OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-7) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (8-2)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost a season-high four straight games to fall a season-high three games under .500 at 4-7...that matches the 2012 club for the A's worst record after 11 games over the last 15 years...a loss today would give the A's their worst record after 12 games since the 2001 club started the year 2-10...were swept by Los Angeles (AL) in a three-game series to start the homestand after sweeping a three-game series in Seattle last weekend...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days tied for third and three days tied for fourth...this is the A's 49th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 116th season in the AL...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have started the season 1-7 at home, which is the worst home record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it matches the 2001 A's for the worst record after eight home games in Oakland history...that club fell to 1-9 at home before winning their second game...have lost five straight home games, which matches the A's longest home losing streak from last year (April 11-26 and Sept. 1-6)...have now lost 18 of their last 22 home games dating back to Sept. 1, 2015...including this series, the A's have played 38 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...are 0-4 on this six-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Kansas City (0-1)...lost three of four to Chicago (AL) on the first homestand...are scheduled to play 10 of their first 13 games at home this year...leave following the game tomorrow for a 10-game road trip to New York (three games), Toronto (three games) and Detroit (four games)...that begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 contests on the road...went 3-0 on the first road trip of the season to Seattle, marking the third time in the last four years the A's have swept their first road series of the season (2013 at Houston, 2014 at Minnesota).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .186 (31-for-167) with 10 runs scored over the last five games...are 3-for-29 (.103) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...have scored six runs or fewer in each game this year, which is the A's longest season-opening stretch with six runs or fewer since the 1972 club went the first 13 games before scoring more than six runs in a game...the A's drew five walks last night, which marked the first time they walked more than three times this year...have the second lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.265), the third lowest batting average (.212) and slugging percentage (.331), the third fewest runs (29) and are tied for third fewest walks (25)...A's pinch hitters are 0-for-12.

ON THE BASES: The A's are a perfect 6-for-6 in stolen base attempts and are the only Major League team without a caught stealing...the season-opening streak of 11 consecutive games without a caught stealing is the second longest season-opening streak in Oakland history...the longest is a 23-game streak last year when the A's started the season 13-for-13...opponents have been successful in just 4-of-8 (50.0%) attempts, which is tied for the third lowest percentage in the American League...A's pitchers are tied for the Major League lead with two pickoffs (Atlanta, Milwaukee).

ONE-RUN GAMES: Six of the A's first 11 games have been decided by one run and the A's are 3-3 in those games...lead the majors in one-run decisions, are tied for the lead in one-run losses and are tied for second in one-run wins (Kansas City, 4)...last year, the A's started the season 1-13 in one-run games and did not win their third one-run decision until May 28 (number four came on June 10)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

PITCHING: The A's rank third in the American League with a 3.15 ERA...that includes 4.00 (32 er in 72.0 ip) at home compared to 0.96 (3 er in 28.0 ip) on the road...lead the league in hit batters (7)...A's starting pitchers have a 3.20 ERA (21 er in 59.0 ip), which ranks fourth in the AL...have

tossed fewer than five innings in four of the first 11 games and are averaging 5.36 innings per start (59.0 ip in 11 g).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in the last six games after making six in the first five...have eight errors overall, which is tied with Texas for the most in the American League...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...rank third in the AL in double plays this year (14).

ROSTER NOTES: Only three of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster played for Oakland prior to 2013 (Crisp, Doolittle, Reddick)...15 of the 25 were added following the 2014 campaign...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.28 years...that was the A's oldest Opening Day roster since 2004 when it was 30.16...Kendall Graveman was the youngest player at the age of 25 years, 105 days...it marked the first time in Oakland history the A's did not had a player under the age of 25 on the Opening Day roster...it is believed to be just the second time in Athletics history, although official Opening Day rosters are not available...the only other probable time the A's did not start the season with a player under 25 was 1902...three of the 25 players on the Opening Day roster were signed as free agents (Axford, Hill, Madson) and six were acquired in a trade (Alonso, Coghlan, Davis, Hendriks, Lowrie, Rzepczynski).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard)...Sogard began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton Monday night...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 12-17-3 (.422) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 when they went 12-21-1...committed 45 errors, which was six more than any other team (39, Chicago-NL)...they were the most by an A's team since at least 2000...the pitching staff issued 125 walks, which was the most among CL teams and second most in the majors to Boston (129)...the walks were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990...compiled a 6.10 ERA, which was third highest in the majors to San Diego (6.89) and San Francisco (6.37)...the ERA was second highest by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (6.22 in 1999).

