WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers lost to the A's 12-1 last night, as club is 1-3 to begin this 10-game, 10-day road trip to Anaheim (1-2), Oakland (0-1), and San Francisco (3 games)...snapped a season-high 4-game losing streak with Sunday's win, longest since 2011 season-high 5-game losing streak, June 11-16, 2011...that was the only time last year the Rangers lost more than 3 in a row...the losing streak was preceded by club's 2nd-longest win streak of the year (4 G, May 25-28)...team has lost 5 of 6, but is 6-6 last 12, 9-9 last 18, and 17-19 since a 15-4 start...the 17-18 (.472) mark beg. April 27 ranks 10th in A.L. in that span...team is 10-7-1 in series in '12, going 4-7-1 in last 12 after winning 1st 6 to open year...the Rangers' **A.L.-best .582 winning pct. is 2nd in majors** (LAD-.618, 34-21)...Texas was first A.L. team w/ 30 wins...team was season-high 13 games above .500 after May 28 win...have majors' best win pct. since 2011 All-Star break at .616 (77-48).

IN THE LEAD: Texas leads Los Angeles-AL in the A.L. West by 4.5 games for a 2nd straight day...current margin is largest for any division leader in majors, 1.5 games better than the Dodgers and Reds (both +3.0 GA)...Rangers have had a lead of at least 3.5 games for 49 straight days beginning April 17...team has had season-high 6.5-game lead for 4 days this season, last following a win May 28...team has led by at least 5.0 games for 13 of last 18 days...Rangers have had outright possession of A.L. West lead for last 57 days and have held at least a share of the West lead for 58 of 60 days in 2012 and for 194 of the last 196 days beginning May 16, 2011...beginning June 8, 2010, Texas has held 1st place for 344 of last 360 days.

GENTRY ON THE MOUND: Craig Gentry allowed 2 runs in the 8th inning last night, becoming just the 4th position player (5th instance) in Rangers history to pitch in a game, the first in nearly 12 years.

CRAZY EIGHTS: There have been 4 major league pitchers to allow 8-or-more runs in an inning this season (all exactly 8 R), and Texas has been involved in all 4 of them...club scored 8 runs off Detroit's Rick Porcello in the first inning on April 21 at Detroit (Game 1)...Texas pitchers own 3 of the 4 instances: Derek Holland (8-run 2nd) and Yoshinori Tateyama (8-run 3rd) on Wednesday vs. Seattle, and also Scott Feldman (8-run 2nd) last night...this is the first time Texas has ever seen 3 individuals allow 8-run innings in one season, and it has all happened in a span of 5 team games.

SHORT STARTS: Texas has seen a pair of 1.2-inning starts in just one turn through the rotation (also Holland on Wed. vs. SEA), something that also happened once in 2011...Colby Lewis lasted 1.1 IP on 6/11/11 at MIN, and Alexi Ogando followed on the same road trip with 1.2 IP on 6/14/11 at NYY.

FEW HITS: Texas ended last night with a season-low 3 hits, fewest hits since Aug. 25, 2011 vs. Boston (3) and lowest road hit total in nearly a year since June 12, 2011 at Minnesota (2).

ANOTHER 10: Mike Napoli hit his 10th homer last night, giving him 6 career seasons of 10+ HR...he is the 3rd Ranger with 10+ HR this season (also Hamilton-21 and Beltre-10)...Rangers have joined 2 other teams in tying for the ML lead with 3 players having 10+ HR: Chicago-AL (Dunn/Konerko/Viciedo) and St. Louis (Beltran/Freese/Holliday).

A GOOD TIME FOR IT: Napoli's HR led off the 9th inning and provided the Rangers' only run last night, maintaining the Rangers' position as one of only 4 big league teams that has yet to be shut out in 2012 (also Cleveland, Detroit, and San Francisco)...Rangers did not have an at-bat with RISP last night until the 9th inning, after Napoli's HR...Texas has gone the first 55 games of the year without being blanked, 6th-longest season-opening streak in team history and longest since 2008 (96 G).

