**2012**

- Underwent surgery on December 18 to remove a bone spur from his right elbow...The surgery was performed by Mets Medical Director Dr. David Altchek at the Hospital for Special Surgery in Manhattan.
- Placed on the 15-Day Disabled List with a left oblique strain on June 24... Reinstated from the 15-Day Disabled List on August 3.
- Became the third closer in major league history to record a save in every game of a season-opening series of three or more games...Earned all three saves with a strikeout of the final batter...Derrick Turnbow of the Brewers in 2006 and Salomon Torres of the Pirates in 2007 were the others.
- Collected three saves in as many days for the second time against Arizona on May 5 in a 4-3 win, May 6 in a 3-1 win and May 7, a 5-2 win over Philadelphia.
- Worked a 1-2-3 ninth inning on August 18 in a 2-0 win at Washington to earn his 20th save of the season...The second 20 save season of his career (had 25 saves in 2009 with Texas).
- Finished 23 for 26 in save opportunities.
- Limited the opposition to a .216 (8-37) batting average in late inning pressure situations, with runners in scoring position.
- Opponents hit .241 (14-58) with runners in scoring position.
- Worked the second fewest innings in a season during his career (42.1)... Threw 7.1 innings over eight games in 2006...Also recorded the second fewest strikeouts (47) in a season during his career.
- Led the bullpen in saves (23).
- Converted nine of 10 save opportunities during the month of May... Recorded 14 strikeouts in 11.1 inning pitched.
- Did not permit a run in nine of his final 10 outings from August 24-September 16.
- Made his final appearance of the year on September 16 at Milwaukee...Did not pitch again due to a sore right elbow.
- Made five rehab appearances for Binghamton (AA) of the Eastern League...Allowed two runs, earned, on six hits in 4.2 innings pitched with four strikeouts.

**2011**

- Began the season on the 15-Day Disabled List, with a sore right pectoral muscle...Was activated on April 19.
- Ranked fifth among American League relievers with 302 strikeouts over the last five years (2007-2011).
- Went 0-0 with seven saves and a 1.37 ERA (four earned runs/26.1 innings) after the All-Star break.
- Tossed 16.0 straight scoreless innings from July 22-September 5.
- Led the Blue Jays with 17 saves.
- Converted 12 of his final 13 save opportunities.
- Allowed one of 11 inherited runners to score...For his career, has permitted 26 of 144 inherited runners to score (18.1 percent).
- Held righthanded batters to a .177 (14-79) average.
- Had nine saves and a 2.51 ERA (eight earned runs/28.2 innings) vs. AL East opponents.

**2010**

- Ranks second all-time in Rangers' history behind Nolan Ryan with 10 strikeouts per 9.0 innings.
- Won a career-high six games, including five in Texas' first 44 games.
- Notched 60 strikeouts and issued 18 walks in 52.2 innings.
- Was on the Disabled List from August 28 through the remainder of the season with right latissimus dorsi muscle strain...Began a throwing program on September 21, but was unable to return for the postseason.
- Allowed two of 13 inherited runners to score.

**2009**

- Ranked 10th in the AL in saves and games finished (42).
- Was unscored upon in 43 of his 51 outings.
- Posted a 2.70 ERA (seven earned runs/23.1 innings) in 24 road games.
- Had a 2.28 ERA (seven earned runs/27.2 innings) before the All-Star break.
- Limited first batters faced to a .188 (9-48) mark.

**2008**

- Had the lowest ERA (3.13) of any Texas pitcher with at least 25.0 innings.

**2002**

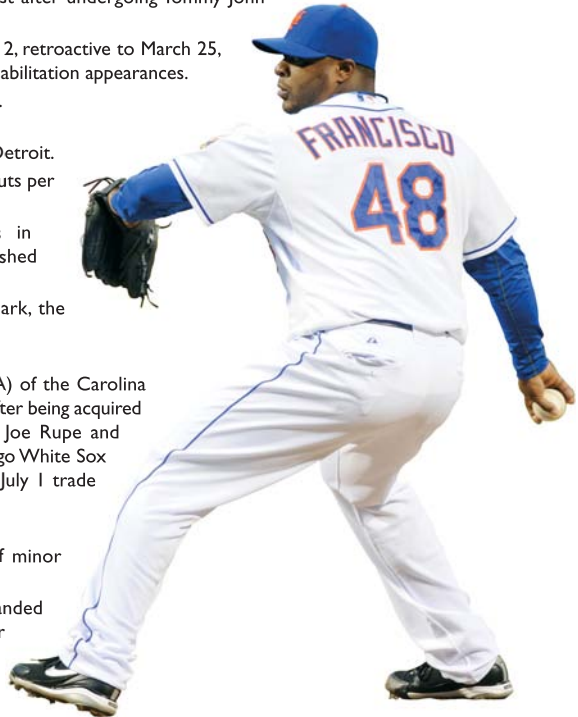
- Ranked as the 29th-best prospect in all of minor league baseball by *Baseball America*.

