ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last five games after winning five straight...are 9-9 over the last 18 games and 39-25 for the season...that is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 42-22) and the A's best record after 64 games since the 1990 club started the year 42-22 (won game 65)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 43rd consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 47 consecutive days (since April 24) and 60 of the last 62...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have 56 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have a 3½ game lead over Los Angeles in the West.

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors in ERA (2.91), opponents batting average (.225), on-base percentage (.288) and slugging percentage (.339)...also lead the majors with a .196 (93 for 474) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for the third most shutouts in the American League (7) and have issued the second fewest walks (176).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-7 with a 3.66 ERA (43 er in 105.2 ip) over the last 17 games...however, are 26-15 with a 3.06 ERA (132 er in 388.1 ip) for the season...have the fewest losses in the majors and the second lowest ERA (Atlanta, 2.86)...are tied for the American League lead in complete games (2) and rank second in innings pitched (388.1).

MARGIN OF VICTORY: The A's have outscored the opposition by 125 runs, which is more than double next closest team (San Francisco, 58) and nearly triple the next closest American League team (Toronto, 44)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973...the last Major League team to outscore its opponents by more than 127 runs before the break is the 2001 Seattle Mariners (149).

THE LONG BALL: The A's had their season-best streak of 16 consecutive games with a home run end yesterday...hit 27 home runs during the streak and have 76 home runs for the season, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...lead the majors with four grand slams and rank second with 38 home runs with runners on base (Toronto, 39)...the pitching staff has allowed 52 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors...only 16 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied with the Cubs for the fewest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's did not draw a walk last night for the second time this year (May 10 vs. Washington)...had 11 walks the day before at Baltimore, which are their most in a game since they had 13 on May 18, 2007...have 274 walks for the season, which is 35 more than any other team...also lead the majors in runs (328) and on-base percentage (.336), rank third in home runs (76), fifth in extra base hits (200), sixth in slugging (.415), tied for seventh in triples (14) and eighth in fewest strikeouts (456).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors last night (April 11 at Seattle)...had just four errors over the previous 12 games...have 44 errors for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...however, have just 15 unearned runs, which is second fewest in the AL (Baltimore, 13)...are 21-11 when committing at least one error compared to 18-14 when going errorless...A's outfielders have 10 assists in the last 17 games and 17 for the season, which is tied for the Major League lead (Arizona, New York-NL).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-3 on this nine-game road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (0-1)...are 22-13 (.629) on the road for the season, which is the second best mark in the American League (Toronto, 19-11)...are hitting .242 (301 for 1246) with 35 home runs in 35 games on the road compared to .261 with 41 home runs in 29 games in Oakland...return home following the game tomorrow and begin a 10-game homestand Friday against New York-AL (three games), Texas (three games) and Boston (four

games)...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and are 17-12 (.586) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the AL (Cleveland, 21-11)...have won 11 of the last 14 home games after losing six straight.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 6 with a walk and four RBI...lead the American League in RBI (11) and walks (13) and are tied for the lead in hits (15), doubles (4), home runs (1) and extra base hits (5)...rank second in on-base percentage (.426) and plate appearances (68), third in batting (.283) and fourth in slugging (.415).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 35 for 42 (83.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is tied with the Yankees for the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 40 of their 46 (87.0%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Cubs, 89.1%)...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-3 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and top the American League in extra inning games...have the second best record in the AL (Cleveland, 4-1)...are 11-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Miami for the most last at bat wins in the majors and have the most last at bat games in the AL...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...are 12-16 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 27-9 in games decided by three runs or more

THIS AND THAT: The A's lead the majors in series swept (6) and have the best record in the American League when scoring first (24-5) and on Sunday (8-2)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 64 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the second longest single-season streak in Oakland history...the record is a 73-game streak to start the 1984 season...went 16-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Reddick)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL nine times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 5-2...are 3-0 in Oakland and 2-2 in Anaheim...have won each of the previous three season series are 37-27 (.578) against the Angels over the last four years...including 30-3 when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in seven of their last 19 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in seven of those games...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 402-323 against the Angels...that includes 208-153 in Oakland and 194-170 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 451-400 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has stranded all 14 of his inherited runners and is the only qualifying American League reliever that has not allowed an inherited runner to score...**Kyle Blanks** has a career-high nine-game hitting streak and is 10 for 22 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak...**Sean Doolittle** has a 17.1 inning scoreless streak, which is an on-going career-high...has struck out 42 batters while walking only one this season...**John Jaso** is batting .330 (31 for 94) with 10 walks (4 hbp, .417 on-base percentage) over his last 29 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1979** Jim Essian hits an inside-the-park Grand Slam in the A's 12-1 win against Toronto...in **1992** Mark McGwire hits his 200th career home run off Chris Bosio in the A's 5-2 win at Milwaukee...he becomes the third Oakland Athletic to reach the 200 mark, joining Reggie Jackson and Jose Canseco...in **1997** Damon Mashore has three assists at Detroit to set an Oakland record for assists by an outfielder.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (5-3, 2.20 ERA)

