ABOUT THE A'S: The A's were swept for the first time this year over the weekend by Houston...now have a season-high four-game losing streak and are four games under .500 for the first time since July 1, 2012 (38-42)...have not been five games under .500 since June 30, 2012 (37-42)...are in fourth place in the American League West for the first time this year...are a season-high 4½ games behind first place Houston...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, four days tied for third and one day in fourth.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's fell to 0-4 in one-run games with the loss on Sunday...are 0-4 in two-run games and are the only Major League team without a win in a game decided by one or two runs...the eight combined losses in one and two runs games are tied with Miami for the most in the majors...are 5-2 in games decided by seven runs or more...have the most games and wins in the majors in games decided by seven or more...have been out-scored 79-34 in their 12 losses (6.6 to 2.8) and have out-scored the opposition 62-6 in their eight wins (7.8 to 0.8).

IN APRIL: The A's are 8-12 in April with three games remaining...will finish with a losing record in April for the first time since 2012 (10-12)...have finished the month of April more than two games under .500 just once in the last 14 years (8-11 in 2009)...are batting .268 in April, which is currently their best average in the first month of the season since 1998 (.282).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-6 with a 3.08 ERA (40 er in 117.0 ip)...have the lowest ERA in the American League and third lowest in the majors...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (117.0) and tied for third in wins (7) and fewest home runs (8)...Gray, Kazmir and Hahn are a combined 5-1 with a 1.61 ERA (13 er in 72.2 ip) in 11 starts...the rest of the rotation is 2-5 with a 5.48 ERA (27 er in 44.1 ip) in nine starts...starters have seven of the A's eight wins and have a 0.74 ERA (4 er in 48.2 ip) in those games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.69 ERA (50 er in 96.0 ip) over the last 11 games after logging a 2.14 ERA over the first nine contests...have a 3.50 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.351) and on-base percentage (.295) and fourth lowest batting average (.225)...have a 0.63 ERA (5 er in 72.0 ip) in their eight wins, a 5.42 ERA (65 er in 108.0 ip) in their 12 losses...lead the majors with five shutouts...three of those have been by eight or more runs, matching the A's total for the entire 2014 season.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .241 (98-for-407) with 45 runs scored (3.8 per game) over the last 12 games after hitting .306 with 51 runs scored (6.4 per game) over the first eight contests...are batting .268 overall, which ranks fourth in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in triples (7) and rank fourth in doubles (37) and on-base percentage (.327)...are batting .315 (58-for-184) with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the majors to San Diego (.330).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in six of the last seven games (10 errors total) and have 20 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Washington, 22)...the errors have led to 15 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL and third most in the majors...A's outfielders have committed eight of the errors, which is twice as many as any other team.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have a five-game home losing streak and are 3-7 overall at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League...it matches the A's second worst record over the first 10 home games in Oakland history (1-9 in 2001)...are 0-3 on this six-game homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 5-5 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2)...leave following the game Thursday for their second 10-game road trip of the season to Texas (three games), Minnesota (four games) and Seattle (three games)...have hit 11 of their 15 home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 0-7 during day games compared to 8-5 at night...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game and

are tied for the most day losses in the majors...the seven-game losing streak in day games is the A's longest such streak since they dropped nine straight from Sept. 24, 2008 to April 22, 2009...are batting .245 (60 for 245) with 23 runs scored during the day (3.29 per game) compared to .281 (129 for 459) with 73 runs scored at night (5.62 per game)...have hit all 15 of their home runs at night...have a 2.87 ERA (37 er in 116.0 ip) at night, 4.64 (33 er in 64.0 ip) during the day...have surrendered six home runs in 13 night games compared to 12 in seven day games.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high four bases last Wednesday night at Los Angeles (AL)...it was the A's first four-steal game since April 16, 2013 against Houston...are a perfect 11-for-11 in stolen base attempts and are one of two Major League teams without a caught stealing (New York-NL 10).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters went 4-for-4 last Friday night, which tied the Oakland record for pinch hits in a game...also had four pinch hits Aug. 30, 1970 at Detroit (Alou, Hovley, Jackson, Donaldson)...had three pinch hits in an inning (10th) for the first time since May 22, 1997 at Texas (Williams, Stairs, McGwire)...were 1-for-8 in the pinch to start the season...are tied for the American League lead in walks (2), rank second in hits (5) and tied for third in RBI (3).

