THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY:

Sept. 7

2005 - Craig Biggio hits a dramatic 3-run homer off ex-Astro **Billy Wagner** with 2 outs in the 9th to stun the Phillies, 8-6... **Lance Berkman** and **Mike Lamb** had previously gone deep...it's the 2nd night in a row the Astros tag their former closer for the winning run, extending Houston's win streak over Philadelphia to 12 straight.

1972 - Don Wilson ties a club record by tossing 13 innings in a complete game, 5-1 victory in SF...**Bob Watson** and **Roger Metzger** end it with home runs in the decisive frame...Metzger finishes with 4 hits and 4 RBI...Wilson throws 193 pitches in the win.

LABOR DAY SPECIAL: The Astros will commence this season-long, 11-day, 10-game road trip through Oakland, Anaheim and Texas with the opener of this 3-game series with the A's this afternoon...**RHP Mike Fiers** (7-9) will start for the Astros opposite A's starter **LHP Felix Doubront** (2-1).

DIVISIONAL GAMES: The Astros will play their next 22 games against AL Western division opponents before finishing the season with a 3-game series at Arizona...on the season, the Astros are 29-25 against the AL West: Seattle (10-6), Los Angeles (8-5), Oakland (7-6) and Texas (4-8).

PICKUP GAME: **RHP Mike Fiers** has pitched 5 times since the Astros acquired him via trade from the Brewers on July 30, including 4 starts... in his 4 starts, Fiers has posted a 2-0 record and a 0.67 ERA (2ER/27IP), which included his 1st career no-hitter on Aug. 21 vs. LAD.

IN THE STANDINGS: At 75-62 (.547), the Astros are in 1st place in the AL West with a 3.0-game lead over the 2nd-place Rangers...the Astros have been in 1st place or have shared 1st place for 41 straight days, dating back to July 28, and have owned at least a share for the division lead for 131 out of 154 days so far this season.

BESTS SINCE 2001: The Astros 75-62 record is their best after 137 games since 2001, when they were 80-57...the last time the Astros held at least a 3.0-game lead in their division this late in the season was on Sept. 28, 2001, when the Astros led the NL Central by 3.0 games over the Cardinals.

75 WINS: With 75 wins this season, the Astros have already surpassed their win total from 2014 (70-92)...the last time Houston posted more than 75 wins in a single season was in 2010 (76-86).

HIGH WATER MARK: A win today would put the Astros 14 games above .500, which would tie their high water mark on the season...the Astros were also 14 games above .500 after games on June 3 (34-20), July 3 (48-34), Aug. 2 (60-46), Aug. 26 (71-57), Aug. 29 (72-58) and Sept. 1 (73-59).

ABOUT YESTERDAY: The Astros defeated the Twins in thrilling fashion behind a strong pitching performance by **LHP Dallas Keuchel** (3ER/8IP) and a go-ahead, 7th-inning grand slam by **3B Jed Lowrie** (1x5, 4RBI) in their 8-5 series clinching win yesterday...the home series win over the Twins was the Astros 1st in franchise history.

HOME RECORDS: **LHP Dallas Keuchel** is 13-0 with a 1.49 ERA (19ER/114.2IP) in his 16 starts at Minute Maid Park this season...by winning his 1st 13 home decisions this season, Keuchel has tied a Major League record and has become 1 of only 4 pitchers to do so since 1914 (last, **RHP Dave Ferriss** in 1946)...dating back to last season, Keuchel has won 14 straight home decisions, a franchise record.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Astros are departing Minute Maid Park, where they have posted a 48-24 record, which ties as the best home record in the AL (also, KC)...the Astros are 24-8 in their last 32 home games and 40-15 in their last 55 and have won or split 13 of their last 14 home series.

BUCHANAN OUTRIGHTED: **RHP Jake Buchanan**, who was designated for assignment on Sept. 1, has cleared waivers and been outrighted to Triple A Fresno.

ERA LEADERS: The Astros own the best team ERA (3.34) in the American League, with both their bullpen (2.88) and their starting staff (3.56) ranking 2nd in the AL in ERA.

FIRE STARTERS: Since the Astros inserted **LHP Scott Kazmir** into the rotation on July 24, Houston owns the best team ERA (2.84) and the best starter's ERA (2.64) in the Majors...MLB rankings since July 24:

SPEED AND POWER: The Astros lead the American League in stolen bases (101) and rank 2nd in the Majors in home runs (185)...individually, **2B Jose Altuve** leads all American League players with 36 steals.

SPREADING THE WEALTH: The Astros have set a franchise record with 10 players recording double digit homers this season...the Major League record of 11 players with double-digit homers in a single season, set by the 2004 Tigers, is reachable for the Astros, as **IF Marwin Gonzalez** enters today's game with 9 home runs.

UP THE CHARTS: The Astros have posted 185 home runs this season, which ranks 5th among single-season totals in franchise history...with 2 home runs, the Astros can match the 4th-highest total, which was posted by the 2004 Astros (187)...the franchise record is 249 home runs, set by the 2000 club.

