WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers and A's conclude this season-opening series this afternoon...Texas has started with 2 losses in 1st 3 games for the 18th time, 1st since 2010...it marks the 1st time the club has started loss-win-loss since 2008...the Rangers have split their 1st 4 games of a season 16 times, including 2014...Texas has lost 3 of 4 to open a year on 13 occasions, last in 2007.

FOUR-GAME SERIES: Texas needs a victory today to split this series...the Rangers were 3-7-1 in 11 total 4-game series in 2014, going 0-7-1 in the last 8 after going 3-1 at MIN, 5/26-29...Texas lost 7 straight 4-game series before splitting with OAK in the final series of the year, 9/25-28.

A GOOD MONTH: The Rangers have posted a 50-28 record in April since the start of 2012, a .641 winning percentage that ranks only behind Atlanta (.658) in that span...Texas went 17-6 in 2012, 17-8 in 2013, and 15-12 in 2014 during April.

VS. OAKLAND: The Rangers have dropped 4 of 6 to the A's since last 9/26 but have won 6 of the last 10 meetings...the clubs have split 22 games since the start of last season...Texas has captured 4 of the last 6 games at O.co Coliseum, where the club is 13-8 since the start of 2013...all-time, Texas leads, 335-324 overall with the A's holding a 171-159 advantage in Oakland...the teams next meet in Arlington, 5/1-3.

BLANKED: The Rangers have been shut out twice in the season's 1st 3 games for the 3rd time in club history: 1972, 4/15 at CAL and 4/18 at CWS (Games 1 and 3) and 1991, 4/10 vs. MIL and 4/12 vs. BAL (Games 2 and 3)...Texas joins the Twins as the only clubs to have been blanked twice in this young season...prior to this season, the last time it occurred was 2013 (HOU and MIA)...in 2014, the Rangers were not shut out for the 2nd time until game #40 on 5/13 at HOU...the 10 runs issued by Texas on Wednesday were the most allowed in a shutout defeat since 8/21/11 at CWS (0-10).

DROUGHT WITH THE BATS: The Rangers totals of 3 runs, 12 hits, 2 extra base hits, and 3 walks are all the club's fewest totals through 3 games in team history...previous low for runs in the 1st 3 games of a season was 4 in 1991...Texas has produced one, 8, and 3 hits, just the 13th time in major league history that a club has had 3 or fewer hits twice in its 1st 3 games of the year...the Cubs and A's both did it in 2013...Texas' .130 team batting average ranks 28th in the majors, the lowest of any club which has played 3 games.

LOOKING FOR A LONG BALL: The Rangers and Miami Marlins are the only ML teams to have gone homerless in the 1st 3 games of the season...5 clubs (CHC, HOU, MIN, NYM, STL) have yet to homer but have played just 2 games each...the only other times the club has not gone deep in more than the 1st 3 games of a year were 1972 (4) and 1981 (4).

HITTING NOTES: Prince Fielder and Leonys Martin are the only Rangers to hit safely in each of the last 2 games, and there is no Ranger with a 3-game opening hitting streak...Martin led off the Texas 1st with a bunt single on Wednesday...it was his 29th bunt hit since the start of 2013, 6 more than any other major leaguer in that span (Dee Gordon-23)...Adrian Beltre is hitless in 11 at bats in this series...he also started the 2013 season 0-for-11 before a 6th inning 1B on 4/3 at HOU...Ryan Rua has fanned in each of his last 6 plate appearances, the longest such span for a Ranger since Donnie Murphy, 7 in a row from 6/21-7/4/14.

STYMIED BY THE STARTER: In the 1st 3 games, the Rangers have seen 2 starts against them of 7.0+ innings while allowing one-or-zero hits...club had seen just 2 opponents with starts of that kind in all of 2013-14, Justin Verlander on 7/14/13 at DET and Jesse Chavez on 4/30/14 vs. OAK.

DAY ACTION: Texas plays its 1st day game of 2015 this afternoon...the Rangers were 25-19 in the daytime in 2014, the 4th highest winning percentage in the A.L. and 3rd best in team history...club was 15-11 in road day action a year ago.

