### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (45-59) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (48-54)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three straight and seven of the last eight games...are 4-9 (.308) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League...are 45-59 (.433) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 13 games, which is ½ game short of the season high (last: May 27)...have spent 77 of the last 81 days in sole possession of last in the West (dating back to May 8)...the 77 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 11-18 (.379) since then.

**IN JULY:** The A's went 10-14 in July, the third time in four months this year they finished with a losing record...it was their first losing July since 2009 (12-14)...had a .267 on-base percentage, which was second lowest by an American League team in July since at least 1914 (Seattle, .266 in 2011)...it was the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (min. 3 games)...walked just 43 times, which was second fewest by a Major League team in July since at least 1914 (Montreal, 42 in 1999)...they were the fewest in any month in Oakland history (min. 12 games)...scored 76 runs and hit 15 home runs, which were the fewest in Oakland history in July...the runs were second fewest by an A's team in any month of 12 or more games over the last 36 years (68 in April, 2012).

**OFFENSE:** The A's were held to a season-low one hit last night after collecting two hits the night before...the three hits over a two-game stretch are the fewest by an A's team since the 1953 Philadelphia A's collected three hits from May 9-10...have scored one run in each of the last two games and two runs or fewer in 15 of the last 29 contests...are batting .226 (214-for-957) with 91 runs total over that 29-game stretch (3.14 per game), which dates back to June 26...for the season, the A's lead the majors in stolen base percentage (60-for-77, 77.9%)...have 108 infield hits, which is second most to Pittsburgh (112)...rank last with nine sacrifice hits...the fewest sacrifice hits in Athletics history is 18 in 2007...are tied for the second fewest strikeouts in the American League (682), tied for the third fewest home runs (83) and rank fourth in triples (25)

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's fell to 10-25 (.286) in one-run games with the loss last night, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (17-37, .315)...are 3-6 (.333) in extra innings, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have won each of their last three extra inning games after losing each of their first six...are 5-12 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most in the AL...have two walk-off wins in their last seven home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The are 0-2 on this season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (0-2), Baltimore (three games) and Houston (four games)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12-game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 21-31 (.404) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Cleveland, 20-32)...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games...are 24-28 (.462) on the road.

**PITCHING:** The A's lead the American League and rank fifth in the majors with a 3.45 ERA...also lead the AL in shutouts (13), opponents slugging percentage (.362) and fewest home runs (84), rank second in fewest extra base hits (247) and third in opponents batting average (.240) and on-base percentage (.301).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 2-6 with a 3.98 ERA (32 er in 72.1 ip) in 13 games since the All-Star Break...have a 3.13 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have allowed 11 home runs in 13 games since

the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break...have surrendered 48 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Pittsburgh, 44)...rank third in the AL in innings pitched (630.2).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 90 errors, which is the most in the majors...the errors have led to 46 unearned runs, which is second most (San Diego, 51)...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied for the fewest in the American League.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 8-19 (.296) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 37-40 (.481) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-17)...are batting .242 (231-for-954) against lefties compared to .255 (667-for-2620) off righties...the mark against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are batting .337 (30-for-89) with five home runs and 81 RBI with the bases loaded...rank second in the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (NYY, 97) and tied for third in grand slams...A's pinch hitters are batting .197 (15-for-76) but have 14 walks, which are twice as many as any AL team and seventh most in the majors...rank third in the AL in pinch plate appearances (92)...on Thursday night, Carlos Carrasco became the first pitcher to toss a complete game against the A's since Jason Vargas on Aug. 13, 2014 at Kansas City...it snapped a streak of 144 consecutive games without the opponent tossing a complete game, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...this 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Crisp, Thompson and Venditte are on rehab assignments...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. INDIANS:** The A's trail in the season series, 2-3...have lost the first two games in Oakland after taking two of three in Cleveland in the final series before the All-Star Break...are batting .151 (23-for-152) with 10 runs scored in the five games (2.00 runs per game)...since 1914, the A's lowest single season batting average against the Indians is .206 by the 1954 Philadelphia A's and the fewest runs per game is 2.43 by the 1995 Oakland A's...have won two season series and lost two season series over the previous four years and are 18-17 against Cleveland dating back to 2011...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 266-232 against the Indians...that breaks down to 139-103 in Oakland and 127-129 in Cleveland...including 42-60 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 901-1025 against the Indians.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (21) and multiple hit games (29) and leads American League rookies in hits (96) and total base (124)...is batting .353 (54-for-153) in Oakland, which is the third best home batting average in the American League...**Josh Reddick** is 13-for-37 (.351) with five doubles, two home runs and seven RBI over his last 11 games...**Eric Sogard** has a 48-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads AL second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1976** the A's steal a club record 12 bases in an 8-7, 12 inning loss in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota...in that game, Craig Kussick's eighth inning homer off Vida Blue snaps Blue's club record string of 140.2 innings without a home run...in **1988** Jose Canseco hits his 100th career home run off Melido Perez in the A's 10-2 win at Chicago...in **1999** Miguel Tejada, Eric Chavez, Jason Giambi and John Jaha all homer in the fourth inning of the A's 10-6 win over Tampa Bay...the four home runs in an inning ties the Oakland record...in **2009** Rickey Henderson become the fifth player in Athletics history to have his uniform retired when the A's retire #24.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Aaron Brooks (0-0, 6.23 ERA)