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's lost the first game of 2016 last night and now have a five-game losing streak to the Royals in the Coliseum...that is the second longest home losing streak to Kansas City in Oakland history (7, Sept. 11, 1987 to Sept. 16, 1988)...lost the season series last year when they went 1-5 against the Royals...that was the A's worst mark ever against Kansas City...lost two of three in Kansas City and were swept in a three-game series in Oakland...have now dropped eight of their last nine games to the Royals...have lost each of the previous two season series and three of the previous four...are 12-17 against Kansas City over the last five years...all-time, the A's are 308-260 against the Royals...that breaks down to 169-115 in Oakland and 139-145 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns is the only Athletic without a strikeout and his 26 plate appearances are the most in the majors among players with no strikeouts...**Ryan Dull** is the first A's pitcher since at least 1913 to begin the season with seven consecutive hitless outings...**Marcus Semien** has four home runs in his last five games and is tied for fourth in the American League in home runs (4)...this is the first time he has hit more than three home runs in a month in his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Sal Bando hits the first grand slam in Oakland history in the A's 6-1 win over California at the Coliseum...in **1984** Dave Kingman becomes the second player in Oakland A's history to homer three times in one game in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle...he has a grand slam in the first, and two-run shots in the third and fifth and drives in eight runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (1-1, 2.70 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...started the A's third game of the season April 6 after being scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...is on his third straight Opening Day roster.

IN APRIL: Went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April last year and is now 8-2 with a 2.13 ERA (20 er in 84.2 ip) in 12 career starts in the month...

the eight wins are his most in any month and the ERA is second lowest to his 1.64 ERA in July.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) April 6 in Oakland...allowed his only run in the third inning when Jackson led off with a double, went to third on an Eaton ground out and scored on a Rollins sacrifice fly...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on Monday in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career (now has 504.1)...shut out the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings but Tropeano blanked the A's on six hits and two walks in five innings...allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a Nava RBI single and a Trout two-run home run.

GRAY vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 0-2 with a 3.15 ERA (20.0 ip, 20 h, 8 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 14 so, 1 hr) in three career starts...the Royals are one of two American League teams (besides the A's) that he has not defeated (Boston)...the no decision came in his only start last

year, a 6-4 A's loss at Kansas City April 17...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on two-out RBI singles by Hosmer, Gordon and Perez...the A's came back with two in the fourth to tie the game but he allowed a RBI single to Infante in the sixth...the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh and he left after six innings with the score tied 4-4...had two losses in two starts in 2014...the first came in a 1-0 loss in Oakland on Aug. 1...retired 14 of the final 15 batters he faced, but the one exception was a one-out home run by Ibanez in the fifth...Guthrie, Herrera, Davis and Holland combined to shutout the A's on five hits and three walks...then dropped a 3-2 decision at Kansas City Aug. 11...allowed single runs in each of the first two innings and the A's tied the game before he allowed an Escobar RBI single in the seventh for the loss.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 5.60 ERA in four starts...also started in a minor league game March 24...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...allowed a .311 (23-for-74) opponents batting average but issued just two walks in 17.2 innings...surrendered nine runs in his last two starts (8 er in 10.0 ip, 7.20 ERA) after yielding three in his first two (7.2 ip, 3.52 ERA)...went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA and a .354 opponents batting average last spring.

2015 RECAP: Was named to his first American League All-Star Team...went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA...also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.316) and OPS (.590), third in opponents batting average (.217), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.273), eighth in innings pitched (208.0) and tied for eighth in wins...the batting average and on-base percentage were seventh lowest in Oakland history and the OPS ranked eighth...finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting...led the A's in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts (169), complete games (3) and walks (59).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA, .198 opponents batting average and five home runs in 18 starts before the All-Star Break compared to 4-4 with a 3.74 ERA, .244 opponents batting average and 12 home runs in 13 starts after the break...it marked the second consecutive season he had 10 wins before the break and four after the break...is now 21-7 with a 2.41 ERA (71 er in 264.2 ip) in 40 career games before the break, 13-14 with a 3.38 ERA (90 er in 239.2 ip) in 38 games after the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Set an Athletics single season record for putouts by a pitcher with 37...broke the previous mark of 35 set by Chick Fraser in 1901...the putouts were the most by a pitcher since Kevin Brown had 41 for the Dodgers in 1999...did not commit an error in 60 chances, which were the most in the majors and second most in Oakland history (Langford, 62 in 1979) among pitchers with no errors...they were the most errorless chances by an AL pitcher since Josh Towers had 60 for Toronto in 2005...had the second most total chances among AL pitchers.

