ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning five in a row...are 7-3 over the last 10 games and 47-30 for the season, which is the best record in the majors...have owned the best mark in the majors for seven consecutive days and nine days this year (also May 21-22)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 58th consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 62 consecutive days (since April 24) and 70 of the last 72...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...lead second place Los Angeles by four games...have 71 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 3-1 in interleague play (Washington, 3-0; New York, 0-1)...the four interleague games are the fewest in the majors (Detroit, 5)...also play at Miami (June 27-29), San Francisco (July 9-10) and Atlanta (Aug. 15-17) and host San Francisco (July 7-8), New York (Aug. 19-20) and Philadelphia (Sept. 19-21)...are now 25-11 (.694) over their last 36 games against the National League...went 13-7 against the NL last year, which tied for third best in the majors...it marked the second consecutive season and 10th time in 17 seasons that the A's finished with a winning record against the NL...are 170-138 (.552) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0 for 2 with a strikeout, not including Sean Doolittle's pinch hit ground out...they went 2 for 22 (.091) with two runs, one RBI, two walks and 11 strikeouts last year...now have a .084 (26 for 311) average with four doubles, 10 RBI, 10 walks and 142 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .092)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

WINNING MONTHS: The A's are 13-8 in June and need one more win to clinch a winning record for the 13th consecutive month...that would match the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972)...the Athletics record is 15 from July, 1928-Sept. 1930...the last Major League team with 13 consecutive winning months is the Boston Red Sox (July, 2004-July, 2006).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this eight-game road trip to New York-NL (0-1), Miami (three games) and Detroit (three games) tonight...went 5-4 on the last road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2), which marked their 10th consecutive road trip with a .500 or better record...that is the A's longest such streak since an 11-trip streak from June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990...have not finished a road trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...are 23-15 (.605) on the road, which is the second best road record in the American League (Detroit, 22-13)...went 7-3 on the last homestand against New York-AL (2-1), Texas (2-1) and Boston (3-1) and are 24-15 (.615) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 24-14).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .228 (44 for 193) with 21 runs scored over the last six games (3.5 runs per game)...lead the majors in runs scored (390) and walks (319), rank second in on-base percentage (.334), fourth in home runs (86), seventh in slugging (.407) and eighth in extra base hits (229)...also lead the majors with four grand slams and rank second with 44 home runs with runners on base (Toronto, 47)...are the only team in the majors with three players with 50 or more RBI (Donaldson, Moss, Céspedes).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.18 ERA (42 er in 73.0 ip) over the last eight games...have a 3.11 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the majors...allowed a season-high tying four home runs last night and have surrendered 15 home runs in the last nine games...lead the majors in opponents batting average (.230) and on-base percentage (.291) and rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.350)...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (212).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in three of the last eight games and are 3-2 with a 5.95 ERA (28 er in 42.1 ip) over that span...are 32-18 with a 3.21 ERA (165 er in 462.1 ip) for the season...have the fewest losses in the majors, the third lowest ERA and are tied for fifth in wins.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's lost 10-1 last night, which is their largest margin of defeat this year...have outscored the opposition by 126 runs, which is more than double the next closest team (Seattle, 52)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973 (first All-Star Game was in 1933).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9 for their last 19 (.474) with two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and two walks...are batting .288 (19 for 66) with three home runs, 15 RBI and 14 walks for the season...lead the American League in pinch RBI, walks and extra base hits (7)...the walks rank third in the majors, the RBI are sixth and the extra base hits are tied for seventh...are tied for the AL lead in doubles (4) and home runs (3), rank second in hits, slugging percentage (.485) and plate appearances (82), tied for second in on-base percentage (.415) and fourth in batting.

ON THE BASES: Scott Kazmir recorded the A's first pickoff of the season last night, which is tied with St. Louis for the fewest in the majors...opponents have been successful in 44 of their 51 (86.3%) attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the majors...the A's are 45 for 53 (84.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 85.7%).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-5 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games and wins...the 13 extra inning games match the A's season total from last year (7-6)...are 13-9 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat wins and are tied for third in last at bat games...have won four of the last five games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 31-12 in games decided by three runs or more.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 55 errors, which is second most in the American League...A's outfielders have 21 assists, which is second most in the majors (Arizona, 24).

