OAKLAND NOTES

- The Oakland Athletics tossed their 11th shutout this season, their second in the past four games...have won four straight games after losing three in a row...are a season-high tying 10 games over .500 at 65-55 (fourth time, last: 58-48 on August 3)...are 28-13 since the start of July, which is the **best record in the American League**...are third in the Wild Card race, ½ game behind second place Baltimore...swept a three-game series from the Indians for the first time since April 25-27, 2003, although the A's did sweep a four-game series, Sept. 17-20, 2009...are 3-0 on this six-game homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Minnesota (three games).
- Jarrod Parker** tossed a career-high tying eight innings (third time, last: July 21 vs. New York)...snapped his career-high three-game losing streak...had a 5.71 ERA (11 er in 17.1 ip) in three starts over that span...is 4-2 with a 2.04 ERA (12 er in 53.0 ip) in eight starts during the day and 4-4 with a 2.48 ERA (22 er in 80.0 ip) in 12 starts at home.
- Chris Carter** (2 for 4) is batting .368 (14 for 38) with six walks over his last 11 games.
- Yoenis Cespedes** (1 for 3) is batting .376 (47 for 125) since the All-Star Break, which **leads the American League**.
- Coco Crisp** (3 for 5) had a career-high tying five RBI (fifth time, last: Aug. 24, 2011 at New York-AL) and a season-high tying three hits (seventh time, last: Aug. 11 at Chicago)...that includes a three-run home run in the fifth inning...14 of his last 23 hits are for extra bases (eight doubles, two triples, four home runs).
- Brandon Moss** (2 for 4) hit his 13th home run of the season, which is an on-going career high...of his 39 hits this year, 20 are for extra bases (seven doubles, 13 home runs).

CLEVELAND NOTES

- The Cleveland Indians were shut out for the sixth time this season...are on a five-game losing streak...are 10-26 since the All-Star Break, which is the worst record in the American League...are 16-28 in day games...are 24-38 on the road and 30-29 at home...are 1-5 on this nine-game road trip to Los Angeles (1-2), Oakland (0-3) and Seattle (three games).
- Justin Masterson** is 4-7 with a 6.48 ERA (53 er in 73.2 ip) in 13 starts on the road compared to 5-4 with a 3.27 ERA (32 er in 88.0 ip) in 13 starts at home...is 1-4 with a 6.89 ERA (25 er in 32.2 ip) in nine career appearances, five starts, against the A's...that includes 0-4 with a 9.13 ERA (23 er in 22.2 ip) in five games, four starts, in Oakland.
- Michael Brantley** (1 for 4) is 21 for 65 (.323) with nine runs, seven doubles, one home run and six RBI over his last 18 games.
- Carlos Santana** (1 for 4) is batting .266 (37 for 139) with 10 doubles, eight home runs, 25 RBI and 28 walks over his past 42 games.
