OAKLAND ATHLETICS (12-9-5) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (15-9-3)

SUNDAY, MARCH 23, 2014 – PEORIA STADIUM – 1:05 P.M.

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 6-3-1 over the last 10 games after going 1-4-3 over the previous eight contests...are batting .319 (116 for 364) with 89 runs scored over the last 10 games...lead the majors in walks (109), rank second in runs (163) and on-base percentage (.363), tied for third in grounded into double plays (24) and fourth in batting (.286)...A's pitchers have allowed 21 home runs in the last 13 games and a Major League leading 33 for the spring...also rank second in the majors in strikeouts (203)...the A's have five tie games, which are the most by an Oakland team since moving to Arizona for Spring Training in 1969...the previous high was three in 2010 and 2013...have 16 tie games over the last six springs...are 7-3-2 at Phoenix Muni and 5-6-3 on the road...this is the A's 46th Spring Training in Arizona, including their 33rd and final spring in Phoenix...return to Mesa next spring, where the A's trained from 1969-78 after moving from Florida...moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and have been in Phoenix since 1982...are scheduled to play 34 games this spring, including 31 games in Arizona and three in the Bay Area against San Francisco (March 27-29)...the A's went 17-13-3 last spring, which was the third best record in the Cactus League and sixth best in the majors...went 15-7-2 in 2012, marking the first time they have posted a winning record in consecutive springs since 2007-08.

YESTERDAY: The A's defeated the Mariners, 6-5 in Phoenix...Seattle scored twice in the first inning but the A's came back with two runs in the second on a RBI single by Eric Sogard and a bases loaded walk to Daric Barton...Stephen Vogt then hit a two-run home run in the third inning to give the A's the lead...the Mariners scored three times in the fifth to take a 5-4 lead but Vogt hit his second home run of the game in the bottom of the fifth, another two-run shot...Scott Kazmir started for the A's and had a no decision (4.1 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...Dan Otero allowed two runs in the fifth (0.2 ip) but picked up the win...Joe Savery tossed a scoreless sixth inning and Arnold Leon shutout the Mariners over the final three innings for the save...Vogt, Billy Burns and Derek Norris had two hits each.

PLAYER NOTES: **Daric Barton** is 4 for 16 (.250) with four walks and four RBI in five games after missing a week due to a left hamstring injury...**Billy Burns (NR)** stole his Major League leading 10th base yesterday against Seattle...those are the most steals by an Athletic player during a non-strike spring since at least 1991, the first year spring stats are available (previous: 7, Rajai Davis in 2009)...is tied for fifth in the Cactus League in runs (12) and tied for 10th in hits (18)...is 9 for 22 (.409) over his last seven games...**Alberto Callaspo** is 0 for 7 with four walks over his last three games after hitting safely in each of his previous five contests (7 for 15, .467)...has appeared in nine games at third base, three at first base and two at designated hitter...**Yoenis Céspedes** snapped a 0 for 23 streak with his sixth inning single last Monday against the Cubs...is now 2 for 30 (.067) over his last 10 games...has appeared in nine games in left field, including six of his last seven, and eight at designated hitter...**Coco Crisp** went 0 for 3 Friday night at San Francisco after reaching base safely via hit or walk in each of his first 11 games...is 9 for 19 (.474) over his last six games...is tied for the ML lead in walks (11)...**Josh Donaldson** is 8 for 26 (.308) with seven RBI over his last 10 games after going 1 for 11 (.091) with no RBI over his first five contests...**Jake Elmore** is 12 for 33 (.364) over his last 15 games after going 1 for 10 (.100) over his first five contests...has appeared in 12 games at second base, eight at third base and four at shortstop...**Nate Freiman** had his second multiple hit game Wednesday at Cleveland, including his first home run...is 8 for 23 (.348) with eight RBI over his last 14 games after going 1 for 15 with no RBI over his first eight contests...**Sam Fuld (NR)** ranks second in the CL in runs (14) and tied for fourth in triples (3)...has appeared in 11 games in left field, eight in center field and one in right field...**Chris Gimenez** is 2 for 4 (.500) over his last three games after going 1 for 15 over his previous 12 contests...has appeared in 19 games at catcher, one at first base and one in left field...**John Jaso** is 6 for 16 (.375) with seven RBI over his last six games...is tied for ninth in the CL in RBI (11)...**Jed Lowrie** went 0 for 3 Friday night at San Francisco after hitting safely in each of his previous eight games (9 for 25, .360) with four doubles, two home runs and nine RBI...is tied for third in the CL in RBI (12) and tied for ninth in doubles (5)...**Brandon Moss** is 4 for 15 (.267) over his last six games after going 9 for 18 (.500) over his first six contests...is tied for ninth in the CL in RBI (11)...**Derek Norris** has hit safely in each of his last six games (10 for 20, .500) and has four multiple hit games over that stretch...**Nick Punto** went 0 for 2 Friday night at San Francisco after reaching base safely via hit or walk in each of his first 13 games...is 8 for 18 (.444) over his last six games after going 4 for 18 (.222) over his previous seven contests...has appeared in seven games at shortstop and seven at second base...**Josh Reddick** is 5 for 24 (.208) over his last nine games after going 7 for 16 (.412) over his first six contests...**Eric Sogard** is 8 for 22 (.364) over his last eight

