**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won seven of the last nine games, 11 of the last 16 and 18 of the last 26 and are 23 games over .500 at 58-35...that is one game short of the season-high (24, July 8, July 10) and is tied for the second best record after 93 games in Oakland history...have the **best record in the majors** for the 24<sup>th</sup> consecutive day (since June 18) and 26<sup>th</sup> day this year (also May 21-22)...lead the American League West by 2½ games...have been alone in first every day since April 28 and have held at least a share of first since April 24...have spent 88 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed one run or fewer in six of the last nine games and have a 1.43 ERA (13 er in 82.0 ip) over that span...have the **lowest ERA in the majors** for the season (3.08)...also **lead the majors** in opponents on-base percentage (.291) and slugging percentage (.346) and rank second to the Mariners (.227) in opponents batting average (.230)...are tied for third in the American League in fewest home runs (78) and most shutouts (9).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in seven of the last nine games and are 6-2 with a 1.35 ERA (8 er in 60.0 ip) over that span...have a 3.15 ERA (197 er in 562.0 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (Los Angeles-NL, 3.14)...have the fewest losses in the majors (22) and are tied for the third most wins (40).

**RUN DIFFERENTIAL:** The A's have outscored the opposition by 146 runs, which is the most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 83)...since 1940, only four American League teams have finished with a run differential greater than 139 before the All-Star Break (Baltimore, +168 in 1969; New York, +157 in 1998; Seattle, +149 in 2001; Baltimore, +143 in 1966)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973.

**BEFORE THE BREAK:** The A's 58 wins are the **most in Athletics history** before the All-Star Break (previous: 56 in 1971, 1972 and 1973)...the last team with more than 58 wins before the break is Detroit in 2006 (59)...will go into the break in first place in the American League West for the second consecutive season...had a two game lead last year and have not had a larger lead at the break since 1988 when they led by 5½ games...the pitching staff has 715 strikeouts, which is the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (650 in 2013)...has a 3.08 ERA...the last AL team with an ERA under 3.13 at the break was the 1990 A's (3.09) and the last under 3.09 was the 1989 Angels (2.89)...the offense has scored 460 runs, which is third most in Athletics history before the break (522 in 2000, 494 in 1996)...Scott Kazmir leads the A's with 11 wins and Sonny Gray has nine...the last time the A's had two 10-game winners at the All-Star Break was in 1990 (Welch 13, Stewart 11).

**OFFENSE:** The A's **lead the majors** in walks (359), rank second in runs (460), fourth in on-base percentage (.331) and fewest strikeouts (656), tied for seventh in triples (19) and home runs (95) and eighth in extra base hits (272) and slugging percentage (.401)...are tied with Baltimore and Milwaukee for the Major League lead with four grand slams and rank fourth with 47 home runs with runners on base.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-2 on this five-game road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Seattle (0-1)...went 4-4 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-1), Miami (3-0) and Detroit (0-3), marking their 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive road trip with a .500 or better record...that matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history (June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990)...the longest is a 14-trip streak from April 12, 1971 to July 23, 1972...have not finished a road trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...are 28-20 (.583) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Toronto (4-0) and

San Francisco (2-0)...it was the 11<sup>th</sup> undefeated homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...the last was Sept. 28-Oct. 3, 2012 when the A's went 6-0 against Seattle and Texas...have won 11 of the last 12 home games and 24 of the last 30 and are 30-15 (.667) at home for the season...that is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 32-15)...begin post All-Star Break play July 18 with a six-game homestand against Baltimore (three games) and Houston (three games).

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters lead the American League in walks (16), doubles (5) and extra base hits (8), rank second in hits (20), RBI (15) and plate appearances (96), tied for second in home runs (3), third in slugging percentage (.436) and fourth in batting (.256) and on-base percentage (.385)...the 20 pinch hits match the A's season total from last year and the 16 walks are tied for third in the majors.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 54 for 66 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 84.2%)...opponents have been successful in 52 of their 62 (83.9%) attempts, which is fourth highest in the majors.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's have won eight of their last 11 games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 38-15 in games decided by three runs or more...are 10-5 (.667) in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games and wins and have the fourth best record...the 15 extra inning games are already two more than the A's played last year (7-6)...are 16-10 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat wins and are tied for third in games decided in the last at bat...have six walk-off wins, which is tied for second in the AL (Chicago, 7).