NO ROOKIES: The A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 77 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest single-season streak in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest season-opening streak by a Major League team since the 2005 Cleveland Indians went the first 82 games without playing a rookie.

A's vs. METS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2014 last night and now trail in the all-time series, 3-7...are 2-1 in Oakland and 1-6 in New York...including 1-3 at Citi Field...also met in the 1973 World Series, which the A's won in seven games.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes...has a season-high tying nine-game hitting streak (13 for 35, .371) and has hit safely in 18 of his last 20 games (28 for 82, .341)...**Sean Doolittle** has a 24.1-inning scoreless streak, which is the longest active streak in the American League and tied for fourth longest by a reliever in Oakland history...has retired 34 of the last 35 batters he has faced and 60 of the last 64.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1950** Eddie Joost homers in both games of a doubleheader at Chicago and combines to drive in seven runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits his 300th career home run in the second inning of the A's 10-8 loss to Detroit...he would later add #301 for his 33rd career multi-homer game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brad Mills (0-0, 4.50 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was acquired from Milwaukee on June 17 in a minor league trade for cash considerations...spent the entire season at Triple-A Nashville where he was 4-2 with a 1.56 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento last Friday and started that night against Boston.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 0-1 with a 14.09 ERA (7.2 ip, 14 h, 12 r, 12 er, 6 bb, 9 so, 4 hr) in two career interleague starts...both came in 2009 with Toronto against Philadelphia and they were the first two starts of his career.

WITH THE BAT: Is 0 for 1 in his Major League career...the at bat came at Philadelphia June 18, 2009...is 0 for 15 with 12 strikeouts as a minor leaguer, all with Triple-A Nashville this year.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Boston last Friday in Oakland...it was his first Major League appearance since July 8, 2012...walked a career-high tying four batters (fourth time)...struck out three of the four batters he faced in the first inning before allowing two runs, one earned, in the second on a two-run single by Bradley...also allowed a RBI single to Ortiz in the third...was relieved by Johnson to start the fifth inning with the scored tied at 3-3.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 4-2 with a 1.56 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...the ERA was the lowest in the Pacific Coast League and second lowest among all full season minor leaguers (Daniel Winkler, Tulsa, 1.41) at the time of his promotion to Oakland on June 20...also ranked third in the PCL in opponents batting average (.190) and fourth in strikeouts (77) at the time...walked just 18 batters for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.28...surrendered five home runs in 75.0 innings, an average of 0.60 per nine innings.

LAST FIVE MINOR LEAGUE STARTS: Allowed one earned run or fewer in each of his last five starts but was just 1-2 despite a 0.87 ERA (31.0 ip, 20 h, 7 r, 3 er, 9 bb, 40 so).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .190 batting average, including .190 (40 for 211) against right-handed hitters compared to .193 (11 for 57) against left-handers...surrendered four of his five home runs to righties...four were solo shots...opponents batted .157 with four walks (.213 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...yielded a .193 batting average with runners in scoring position.

MONTH BY MONTH: Lowered his ERA each month of the season at Nashville...went 2-0 with a 2.95 ERA in five games in April, 2-0 with a 1.16 ERA in six starts in May and was 0-2 with a 1.00 ERA in three starts in June before the trade...struck out 43 batters in 38.2 innings in May, which led all minor league pitchers...his 1.16 ERA that month tied for 11th in the minors.

THIS AND THAT: Was 1-1 with a 0.75 ERA in five games during the day compared to 3-1 with a 1.94 ERA in nine games at night...did not allow a home run and issued just one walk while striking out 26 in 24.0 innings during the day...allowed just one run over the first two innings of a game (0.38 ERA)...had a 2.12 ERA from the third inning on...the Sounds were 7-5 (.583) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in eight of his 12 starts, allowed six hits or fewer 11 times, one run or fewer eight times and two walks or fewer nine times...was 0 for 15 with 12 strikeouts as a hitter.

