OAKLAND ATHLETICS (73-48) VS. ATLANTA BRAVES (61-60)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the past five games after winning three in a row...are 25 games over .500 at 73-48, which is three away from the season-high of 28 (72-44, August 9)...have owned the **best record in the majors** every day since June 18 and the best in the AL since May 31...lead Los Angeles in the American League West by 2 games...have held sole possession of first place in the AL West every day since April 28, a streak of 105 consecutive days...that is the fifth longest streak of consecutive days alone in first in Oakland history and is the longest since 1988 when they spent the final 164 days of the season alone in first...have held at least a share of first since April 24...have spent 122 days in first place (118 alone, four days tied)...this is the 10th season in Oakland history the A's have spent at least 100 days in first, but just the second over the last 22 years (125 in 2006).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 168 runs, which is **nearly double the next closest teams** (Seattle/Washington, 89)...it is currently the third best season run differential in Oakland history (239 in 2001, 180 in 1988, 163 in 1990, 152 in 1975).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.61 ERA (53 er in 132.0 ip) over the last 15 games (since July 30) but a 3.20 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League to Seattle (2.95)...have not finished with an ERA under 3.18 since 1989 (3.09)...rank second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.293) and third in batting average (.234) and slugging percentage (.351)...have issued the third fewest walks (321) and rank fourth in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 52-33 with a 3.34 ERA (273 er in 736.1 ip)...**lead the American League** in wins, rank second in ERA and tied for third in complete games (4) and complete game shutouts (2)...have the fewest losses in the majors...have three of the top nine individual ERA's in the AL (Lester 5th, Kazmir 8th, Gray 9th)...starters have thrown six-straight starts of 6.0 ip or more and three earned runs or fewer.

OFFENSE: The A's scored just three runs last night, and have scored three runs or fewer in 11 of the last 15 games...are batting .228 (112 for 491) with 55 runs scored over those 15 games (3.67 runs per game)...however, **lead the majors** in runs scored (589) and walks (446), have the second fewest strikeouts (830), are sixth in home runs (120) and on-base percentage (.326), eighth in slugging percentage (.397) and ninth in extra base hits (348).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 10-2 in interleague play (Washington, 3-0; New York, 1-1; Miami, 3-0; San Francisco, 3-1), which is the best record in the majors...have the fourth best batting average (.276) and sixth lowest ERA (3.05)...rank second in runs per game (5.75)...have eight interleague games remaining this season, playing at Atlanta (Aug. 15-17) and at home against New York (Aug. 19-20) and Philadelphia (Sept. 19-21)...are now 32-12 (.727) over their last 44 games against the NL...went 13-7 against the NL last year, which tied for third best in the majors...it marked the second consecutive season and 10th time in 17 seasons that the A's finished with a winning record against the NL...one more win against the NL would guarantee the A's a winning record in interleague play in 2014.

HOME AND AWAY: Are 1-3 on this seven-game road trip to Kansas City (1-3) and Atlanta (three games)...are 33-27 (.550) on the road, which is tied for the fourth best record in the American League...went 18-6 over the first 24 road games but are 15-21 since then...were 3-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (1-2)...are 40-21 (.656) at home, which is the **best mark in the majors** ahead of the Angels (41-23, .641)...with their next home win, the A's will clinch a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season...went 6-9 over the first 15 home games but are 34-12 since then...went 6-4 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Minnesota (3-1).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's **lead the majors** with 11 wins when trailing after seven innings and six when trailing after eight innings...the 11

wins when trailing after seven innings is the second best total in Oakland history (12 in 1969) and the six wins when trailing after eight is tied for second best (10 in 1971)...are 19-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are second in the majors in last at-bat wins (Miami, 20) and tied for sixth in games decided in the last at bat (30)...are tied for second in the American League in walk-off wins (8)...are 11-6 (.647) in extra-inning games...tied for the Major League lead in extra-inning games (Miami) and rank second in wins...have the second best record in the AL...are 24-24 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 49-24 in games decided by three runs or more.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders have 31 assists, which ranks second in the majors (Arizona, 33)...the A's have committed 11 errors in the last 11 games and now have 81 for the season, which is the third most in the American League.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 15 for 16 (93.8%) in stolen base attempts since the All-Star Break and are 69 for 82 (84.1%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 86.1%)...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 71 of their 85 (83.5%) attempts, which is third highest in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 34 (.118)...lead the American League in walks (18) and extra base hits (8), are tied for the lead in doubles (5), rank second in RBI (18), tied for second in hits (22) and home runs (3), third in plate appearances (114) and slugging (.383) and fourth in on-base percentage (.357).

