A's vs. ORIOLAS

The A's trail the season series, 3-1...won the season series last year, 5-4...it was their fifth consecutive season series victory...went 2-1 in Oakland and 3-3 in Baltimore...have not lost a season series to Baltimore since 1998...are 83-42 (.664) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team** over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 250-248 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 125-129 in Oakland and 125-119 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 986-928 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp led off the game with a home run Wednesday afternoon...it was his fourth leadoff home run this year, his 10th as an Athletic and 12th of his career...the 10 leadoff homers are tied for second most in Oakland history.

Josh Donaldson has seven multiple hit games in his last 14 games and 43 for the season, which are the most by an Athletic over the last four years.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1975** Billy Williams homers twice in the second game of a doubleheader at Milwaukee and combines for six hits in the A's sweep of the Brewers...in **1983** Rickey Henderson has three hits and steals four bases in the A's 9-3 win at New York.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won four of the last seven games and seven of the last 13 after losing six of the previous seven contests...are 15-16 since the All-Star Break after going 56-39 before the break...are in second place in the American League West for the 13th consecutive day and trail Texas by 2½ games for the second consecutive day...those are the A's most games out of first since May 31 when they were three out...currently have the second Wild Card spot, 1½ games behind Tampa Bay and 2½ games ahead of third place Cleveland...have spent 57 days in sole possession of first, nine days tied for first, 66 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...went 12-4 over the first 16 games this year (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 from April 19 to May 10 (tied for the worst in the majors), 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors), 6-9 from June 8 to 24 (tied for second worst in the majors), 19-9 from June 25 to July 29 (third best in the majors) and 1-6 from July 30 to August 7 (second worst in the majors)...are 7-6 since August 8 (tied for ninth best in the majors)...are 212-175 (.548) since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is the 10th best record in the majors over that span.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in five of the last 10 games and have a 2.93 ERA (30 er in 92.0 ip) over that span...now have a 3.58 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have walked just 326 batters, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (Atlanta)...are on pace to walk 419 batters...the Oakland record for fewest walks in a non-strike season is 415 in 1976...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.297) and the second lowest batting average (.242) and slugging percentage (.381)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .300 was in 1972 (.284)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 103 consecutive games, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 139-game streak from May 20, 1972-April 18, 1973...it is the second longest streak by an AL team since 1992 (Toronto, 136 from May 17, 2008-April 24, 2009)...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer six of the last 10 games and are 2-3 with a 2.49 ERA (18 er in 65.0 ip) over that span...are 36-20 with a 3.25 ERA (191 er in 529.0 ip) over the last 84 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA over the first 42 contests...are 50-41 with a 3.83 ERA (327 er in 769.1 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), are tied for second in complete games (5), rank third in ERA, fourth in wins and fifth in innings...the A's have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is their fewest since employing six in 2004...in the majors, only Detroit has used fewer starters this year (6)...the A's started a right-handed pitcher in 13 consecutive games from August 3-17, which was their longest such streak since July 21-Oct. 2, 1999 when they did it in 68 consecutive games.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 18 errors in the last 20 games, which has led to 13 unearned runs...made 61 errors over the first 106 games leading to 23 unearned runs...have turned 91 double plays, which is second fewest in the majors (Cincinnati, 90)...rank last in the majors in assists (1083).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .262 (126 for 481) with 64 runs scored over the last 14 games (4.57 runs per game) after hitting .209 with 72 runs scored (3.13 per game) over the previous 23 contests...are batting .244 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...A's outfielders have combined for a Major League low .222 (326 for 1467) batting average...the lowest mark by A's outfielders since at least 1916 is .228 in 1979...A's designated hitters are batting .212 (94 for 443), which is fourth lowest in the AL...it is currently second lowest in A's history (.203 in 1987)...have hit 21 home runs in the last 15 games after homering just twice over the previous seven contests...have 455 walks, which ranks third in the majors...have 17 sacrifice hits, which is tied for second fewest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: Four of the A's last nine games have been decided by one run and they are 2-2 in those contests...are 23-16 (.579) in one-run games for the season...rank third in the American League in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...are 7-5 (.583) in extra inning games...have seven "walk-off" wins...are 15-9 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors with 13 wins when trailing after six innings...have won three games where they have overcome a five-run deficit, marking the first time the A's have done that three times in a season since 2002.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are batting .139 (15 for 108), which is the lowest mark in the American League...