**THIS AND THAT:** A's outfielders have 25 assists, which is tied for second in the majors and matches the A's season total from last year...have not used a rookie this year, which is the longest season-opening streak by a ML team since the 1971 Baltimore Orioles went the first 152 games (source: Elias)...have posted a winning record in 13 consecutive months, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972).

**ALL-STARS:** The A's had six players named to the American League All-Star team (Céspedes, Donaldson, Doolittle, Kazmir, Moss and Norris) and one named to the National League All-Star team (Samarzija)...the six All-Stars are the most of any team this year and are the A's most since they had an Athletics record seven in 1975...this marks the first time since 2003 the A's are sending a non-pitcher to the All-Star Game (Hernandez)...have four non-pitchers for the first time since 1991...have two players participating in the Home Run Derby (Céspedes and Donaldson) for the second time (Canseco and McGwire in 1990).

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's trail the season series, 6-5...are 3-4 in Oakland and 2-2 in Seattle...are hitting .212 (77 for 364) with 33 runs scored (3.00 per game) but have a 2.76 ERA (31 er in 101.0 ip)...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...Oakland is 84-79 (.515) against the Mariners since 2006...all-time, the A's are 317-241 (.568) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .579 mark (min. 20 games)...are 175-105 in Oakland, 141-135 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 65-71 at Safeco Field.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Yoenis Céspedes** has 14 career home runs against Seattle, which are tied for fifth most in Oakland history against the Mariners...**Jed Lowrie** extended his hitting streak to a season-high seven games last night...is 13 for 28 (.464) with six runs scored and six multiple hit games over that span...**Stephen Vogt** has a career-high 11-game hitting streak (18 for 38, .474)...is batting .376 overall, which is the best mark in the majors among batters with 100 or more plate appearances.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1913 A's starter Carroll "Boardwalk" Brown walks 15 batters in 7 2/3 innings but the A's defeat Detroit 16-9...in 1972 A's catcher and future pitching coach Dave Duncan is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 7-6 loss to Boston...in 1988 Terry Steinbach is named All-Star Game MVP after driving in all the American League's runs with a home run and a sacrifice fly in a 2-1 win.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (7-5, 3.06 ERA)

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks ninth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.349)...has the sixth highest run support (5.78)...opponents have reached base on an error seven times, which is tied for second most (Kuroda, NYY 9).

**LAST NINE, FIRST NINE:** Is 3-4 with a 3.61 ERA (21 er in 52.1 ip) and .281 (57 for 203) opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and .216 opponents average over his first nine starts...is averaging 7.57 strikeouts per nine innings over his last eight starts (44 so in 52.1 ip) after average 9.05 over his first nine starts.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has not allowed a home run in his last six starts, 38.0 innings and 164 batters faced...has allowed nine home runs for the season, eight of which have been solo shots...opponents are 14 for 40 (.350) with runners in scoring position over his last eight games...yielded a .149 average with RISP over his first 10 starts...has a .316 (24 for 76) opponents batting average in the first inning, .232 (79 for 340) after that...the opponents number six hitter is hitting .087 (4 for 46), which is the lowest mark in the majors.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 4-2 with a 2.13 ERA (12 er in 50.2 ip) and .219 (41 for 187) opponents batting average in seven starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 3.86 ERA (25 er in 58.1 ip) and .271 (62 for 229) opponents average in 10 starts on the road...ranks fourth in the American League in home ERA.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Is 1-1 with a 4.09 ERA (5 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts in the month of July...went 2-1 with a 3.30 ERA in five starts in June after going 2-3 with a 3.90 ERA in five starts in May...was 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 13-5 (.722) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 13 of his 18 starts and allowed two runs or fewer 10 times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

**CAREER BESTS:** Has seven wins, which is two more than his previous career high (5 in 2010)...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...also has career highs in strikeouts (101), innings pitched (109.0), games started (18), hits (103) and walks (34)...his 3.06 ERA is nearly a run lower than his previous best of 3.92 last year.

