**THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY:**  
**August 15**

**2004** - At 56-60 on the season and losers of six of their last seven, the Astros entered the 9th inning in Montreal trailing 4-2 to the Expos... an improbable three-run rally pushes Houston to a 5-4 win which would catapult the Astros to a furious 36-10 sprint to finish the season...the run erases a six-game deficit and punches Houston's ticket to the playoffs as the National League's Wild Card.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Astros will continue their nine-game road trip with the last of three in Oakland today at 2:35 p.m. CT...**LHP Erik Bedard** (3-8) is looking to pitch the Astros to a series sweep over the Athletics, but will have to do so opposite **RHP Sonny Gray** (0-1).

**VS. THE A'S:** This marks the Astros' third franchise series in Oakland, after having visited for three game series in 2002 (0-3) and in April of this season (0-3)...despite the Astros win-loss record (3-11) against the A's this season, each of the last five games between the two clubs have been determined by one run, while eight of the 14 contests have been determined by two-or-fewer runs.

**SWEEPSTAKES:** This series marks the first series victory by the Astros over the A's in franchise history...the Astros are going for their third series sweep of the season today as they swept consecutive road series from COL (2-0) and LAA (4-0) from May 29-June 3.

**HEALTHY RETURNS:** Houston and Oakland's offseason trade has worked out well for both clubs...the A's received **IF Jed Lowrie** in the deal and he's hit .285 with 48 RBI this season...Houston received **IF/OF Chris Carter** (22 HR, 56 RBI), **RHP Brad Peacock** (3.15 ERA over last five MLB games) and minor leaguer **C Max Stassi** (.274, 16 HR, 52 RBI with Double A Corpus Christi).

**LAST NIGHT'S RECAP:** Great defensive plays, a timely offense and solid pitching performances highlighted last night's 11-inning, 2-1 Astros victory over the Athletics...**RHP Jarred Cosart** (0ER/6IP) pitched thru the 6th inning before giving way to a much-maligned bullpen, which turned in 5.0 innings of 1-run relief...the win went to **RHP Lucas Harrell** (6-13), while **RHP Josh Fields** (0ER/1IP) picked up his second save of the season...the go-ahead run was produced by **C Carlos Corporan** (1x1, RBI), who doubled home **2B Jose Altuve** (2x5) in the 11th inning.

**IMPRESSIVE START:** Per Elias, **RHP Jarred Cosart** has pitched at least six frames and allowed no more than one earned run in five of his first six Major League games...the last pitcher to put up a line like that in five of his first six MLB appearances was **LHP Tom Browning**, for the Reds in 1984 and 1985.

**COSART MASTERPIECES:** Rookie starter **RHP Jarred Cosart** has posted a 1.15 ERA (5ER/39IP) thru his first six Major League starts...per Elias, this is the lowest ERA by a starter thru their first six MLB starts since **RHP Josh Collmenter** posted a 1.05 ERA (4ER/34.1IP) to begin his career as a starter in 2011 (excluding relief apps.).

**BLACKLEY TRADED TO RANGERS:** Yesterday, the Astros announced a trade sending **LHP Travis Blackley** to Texas in exchange for a player to be named later and cash considerations...Blackley was with Triple A OKC after being designated for assignment on Aug. 8.

**ROOKIE STARTERS:** The three rookie starters currently in the Astros rotation have each pitched well as of late...since 7/12, **RHP Jarred Cosart**, **RHP Brad Peacock** and **LHP Brett Oberholtzer** have a combined 1.34 ERA (11ER/73.2IP) in their 11 starts in that span.

**YOUNGBLOODS:** The Astros have the youngest roster in the Majors with an average age of 25.6...the club is currently carrying 13 rookies on their active roster, which includes five rookie relievers...Houston has had 12 players make their Major League debut this season.

**STREAKER:** **Jason Castro** has hit safely in a career-high 12 straight games...he is hitting .370 (17x46) during the streak with four doubles, two home runs and 10 RBI...the streak, which is the club high this season, is the longest by an Astro since **Carlos Lee's** 14-game run in 2011, and the longest by an Astros catcher since **Tony Eusebio's** 24-game run in 2000.

**CATCHING ON:** The Astros 19 combined HR from their catchers rank tied for first in the AL this season...the 19 HR are three behind the club record for catchers of 22, which was set in 2000.

**GRAND THEFT:** Since the All-Star break, the Astros rank tied for first among all Major League teams with 33 steals (also, MIL)...individually, **SS Jonathan Villar** ranks tied for first in the Majors in steals since the All-Star break with 11.