LAST THREE/FIRST THREE: Is 1-2 with a 4.41 ERA (8 er in 16.1 ip)..242 (15 for 62) opponents batting average and four home runs allowed over his last three starts after going 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA and .157 opponents average over his first three starts.

BRIEFLY: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA in nine relief appearances before moving into the starting rotation May 7...is 4-2 with a 2.30 ERA (8 er in 31.1 ip) in six starting assignments...has a 2.20 ERA overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings...using the same minimum, he has the fifth lowest opponents batting average (.209).

INNINGS PITCHED: Tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in his last start Thursday at New York...it marked the first time he tossed at least six innings in a start since July 6, 2012 when he logged 6.1 innings at Washington...that snapped a streak of 24 consecutive starts of fewer than six innings, which is the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Don Wengert, June 25, 1997-May 26, 2001)...had a 20-start stretch of five innings pitched or fewer from Aug. 1, 2012 to May 25, 2014, which was also the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Len Barker, 14 from May 21, 1985-June 10, 1987)...has tossed more than five innings in just eight of his 36 career starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .148 (4 for 27) with runners in scoring position...five of the six home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...four have been hit by right-handed hitters, as have 21 of 24 in his career...has a .456 career slugging percentage against righties compared to .258 by lefties...opponents are 7 for 43 (.163) with three walks (.217 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has a .165 (13 for 79) opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .250 (21 for 84) after that.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 0.50 ERA (1 er in 18.0 ip) and .148 (9 for 61) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game...has a 4.24 ERA (8 er in 17.0 ip) in innings four through six and a 1.80 ERA (2 er in 10.0 ip) from the seventh inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-1 with a 4.40 ERA (7 er in 14.1 ip) in three starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 0.53 ERA (1 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 2.33 ERA (5 er in 19.1 ip) and .134 (9 for 67) opponents batting average in seven games at home compared to 1-3 with a 2.10 ERA (6 er in 25.2 ip) and .260 (25 for 96) opponents batting average in eight games on the road...is tied for fifth in the American League in home wins.

IN MAY: Went 4-1 with a 2.70 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts, in May...tied for fourth in the American League in wins in May...had just five wins over the first 42 games of his career.

SCORELESS STREAK SNAPPED: Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high and A's season-high 18.0 innings in the fourth inning May 25 at Toronto...began the streak with three consecutive scoreless starts of exactly 5.0 innings from May 7 to 20...is the first A's pitcher with three consecutive scoreless outings of five or more innings since Ted Lilly (Sept. 10-21, 2003)...allowed three hits or fewer in each of those three starts, joining Steve Ontiveros (June 14-24, 1994) as the only A's pitchers since 1914 with three consecutive scoreless outings of five innings or more and three hits or fewer.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Had his three-game winning streak snapped May 25...went 3-0 and did not allow a run over a three start stretch from May 7 to 20 (15.0 ip, 8 h, 4 bb, 16 so)...it marked the first time in his career he put together consecutive wins...now has five wins in 2014 after tallying four wins in 34 games over his first three seasons.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: First batters faced were 0 for 8 with a walk in his relief appearances this year and he stranded all three of his inherited runners...began his career with 30 consecutive starts before making his final four appearances of 2013 in relief...is 8-16 with a 4.80 ERA (87 er in 163.0 ip) in 36 career starts compared to 1-1 with a 1.45 ERA (3 er in 18.2 ip) in 13 relief appearances.

2013 START-BY-START: He combined with Dan Otero and Jim Johnson on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win in the second game of the doubleheader **May 7** against Seattle...it was his first win as a starter since Sept. 26, 2012 against Chicago (NL)...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...won his second consecutive start in the A's 11-0 win over Chicago (AL) **May 13** in Oakland...it marked the first

time in his career he has put together back-to-back wins...combined with Dan Otero, Fernando Abad and Joe Savery on a four-hit shutout...tossed five innings and allowed three of the hits while striking out a career-high eight...combined with Dan Otero, Luke Gregerson and Sean Doolittle on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Tampa Bay **May 20**...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Toronto **May 25**...blanked the Blue Jays on two walks over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...the streak was snapped on a one-out solo home run by Encarnacion in the fourth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-5 win over Los Angeles **May 30** in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced (Iannetta walk) and had a 7-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth inning.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at New York last Thursday...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings...the A's scored a run in the first to give him a 1-0 lead but that would be their only run...he allowed a RBI single to Soriano in the second and a lead off home run to Gardner in the third.