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in strikeouts (33), rank second in plate appearances (126), home runs (4) and walks (16) and are tied for second in RBI (13)...the 16 walks are the most by an A's team since 2000 (21), the 124 plate appearances are the most since 2001 (128) and the home runs are the most since 2002 (5).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a seven-game road trip to Baltimore (three games) and Detroit (four games) today...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Cincinnati (0-2) and Toronto (3-1) and are 32-30 (.516) on the road...went 4-5 on their last homestand against Houston (1-2), Cleveland (2-1) and Seattle (1-2) are 39-25 (.609) in Oakland for the season, which is the fourth best home record in the American League...are in the middle of a stretch where they will play 29 of 42 (July 25-Sept. 8) games at home...have a 10-game homestand against Tampa Bay (three games), Texas (three games) and Houston (four games) beginning Aug. 30.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 8-10 in the month of August...went 15-10 in July and have posted a winning record in eight consecutive months dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 19-22 against the West since May 10 while going 34-15 against everyone else...have used the disabled list 11 times this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8)...have used 40 players...have not used fewer than 48 players in a season since 2006 when they used 40...have used 17 pitchers, which is the fewest since 2004 (17)...the A's average time of game is 3:05, which is currently second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season, his seventh since being recalled from Sacramento July 20...the A's are 11-9 (.550) in his starting assignments this year and are 16-11 (.593) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 10 of his 20 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-5 with a 4.09 ERA (15 er in 33.0 ip) and .300 (39 for 130) opponents batting average in six starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 20...the five losses are tied for the most in the majors since the All-Star Break (Williams, LAA)...the five-game losing streak is the longest of his career and matches the A's season high (Milone)...it comes on the heels of a five-game winning streak from May 21 to July 9...posted a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned nine starts.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in four of his six starts since the All-Star Break and has two runs of support or fewer in all six starts (3 rs in 33.0 ip, 0.82 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 14 of his 20 starts for the season and is 4-7 in those games...his season run support of 3.27 is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Leads American League rookies in games started (20), strikeouts (92) and innings pitched (113.0) and is tied for second in wins (6).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 5-2 with a 2.77 ERA (19 er in 61.2 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-5 with a 5.96 ERA (34 er in 51.1 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-2 with a 2.47 ERA (24 er in 87.1 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-6 with a 6.37 ERA (46 er in 65.0 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded a .213 (35 for 164) batting average the first time through the lineup, .236 (39 for 165) the second time and .302 (29 for 96) after that...the mark the first time through the lineup is seventh lowest in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings...opponents are batting .302 (26 for 86) with runners in scoring position, including .351 (13 for 37) with RISP and two outs...the mark with RISP and two outs is third highest in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings...the opponents number three hitter is batting .365 (19 for 52), which is seventh highest in the AL...has issued 25 of his 38 walks to left-handed hitters.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed nine home runs in his last 10 starts, snapping a six-game, 40.0-inning homerless streak...has surrendered 12 home runs for the season...10 have been solo shots and eight have come in the first two innings of a game...has allowed five home runs in 33.0 innings since the All-Star Break after surrendering seven in 80.0 innings before the break.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-6 with a 5.03 ERA (43 er in 77.0 ip) and .261 (78 for 299) opponents batting average in 14 starts at night compared to 2-1 with a 2.50 ERA (10 er in 36.0 ip) and .198 (25 for 126) opponents average in six starts during the day...has allowed all 12 of his home runs at night.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 2-4 with a 6.32 ERA (33 er in 47.0 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition compared to 4-3 with a 2.73 ERA (20 er in 66.0 ip) in 11 starts against all other teams...his career numbers are 3-4 with a 5.84 ERA (45 er in 69.1 ip) in 13 starts against the West, 5-4 with a 2.71 ERA (25 er in 83.0 ip) in 14 starts against everyone else.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento July 20 for his fifth stint with the A's this year and is 0-5 with a 4.09 ERA (15 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and started the fifth game of the season April 5 at Houston...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Bartolo Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with the River Cats before being recalled from Sacramento April 29 to start for Brett Anderson...started that night, was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and recalled May 1 when Anderson went on the DL...went 3-2 with a 4.69 ERA in 10 starts before he was optioned to Sacramento June 23 as the A's had three days off over an eight-day stretch...returned July 4 and went 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA in two starts before he was sent back to Sacramento July 10 with the All-Star Break approaching.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss to Cleveland last Saturday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the first inning on a solo home run by Swisher and a RBI single by Cabrera...then blanked the Indians on two hits and two walks over the next four innings...allowed a RBI double to Cabrera in the sixth and left trailing 3-0 after 5.2 innings...Jimenez and four relievers held the A's to a run on three hits.