RANKINGS: Also tied for first in the AL in shutouts (2), tied for third in complete games, ranked fourth in fewest pitches per inning (14.8), tied for fourth in wild pitches (13), tied for sixth in winning percentage (.667), seventh in home runs per nine innings (0.74), tied for eighth in opponents grounded into double plays (19) and tied for ninth in opponents reaching on an error (8).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .217 opponents batting average included a mark of .208 (81-for-389) against left-handed hitters compared to .226 (85-for-376) against right-handers...it increased to .256 with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .146 with two strikes and .194 the first time through the lineup...held the number eight hitter in the batting order to a .139 batting average, which was the lowest in the AL and second lowest in the majors among pitchers that qualified for the ERA title...yielded a .326 average to the clean-up hitter, .203 against all other spots in the order.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA and five home runs in 16 starts on the road compared to 6-4 with a 2.82 ERA and 12 home runs in 15 starts at home...the road ERA was eighth lowest in Oakland history...it was second lowest over the last 34 years to his mark of 2.51 in 2014...is now 14-6 with a 2.57 ERA (59 er in 206.2 ip) in 31 starts on the road over the last two years compared to 15-12 with a 3.20 ERA (83 er in 233.2 ip) in 34 starts at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA in nine starts during the day compared to 9-5 with a 3.12 ERA in 22 starts at night...his day ERA ranked sixth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 50 day innings and is the lowest since Tim Hudson had a 1.39 ERA in 2003.

AGAINST THE WEST: Went 8-3 against American League West competition, 6-4 against everyone else...is now 20-9 with a 2.51 ERA (71 er in 254.2 ip) in 38 career games against the West compared to 14-12 with a 3.24 ERA (90 er in 249.2 ip) in 40 games against all other teams.

THIS AND THAT: Logged a 2-1 record and a 1.69 ERA in three interleague starts...ranked sixth in the majors in interleague ERA...was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more compared to 2-6 in 11 starts with two runs or fewer...is now 29-2 in 43 career starts with run support of three or more...the A's bullpen blew a save in six of his starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Chris Bassitt (0-0, 2.92 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and the 21st of his career...had his second consecutive no decision in his last start, a 2-1 A's win in 10 innings at Seattle last Sunday (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 0 er, 5 bb, 4 so)...is 0-0 with a 6.23 ERA (8.2 ip, 14 h, 6 r, 6 er, 5 bb, 7 so) in two career appearances against Kansas City, both starts with Chicago (AL) in 2014...went 2-2 with a 4.66 ERA and .263 opponents batting average in five spring training starts...surrendered just one home run in 19.1 innings...last year, he split his first season in the A's organization between Oakland and Triple-A Nashville...went 1-8 despite a 3.56 ERA and .244 opponents batting average in 18 games, including 13 starts, over four stints with the A's...surrendered just five home runs in 86.0 innings for an average of 0.52 home runs per nine innings...that ranked third best in the AL among pitchers with at least 81.0 innings.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in eight of its first 11 games and has a 0.90 ERA (3 er in 30.0 ip) in those contests...however, has allowed three or more runs in its three other games (11 er in 11.0 ip, 9.00 ERA).
- Has tossed 41.0 innings, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead, and allowed just five walks, which is tied with Chicago-NL for the fewest in the majors...leads the majors in walks per nine innings (1.10) and strikeouts per walk (7.00).
- Ranks fourth in the majors in inherited runners (20) and has inherited the most in the majors without allowing one to score...is one of three ML bullpens not to allow an inherited runner to score.
- Is tied for fifth in the American League in wins (2) and saves (3)...has the fourth highest opponents batting average (.248) and is tied for fourth in losses (2).
- First batters faced are 11-for-35 (.314) with two walks (.351 on-base percentage)...the opponents batting average and on-base percentage are third highest in the AL.

Last Year: Had four stints with the A's and posted a 9.90 ERA in 21 relief appearances...struck out 23 in 20.0 innings but also walked 13 and allowed seven home runs...also went 3-3 with five saves and a 4.11 ERA in 31 games with Nashville.