CLOSE CALL: Texas was held hitless for 7.0 innings by Jarrod Parker last night before Michael Young's leadoff single in the 8th...since Mark Buehrle no-hit the Rangers on April 18, 2007 in Chicago, it was just the 4th time that Texas has been held without a hit for at least 7 frames...each of those potential no-hit bids have ended with a hit by the leadoff batter in the 8th...the other instances: 5/1/07 vs. NYY - Phil Hughes (6.1 IP) and Mike Myers (0.2 IP) until a Hank Blalock leadoff double in 8th; 9/17/10 at SEA - Felix Hernandez (7.0 IP) until Nelson Cruz leadoff HR in 8th; 6/12/11 at MIN - Francisco Liriano (7.0 IP) until Adrian Beltre leadoff single in 8th.

IT DOESN'T HAPPEN: Elias Sports Bureau notes that the Rangers were came close to being no-hit as the major league leader in batting average (.288 before last night), a feat which has not happened since the Dodgers' Hideo Nomo pulled the trick on Sept. 17, 1996 at Colorado in Coors Field...the Rockies had entered that game...Colorado was batting .290 going into that game, including a .348 mark at Coors Field...Elias also notes that Mets' Johan Santana had his no-hitter against the N.L. batting average-leader Cardinals (.281 going into game).

A LOSS IS A LOSS?: Over the Rangers' first 49 games, the club's biggest losing margin was 6 runs, and the team had been out-scored by more than 3 runs just 3 times all year...over the last 6 games, Texas has seen losses by 7, 13, and 11-run margins...despite the recent defeats, 17 of club's 23 losses in 2012 have been by 3-runs-or-less.

ON THE ROAD: Current 10-game road trip matches longest in 2012 (one of 3 such trips)...club has dropped 4 of 5, 5 of 7, and 6 of last 9 on the road...the Rangers' .586 (17-12) road winning percentage is still 4th-best in the A.L. and majors...the 17 wins are tied with White Sox and Braves for most in the majors...this matches Rangers' 2nd-best 29-game road record in team history, best road start since opening 17-12 in 2006...Texas tops majors on road in average (.289) and on-base percentage (.350), ranking among ML leaders in slugging (2nd, .454), hits (2nd, 305), runs (2nd, 159) and HR (T4th, 36)...just 3 HR last 6 road games.

VS. OAKLAND: Texas is scheduled for a week's worth of games against Oakland (4) and San Francisco (3)...Oakland is the last A.L. West city for Texas to visit this season...Texas is 1-2 against A's this season, having lost 2 in a row...Texas went 13-6 last year vs. A's in '11, matching club's 2nd-most wins ever against one opponent in a single season (15-4 vs. SEA in '11)...have won 13 of last 17 vs. A's beg. 5/10/11...Texas was 6-4 at the Coliseum last year, and has won 9 of last 14 in Oakland dating to 9/24/10...Rangers lead all-time series, 308-294.

VS. A.L. WEST: Rangers are 9-10 vs. West in 2012, 2-5 on the road...club has lost 5 of 6, 6 of 8, and 8 of last 11 to West opponents overall...team is 2-4-1 in series against the division this year, having lost both road series (one each to SEA and LAA)...Rangers have still won 15 of 25, 22 of 35, and 43 of last 62 games vs. division, latter stretch beg. May 15, 2011...on the road against the West, Rangers have won 9 of 15 and 15 of 22, and are 20-9 since the '11 All-Star break...Rangers have won 5 of last 7 road series vs. A.L. West clubs.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#45 Derek Holland, LHP
(4-4, 5.11)

TONIGHT: The 25-year-old left-hander is slated to make his 11th start and 12th appearance of the season tonight in Oakland...is pitching on extra 5 days' rest after allowing 8 runs/earned runs - all in the 2nd inning - in only 1.2 IP last Wed. vs. Seattle, a 21-8 loss...season ERA went from 4.05 to 5.11 during the outing...has allowed 6 home runs in his last 3 starts...Rangers are 5-5 in his 9 starts...is 3-2 following a Rangers loss...is 14-6 with a 3.86 ERA (72 ER/167.2 IP) in 33 career games/22 starts vs. A.L. West foes but is 1-1 with a 10.00 ERA (10 ER/9.0 IP) in 2 starts against them this season...was in the Rangers Opening Day rotation for the 2nd straight season.