STRAILY vs. BALTIMORE: Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 9-5 loss in Oakland last year on September 16...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed single runs in the second, third, fourth and fifth...Wieters had solo home runs in the second and fourth and Hardy had a RBI single in the third...walked Reynolds with the bases loaded and two outs in the fifth and was relieved by Blackley trailing 4-2.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA in five starts with Sacramento...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA over his first three starts before being promoted to Oakland April 29...was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins as of April 29 promotion...has a .202 opponents batting average, including .174 (8 for 46) by left-handed hitters compared to .219 (16 for 73) by right-handers...has allowed just one home run in 31.2 innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (9-6, 3.71 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 26th start of the season...is 7-0 with a 2.59 ERA (29 er in 100.2 ip) and .204 (73 for 358) opponents batting average over his last 15 starts...the winning streak is a career high (previous: 4, Sept. 10-Oct. 1, 2012) and the second longest active streak in the American League...it is one short of the A's season high of eight (Colón, May 20-June 28)...the 15-start unbeaten streak is tied for third longest in Oakland history...it is the longest since Dan Haren had a 16-start streak from April 13-July 1, 2007...tossed his first career complete game in his last start, the 55th of his career...it was his 54th start as an Athletic and the 53 consecutive starts without a complete game is the fourth longest streak in Oakland history...is 1-1 with a 7.27 ERA (14 er in 17.1 ip) in three career starts against Baltimore.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

The A's bullpen has a 4.33 ERA (17 er in 35.1 ip) and .259 (36 for 139) opponents batting average over its past 12 games (since August 9) after posting a 1.78 ERA and .175 opponents average in its previous 19 contests...now has a 3.07 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...has the fewest walks (112) and strikeouts (320) in the AL and has allowed the fewest home runs (27)...ranks second in opponents on-base percentage (.292) and slugging percentage (.346) and is tied for third in batting average (.230)...is fourth in save percentage (70.8%)...first batters faced are 68 for 318 (.214) with 19 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, .260 on-base percentage)...has allowed the fewest first batter walks in the AL and has the lowest on-base percentage.

- Has not allowed a run in 17 of his past 19 games (3 er in 18.0 ip, 1.50 ERA) and is 13 of 14 in save opportunities over that span.
- Ranks second in the American League in save percentage (96.9%), is sixth in saves (31) and eighth among AL relievers in ERA (1.84)...his 31 saves are the most by an A's pitcher since 2006 (Huston Street, 37).
- Now has 57 career saves with the A's, which ranks eighth in Oakland history...is four away from tying Jay Howell (61) for seventh place.
- Has recorded 499 career strikeouts and is one away from the 500th of his career.
- His opponents have a .192 batting average, which includes .170 (15 for 88) against left-handed hitters and .213 (19 for 89) against righties.
- Has a 1.14 ERA (4 er in 31.2 ip) in 33 games at night compared to 3.12 (6 er in 17.1 ip) in 18 day games.
- Is 2-1 with five saves, two blown saves and a 3.27 ERA in 32 games in his career against the Orioles (33.0 ip, 20 h, 12 r, 12 er, 15 bb, 32 so, 1 hr).
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10th in saves.