**AS A STARTER:** Has made 18 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 7-6 with a 3.59 ERA (47 er in 117.2 ip) in 20 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

**2014 HIGHLIGHTS:** Had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota **April 9**...struck out a career-high nine in 7.0 innings...was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) **April 14**...matched his career high with nine strikeouts for the second consecutive start...picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston **April 20** in Oakland...had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston **April 25**...allowed a career-high eight hits...extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas **April 30**...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Seattle **May 6**...allowed three runs in the first inning and another in the sixth and left trailing 4-2...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago **May 12** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings matched his career high with two home runs...was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland **May 18**...it was the 200<sup>th</sup> appearance of his career...tossed a career-high 109 pitches and allowed a career-high tying two home runs for the second consecutive start...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Toronto **May 24**...allowed a career-high tying eight

hits...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-4 loss to Detroit **May 29** in Oakland...yielded a career-high tying eight hits for the second consecutive start...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-4 win at New York **June 4**...allowed four runs in 6.0 innings, all in the third inning, but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win...he was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 9**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits for the third time in his last four starts...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-5 win over New York (AL) **June 15** in Oakland...shutout the Yankees on three hits over the first five innings...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10 inning win over Boston **June 21** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...however, matched his career high with four walks...left with a 1-0 lead but Gregerson allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save...had a no decision in the A's 9-5 win at Miami **June 27**...was relieved by Otero with a 4-2 lead but he allowed two inherited runners to score for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss at Detroit **July 2**...matched his career high by allowing eight hits and issuing four walks.

**LAST START:** He combined with Abad, Otero and Cook on a five-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over San Francisco on Monday in Oakland...tossed 6.0 innings, allowed four of the hits and matched his career high with nine strikeouts...allowed just two base runners to advance as far as second base...retired the side in order just once (first inning).

**CHAVEZ vs. SEATTLE:** Is 0-1 with a 1.99 ERA (22.2 ip, 18 h, 7 r, 5 er, 9 bb, 20 so, 0 hr) in 10 career appearances, including two starts...is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (9.1 ip) in seven games at Safeco Field and 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA (5 er in 13.1 ip) in three games, two starts, in Oakland...is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (11.2 ip, 12 h, 6 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 7 so) in two starts this year...the no decision came in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win in Oakland April 3...was charged with an unearned run in the first inning when Almonte reached on a Callaspo error, went to second on a Punto error, third on a Miller fly out and scored on a Cano ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the fifth to make the score 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game...then took the loss in an 8-3 decision at Seattle May 6...allowed three runs in the first inning on a wild pitch, a Smoak RBI double and an Ackley RBI single...the A's scored twice in the second to narrow the gap to 3-2 and he blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over innings two through five before allowing a Zunino sacrifice fly in the sixth...left after that trailing 4-2.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Sonny Gray (9-3, 2.97 ERA):** Ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.320), seventh in opponents batting average (.228), tied for seventh in winning percentage (.750), ninth in ERA (2.97) and tied for ninth in wins (9)...is 3-0 with a 3.12 ERA over his last four starts...is 3-1 with a 2.91 ERA and .186 opponents batting average in seven starts on the road...has the third lowest road opponents batting average in the AL...is 6-1 with a 2.40 ERA in seven starts against AL West competition this year and 8-2 with a 1.91 ERA in 13 career appearances...has won nine games this year and now has 14 wins in 30 career games...in Oakland history, only Tim Hudson (15) has more wins in his first 30 career games...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's win over San Francisco last Tuesday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 8 so)...is 3-0 with a 1.44 ERA in four career starts against Seattle, including 2-0 with a 1.39 ERA in two starts this year.

- A's relievers have allowed four runs over their last 24.0 ip (1.50 ERA) but have a 3.92 ERA (38 er in 87.1 ip) in their last 25 games...posted a 2.53 ERA over their first 64 games.
- The A's bullpen is **second in the American League in wins (18) and ERA (2.94)**...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.282) and second in batting average (.225) and slugging percentage (.321).
- Has issued the fewest walks (79) among AL bullpens...**has issued just nine walks over its last 23 games and 78.1 innings** (since June 16)...are the fewest walks in the majors over that span.
- Converted seven straight save chances from June 1-20 but has converted just five of nine saves (55.6%) since June 21 (18 games)...its 61.8% save percentage for the season is third lowest in the American League.