LAST START: Knocked out of the game after allowing 8 runs (all earned) in the 2nd inning, May 30 vs. SEA (L, 1.2 IP, 8 H, 8 R-ER, 2 BB, 2 SO, 2 HR, 51 pitches/28 strikes)...most runs allowed by a Rangers pitcher in one inning since Tommy Hunter (9, 2nd inn.) at BOS, 8/14/08; first at home since Darren Oliver (8, 3rd) vs. MIN, 5/25/98...with first reliever Yoshinori Tateyama allowing 8 runs/6 earned in the 3rd, became the first duo in Rangers history to each allow 8+ runs in the same game...as neither Holland (1.2 IP) nor Tateyama (0.2 IP) completed 2.0 IP, it marked only the 3rd time in the majors since 1918 that a team had 2 pitchers each allow 8+ runs in fewer than 2.0 innings - the others: Chien-Ming Wang (8 in 1.1 IP)/Anthony Claggett (8 in 1.2 IP), NYY vs. CLE, 4/18/09, and Bob Forsch (8 in 1.1 IP)/Steve Peters (8 in 1.2 IP), STL at SF, 7/9/88...according to Baseball-Reference, with Scott Feldman's 8-run, 1.2-inning outing yesterday, Rangers are just 12th team in ML history to have 3 pitchers allow at least 8 runs in fewer than 2.0 IP in one season.

2012: Club's no. 2 starter to begin the year, he has made quality starts in 6 of his first 10 starts this season...has allowed at least 5 ER in all 4 losses but pitched QS in other 6 starts...is 2-1 with a 2.84 ERA (8 ER/25.1 IP) and 24 strikeouts in 4 road starts this season, including 3 quality starts...opponents hitting .196 (18-92) in road starts, 7th-lowest road average in the majors...with Napoli as catcher: 2-2, 5.18 ERA (19 ER/33.0 IP), 4 QS in 6 starts; with Torrealba as catcher: 2-2, 5.02 ERA (16 ER/28.2 IP), 2 QS in 5 games/4 starts...has an unusual left-right split for a LHP, with right-handed batters hitting 45 points lower...holding RHB to .234 (41-175)...LHB are at .279 (17-61), the 6th-highest average against an A.L. lefty...batters leading off innings are hitting .193 (11-57), 3rd-lowest among all A.L. pitchers...first pitch: .393 (11-28)...1st time thru lineup: .267 (24-90); 2nd time: .216 (16-74); 3rd time: .206 (13-63)...top 4 batters in the order are batting .316 (36-114), while 5 thru 9 spots are hitting .180 (22-122)...opposition hitting .409 (18-44) with RISP, 2nd-highest in the A.L.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 3-1 with a 1.91 ERA (10 ER/47.0 IP) in 9 career games/6 starts against the A's...tossed quality starts in all 3 outings vs. Oakland in 2011, boasting a 2-0 record and 1.17 ERA (3 ER/23.0 IP) and including a 4-hit shutout at RBIA on 7/7/11...in 6 career starts vs. OAK, is 3-1 with a 1.64 ERA (7 ER/38.1 IP)...has allowed one run or fewer in 4 of 6 career starts vs. Oakland...is 1-1 with a 2.49 ERA (7 ER/25.1 IP) in 5 career games/4 starts at O.co Coliseum...has allowed 2 or fewer earned runs in his last 3 starts here...won his last start here, limiting the A's to one run on 2 hits with 7 strikeouts over 7.0 strong innings, 9/20/11.

ON THE ROAD: Is 2-1 with a 2.84 ERA (8 ER/25.1 IP) and 24 strikeouts against 10 walks in 4 road starts this season...would rank 8th in A.L. in road average if he qualified...reeled off QS in each of his first 3 road starts before allowing 5 ER in 5.0 IP at HOU on 5/19 in his last road outing...his .196 road opponents average ranks 7th in the majors...allowed one home run over his first 3 road starts before giving up 3 in his last road start...has allowed 4 or 5 hits and 2 or 3 walks in all 4 road starts.