THIS AND THAT: The A's fell to 0-6 in games decided in the last at bat with the loss on Sunday...have the most last at bat losses in the majors and are one of four teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland, Milwaukee, Los Angeles-AL)...lost for the third time when leading after seven innings on Sunday, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors...are 4-2 in the first game of a series, 0-6 in the final game of series...are 7-8 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .287 (158-for-550) with 14 of their 15 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .201 (31-for-154) off left-handers...are 0-3 in extra inning games...are tied with Cincinnati for the most extra inning losses in the majors and have the second most extra inning games in the American League...are 0-8 when the opponent scores first, 0-8 when they are out-homered and 0-7 when scoring fewer than four runs.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Parker, who is recovering from Tommy John surgery, began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton last Thursday...have used the DL nine times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The season series is even at two games each as the A's split a four-game series at Anaheim last week...lost the season series last year, 10-9...it marked the first time the A's lost the season series to the Angels since 2010...went 6-3 in Oakland and 3-7 in Anaheim...won eight of the first 11 games and then lost seven of the final eight contests...have been shutout in four of their last 10 games against the Angels...are 43-37 against the Angels over the last five seasons...including 35-5 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 21 of their last 29 losses, including 11 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 408-333 against the Angels...that includes 211-156 in Oakland and 197-177 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 457-410 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ike Davis is 19-for-49 (.388) over his last 15 games and is batting .345 overall, which ranks eight in the AL...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a run in 14 career games against Los Angeles (20.2 ip)...**Josh Reddick** is 12-for-26 (.462) with four walks over his last eight games after going 4-for-20 (.200) over his first five contests...**Stephen Vogt** is tied for the Major League lead with a .615 batting average with runners in scoring position.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1987** Dennis Eckersley commits an error in the A's 7-1 win over Boston...he would not commit another error for eight years, setting what was then an American League record for pitchers with 470 consecutive errorless games...in **2002** Tim Hudson and Billy Koch combine on a three-hit shutout and Eric Chavez homers and drives in four runs in the A's 10-0 win over Chicago...in **2010** Cliff Pennington and Adam Rosales collect four hits each, marking the first time in Athletics history both middle infielders had at least four hits in the same game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (2-0, 1.91 ERA)

IN APRIL: Is 2-0 with a 1.91 ERA over his first four starts after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April last year...is now 6-1 with a 1.99 ERA (14 er in 63.1 ip) in nine career starts in April...was named American League Pitcher of the Month last April...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for fifth in the American League in innings pitched (28.1), ranks seventh in opponents slugging percentage (.245), eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.241), tied for eighth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.32) and tied for ninth in ERA (1.91), wins (2) and fewest walks per nine innings (1.59).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-0 with a 0.81 ERA (2 er in 22.1 ip) in three starts against American League West competition this year compared to 0-0 with a 6.00 ERA (4 er in 6.0 ip) in one start against everyone else...last year, he was 10-4 with a 2.64 ERA in 16 starts against AL West competition last year compared to 4-6 with a 3.54 ERA in 17 starts against everyone else...is now 14-5 with a 2.11 ERA (40 er in 170.2 ip) in 25 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 7-8 with a 3.84 ERA (60 er in 140.2 ip) in 24 games against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed one home run, a solo shot by a left-handed hitter (Ackley, SEA)...has yielded 13 of his 20 career home runs to lefties and 15 have come with the bases empty...opponents are batting .214 (6-for-28) when leading off an inning this year and .210 (62-for-295) in his career...the A's are 2-2 in his starting assignments this year and 26-21 (.553) in his career.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS: Allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning April 11 against Seattle to snap his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings...it snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014...that is a new career high, surpassing his previous best of 14.0 innings (twice, last: April 23-May 4, 2014).

20 CAREER WINS: His Opening Day win was the 20th victory of his career and it came in his 46th appearance...joins Tim Hudson (37 games), Vida Blue (39), A.J. Griffin (44) and Barry Zito (45) as the only pitchers in Oakland history to win 20 games in 46 or fewer career outings.

OPENING DAY STARTER: Made his second consecutive Opening Day start April 6 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...it marked the third time in Oakland history the starting pitcher did not allow a run on Opening Day...he also did it last year and Tim Hudson did it in 2003...is now 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two career Opening Day starts (14.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 10 so).