**BRIEFLY:** Was acquired from the Kansas City Royals with minor league pitcher Sean Manaea on Tuesday for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville but did not pitch before his promotion to Oakland today...was 0-0 with a 6.23 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in two relief appearances over four stints with the Royals...was also 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha.

**WITH KANSAS CITY:** Was recalled for the first time April 26 as the 26th man but did not pitch...recalled for his second stint May 12 and made one appearance on May 15 against New York, retiring the side in order in the ninth inning of the Royals 12-1 win (1.0 ip, 1 so)...was optioned following the game...recalled for a third time June 20 and pitched the next day against Boston (3.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 so)...was optioned back to Omaha the next day...was recalled July 7 as the 26th man and stayed one more day without pitching before he was optioned to Omaha for the final time July 8.

**ONLY MAJOR LEAGUE START:** He was the losing pitcher in a 12-2 Kansas City loss at Toronto on May 31, 2014...it was his second career appearance...faced 11 batters in the first inning and allowed seven runs on five hits and three walks while recording just two outs...Bautista had a RBI double, Lind a RBI single, Lawrie a bases loaded hit by pitch, Francisco a two-run double, Reyes a RBI single and Cabrera a RBI single.

**WITH OMAHA:** Went 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha...struck out 92 batters and ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts at the time of the trade on July 28...was also tied for eighth in innings pitched (106.2)...walked just 21 batters for an average of 1.77 per nine innings.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .282 opponents batting average, including .259 (51-for-197 against left-handed hitters compared to .303 (67-for-221) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his nine home runs to righties...six were solo shots...yielded five home runs in his first four starts and 20.1 innings, four home runs over his final 14 games and 86.1 innings.

**THIS AND THAT:** Went 3-1 with a 3.09 ERA in eight games on the road compared to 3-4 with a 4.20 ERA in 10 starts on the road...was 3-1 with a 2.35 ERA and .183 opponents batting average during the day, 3-4 with a 4.09 ERA and .307 opponents average in 14 starts at night...the Storm Chasers were 12-5 (.706) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer and tossed at least five innings in each of his 18 appearances.

**OMAHA HIGHLIGHTS:** Allowed a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings in his first start of the season April 9 at New Orleans, but allowed just three runs and had a no decision in a 10-6, 10-inning Omaha win...made his lone relief appearance in his second outing, April 15 at Memphis...entered the game to start the third inning with a 2-1 lead but ended up taking the loss in a 4-2 decision (5.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 1 hr)...was 0-2 with a 4.70 ERA over his first three games before his promotion to Kansas City April 26...returned the next day and picked up the win in consecutive starts on April 28 at Oklahoma City and May 3 at Colorado Springs to start a seven-start stretch where he went 4-1 with a 2.95 ERA...struck out a season-high nine batters in 6.0 innings May 8 against Oklahoma City...allowed just two runs but took the loss in a 2-1 decision...was sent to Kansas City for the second time May 12 and was optioned back to Omaha May 15...allowed a season-high four runs (first of four times) May 21 against Reno but picked up the win in a 9-6 Storm Chasers win...matched his season high with nine strikeouts May 31 at Albuquerque...matched his season high by allowing 10 hits in 7.0 innings in a no decision against Iowa, June 16...was promoted to Kansas City a third time June 20...then went 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA over his first five starts from June 27 to July 21 following his return...joined the Royals for his fourth stint July 7...tossed his lone complete game of the season in his first start following his return on July 11 against Iowa...fired a seven-hitter in a 3-2 seven-inning loss in the second game of a doubleheader.

**CAREER:** Was drafted by Kansas City in the ninth round of the 2011 draft...is 42-32 with 4.21 ERA in 111 career minor league appearances, including 106 starts, over five professional seasons...made his Major League debut with two stints with the Royals in 2014...compiled a 43.88 ERA in two games, including one start...is now 0-1 with a 20.57 ERA (16 er in 7.0 ip) in four career appearances, including one start...was named Pitcher of the Year at Triple-A Omaha in 2014 and also earned Pacific Coast League Postseason MVP honors after tossing a two-hit shutout to clinch the PCL title...earned Northwest Arkansas Pitcher of the Year honors in 2013 and was a Pioneer League All-Star in 2011.