2014 NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Made his season debut with a start in the second game of a double header April 5 at Omaha...then pitched in relief in each of his next two outings (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 0 so) before returning to the rotation for the rest of the season...did not allow a hit in 6.0 innings against New Orleans May 1...issued three walks and allowed an unearned run in the third inning on a walk, wild pitch and error...left with a 5-1 lead but the bullpen allowed four runs before Nashville scored once in the bottom of the 11th for the win...did not allow a run in his next two starts on May 8 at Colorado Springs (7.0 ip) and May 13 at Iowa (6.0 ip) and had a 18.0-inning scoreless streak from May 1 to 19...extended his season-opening winning streak to four games by tossing 8.0 shutout innings and striking out a season-high 13 in a 3-0 win over Colorado Springs May 29...logged a 1.73 ERA during the streak, which spanned nine games, including eight starts, from April 12 to May 29...went 0-2 over his final three starts but allowed just two earned runs for a 1.00 ERA.

MAJOR LEAGUE CAREER: Made his Major League debut with Toronto in 2009...went 2-3 with an 8.57 ERA in 14 games, including nine starts, in three seasons with Toronto from 2009 to 2011...was traded to Los Angeles (AL) following the 2011 season and appeared in one game for the Angels in 2012 (see last Major League appearance above)...is 3-3 with a 7.53 ERA (48 er in 57.1 ip) in 16 career appearances, including 11 starts...has 55 strikeouts in 57.1 innings (8.63 per nine innings), but has also issued 35 walks (5.49 per nine innings)...is 3-3 with a 7.15 ERA (40 er in 50.1 ip) in 11 starts, 0-0 with a 10.29 ERA in five relief appearances.

PROFESSIONAL CAREER: Is 52-45 with a 3.73 ERA in 144 games, including 135 starts, in eight seasons in the minors...was originally drafted by Toronto in the fourth round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to Los Angeles (AL) on Dec. 3, 2011 for catcher Jeff Mathis...was claimed off waivers by Texas March 24, 2013 and pitched for Triple-A Round Rock before he was released July 18...also made one start for Orix in the Japanese Leagues following his release, a loss (2.2 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 10.12 ERA).

2013 RECAP: Was with Los Angeles (AL) during the spring but was claimed off waivers by Texas March 24...was outrighted to Triple-A Round Rock March 28 and went 7-5 with a 3.87 ERA in 18 games, 17 starts, before he was released July 18...pitched for Orix in the Japanese Leagues and made one start, a loss (2.2 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 10.12 ERA)...held the opposition to a .248 batting average at Round Rock, including .239 (28-for-117) against left-handed hitters compared to .252 (64-for-254) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his nine home runs to righties...began the season by going 6-0 with a 2.87 ERA over his first 11 games through June 6, including 10 starts...then went 1-5 with a 5.45 ERA over his final seven starts...including 0-4 with a 7.58 ERA over his final four starts...was on the disabled list from May 15 to 22 with a strained left elbow.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jesse Chavez (6-4, 2.71 ERA): Ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (2.71)...has allowed a .191 batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .270 against left-handers...his .227 on-base percentage against right-handers is the lowest in the AL and he ranks fourth in batting average...opponents are hitting .192 with runners in scoring position, which ranks seventh in the AL...they are 4 for 32 (.125) with RISP and two outs...is 2-1 with a 2.52 ERA in four starts in June...had a no decision in his last start, a 2-1 A's win in 10 innings over Boston last Saturday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 3 h, 4 bb, 4 so)...the A's are 11-4 (.733) in his starting assignments...is 1-2 with a 7.94 ERA in eight career appearances, including one start, against Miami...his last start was his only start, a loss in a 9-0 decision for Toronto at Miami (6.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 6 so)...is 0-2 with a 5.04 ERA in 16 career interleague appearances, including two starts...is 0 for 5 with five strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in his career as a hitter.

- The A's bullpen has a 4.99 ERA over its last 11 games (22 er in 39.2 ip)...prior to that stretch, had posted a 0.72 ERA over 12 games (3 er in 37.1 ip) from May 30-June 11...is 2-1 in the last six games after 12 straight games without a win.
- The A's bullpen is **second in the American League in ERA** (2.93) and wins (15)...ranks first in opponents batting average (.222), on-base percentage (.283) and slugging percentage (.319).
- Is **nine for 11 (81.8%) in save chances since May 16** after converting just seven of its first 15 (46.7%) save opportunities this season.
- Has issued the fewest walks (71) and has tied for the fourth fewest home runs allowed (17) among AL bullpens...**has issued just one walk over its last eight games and 30.2 innings** but has a 4.11 ERA over that stretch.

