ABOUT THE A'S: Have won seven of the last nine games and nine of the last 13...are a season-high tying 15 games over .500 for the third time (June 4 and 6)...are 39-24, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 42-21)...it is the A's best record after 63 games since the 1990 club started the year 42-21 (lost game 64)...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 42nd consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 46 consecutive days and 59 of the last 61...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have a 4½ game lead over Los Angeles in the West, which is one game shy of their season-high of 5½ games (last: June 6)...have 55 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

THE LONG BALL: Brandon Moss hit the A's Major League leading fourth grand slam of the season yesterday...it extended the A's streak of consecutive games with a home run to 16 (27 home runs total), which is the second longest streak by an A's team over the last 12 years (17, June 20-July 7, 2012)...have 76 home runs for the season, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...38 of the home runs have come with runners on base, which is tied with Toronto for the most in the majors...the pitching staff has allowed 52 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL and sixth fewest in the majors...only 16 of those have come with runners on base, which is second fewest in the majors (Cubs, 15).

MARGIN OF VICTORY: The A's defeated Baltimore 11-1 yesterday, which was their sixth win by 10 or more runs this year...no other team has more than three...the only times in Oakland history the A's have more wins by 10 or more runs are 2000 (8) and 1973 (7)...have outscored the opposition by 128 runs for the season, which is nearly double that of the second closest team (San Francisco, 65) and nearly triple the next closest American League team (Toronto, 43)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973...the last Major League team to outscore its opponents by more than 127 runs before the break is the 2001 Seattle Mariners (149).

OFFENSE: The A's drew 11 walks yesterday, which are their most in a game since they had 13 on May 18, 2007...now have 274 walks for the season, which is 38 more than any other team...also **lead the majors** in runs (327) and on-base percentage (.338), rank third in home runs (76), fourth in slugging (.419), tied for fourth in extra base hits (199) and tied for sixth in triples (14) and fewest strikeouts (447).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.51 ERA (73 er in 261.2 ip) over the last 29 games...**lead the majors** in ERA (2.91), opponents batting average (.224), on-base percentage (.286) and slugging percentage (.338)...also lead the majors with a .194 (89 for 458) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for the third most shutouts in the American League (7) and have issued the third fewest walks (174).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-6 with a 3.70 ERA (41 er in 99.2 ip) over the last 16 games...however, have a 3.06 ERA (130 er in 382.1 ip) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.88)...have just 14 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...are tied for the AL lead in complete games (2) and rank third in innings pitched (382.1).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this nine-game road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...are 22-12 (.647) on the road for the season, which is the **best mark in the majors**...are hitting .244 (297 for 1215) with 35 home runs in 34 games on the road compared to .261 with 41 home runs in 29 games in Oakland...return home following the game Wednesday and begin a 10-game homestand Friday against New York-AL (three games), Texas (three games) and Boston (four games)...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and are 17-12 (.586) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the AL behind Cleveland (21-11)...have won 11 of the last 14 home games after losing six straight.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 6 with a walk and four RBI...lead the American League in RBI (11) and walks (13) and

are tied for the lead in hits (15), doubles (4), home runs (1) and extra base hits (5)...rank second in on-base percentage (.426) and plate appearances (68), third in batting (.283) and fourth in slugging (.415).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 35 for 42 (83.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is tied with the Yankees for the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 40 of their 45 (88.9%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Cubs, 90.6%)...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just four errors in the last 12 games...now have nine in the last 26 games after making 32 in the first 37...have the fourth most errors in the American League (41) but are tied with Baltimore for the fewest unearned runs (13)...are 21-10 when committing at least one error compared to 18-14 when going errorless...A's outfielders have nine assists in the last 16 games and 16 for the season, which is tied with Toronto for the AL lead.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-3 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and top the American League in extra inning games...have the second best record in the AL (Cleveland, 4-1)...are 11-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Miami for the most last at bat wins in the majors and have the most last at bat games in the AL...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...are 12-16 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 27-8 in games decided by three runs or more