OTHER STARTS: Took ND in his 1st start of the season April 7 vs. CWS (6.0 IP, 3 H, 3 R-ER, 3 BB, 5 SO)...in 2nd start, April 12 vs. SEA, earned 5-3 win to finish Rangers' season-opening 5-2 homestand (W, 7.1 IP, 5 H, 2 R-ER, 0 BB, 8 SO)...were his most innings and strikeouts ever in a walk-less start...finished the Rangers' 2-game sweep on April 18 at BOS with his 3rd quality start in a 6-3 win (W, 7.0 IP, 4 H, 2 R-ER, 3 BB, 7 SO)...extended his career-best winning streak to 7, dating back to 8/26/11...suffered the loss in opener of homestand on April 23 vs. NYY (6.0 IP, 9 H, 7 R-ER, 4 BB, 1 SO), snapping win streaks of 7 games (reg. season) and 8 games (reg. and post-season)...was first loss since 8/21/11 at CWS, his first loss in Arlington since 7/2/11 vs. FLA (0.2 IP, 5 R-ER)...on April 29, took a loss on ESPN Sunday Night Baseball vs.

TB in matchup with David Price (7.0 IP, 9 H, 5 R-ER, 2 BB, 8 SO)...gave up 4 straight hits to open the 3-run 2nd inning, but matched season high with 8 strikeouts...matched season high with 7.1 innings in ND at CLE, his 4th QS (7.1 IP, 5 H, 2 R/1 ER, 3 BB, 6 SO)...left in 8th with a 2-0 lead after allowing a pair of one-out singles to Brantley and Kipnis, but Mike Adams allowed both runners to score...the Rangers ultimately won in 11 innings on Adrian Beltre's pinch-hit, 3-run HR...started game 2 of doubleheader on 5/10 at BAL, allowing only 3 unearned runs and retiring 12 of final 15 in 7-3 victory...threw 1.0 inning in relief appearance on 5/14 vs. KC...lost 5/19 at HOU, as he permitted career-high 3 HR after Rangers took a 4-0 lead in eventual 6-5 defeat...the start was Holland's first in 9 days after receiving extended rest and making one relief appearance on 5/14...beat the Blue Jays on 5/25 with season-high 9 strikeouts in Texas' 14-3 victory (7.1 IP, 5 H, 2 R-ER, 1 BB, 9 SO, 1 HR, 105 pitches/75 strikes)...whiffed game's first 3 batters, then saw Rangers score 6 runs in the first inning...held Jays scoreless until solo HR by Encarnacion with 2 outs in 6th.

2011: Holland made his first career Opening Day roster with Texas as the club's no. 4 starter and went 16-5 with a 3.95 ERA (87 ER/198.0 IP) in 32 starts, establishing career highs in wins, starts, innings, and strikeouts (162)...his 16 wins were the most in Washington/Texas franchise history by any player under the age of 25...was particularly effective during the final 3 months of the regular season, winning 5 straight and 10 of his last 11 decisions to end the year...finished 2011 with the 5th-best winning percentage in the majors at .762...set a single-season club record by a left-hander with 4 complete game shutouts, trailing only Cliff Lee (6) for the ML lead in 2011.

POSTSEASON: Has gone 3-0 with a 3.82 ERA (15 ER/35.1 IP) in 12 games/4 starts in his postseason career, all with Texas in 2010-11...his 3 wins are T2nd-most by a Ranger in the postseason (also Cliff Lee), trailing only Colby Lewis (4)...he is 2-0, 3.48 (8R/20.2 IP) in his 4 career postseason starts, all in 2011, with Texas going 4-0 in those games...earned wins in 2011 ALDS Game 2 vs. Tampa Bay and 2011 World Series Game 4 vs. St. Louis...tossed 8.1 shutout innings and allowed just 2 hits in the latter victory, first pitcher with that combination in the Fall Classic since Pittsburgh's Nelson Briles in 1971 Game 5 vs. Baltimore (9.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R)...Holland (25 years, 14 days old) was also the 3rd-youngest starter in World Series history with 8.0 SHO IP on 2-hits-or-less.