A PAIR OF DEBUTS: Delino DeShields and Logan Verrett saw their 1st major league action on Wednesday night...it was the 1st time that a pair of Rangers have made their MLB debuts in the same game since Lisalberto Bonilla and Spencer Patton on 9/4/14 vs. SEA...prior to that it had not occurred since 9/26/04 vs. SEA (Kameron Loe and Travis Hughes).

--DeShields singled in his 1st ML plate appearance in the 8th inning, the 1st Ranger to hit safely in his 1st PA since Luis Sardinas on 4/20/14 vs. CWS (1B)...a pair of Texas rookies did it in 2013: Engel Beltre on 6/27 at NYY and Jim Adduci on 9/1 vs. MIN.

ROOKIE WATCH: The Rangers have had 6 rookies (Delino DeShields, Keone Kela, Phil Klein, Ryan Rua, Jake Smolinski, Logan Verrett) see action in the 1st 3 games of this series...According to STATS, Inc., this is the 1st time that the Rangers have ever more than 5 rookies appear in the team's 1st 5 games of a season...the only other time in franchise history that as many as 6 rookies saw action in the season's 1st 5 games was in 1962, when the Washington Senators had 6.

HOME OPENER FRIDAY: The Rangers open their 44th season in Arlington tomorrow afternoon with a 3:05 p.m. game versus Houston...a few scattered single tickets remain for the game but all other seats and standing room have been sold...the ceremonial 1st pitch will be delivered by Retired U.S. Air Force Staff Sergeant Nicholas Bradley who is representing the programs offered at the George W. Bush Presidential Center and was a participant in 2012 and 2013 Warrior Opens...the 48th Governor of Texas Greg Abbott will participate in a "Texas Toss" caught by Rangers Hall of Famer Ivan Rodriguez...the U.S. Air Force Band of the West will perform the National Anthem and a U.S. Air Force Flyover from the 301st Fighter Wing will follow.

--Globe Life Park in Arlington parking lots open at 9:00 a.m. and the park gates open at 12 noon...the Rangers encourage fans to arrive early on opening day...all fans will be required to undergo Major League Baseball mandated metal detection screening before entering the ballpark this season.

NOTES ON TOMORROW: Texas is 23-20 overall in home openers, losing to Philadelphia in 2014 to snap a 5-game winning streak...the Rangers are 11-10 in the opener at Globe Life Park in Arlington...this will be the first time that Houston has provided the opposition for a home opener...the Astros captured the 2014 Lone Star Series, 11-8, ending the Rangers' 7-year run of earning the coveted Silver Boot.

SCHIPPERS SENT TO FRISCO: RHP Tanner Scheppers begins a rehab assignment tonight when Double-A Frisco opens its season at home with Arkansas...Scheppers was placed on the DL on 4/5 (ret to 3/29) with a right ankle sprain.

MINOR LEAGUE OPENERS: The Rangers 4 full season affiliates open the 2015 season on Thursday night...Probables: Round Rock at Oklahoma City: RHP Anthony Ranaudo Frisco hosts Arkansas: RHP Alec Asher High Desert at Visalia: LHP Frank Lopez Hickory hosts Hagerstown: RHP Ariel Jurado

SHORTS: The Rangers lead the majors with 6 errors, 4 of those committed by Elvis Andrus...that is the most errors by a player in a team's 1st 3 games of a season since CIN's Pkey Reese (5) in 1998...the 4 errors by Texas last night were team's most in a game since 4/30/14 vs. OAK (4)...with his appearance on Wednesday, Delino DeShields became the 18th Ranger whose father also played in the majors, the 2nd current player (Prince Fielder).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#22 Nick Martinez, RHP

TODAY: The 24-year-old right-hander will be making his season debut in today's series finale in Oakland...went 2-2 with a 2.29 ERA (9 ER/35.1 IP) over his final 6 starts in 2014 beginning Aug. 31, as he has allowed 2-ER-or-less in each of his last 6 reg. season starts...will be starting a road day game...had lower ERA's both on road and in daytime vs. the alternative in 2014.

RETURN OF THE NICK: Martinez is the only repeat member of the Texas season-opening rotation from 2014...he made his ML debut in Rangers' 5th game last season on 4/5/14 at TB...Martinez is the youngest member of the club's 2015 season-opening rotation by nearly 4 years (next-youngest is Derek Holland).