THIS AND THAT: The A's have the best record in the majors in night games (24-13) and when scoring first (24-4) and are tied with San Francisco for the best record in the first game of a series (14-6)...lead the majors in series swept (6)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 63 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the second longest single-season streak in Oakland history...the record is a 73-game streak to start the 1984 season...are 8-2 on Sunday, which is the best record in the American League...went 16-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Reddick)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL nine times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 5-1...are 3-0 in Oakland and 2-1 in Anaheim...have won each of the previous three season series are 37-26 (.587) against the Angels over the last four years...including 30-3 when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in seven of their last 18 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in six of those games...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 402-322 against the Angels...that includes 208-153 in Oakland and 194-169 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 451-399 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Kyle Blanks has a career-high nine-game hitting streak and is 10 for 22 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak...**Coco Crisp** has an 11-game hitting streak (15 for 39, .385), which is an A's season high and the third longest active streak in the majors...**Sean Doolittle** has a 17.1 inning scoreless streak, which is an on-going career-high...has struck out 42 batters while walking only one this season...**Brandon Moss** has two grand slams in his last seven games and has 11 RBI over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1973** Ken Holtzman tosses a two-hit shutout to improve to 11-3 in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a four-hitter as the A's shutout Kansas City, 5-0...in **1991** Jim "Catfish" Hunter becomes the first player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor the Hall of Famer by retiring number 27.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (5-3, 3.04 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks eighth in the American League in ERA (3.04) and 10th in on-base percentage (.292)...is also sixth in highest run support (5.96)...opponents have reached base on an error five times, which is tied for third most.

SINCE APRIL: Is 3-3 with a 4.25 ERA (17 er in 36.0 ip) and .285 (41 for 144) opponents batting average in six starts in May and June after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...has 28 strikeouts in 36.0 innings in May and June after fanning 41 in 38.0 innings in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .193 (11 for 57) with runners in scoring position, which ranks eighth in the American League...they are 2 for 24 (.083) with RISP and two outs...has walked just two batters to lead off an inning for a .276 on-base percentage...however, has allowed four doubles and four home runs for a .473 slugging percentage...has a .340 (18 for 53) opponents batting average in the first inning, .220 (51 for 232) after that...has a .267 (54 for 202) opponents batting average the first two times through the order, .181 (15 for 83) after that...has held the fourth through seventh hitters in the batting order to a .145 (19 for 131) batting average...all other hitters are batting .325 (50 for 154).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .184 (21 for 114) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .281 (48 for 171) against left-handers...has issued just four of his 20 walks to righties for a .208 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is second lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks fourth...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .197 (42 for 213) batting average...has issued 30 of his 40 walks over that stretch to lefties.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed six home runs in his last five starts (30.1 ip) after allowing three home runs over his first seven starts (43.2 ip)...has allowed nine home runs for the season, eight of which have been solo shots.

AS A STARTER: Has made 12 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 5-4 with a 3.81 ERA (35 er in 82.2 ip) in 14 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 10 of his 12 starts and allowed two runs or fewer seven times...has career highs in strikeouts (69), innings pitched (74.0) and games started (12) and has matched his best in wins (5)...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

2014 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle **April 3** in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game...had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota **April 9**...struck out a career-high nine in 7.0 innings...was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) **April 14**...matched his career high with nine strikeouts for the second consecutive start...picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston **April 20** in Oakland...blanked the Astros on three hits and two walks over the first three innings before Gonzalez homered with two outs in the fourth...then retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston **April 25**...allowed a career-high eight hits...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a run in the third inning on an Altuve RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fourth to take a 5-1 lead but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fourth on