FIRST START: He combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day April 6...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning...walked just one batter...it was the 13th time in Oakland history a pitcher tossed at least eight shutout innings while allowed one hit or fewer and one walk or fewer, the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010...allowed just one base runner as far as second base (Martin two-base error on Zobrist dropped fly ball).

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Seattle April 11 in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced with the one exception being a lead off home run to Ackley in the third...the A's were shutout on three hits over the first six innings before scoring twice in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...retired the first batter in the eighth before allowing a single to Anderson, the final batter he faced...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero).

THIRD START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Kansas City April 17...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on two-out RBI singles by Hosmer, Gordon and Perez...the A's came back with two in the fourth to tie the game but he allowed a RBI single to Infante in the sixth...the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh and he left after six innings with the score tied 4-4.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-2 win at Los Angeles last Wednesday...the A's scored a run in the first and after he retired the side in order in the bottom of the first, he allowed a run to score in the second when Freese doubled, went to third on a wild pitch and scored on an Aybar ground out...loaded the bases with one out in the third inning but

then retired each of the final 14 batters he faced...the A's scored five times in the seventh and three times in the eighth for the win.

GRAY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 3-1 with a 2.45 ERA (44.0 ip, 30 h, 13 r, 12 er, 15 bb, 43 so, 4 hr) in seven career appearances, including six starts...is 2-1 with a 2.57 ERA (8 er in 28.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (4 er in 16.0 ip) in three games at Anaheim...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year (see last start above)...was 2-1 with a 3.10 ERA in four starts last year...the first win came in a 6-3 decision in Oakland on June 1...blanked the Angels on four hits and two walks over the first four innings...also picked up the win in a 5-3 victory in Oakland August 22...allowed a career-high two home runs...then had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) August 28...allowed three runs in the second inning on a RBI single by Aybar and a two-run single by Beckham...left after seven innings with the scored tied 3-3...took the loss in a 2-0 decision in Oakland Sept. 23...struck out a career-high 12 batters in 7.0 innings...LeBlanc and four Angels relievers combined to shut out the A's on seven hits.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA in four starts...also started in a minor league game March 31...allowed a .354 (21-for-65) opponents batting average...yielded six runs in his final Cactus League start (2.2 ip) after surrendering six runs in his first three starts (11.2 ip, 4.63 ERA).

2014 RECAP: Spent the entire season in the starting rotation in his first full season with the A's and went 14-10 with a 3.08 ERA in 33 starts...led the A's in strikeouts, games started, innings pitched, losses, hits (187), runs (84) and walks (74) and tied for the lead in earned runs (75).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for second in the American League in shutouts (2), ranked fifth in opponents batting average (.232) and slugging percentage (.327), tied for sixth in complete games (2), seventh in innings pitched (219.0), eighth in ERA, tied for eighth in games started and ninth in strikeouts (183)

STRIKEOUTS AND INNINGS: His 183 strikeouts were the 10th highest single season total in Oakland history...they were third most in Oakland history by a pitcher 24-years old or younger behind Vida Blue (301 strikeouts in 1971 at age 21) and Barry Zito (205 strikeouts in 2001 at age 23)...his 219.0 innings pitched were third most by an Oakland pitcher 24-years old or younger since 1981.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 10-3 with a 2.79 ERA in 19 starts before the All-Star Break...ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and tied for seventh in wins at the break...then went 4-7 with a 3.47 ERA in 14 starts after the break...tied for third in the AL in post-break losses.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (1-1, 2.12 ERA): s scheduled to make his fourth start as an Athletic, his first since April 18...missed his last turn in the rotation on April 23 due to a blister...combined with Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in his last start, a 5-0 A's win at Kansas City April 18 (5.1 ip, 3 h, 1 bb)...it was his first win as an Athletic...has never faced the Angels in his career...went 1-2 with a 3.06 ERA in five games, four starts, this spring...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 18, 2014 with pitcher R.J. Alvarez for catcher Derek Norris, minor league pitcher Seth Streich and international bonus slot 117...made his Major League debut with the Padres last year and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts...tied for third among National League rookies in wins, ranked sixth in strikeouts (70), tied for ninth in games started and 10th in innings pitched (73.1)...allowed a .214 opponents batting average.