- All three runs over four-game stretch came via solo home runs...are his only extra-base hits allowed this season (14 singles, three home runs).
- Is seventh among AL relievers in opponents batting average (.165) and eighth in slugging percentage (.252).
- Has stranded all 15 inherited runners...is the only qualifying AL reliever to not have allowed an inherited runner to score.
- Has a loss in 14 career games against the Mets (15.1 ip, 10 h, 1 r, 1 er, 7 bb, 11 so, 0.59 ERA)...one of his six career starts came against the Mets (Aug. 25, 2012 at New York).

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

- Has appeared in eight games since coming off the DL June 3 (6 er in 7.1 ip, 7.36 ERA)...missed 22 games with a strained right forearm...was his second stint on the DL this season (also March 29-April 6)...prior to second DL stint, pitched in 12 games and posted an 0-1 record with a 2.92 ERA (4 er in 12.1 ip).
- Had a 0.96 ERA (1 er in 9.1 ip) in nine games in April...has pitched 11 times in May and June and has a combined ERA of 7.84 (9 er in 10.1 ip).
- Righties are 7 for 43 (.163) against him this season with 17 strikeouts...lefties are 10 for 31 (.323) with five strikeouts.
- Has never faced the Mets in his career.

Last Year: Was 6-4 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA in a team-leading 71 relief appearances...allowed just two home runs in 67.1 innings, an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which was fourth lowest among AL relievers.

FRIDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (6-4, 2.71 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks **seventh** in the American League in ERA (2.71)...is also **fourth** in highest run support (5.90)...opponents have reached base on an error seven times, which is **tied for second most** (Kuroda, NYY 8).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is making his first interleague appearance of the season...is 0-2 with a 5.04 ERA (17 er in 30.1 ip) in 16 career interleague appearances...that includes two starts with Toronto in 2012 when he went 0-1 with a 10.38 ERA (10 er in 8.2 ip).

WITH THE BAT: Struck out in his only at bat last year (Aug. 7 at Cincinnati) and is 0 for 5 with five strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in his career...went 1 for 10 with eight strikeouts and a sacrifice hit as a minor leaguer.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .191 (25 for 131) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .270 (60 for 222) against left-handers...has issued just six of his 25 walks to righties for a .227 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is **tied for second** in the American League and the batting average ranks **sixth**...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .200 (46 for 230) batting average...has issued 35 of his 45 walks over that stretch to lefties.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .192 (14 for 73) with runners in scoring position, which ranks **seventh** in the American League...they are 4 for 32 (.125) with RISP and two outs...eight of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...walked two batters to lead off an inning in his last start after issuing just three such walks over his first 14 starts...has a .317 (20 for 63) opponents batting average in the first inning, .224 (65 for 290) after that...the opponents number three hitter is batting .375 (15 for 40) with three home runs...the four through seven hitters have a combined .154 (25 for 162) average

CAREER BESTS: Won his sixth game of the season June 15, which is a new career high (previous: 5 in 2010)...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...also has career highs in strikeouts (82), innings pitched (93.0) and games started (15) and his 2.71 ERA is more than a run lower than his previous best of 3.92 last year.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 2-1 with a 2.52 ERA (7 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts in June after going 2-3 with a 3.90 ERA in five starts in May...was 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-2 with a 2.13 ERA (10 er in 42.1 ip) in seven starts during the day compared to 3-2 with a 3.20 ERA (18 er in 50.2 ip) in eight starts at night...has the **ninth** lowest day ERA in the American League.

AS A STARTER: Has made 15 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 6-5 with a 3.36 ERA (38 er in 101.2 ip) in 17 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 11-4 (.733) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 15 starts and allowed two runs or fewer nine times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit, snapping his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.

- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.

- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JOE SAVERY

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

ERIC SOGARD

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
