OAKLAND ATHLETICS (64-87) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (81-69)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight games to fall 23 games under .500 for the first time since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)...are 13-25 (.342) over the last 38 games and 64-87 (.424) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and tied for sixth worst in the majors...the 87 losses are tied for third most by an A's team over the last 18 years (88 in 1998 and 2011, 87 in 2009)...will finish under .500 for the first time since 2011 and just the fifth time in the last 17 seasons...are in last place in the AL West for the 62nd consecutive day...have spent 130 of the last 134 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8), which are the fourth most days alone in last in Oakland history...have a tragic number of two to clinch a last place finish in the West...have finished last in the West just once over the previous 16 seasons (2009) and seven times in Oakland history (1998, 1997, 1995, 1993, 1979 and 1977).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Texas (0-1) and San Francisco (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Seattle (0-3) and Houston (2-1) and are 33-43 (.434) in Oakland, which is tied with Colorado for the worst home record in the majors...will have a losing record at home for just the third time in the last 17 seasons, but this will be the first time the A's will finish more than one game under .500 at home over that span...went 4-6 on the last road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Houston (1-2) and are 31-44 (.413) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the AL...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season (went 40-41 last year) and seventh time in the last nine years.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 8-6 yesterday, marking the 50th time they lost a game by two runs or fewer...that is a new Oakland record, breaking the previous mark of 49 set in 1968...have 32 one-run losses, which ties the Oakland record set in 1976...are 17-32 (.347) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Toronto, 13-27) and fifth worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940, .352 in 1943)...lead the majors in one-run losses and rank seventh in games...are 27-50 (.351) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst record in the majors...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games...rank third in the American League in most extra inning losses and lowest winning percentage and are fourth in games...are 10-18 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied with New York for the fewest in the AL and the losses are third most.

OFFENSE: The A's had back-to-back triples in the second inning last night (Smolinski and Semien) for the first time since July 26, 1992 vs. Toronto (Willie Wilson and Mike Bordick)...now have 40 triples for the season, which ties the Oakland single season record set in 1968, the A's first year in Oakland...have hit 28 home runs in 19 games in September, which matches the A's most in a month this year (May)...for the season, the A's rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (1036), third in triples and lowest slugging percentage (.395) and fourth in fewest home runs (135)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (151)...have the most infield hits by an A's team since 1992 (154)...have 12 sacrifice hits, which are the fewest in the majors and are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.43 ERA (122 er in 170.2 ip) in September, which is the highest in the majors (Philadelphia, 5.57)...have finished a month with an ERA of at least 6.00 twice in Oakland history: 6.59 in May, 1997 and 6.20 in April, 1994...now have a 3.99 ERA for the season, which ranks ninth in the American League...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have not finished in the top four in the AL in ERA was in 2007 when they finished sixth...have not finished lower than sixth since they were ninth in 1998...have allowed 67 home runs over the last 43 games after surrendering just 87 over the first 108 games...have 1122 strikeouts, which is the sixth highest single season total in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1160 in 2011, 1136 in 2012, 1124 in 2009)...lead the AL in shutouts (15), rank third in fewest extra base hits (411) and fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.393)...opponents have been successful in just 73-of-112 (65.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-19 with a 6.18 ERA (134 er in 195.0 ip) over the last 38 games (dating back to Aug. 11)...have tossed five innings or fewer in 18 of those contests and are averaging 5.13 innings per start over that span...now have a 3.74 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have allowed 89 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...have issued 273 walks, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 41 errors in the last 78 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 113 errors for the season, which is second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 115) and second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (124 in 2011)...have 62 unearned runs, which are the most in the AL and third most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 22, which rank first and tied for second in the AL...the 56 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