WINNING MONTHS: The A's are 7-7 in August...have posted a winning record in 14 consecutive months, which is the **longest streak in Oakland history** (previous: 13, Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972) and second longest in Athletics history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...it is the second longest streak by an American League team over the last 36 years (20, New York, Sept. 1996-April 2000).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 42 players this year...employed 44 players last year, which was their fewest since 2006 (40)...Jon Lester became the 11th pitcher to start a game for the A's, which is their most since 2009 (14)...Lester is the fourth 30-year-old to start a game for the A's...had just one pitcher aged 30 years or older start a game for the A's from 2011-13 (Colón)...this is the first time the A's had four 30-year-olds start a game since 2000 (Appier, Heredia, Olivares, Prieto)...only one rookie has appeared in a game for the A's this year (Billy Burns)...played the first 104 games without a rookie, which was the longest single-season streak by an A's team since at least 1913...it was the longest season-opening streak by a Major League team since the 1971 Baltimore Orioles went the first 152 games (source: Elias).

A's vs. BRAVES: This weekend's three-game series is the lone matchup between Oakland and Atlanta this season and just their fourth series all-time...the A's are 4-5 all-time against the Braves, having lost two of the three three-game sets...the Braves won two-of-three in Oakland in 2003 and in Atlanta in 2008...the A's only series win against Atlanta came June 10-12, 2005 at Turner Field, taking two of three games behind Dan Haren and Barry Zito...this marks the third of the four all-time series between the two clubs to be played in Atlanta.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has stranded all 23 of his inherited runners, the most among Major League relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...**Josh Reddick** is batting .325 (27 for 83) with eight doubles, one triple, four home runs and 11 RBI since being reinstated from the DL on July 22...his 13 extra-base hits are tied for the fourth-most in the Majors over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1907** Chief Bender wins his 11th consecutive decision in the A's 4-2 win over Cleveland...in **1976** Joe Rudi collects his 1000th hit as an Oakland Athletic in the A's 8-7 win against Boston...in **1980** Rick Langford pitches a six-hitter as the A's defeat Seattle 11-3...it is his club record ninth consecutive complete game victory...the win comes in the midst of a club record 22 consecutive complete games...in **2009** Adam Kennedy is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 8-1 loss to Chicago...it is Kennedy's second of two five-hit games in 2009.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jason Hammel (1-4, 5.90 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 1-0 with a 0.75 ERA (1 er in 12.0 ip) over his past two starts after going 0-4 with a 9.53 ERA in his first four games with Oakland...is now 1-4 with a 5.90 ERA (19 er in 29.0 ip) in six starts with the A's after going 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago...is 9-9 with a 3.60 ERA (55 er in 137.2 ip) in 23 starts overall...was acquired from the Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jeff Samardzija for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash.

NINE-GAME WINNER: Has won nine games, which is one short of his career high...won 10 games with Colorado in 2009 and 2010...had eight wins at the All-Star Break, which matched his most before the break (2012).

LAST 11 STARTS: Is 3-6 with a 5.01 ERA (33 er in 59.1 ip) and .301 (72 for 239) opponents batting average over his last 11 starts after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...has allowed 11 home runs in his last 11 starts (59.1 ip, 1.67 per nine innings) after surrendering just five home runs in 78.1 innings over his first 12 starts (0.53 per nine innings).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 1-3 with a 6.38 ERA (17 er in 24.0 ip) in five starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 3.01 ERA in 18 starts before the break...his win August 5 snapped an eight-game post All-Star Break losing streak...it was his first win after the break since Aug. 13, 2011 at St. Louis...is 14-32 with 5.35 ERA (254 er in 427.1 ip) in 104 career appearances after the break compared to 44-36 with a 4.23 ERA in 134 games before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA (6 er in 14.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland and is now 5-1 with a 2.65 ERA (10 er in 34.0 ip) in eight career games, including five starts, in the Coliseum...went 4-1 with a 2.35 ERA in seven starts at Wrigley Field...is 5-2 with a 2.70 ERA (18 er in 60.0 ip) in 10 starts at home compared to 4-7 with a 4.29 ERA (37 er in 77.2 ip) in 13 starts on the road...is tied for sixth in the majors in road losses.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-4 with a 4.17 ERA (27 er in 58.1 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest compared to 6-5 with a 3.18 ERA (28 er in 79.1 ip) in 13 starts on five day rest or more.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Tossed 5.2 shutout innings August 5 to snap his losing streak at an A's season-high four games...compiled a 9.53 ERA and .351 opponents batting average during the losing streak...became the third pitcher in Oakland history to lose each of his first four games with the club...Ryan Glynn also lost each of his first four contests from June 3-22, 2005 and Mike Morgan lost his first nine from June 11, 1978-July 24, 1979.

MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS: Went 1-4 with a 7.83 ERA and .323 opponents batting average in five starts in July...it was the third time in his career he lost four games in a month (July, 2013 and May, 2011) and he tied for the Major League lead in July losses...combined for a 3-4 record and a 3.44 ERA in 11 starts in May and June...went 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .144 opponents batting average in five starts in April...ranked second in the National League in opponents batting average in April, tied for second in wins and 10th in ERA...it marked the fourth time he has won four games in a month in his career...became the first Cubs pitcher to win four games in April since 2008 (Dempster, Zambrano)...the opponents batting average was the lowest single month mark of his career.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed 16 home runs, 11 of which have been solo shots...eight have come in the first inning, which is tied for the most in the majors (Estrada, MIL)...A's are 1-5 (.167) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 10-7 (.588) in his starts...his teams are 93-88 (.514) when he starts in his career...has tossed exactly 7.0 innings in eight of his 23 starts...has not tossed more than seven innings since May 27, 2013 at Washington (8.0 ip)...has allowed two runs or fewer in 12 of his 23 starts and walked two batters or fewer 19 times.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Pedro Strop and Hector Rondon on a three-hit shutout in the Cubs 4-0 win at Milwaukee **April 27**...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits...combined with Justin Grimm and Pedro Strop on a four-hit shutout in an 8-0 win at Milwaukee **May 31**...tossed seven innings and allowed all four hits...allowed just one base runner to advance into scoring position...tossed 7.0 shutout innings for the second consecutive start but had a no decision in the Cubs 5-3, 13-inning win over Miami **June 6**...the Cubs had a 3-0 lead entering the ninth inning but Rondon

allowed three runs for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in a 4-2 loss at Pittsburgh **June 11**...allowed a two-run home run to McCutchen in the first inning to snap a 14.0-inning scoreless streak and a career-high 51.2-inning homerless streak...was the winning pitcher in his final start with the Cubs, a 7-2 win at Washington **July 4**...is now 8-0 against the Nationals in his career...was the losing pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 5-2 decision at San Francisco **July 9**...also took the loss in an 8-4 decision to Baltimore **July 19** in Oakland...allowed five runs in just 2.0 innings, which was his shortest outing as a starter since April 16, 2010 at Atlanta (1.2 ip)...allowed a career-high tying eight runs in an 8-1 loss at Houston **July 30**.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-1 loss to Minnesota in Oakland Sunday...allowed a solo home run to Dozier in the first inning, which was the only run he would allow in 6.1 innings...was relieved with the game tied 1-1 and two runners on base by Abad, who stranded both runners...Gregerson allowed three runs in the eighth and was charged with the loss.

HAMMEL vs. ATLANTA: Is 1-3 with a 5.68 ERA (38.0 ip, 52 h, 29 r, 24 ER, 10 bb, 27 so, 4 hr) in seven career appearances, all starts...is 0-1 with a 7.53 ERA (12 er in 14.1 ip) in three games in his home ballparks, 1-2 with a 4.56 ERA (12 er in 23.2 ip) in four games in Atlanta...had a no decision in a start for the Cubs in Atlanta earlier this season May 9, allowing two runs in 7.0 innings...is now 1-0 with a 1.13 ERA (2 er in 18.0 ip) over his past two starts against the Braves...including his only career complete game shutout June 16, 2012...was 0-3 with a 9.00 ERA in his first five career starts against Atlanta.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (12-6, 2.86 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 4.42 ERA (9 er in 18.1 ip) over his last three starts...the three-game losing streak is a career-high...this is just the second time in his career he has lost two or more games in a row...the other time was a two-game losing streak earlier this year from June 7-13...was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts...then went 2-2 with a 5.50 ERA and .277 opponents average over a six-start stretch from May 27 to June 28...is 5-3 with a 2.19 ERA (13 er in 53.1 ip) and .224 (44 for 196) opponents batting average over his last eight starts...is 5-2 with a 2.39 ERA (18 er in 67.2 ip) and .205 (50 for 244) opponents batting average in 10 starts on the road...has the fifth lowest road opponents batting average in the American League and ranks sixth in ERA...was charged with the loss in the A's 3-2 loss at Kansas City Monday, which extended his losing streak to a career-high three games (7.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...has not faced Atlanta in his career).

- The A's bullpen has allowed 10 runs over its last six games (10 er in 12.1 ip, 7.30 ERA) after allowing just two runs over its previous 14 games (2 er in 39.0 ip).
- From July 23-Aug. 9, set an Oakland record with a 29.2-inning scoreless streak...was the fourth-longest streak in Athletics franchise history and the longest in Oakland history.
- Is third in the American League in ERA (2.91) and tied for fourth in wins (21)...is first in opponents on-base percentage (.278) and second in batting average (.222) and slugging percentage (.320).
- Has issued the fewest walks (96) among AL bullpens (second: Boston, 112)...are **averaging 2.37 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest rate in the majors and would be the lowest in franchise history since at least 1914 (1944, 2.49).**
- Ryan Cook's blown save yesterday was the first by a reliever since June 30 (Doolittle)...had converted seven-straight save chances.