a Dominguez RBI single, a two-run error by Donaldson and a Castro RBI ground out...the A's scored seven times in the ninth for the win...extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas **April 30**...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings...yielded just one hit (Felder two-out single in first) and one walk (Felder, one out in fourth)...did not allow a base runner past first base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Seattle **May 6**...allowed three runs in the first inning on a wild pitch, a Smoak RBI double and an Ackley RBI single...the A's scored twice in the second to narrow the gap to 3-2 and he blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over innings two through five before allowing a Zunino sacrifice fly in the sixth...left after that trailing 4-2...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago **May 12** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings...allowed two runs on a pair of solo home runs by Vicedio in the second and Abreu to lead off the ninth...the two home runs matched his career high...the A's bullpen was charged with two more runs in the ninth before Doolittle retired the final three batters for the save...was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland **May 18**...it was the 200th appearance of his career...tossed a career-high 109 pitches and allowed a career-high tying two home runs for the second consecutive start...allowed a leadoff home run to Bourn in the first inning but the A's scored seven unanswered runs before he allowed a one out solo home run to Brantley in the fifth...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Toronto **May 24**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed an unearned run in the third when Gose scored on a Gentry error...then allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Lawrie home run and a two-run error by Moss...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-4 loss to Detroit **May 29** in Oakland...yielded a career-high tying eight hits for the second consecutive start...allowed a run to score on a ground out in the third inning and the A's scored twice in the fourth to give him a 2-1 lead...surrendered two more runs in the fifth inning on a Kinsler RBI double and a Cabrera sacrifice fly to give the Tigers the lead for good.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-4 win at New York last Wednesday...allowed four runs in 6.0 innings, all in the third inning on a Jeter RBI single and a Ellsbury three-run home run...that gave the Yankees a 4-0 lead but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win and he retired seven of the final eight batters he faced.

CHAVEZ vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-2 with a 4.70 ERA (15.1 ip, 15 h, 12 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 17 so, 2 hr) in nine career appearances, including one start...is 1-1 with a 9.00 ERA (5 er in 5.0 ip) in four games in his home ballpark and 0-1 with a 2.61 ERA (3 er in 10.1 ip) in five games in Anaheim...his only start came in his only outing this year, a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles April 14...matched his career high with nine strikeouts...allowed an unearned run in the first inning when Calhoun singled, went to second on a passed ball and scored on a Pujols single...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the third and left after seven innings trailing 2-1.

LHP Drew Pomeranz (5-3, 2.20 ERA): Is 1-2 with a 4.41 ERA over his last three starts after going 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA over his first three starts...has a 2.20 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...opponents are batting .148 with runners in scoring position...has a 0.50 ERA over innings one through three, a 4.24 ERA in innings four through six and a 1.80 ERA from the seventh inning on...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 2-1 A's loss at New York (AL) last Thursday (7.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...that start snapped a streak of 24 consecutive starts of fewer than six innings, which was the longest such streak by a ML pitcher since at least 1914...is 1-1 with a 5.59 ERA in three career appearances against Los Angeles, including one start, all this year...the start was a win on May 30 in Oakland (5.1 ip, 4 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 5 so).

- With Friday's win, broke a 15-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that was the longest active losing streak in the majors and the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has not allowed an earned run over his last 11 outings (8.1 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 5 bb, 6 so) after posting a 12.27 ERA over a five-game stretch from May 7-17 (5 er in 3.2 ip)...did not allow a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season.
- Is second among AL relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.153) and fifth in opponents batting average (.153)...all 13 of his hits allowed this season have been singles.
- Is ninth among AL relievers in WHIP (0.91).

2014 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

DARIC BARTON

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.
- Was batting .158 with five RBI in 30 games when he was designated for assignment May 15...was outrighted to Sacramento May 17.

KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.
- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a career-high 0 for 20 streak from April 2 to 6.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).

- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.
- Hit his second career walk-off home run May 28 against Detroit...his other was also against the Tigers (April 12, 2013)...it was his fourth career game-ending RBI.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...it was his fifth career two-homer game (last: Aug. 28, 2013 at Detroit) and his fourth game with five or more RBI... became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego).
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