VS. OAKLAND: Went 1-1 with a 2.53 ERA (6 ER/21.1 IP) in 4 G/3 starts vs. the A's in his rookie campaign...is making back-to-back starts vs. A's, as he started Rangers' season finale on 9/28/14 in Arlington (L, 5.2 IP, 4 H, 2 R-ER)...pitched 5.0+ innings and allowed 2-ER-or-less in all 4 outings (including lone relief game 4/28/14 in Arlington)...made 2nd career start on 4/22/14 here in Oakland (ND, 5.0 IP, 6 H, 4 R-2 ER), a Rangers last-at-bat come-from-behind 5-4 win...most recent start at Coliseum was lone win vs. A's on 9/18/14 (5.2 IP, 3 H, 2 R-ER), besting Sonny Gray to finish off Rangers' 3-game sweep...the Coliseum was one of 3 road parks in which he had multiple starts in '14 (also 2 GS at HOU and SEA).

SPRING TRAINING: Allowed multiple runs just once in 7 outings this spring (5 A games, 2 intrasquads)...had a 3.94 ERA (7 ER/16.0 IP) in his 5 A game appearances...joined Ross Ohlendorf as only Rangers with multiple wins this spring (both w/ 2 wins)...worked in an intrasquad game on 3/20 in Surprise after scheduled outing in Goodyear on 3/19 was rained out.

THESE HAPPY DAYS ARE YOURS AND MINE: Martinez has recorded 4 of his 5 career wins in day games...went 4-2, 2.89 (17 ER/53.0 IP) in 10 games/9 starts in day games last year...has pitched at least 5.0 innings in all 9 day starts, allowing 2-runs-or-less in 8 of 9...in his 2 day losses in '14, Rangers scored a total of one run in the 2 games.

ONE FOR THE ROAD: Had 4 road wins last year and just a single win in Arlington, and his 4.09 ERA in away games was over a run lower than at home (5.24)...over his last 5 road starts in 2014, Martinez went 3-1 with a 4.00 ERA (12 ER/27.0 IP), allowing 2-runs-or-less in 4 of those 5 outings.

WALKAWAYS: Martinez did not allow a walk in his final 2 starts last season, and he enters 2015 with 13.0 consecutive walkless innings since last free pass on 9/18/14 here at the Coliseum (Derek Norris in 5th inning)...those final 2 outings last year are the only walk-free starts of his career.

2014: A surprise addition to the Opening Day rotation at the end of spring training, ranked 2nd on the club in starts (2nd, 24), innings (3rd, 140.1), and strikeouts (3rd, 77)...was among A.L. rookie leaders in starts (6th) and innings (6th)...tied for 8th in A.L. in losses (12)...became just the 9th rookie in Rangers history with 24-or-more starts in a season, the 4th in the last 25 seasons (see charts on right)...was 5-11, 4.90 (70 ER/128.2 IP) in 24 starts and 0-1, 0.77 (1 ER/11.2 IP) in 5 relief appearances...was 1-7, 5.24 at home and 4-5, 4.09 on the road, losing 1st 6 Arlington decisions before win on 9/23 vs. HOU...opponents batted .275, .279 vs. LHB and .271 vs. RHB.

SUMMARY: Was named to Texas' season-opening rotation on 3/26 despite never being in big league camp prior to the announcement...opened the season on the Frisco (AA) roster before making his ML debut in a start on 4/5 at TB (ND, 6.0 IP, 4 H, 3 R-ER)...became just the 5th pitcher in Texas history to make his ML debut with a start within the Rangers' 1st 5 games of a season, joining Don Stanhouse (4/19/72 at CWS), Bobby Witt (4/10/86 vs. TOR), Rick Helling (4/10/94 at BAL), and Yu Darvish (4/9/12 vs. SEA)...was optioned to Frisco the following day and posted a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) in 2 starts for the RoughRiders before recall for remainder of season on 4/22...after return 5 of 1st 6 outings were in relief before working exclusively as a starter beginning 5/14...was 1-0, 1.63 (2 ER/11.0 IP) in 1st 2 outings of that span, earning 1st ML win on 5/24 at DET...was 0-7, 7.48 (41 ER/49.1 IP) in next 10 starts, the longest losing streak by a Ranger in 2014 and the longest winless drought by a Texas starter since R.A. Dickey went 11 games without a victory, 5/8/04-9/13/05...drought ended with a victory on 8/10 at HOU and was 4-4, 3.45 (22 ER/57.1 IP) in final 10 starts... went 2-2, 2.29 (9 ER/35.1 IP) over final 6 starts beginning 8/31, with a .214 (28-131) opponents average in that span...only time with consecutive winning decisions was 9/18 & 23.