ROSTER NOTES: Last night, Bryan Anderson became the 52nd player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is second most in Oakland history (54 in 2007) and tied for third in the American League this year...have set a franchise record by using 30 pitchers and an Oakland record by using 23 relievers...the 23 relievers match the 1965 Kansas City A's for second most in franchise history (26 in 1955)...currently have 37 players on the active roster...have used the disabled list 23 times, which is their most since 2010 (23)...players have combined to miss 1026 games while on the DL, which is the most since 2012 (1072)...currently have seven players on the DL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 14-29 (.326) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 9-29)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .328 (19-39) in 1979...are batting .344 (44-for-128) with the bases loaded, which ranks second in the majors (Washington, .382) and third in Oakland history...A's pinch hitters lead the American League in walks (17), are tied for the lead in triples (2), rank second in hits (29) and plate appearances (138) and fourth in batting average (.246)...are one of three AL teams without a home run (Boston, Kansas City)...the A's have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas...including this series with the Rangers, the A's have played 23 consecutive series of three or more games without a sweep...have a streak of 34 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history (35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...are averaging 3 hours and 18 minutes per game in September after averaging 2:58 over the first five months of the season

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's have won the season series for the third time in the last four years as they lead 10-7 with two games remaining...went 6-3 in Texas and are 4-4 in Oakland...are 40-34 against Texas over the last four years...are 332-341 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 173-162 in Oakland and 159-179 in Texas...have an all-time record of 429-423 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1950** the A's score 12 runs in the sixth inning of a 16-5 win over Washington...Joe Astroth has a grand slam and six RBI in the inning...in **1973** Vida Blue wins his 20th as the A's win at Chicago 10-5 to clinch their third consecutive AL Western Division title...in **1988** Jose Canseco steals his 40th base of the season in the A's 9-8, 14-inning win at Milwaukee...he becomes the charter member of baseball's 40/40 club, hitting 42 home runs and stealing 40 bases...in **2001** Mark Mulder wins his 20th game and the A's clinch their first ever AL Wild Card with a 7-4 win at Seattle...in **2003** the A's clinch their third AL West title in four years and the 13th in Oakland history as they defeat Texas, 4-3 in 10 innings.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Felix Doubront (3-2, 4.95 ERA)

LAST THREE STARTS: Is 2-1 with a 7.25 ERA (18 er in 22.1 ip) and .318 (27-for-85) opponents batting average over his last four starts...went 0-0 with a 2.41 ERA and .214 opponents average over his first four games with the A's.

BRIEFLY: Was acquired by the A's from the Blue Jays on July 31 for cash considerations and is 2-1 with a 5.05 ERA (23 er in 41.0 ip) in eight games, including six starts, with Oakland...went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in five games, four starts, with Toronto prior to being designated for assignment July 29... was with Chicago (NL) during the spring but was released March 28... signed a minor league contract with Toronto April 2 and began the season on the disabled list at Triple-A Buffalo with a left shin contusion...was reinstated May 13 and went 1-3 with a 2.44 ERA in nine starts with the Bisons before he was selected by the Blue Jays July 3.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed five home runs in his last three starts (16.1 ip), including a career-high three on Sept. 13 at Texas, after surrendering just two home runs over his first 10 games (47.1 ip)...has surrendered 20 of his 22 extra base hits to right-handed hitters...lefties are slugging .327 (1 double, 1 home run) compared to .474 by righties...has yielded a .322 (19-for-59) average with runners in scoring position...the opponents number four hitter is batting .414 (12-for-29).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 3-2 with a 5.15 ERA (29 er in 50.2 ip) and .308 (61-for-198) opponents batting average in his 10 starts compared to 0-0 with a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) and .255 (13-for-51) opponents average in three relief appearances...allowed 2-of-6 (33.3%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 1-for-3 in his relief appearances...is now 30-25 with a 4.53 ERA (228 er in 453.1 ip) in 83 career starts, 1-0 with a 7.40 ERA in 32 relief appearances.

WITH TORONTO: Made his Blue Jays debut in relief on **July 3** at Detroit, allowing one run in 2.1 innings in relief of Drew Hutchison...picked up his first win of the season in his first start, a 2-1 Toronto win at Chicago (AL) **July 7**...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a Sanchez RBI single...shutout the White Sox on three hits over his final 4.2 innings...had a no decision in an 11-10 loss at Kansas City **July 12**...yielded a career-high tying seven runs, including six runs in the first inning and another in the fifth...left with an 8-7 lead but Delabar allowed three runs for the blown save...had a no decision in a 4-3, 10-inning loss at Oakland **July 22**...eft after 4.2 innings trailing 3-1... was the losing pitcher in Toronto's 3-2 loss to Philadelphia on **July 28**...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Asche and a RBI double by Blanco.