**FARMING SUCCESS:** The Astros combined minor league record of 401-304 (.569) is tops among all organizations...in 2012, the Astros had the top combined winning pct. among domestic minor league clubs (were last overall in both 2010 and 2011).

**SPRINGER UP FOR AWARD:** Astros prospect **OF George Springer** is one of five finalists for the USA Today Minor League Player of the Year Award...fans can vote for Springer by logging on to USAToday.com...the winner will be chosen by a combination of USA Today staff votes and online fan balloting...voting concludes on Aug. 21.

**BEST MINOR LEAGUE BALLPARKS:** Modern Woodmen Park, the home of the **Class A Quad Cities River Bandits**, was voted as the Best Minor League Ballpark after four weeks of nationwide voting by fans and readers of 10Best.com and USA TODAY...two other Astros affiliates home stadiums also ranked the top 10: **Double A Corpus Christi's** Whataburger Field (#6) and **Triple A OKC's** Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark (#9).

**LAST START - 8/9 vs. TEX:** had ND in 9-5 loss...despite the loss, registered 9th quality start of the season (6.2 IP, 7 H, 3 ER, 2 BB, 5 SO)...left game with in 7th with 4-3 lead.

**ABOUT BEDARD:** has held his opponent to 2 earned runs or less in 10 of his 16 starts since returning to the rotation on 5/11...has posted a 3.56 ERA (37ER/93.2IP) in those 16 starts.

**LAST FOUR:** has posted a 3.00 ERA (8ER/241IP) over his last 4 starts with a .198 opp. avg. and 27 K's in 24.0 IP.

• since 5/11, ranks 6th among left-handed AL starters in ERA (3.56) and 8th in strikeouts (82).

**2ND HALF:** has a .198 opponent's batting average (16x81) since the All-Star Break and 27 K's in 24.0 IP...his 10.13 SO per 9.0 IP since the Break ranks 3rd among AL starters and is tops among AL southpaw starters.

**CANADA-BORN:** left-handed starter was born in Navan, Ontario... is 1 of 6 Canadian-born pitchers to make 200+ Major League starts...among active Canada-born players, he ranks 3rd behind Ryan Dempster (346gs) and Jeff Francis (215gs) with 210 career starts.

• surpassed the 1100 strikeout-mark for his career on 6/19...has more K's than any Canadian-born left-hander in MLB history.

**NO HITS ALLOWED:** tossed 6.1 hitless innings on 109 pitches on 7/20 vs. SEA (4-2 loss) before exiting the game...the only other Astros pitcher to ever be pulled from a game without allowing a hit while pitching into at least the 7th was RHP Don Wilson (8IP) on 9/4/74 vs. CIN.

• became the 1st MLB pitcher to finish his night with 6.1+ hitless innings and receive a loss since BOS' Matt Young (8IP) received the loss in a 2-1 Cleveland win over the Red Sox on 4/12/92.

**vs. OAK:** is facing the A's for the 3rd time in 2013 and for the 14th time in his career...at O.co Coliseum: is 3-1 in 5 starts here with a 3.49 ERA (11ER/28.1IP) with a .170 opp. avg. and 30 K's in 28.1 IP (despite allowing 6 ER in 0.1 IP at O.co on 4/15).

**AT MINUTE MAID PARK:** has posted a 2-2 record with 1 save and a 2.93 ERA (19ER/58.1IP) in 11 games, 9 starts at Minute Maid Park this season.

• has 62 strikeouts in 58.1 innings pitched at home this season and has allowed just a .213.

**IN 2012:** made 24 starts for the Pirates in what was his first NL season...posted a 3.12 ERA with 51 strikeouts over his first 10 starts of the year from 4/5-5/27...allowed 52 earned runs in his next 14 starts before being given his unconditional release on 8/30.

**CAREER:** from 2006-09, was one of the most effective left-handed starters in the American League, ranking 4th in winning percentage with a 39-23 (.629) record, 2nd in ERA (3.40), 3rd in strikeouts (554), 1st in opponents batting average (.232), and 2nd in strikeouts per nine innings (9.19) among southpaws during that span...ranked 8th in MLB with 10 double-digit strikeout games from 2006-08.

• aside from his stint with the Pirates in 2012, has pitched his entire career in the American League with the Orioles (2004-05), Mariners (2008-11), Red Sox (2011) and Astros (2013).

• was signed by the Astros to a minor league contract with an invite to Spring Training on Jan. 21, 2013.