MISCELLANEOUS: Was on the DL from 7/2-21 with discomfort in his left side...retired 1st 15 batters faced on 6/21 at LAA before Hank Conger leadoff double in 6th...was 4th rookie in WAS/TEX franchise history to start a game with at least 5.0 perfect innings: Joe McClain (5.1 IP), WAS-5/14/61 vs. BOS; Mike Mason (6.1 IP), TEX-6/27/84 vs. CAL; Yu Darvish, (5.2 IP), TEX-9/3/12 at KC...fanned season high 7 batters, 8/20 at MIA... pitched 5.0 SHO innings on 4/28 vs. OAK, longest scoreless outing by a Texas reliever since Kameron Loe (5.0 IP). 8/17/08 vs. TB...went 0-for-3 at the plate, with 1st ML plate appearance being a ground out as a pinch-hitter, 5/31 at WAS...was also used twice as a pinch-runner: 6/1 at WAS and 8/12 vs. TB, scoring the walk-off run in the 14th inning against the Rays...was 1st Texas pitcher to pinch-run and score since Bobby Witt on 6/30/90 at BOS.

AMATEUR BACKGROUND: Selected by Texas in 18th round of 2011 June draft as a pitcher...played 3 seasons at Fordham University in Bronx, NY...was primarily as a second baseman with a .295 career average, 4 HR, and 66 RBI with the Rams...appeared in 15 games in relief, going 1-3, 5.33...batted .292 and led team in runs (46), walks (37), and OBP (.404) in 2011...also appeared in 10 games in relief that season...was the 1st Fordham player to appear in the majors since RHP Pete Harnisch in 2001...played baseball at Belen Jesuit Prep in Miami, FL (graduated 2008).

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER — LHP DEREK HOLLAND (2-0, 1.46 in 6 games/5 starts in '14)

The 28-year-old left-hander is slated to start tomorrow afternoon's home opener at Globe Life Park in Arlington...returned from knee surgery in 2014 to post a strong September for Texas, when he was named the club's player of the month while posting his lowest career ERA in any month...defeated the Astros in his only start vs. the club last season on 9/22 here in Arlington (7.0 IP, 7 H, 3 R-2 ER, 1 BB, 0 HR, 2 SO, 100 pitches/67 strikes)...has gone 3-1, 3.52 (18 ER/46.0 IP) over 7 games/starts in his career vs. the Astros, winning 2 straight...had no record and a 4.32 ERA (4 ER/8.1 IP) in a pair of A game starts this spring...also appeared in a B game and minor league game after he was slowed early in camp by left shoulder soreness...is 26-18, 4.67 (202 ER/389.2 IP) over 66 career starts at Globe Life Park, including 5-6, 3.15 (43 ER/123.0 IP) in last 19 starts since the start of the 2013 season...was a regular in the Texas starting rotation for three consecutive years from 2011-13, when he posted three straight seasons of 10-or-more victories...has more starts (92) and wins (38) than any other Ranger in that three-year span...set career bests for ERA, starts, innings, and strikeouts in 2013...ranks among the club's all-time top 10 list for shutouts, strikeouts, and winning percentage...made his major league debut in 2009 after just 43 minor league games, only 5 of those above the Single-A level...the Rangers 2008 Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year made a rapid rise through the organization after not signing with Texas until May 20, 2007 as a draft and follow pick...was the club's 25th round selection in the 2006 MLB June draft...signed a five-year contract extension through 2016 with two club options for 2017 and 2018 on March 20, 2012.