CONQUER THE COLISEUM: **2B Jose Altuve** has an active 20-game hitting streak at the O.co Coliseum, which ties as the 3rd-longest in Coliseum history, along with **IF Erick Aybar**, who extended his streak to 20 games earlier this month...the last player with a streak longer than 20 games at the O.co Coliseum was **OF Paul O'Neill**, who had a 21-game run over the 1995-98 seasons...the stadium record is a 30-game run, set by **IF Carney Lansford** in 1984.

RETURN OF THE JEDI: Over his last 6 games, **3B Jed Lowrie** has hit .454 (10x22) with 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 7 RBI and 2 walks...this hot streak comes on the heels of a season-long 0x28 run.

MINOR LEAGUE PLAYOFFS: The Astros have 7 affiliates that have clinched a postseason berth this season, besting their previous franchise record of 6, set in 2013...while the 5 full-season affiliates have yet to start postseason play, and with the DSL Astros being eliminated, only the Rookie Level Greeneville Astros were in post-season action last night, as they lost to Princeton in game 1 of their 3-game Appalachian League Championship Series.

LAST START - 8/29 at MIN: in his 1st start since tossing his 1st career no-hitter, notched the win in Houston's 4-1 victory over Minnesota...went 6.0 innings, allowing 1 run on 3 hits...walked 3 with 5 strikeouts.

ABOUT FIERS: 30-year-old will make his 5th start with the Astros and his 6th appearance overall with the club...his last name is pronounced as "fires."

• was acquired by Houston from Milwaukee on July 30, along with **OF Carlos Gomez** and slot number 76 in the 2015-16 international pool in exchange for prospects: **LHP Josh Hader**, **RHP Adrian Houser**, **OF Brett Phillips** and **OF Domingo Santana**.

STARTING STRONG: since making his 1st start with the Astros on Aug. 9 at OAK (1ER/6.2IP), has posted a 0.67 ERA (2ER/27IP), which leads the American League and ranks 3rd in the Majors in that span...has posted a .141 opponent batting average in that span, which also leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the Majors.

• is 1 of 5 pitchers in club history to allow 1 earned run or less in each of his first 4 starts with the club...the last to do it was **RHP Jarred Cosart** in 2013...looking to join **LHP Randy Niemann** (1979) as the only pitchers in Astros history to allow 1 earned run or less in each of their first 5 starts with the club.

MAKING HISTORY: tossed his first-career no hitter, and 1st career complete game on Aug. 21 vs. LAD...allowed just 3 walks on a career-high 134 pitches (previous high was 113, last accomplished on July 3 at CIN)...retired 21 straight batters following a 3rd inning walk to **Joc Pederson**.

• struck out 10 batters...was his 7th career double-digit strikeout game (last, July 23 at ARI, 10 K's).

• marked the 11th no-hitter in club history, 10th individual no-hitter, and 1st no-hitter in Minute Maid Park history...the Astros last no-hitter was a 6-pitcher combined effort on 6/11/13 at NYY (Oswalt, Munro, Saarloos, Lidge, Dotel, Wagner)...HOU's last individual no-hitter was tossed by **RHP Darryl Kile** on 9/8/93 vs. NYM.

WHIFF MACHINE: is 1 of 20 Major League starters with a strikeouts per 9.0 innings ratio above 9.00 (9.06, 151SO/150IP)...among those 20 starters, Fiers is the only 1 whose average fastball velocity is below 90 miles per hour (per Fangraphs).

• ranks 10th among all Major League starting pitchers in strikeouts per 9.0 innings (9.23, 356SO/347IP) since 2011, his debut season (min. 300IP)...trails only **Darvish**, **Sale**, **Salazar**, **Strasburg**, **Scherzer**, **Kershaw**, **Kluber**, **Harvey** and **deGrom**.

• has posted over a strikeout per inning in his Major League career with 379 strikeouts in 373.2 innings pitched.

AS A BREWER IN 2015: spent his entire 2015 season in the Brewers starting rotation prior to the trade, making 21 starts for Milwaukee...Milwaukee went 10-11 in his starts, while he went 5-9 with a 3.89 ERA (51ER/118IP) and 121 strikeouts.

STARTER vs. RELIEVER: has made 60 career starts and 16 relief appearances over his 5 years in the Majors...has posted a 22-26 record with a 3.53 ERA (136ER/347IP) as a starter and a 1-2 record and a 3.71 ERA (11ER/26.2IP) as a reliever.

IN 2014: went 6-5 with a 2.13 ERA in 14 games (10 starts) during a pair of stints with the Brewers (6/8-24 and 8/9-end)...he held opponents to a .181 batting average with 76 strikeouts in just 71.2 innings pitched.

vs. OAK: will face the A's for the 2nd time this season, and also the 2nd time in his career...made his 1st start with the Astros on Aug. 9 at OAK, tossing 6.2 innings and allowing 1 run in Houston's 5-4 defeat.