WITH OAKLAND: Tossed 4.1 innings of relief **Aug. 3** against Baltimore in his Oakland debut, which was an A's season-high for a reliever at the time...then tossed 6.1 innings of relief at Toronto **Aug. 12**...it was the longest relief appearance of his career (previous: 5.1 on May 8, 2013 vs. Minnesota) and the longest by an A's reliever since Lenny DiNardo tossed 6.1 innings July 7, 2007 vs. Seattle...did not strike out a batter and his 6.1 innings pitched were the most by an A's reliever in a game in which he did not record a strikeout since Johnny Kucks tossed 6.2 innings May 7, 1960 for the Kansas City A's against New York (AL)...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (NL) **Aug. 18** in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit but issued a career-high tying six walks... had a no decision in the A's 11-5 win at Seattle **Aug. 24**...left the game after two innings with a right foot contusion and the scored tied 0-0...the start was the shortest of his career...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-5 win over Los Angeles (AL) **Aug. 31** in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Aybar in the first inning and two more runs in the second on an Aybar sacrifice fly and a Cron steal of home...the A's then scored five times in the third inning to take the lead for good...won his second consecutive start in the A's 10-9 win over Houston **Sept. 7** in Oakland...allowed single runs in the first and second innings but the A's scored six runs in the sixth inning... was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-4 loss at Texas **Sept. 13**...yielded a career-high three home runs and a career-high tying seven runs in 4.1 innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win at Houston last Friday...allowed single runs in each of the first three innings on a Lowrie RBI single, a Carter home run and a Lowrie sacrifice fly...the A's scored twice in the fourth inning and he left after six innings with Oakland trailing 3-2... the A's scored twice in the eighth for the win.

DOUBRONT vs. TEXAS: Is 0-5 with a 12.68 ERA (22.0 ip, 44 h, 33 r, 31 er, 13 bb, 22 so, 5 hr) and .427 (44-for-103) opponents batting average in eight career appearances, including five starts...the five losses are his most against any team...is 0-3 with a 13.19 ERA (21 er in 14.1 ip) in five games at Globe Life Park, 0-2 with an 11.74 ERA (10 er in 7.2 ip) in three games in his home ballparks...is 0-5 with a 11.51 ERA (26 er in 20.1 ip) in his five starting assignments...was the losing pitcher in his only appearance this year, a start in the A's 12-4 loss at Texas on Sept. 13...yielded a career-high three home runs and a career-high tying seven runs in 4.1 innings...allowed a solo home run to Choo in the first and a two-run home run to Beltre in the fourth...then allowed four of the Rangers five runs in the fifth inning, including a three-run home run by Beltre.

WITH BUFFALO: Was 1-3 with a 2.44 ERA and .205 opponents batting average in nine games, all starts, with Triple-A Buffalo...signed a minor league deal with Toronto April 2 and began the season on the Triple-A DL with a left shin contusion...was reinstated May 13...surrendered just one home run in 48.0 innings...allowed a .197 (24-for-122) batting average and his lone home run against right-handed hitters compared to .222 (12-for-54) against left-handers...opponents hit .178 with runners in scoring position and .190 when leading off an inning...went 1-2 with a 1.69 ERA in six starts on the road, 0-1 with a 3.94 ERA in three starts at home...did not allow a run in the fourth (8.0 ip), fifth (6.0 ip) or seventh (3.0 ip) innings... the Bisons were 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed five innings or fewer in five of his nine starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Chris Bassitt (1-6, 2.82 ERA): Is scheduled to make his first start since Aug. 26, a loss in an 8-2 decision at Seattle (4.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 1 so)...has not pitched since then due to a strained shoulder...has tossed 73.1 innings this year...based on a minimum of 70 innings pitched, he ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (2.82) and opponents slugging percentage (.336) and 10th in opponents batting average (.223)... however, he has the lowest winning percentage (.143) and sixth lowest run support (3.31)...has received one run of support or fewer in seven of his 10 starts and his run support average as a starter is 2.15...has 25 runs of support in 15 career starting assignments...has a 6.30 ERA in the first inning, a 1.13 ERA in innings two through five and a 4.18 ERA from the sixth inning on...has faced the Rangers once in his career and it came in relief earlier this year on May 2 at Texas (1.0 ip, 1 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb)