### 2012:

- Went 2-12 with a 5.82 ERA (69 ER, 106.2 IP) in 22 G/18 GS in his first season with the Mariners...ended the season in the bullpen.
- Finished the season with a personal 9-game losing streak, the 2nd-longest losing streak in the AL during the season (Ricky Romero, 13 G).
- In 18 starts went 2-12 with a 6.24 ERA (68 ER, 98.0 IP)...in 4 relief appearances posted a 1.04 ERA (1 ER, 8.2 IP) and limited opponents to a .179 batting average (5x28, 0 HR).
- Recorded the 2nd-lowest run support average in the AL at 3.40 (min. 15 GS)...Mariners scored 1 or fewer runs when he was in the game in 10 of 18 starts (0 runs 6 times).
- Pitched at least 2.0 innings in 3 of 4 relief appearances...in 14 career relief appearances of at least 2.0 IP has a 1.51 ERA (7 ER, 41.2 IP).
- Went 2-11 prior to the All-Star break, tying the club record for losses prior to the All-Star break with Erik Hanson (1992) and Carlos Silva (2008).
- Went 2-for-2 for first ML hit June 24 at San Diego...became 2nd Mariners pitcher (3rd time) to record a multi-hit game; first since Freddy Garcia June 19, 2002 at Cincinnati.
- Made his first Safeco Field start April 14 vs. Oakland tossing 8.0 shutout innings... became the second Mariners pitcher to toss at least 8.0 innings and not allow a run in his first Safeco start (joining Felix Hernandez).
- Allowed 5 of 21 home runs on 0-2 count, leading the Majors.
- Optioned to AAA Tacoma after his start July 4 vs. Baltimore (5.0,7,4,4,0,4,HR)...went 2-6, 5.74 ERA (41 ER, 64.1 IP) in 11 starts for the Rainiers.
- Carried a no-hitter through 7.2 IP in his start Aug. 18 vs. Reno...ended with 11 strikeouts.

**PERSONAL:** Hector (HEHK-ter) Noesi (noh-eh-SEE) ...resides in Mao, Dominican Republic.  
**CAREER:** Played for the World Team in the 2010 All-Star Futures Game...originally signed by New York (AL) as a non-drafted free agent on Dec. 3, 2004...compiled career minor league record of 30-18 with a 2.98 ERA in 97 appearances (74 GS).

**2005:** Made his professional debut with the Yankees Dominican Summer League team, going 5-3 with a 1.60 ERA in 13 games (10 starts).

**2006:** Limited to just 5 relief appearances with the GCL Yankees...on the DL with a strained right shoulder, June 18-July 31.

**2007:** Suffered season-ending right elbow strain June 23...limited to only 5 starts with A Charleston...began the season serving a 50-day suspension for violating the Minor League Drug Prevention and Treatment Program.

**2008:** Combined to go 3-2 with a 3.33 ERA in 14 appearances (7 GSs) with the GCL Yankees and Staten Island.

**2009:** Appeared in 26 combined games (20 GS) with Charleston and Tampa...began the season with 27.1 consecutive scoreless innings over his first 9 appearances (3 starts), striking out 35 and walking only 3...named a South Atlantic League midseason All-Star... on the disabled list from July 19-Aug. 2 with right shoulder tendinitis...made pair of postseason relief appearances for the FSL Champion Tampa squad, including earning the win in Game 1 of the Championship Series at Port Charlotte.

**2010:** Combined to go 14-7 with a 3.20 ERA in 28 games (27 GS) with A Tampa, AA Trenton and AAA Scranton/Wilkes-Barre...walked just 28 batters while striking out 153 (5.46 K/BB Ratio)...led all Yankees minor leaguers in wins and strikeouts (153), and ranked 7th in ERA...named a Florida State League All-Star and FSL Pitcher of the Week honors for April 8-19...promoted to Trenton on May 16...held opponents to 2 runs or less in 12 of 16 starts with the Thunder...collected his first career complete game on June 13 vs. Binghamton and first shutout June 29 at New Brunswick...earned Eastern League Pitcher of the Week honors for week ending June 7...selected to the World Team roster for the 2010 All-Star Futures Game, tossing 1.0 scoreless inning of relief...following the season, named the 7th-best prospect in the Yankees organization and having the "Best Control" by *Baseball America*.

**2011:** Was 2-2 with a 4.47 ERA (28 ER, 56.1 IP, 28ER) in 30 appearances (2 GS) over 4 stints with the Yankees (4/13-21, 5/13-6/8, 6/12-8/28, 9/6-30)...among AL rookie relievers (relief appearances only), ranked 8th in innings pitched (51.2) and ERA (4.01), and 11th in strikeouts (42)...made 28 relief appearances, going 2-1 with a 4.01 ERA (23 ER, 51.2 IP)...17 of his 28 relief appearances were scoreless...recalled from Scranton/WB for the first time April 13-21, but did not appear in a game...earned the win in his Major League debut May 18 in 15-inning win at Baltimore...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings of relief (4 H, 4 BB, 4 K)...became the first Yankees pitcher to win his Major League debut in relief while tossing at least 4.0 scoreless innings, and the first in the Majors since Jim Brower for Cleveland (9/5/99)...made first Major League start Sept. 21 vs. Tampa Bay (G#1)...began the season with AAA Scranton/Wilkes-Barre...went 1-1, 3.28 in 6 games (5 GS).

## LAST SEASON:

- Recognized as having the Best Outfield Arm in the International League (AAA) by Baseball America in its annual "best tools survey".
- Appeared in 100 games for Buffalo, finishing the season with a .261 average with 18 doubles, five triples, 11 home runs, 51 RBI, 57 runs scored, 12 stolen bases and nine outfield assists.