games after going 1 for 18 over his first seven contests...**Michael Taylor** is 3 for 16 (.188) over his last six games...is tied for eighth in the CL in total bases (32), tied for ninth in doubles (5) and ranks 10th in slugging (.615)...**Stephen Vogt** hit two home runs yesterday against Seattle and drove in four runs...now has 12 RBI for the spring, which is tied for third in the CL...is 4 for 14 (.286) with three home runs and seven RBI over his last six games.

A's vs. MARINERS: This is the second and final meeting between the A's and Mariners this spring...the A's won the first game yesterday in Phoenix, 6-5...the two clubs split two games last spring, both in Phoenix...the A's won 7-3 on March 7 and lost 6-5 on March 18...the one scheduled game in Peoria was rained out after four innings.

IN CAMP: The A's have 38 players in camp, including 36 players on the 40-man roster, which is full, and two non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 18 pitchers, four catchers, nine infielders and seven outfielders...the total does not include Eric O'Flaherty and Jarrod Parker, who are on the 60-day disabled list.

PHOENIX MUNI FAREWELL: The A's have three games remaining in Phoenix Muni, including today's game against Chicago (NL)...face Cincinnati on Tuesday and Los Angeles (AL) on Wednesday...this is the A's final spring in Phoenix as last March the team and the City of Mesa reached a 20-year agreement for the A's to return to Mesa beginning in 2015...Oakland, which also holds two five-year options that could extend the contract to 30 years, will conduct workouts at Fitch Park and play its Spring Training games at Hohokam Stadium, the former home of the Chicago Cubs...Fitch Park and Hohokam Stadium are currently undergoing \$20 million in renovations.

MEDIA INFORMATION: The A's clubhouse at Phoenix Municipal Stadium will be open to members of the media with proper credentials beginning at 8:00 am...the clubhouse may be closed at certain times for team meetings, etc...please do not lounge or conduct interviews in the weight room/exercise area...once the games begin, the clubhouse is open only to those media who need access to players who have completed their work for the day...A's manager Bob Melvin will be available to the media each morning in the first base dugout at stretch time...Melvin will also be available in front of the dugout following the game...members of the media will be allowed in the dugout area and foul territory behind home plate extending down to (but not past) first and third base until the batting cage is removed from the field of play...at that point, all media members must leave the field...the A's dugout will remain accessible to the media until 45 minutes before game time...still photographers and television camera crews with proper credentials must stay in assigned areas at all times...no roving is permitted...still photographers or television camera crews are not allowed in the clubhouse, training room or weight room...lunch is available for \$8 to members of the media with proper credentials in the patio area in the right field corner...complimentary parking is available in the main lot at Phoenix Muni at the corner of Van Buren and Priest by presenting your credential to the attendant.

A's ON THE AIR: The A's radio network and flagship station 95.7 FM The Game will broadcast 15 games this spring, including 12 from Arizona and all three games against San Francisco in the Bay Area in April...the remaining Arizona schedule includes today against the Cubs...Ken Korach returns for his 19th year in the broadcast booth and will be joined by Vince Cotroneo (ninth) and Ray Fosse, who enters his 29th season in the booth...Comcast SportsNet California has one remaining game on March 28 against the Giants in San Francisco (7:15 PM)...Glen Kuiper joins Fosse in the broadcast booth for that telecast...all games not broadcast over the air can be heard live via the club's web site...in addition, two remaining games from Arizona will be carried on MLB Network on tape delay: today vs. CHI (12:00 am PT on March 24) and March 24 vs. TEX (11:00 pm PT).