POMERANZ vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-1 with a 5.59 ERA (9.2 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 3 hr) in three career appearances, including one start, all this year...the start came in his last outing when he picked up the win in the A's 9-5 victory in Oakland on May 30...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced (Iannetta walk) and had a 7-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a solo home run by Trout and a two-run home run by Kendrick...the A's increased the lead to 9-3 before he was relieved by Otero with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth...Otero allowed a two-run double to Cron...his other two outings came in relief at Anaheim...tossed 2.2 scoreless innings April 15 in the A's 10-9, 11-inning win win (1 bb, 2 so)...then took the loss in a 5-4 decision the next day (1.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so)...pitched a scoreless 11th inning and retired the first two batters in the 12th before allowing a walk-off home run to Iannetta.

2013 RECAP: Was 0-4 with a 6.23 ERA in eight games, including four starts, over two stints with Colorado...walked 19 and struck out 19 in 21.2 innings...allowed a .301 opponents batting average, including .130 against left-handed hitters compared to .367 against right-handers...issued 16 of his 19 walks and yielded nine of his 10 extra base hits to righties...had a .405 OPS against lefties compared to 1.150 against righties...held opponents to a .190 average with runners in scoring position, including .091 with RISP and two outs...opponents batted .158 when leading off an inning...was on the disabled list from July 22 to Sept. 5 with left biceps tendinitis...began the season at Triple-A Colorado Springs and went 8-1 with a 4.20 ERA in 15 starts before the Rockies called June 30...struck out 96 batters in 85.2 innings, an average of 10.1 per nine innings.

LHP Tommy Milone (3-3, 3.68 ERA): Is 3-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA and .274 opponents average over his first five starts...has 26 strikeouts and seven walks over his last six starts after tallying 16 strikeouts and 12 walks over his first five starts...has allowed a .218 batting average with runners in scoring position...has held the opponents number three, four and five hitters to a .135 batting average...is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA and .279 opponents batting average in seven starts on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's win in 11 innings at Baltimore last Friday (6.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 3 so)...is 5-2 with a 4.21 ERA in nine career starts against Los Angeles...the five wins are his most against any team...is 0-0 with a 3.75 ERA (12.0 ip, 15 h, 6 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year.

- With Friday's win, broke a 15-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that was the longest active losing streak in the majors and the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has not allowed an earned run over his last 12 outings (8.2 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 5 bb, 7 so) after posting a 12.27 ERA over a five-game stretch from May 7-17 (5 er in 3.2 ip)...did not allow a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season.
- Is second among AL relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.151) and fifth in opponents batting average (.151)...all 13 of his hits allowed this season have been singles.
- Is eighth among AL relievers in WHIP (0.90).
- Has stranded all 14 inherited runners this season...is the only qualifying AL reliever to have not allowed an inherited runner to score.
- Has thrown three scoreless outings against the Angels this season (1.2 ip, 2 so)...are his only three career outings against the Angels.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-1 with a 2.87 ERA (10 er in 31.1 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 4.41 ERA (17 er in 34.2 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.2 ip) and .210 (25 for 119) opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA (20 er in 33.1 ip) and .279 (39 for 140) opponents batting average in seven starts on the road...his home ERA is **fifth** lowest in the American League...has allowed six of his eight home runs on the road...last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 14-8 with a 2.84 ERA (63 er in 199.1 ip) in 32 games in Oakland compared to 14-14 with a 4.86 ERA (115 er in 213.0 ip) in 38 games on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA (16 er in 42.2 ip) in seven starts at night compared to 1-2 with a 4.24 ERA (11 er in 23.1 ip) in four starts during the day...has yielded four home runs in 42.2 innings at night, four home runs in 23.1 innings during the day.

THIS AND THAT: Has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (Gregerson each time)...the A's are 5-6 (.455) in his starting assignments this year and are 41-27 (.603) in his career...his teams are 46-27 (.630) in his 73 career starts.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.

- Had a career-high 0 for 20 streak from April 2 to 6.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).

- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.

- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year...that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...it was his fifth career two-homer game (last: Aug. 28, 2013 at Detroit) and his fourth game with five or more RBI... became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego).
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two

3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).

- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
