking his fifth start with seven-or-more strikeouts in Detroit's first 24 games. He joined Mickey Lolich as the only two Tigers pitchers since at least 1918 to have at least five games with seven-or-more strikeouts in the club's first 24 games of a season. Lolich posted six such games in 1970 and five such games in 1972.

**MVP AND CY YOUNG AWARD WINNER:** Verlander was selected the American League Most Valuable Player and he was unanimously named the American League Cy Young Award winner in 2011. He became the 10th pitcher in major league history to win both awards in the same season.

**TAKING HOME THE AL TRIPLE CROWN IN 2011:** Verlander led all American League pitchers with 24 wins, a 2.40 ERA and 250 strikeouts during the 2011 season to become just the second Tigers pitcher to ever lead all three categories during a single season. Hal Newhouser accomplished the feat for the Tigers during the 1945 season. Verlander is the first pitcher to lead the league in all three categories since Minnesota's Johan Santana did so in 2006.

**LOOKING FURTHER AT THE AL LEADER BOARDS IN 2011:** Verlander topped the American League with an .828 winning percentage, 251.0 innings pitched, a .192 batting average against, 6.24 hits per nine innings and 8.39 baserunners per nine innings during the 2011 season, while he tied for the lead with 34 games started, finished third with 9.0 strikeouts per innings and 4.39 strikeouts per walk, tied for fourth with four complete games, tied for fifth with two shutouts and tied for seventh with 2.0 walks per nine innings.

**THREE STRAIGHT SEASONS WITH 200-OR-MORE STRIKEOUTS:** Verlander fanned 250 batters for the Tigers during the 2011 season, marking the third consecutive season he has posted 200-or-more strikeouts. His streak of three straight seasons with 200-or-more strikeouts is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Mickey Lolich did so in six straight seasons (1969-74).

**FIVE STRAIGHT SEASONS WITH 200-OR-MORE INNINGS:** Verlander tossed 251.0 innings during the 2011 season, marking the fifth consecutive season he has surpassed the 200.0-inning mark with the Tigers. His streak of five straight seasons with 200.0-or-more innings pitched is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Jack Morris did so in seven straight seasons (1982-88).

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Verlander was selected by the Tigers in the first round (second overall) of the June 2004 draft. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad four times during his career (2007, 2009-11). Verlander was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 2006. He was selected the American League Most Valuable Player and unanimously named the American League Cy Young Award winner in 2011.