#25 JOSH LINDBLOM RHP (0-2, 4.09 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his sixth appearance and first start of the spring...has allowed at least one run in four of his five outings...was acquired from the Texas Rangers with Craig Gentry for Michael Choice and minor leaguer Chris Bostick, December 3, 2013...spent most of the 2013 season at Triple-A Round Rock but also had three stints with Texas...went 1-3 with a 5.46 ERA in eight games, five starts...the starts were the first of his Major League career...allowed a .278 opponents average, including .262 (11-for-42) against right-handed hitters compared to .286 (24-for-84) against left-handers...yielded a .193 batting average the first time through the lineup and .182 with runners in scoring position...was 8-4 with a 3.08 ERA in 20 games, 18 starts, with Round Rock...had minor league career-highs in wins, starts and innings pitched...allowed a .214 opponents batting average, including .207 (39-for-188) against left-handed pitching compared to .220 (47-for-214) against right-handers...went 7-0 with a 1.99 ERA and .197 opponents batting average over his first 11 games.

#56 FERNANDO ABAD LHP (0-0, 4.00 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his 10th appearance of the spring...is tied for the Cactus League lead in appearances (9)...has not allowed a run in six of his nine outings, including his last appearance Wednesday at Cleveland (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not walked a batter in 9.0 innings...was acquired from the Washington Nationals for minor league infielder John Wooten, November 25, 2013...began the 2013 season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances when he was promoted to Washington May 21...spent the remainder of the season with the Nationals, going 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances...allowed a .271 opponents batting average but surrendered just nine extra base hits for a career-low .368 slugging percentage...yielded a .247 (23-for-93) average to right-handed hitters compared to .306 (19-for-62) against left-handers...had a 1.83 ERA in 20 appearances before the All-Star Break but then posted a 5.00 ERA in 19 games after the

break...pitched for Toros del Este in the Dominican Winter League following the season and was 0-1 with a 4.70 ERA in eight relief appearances.

#58 EVAN SCRIBNER RHP (0-0, 3.12 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his eighth appearance of the spring...has not allowed a run in six of his seven appearances, including his last outing Tuesday at Chicago-AL (1.0 ip, 1 so)...has walked just one batter in 8.2 innings...spent most of the 2013 season with Triple-A Sacramento but appeared in 18 games over five stints with the A's...had no decisions, a 4.39 ERA and .243 opponents batting average...allowed a .220 (11-for-50) opponents average against left-handed hitters compared to .263 (15-for-57) with all three of his home runs against right-handers...was 3-1 with a save, a 2.22 ERA and .192 opponents batting average in 31 relief appearances with the River Cats...yielded just two home runs in 44.2 innings...walked just nine batters while striking out 58 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.44...averaged 1.81 walks per nine innings and 11.69 strikeouts...allowed just 3-of-20 (15.0%) inherited runners to score...his opponents batting average included a .164 (12-for-73) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .213 (20-for-94) against right-handers...opponents were 2-for-21 (.095) with runners in scoring position and two outs.

2014 REGULAR SEASON

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's will open their 47th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3819-3502 (.522) record over the previous 46 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati).

FOR OPENERS: The A's have lost each of their last nine openers, which is tied for the longest Opening Day losing streak in Major League history...share the mark with the Atlanta Braves (1972-80) and New York Giants (1893-1901)...2014 marks the third time in Oakland history the A's have opened with the Indians...lost the previous two meetings, both in Oakland...dropped an 8-5 decision in 1983 and lost 9-7 in 1997...are 1-4 all-time against the Indians to start the season...the only win came on April 15, 1958, a 5-0 win by the Kansas City A's at Cleveland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 20-26 on Opening Day, including 16-12 in Oakland, 4-11 on

the road, 0-2 in Tokyo and 0-1 in Las Vegas...all-time, the Athletics are 52-61 in openers.

STARTING ROTATION: The A's starting rotation will feature, in order, RHP Sonny Gray, LHP Scott Kazmir, RHP Jesse Chavez, RHP Dan Straily and LHP Tommy Milone...Gray will become the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history behind Vida Blue (1971), Catfish Hunter (1968), Trevor Cahill (2011) and Blue Moon Odom (1969)...Gray will be the A's ninth different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last nine years and the 19th different in the last 22.
