CAREER: The 28-year-old Dallas native was acquired in a trade with the Detroit Tigers near the end of spring training... has seen action at the major league level each of the last 4 seasons, including 24 games with the Tigers last season... the Fort Worth resident spent the entire 2014 season in the majors with Detroit, logging a career-high 62 games as the club's primary backup catcher...reached the majors just 2 years after his selection in the 6th round of the 2010 June draft by the Tigers...was drafted out of Texas Christian University, where he won the Johnny Bench Award and led the Frogs to their first-ever College World Series appearance as a senior in 2010.

SPRING TRAINING: Batted .438 (14-32) with 3 doubles, a triple, 4 home runs, and 12 RBI over 16 games with the Tigers this spring...logged time at third base and left field in addition to his catching duties.

2015: Had a pair of stints with the Tigers: 5/9-7/2 and 9/1-end of season...opened the season in Triple-A Toledo after he was optioned to the club at the end of spring training... was recalled from Toledo on 5/9 and batted .271 (13-48) with 2 home runs and 12 RBI over 16 games in his first stint with the Tigers...hit 2nd career home run and matched a career high with 3 RBI in season debut on 5/14 vs. MIN...optioned to Toledo on 7/3...was on the disabled list, 8/18-25, with left thumb dislocation...recalled by the Tigers on 9/1 and spent the remainder of the season with the club...batted .313 (5-16) with a home run and RBI over 8 games in Sept./Oct....was 2-for-3 with a home run in start on 9/29 vs. Texas.

2014: Made an Opening Day roster for the first time in his career and spent entire season with the Tigers, serving as the backup catcher to Alex Avila...threw out 14 of 47 (29.8%) attempted basestealers...started 42 games behind the plate and appeared in 58 games overall at catcher...batted .301/.337/.349 vs. right-handed pitching and .151/.188/.192 against southpaws...was 0-for-3 as a pinch hitter...batted .278 (22-79) prior to the All-Star break and .182 (14-77) following the break...**2013:** Had 3 separate stints with the Tigers: 6/17-30, 8/12-26, and 9/3-end of season...combined to bat .296 (8-27) with a home run and 2 RBI in 16 games with Detroit...opened season in Toledo and was recalled for first stint on 6/17...started 4 games (3-for-13) before he was optioned to Toledo on 6/30...recalled again on 8/14 and batted .333 (4-12) with a home run and 5 runs scored in 8 games... hit 2nd major league home run on 8/22 vs. MIN off Andrew Albers...optioned to Toledo on 8/26 and was recalled on 9/3 for the remainder of the season...appeared in 4 games as a reserve in September...appeared in 11 games with Lacey in the Dominican Winter League following the season...**2012:** Made his major league debut, appearing in 6 games with the Tigers...had a pair of stints with Detroit: 6/6-20 and 9/1-end

of season...spent bulk of the campaign with Toledo, batting .240 (60-250) over 75 games...had contract purchased by the Tigers on 6/6 and made his major league debut that night vs. Cleveland...collected first major league hit with a single off Jeanmar Gomez...optioned to Toledo on 6/21...recalled by the Tigers on 9/1 and appeared in a pair of games during the final series of the season at KC...**2011:** Entered the season as the 20th-best prospect in the Detroit system and the best defensive catcher among Tiger farmhands...reached Double-A Erie in his 2nd pro season...led all Eastern League catchers with 78 assists, while he tied for the lead with nine double plays...**2010:** Spent 1st professional season with Lakeland.

AMATEUR: Led Texas Christian University to its first-ever College World Series appearance as a senior in 2010...was the recipient of the 2010 Johnny Bench Award as the top catcher in college baseball...still shares the College World Series record for most home runs in one tournament with 4...also received first-team Mountain West Conference and second-team All-American honors...tallied a school-record 99 hits, while batting .355 with 24 doubles, one triple, and 17 home runs during his senior campaign...was a second-team all-conference selection as a junior for the Frogs... also played one season at North Central Texas College in Gainesville, Texas and earned all-conference honors as a freshman...lettered four years at W.T. White High School in Dallas, garnering all-state honors as a junior and senior.

PERSONAL: John Bryan Holaday...he and his wife, Ashley, reside in Fort Worth with son, John Thomas, and daughter, Adalynn Mae...grew up in the Metroplex as a Rangers fan... played with the DBat select team as a teenager...played on the same summer ball team as current Texas right-hander Shawn Tolleson.

CAREER: The 31-year-old outfielder returned to Texas after signing a minor league contract with an invite to spring training on 2/26...finished the 2015 campaign with Texas, serving a pinch runner and defensive replacement over the final weeks of the regular season and postseason...the right-handed batter and thrower has played in 842 major league games with Cincinnati (2009-12), Cleveland (2013), Colorado (2014-15), and Texas (2015), playing primarily center field...he had 3 consecutive 30-steal seasons from 2010-12, including a career-best 40 stolen bases in 2011... he is one of just 7 major leaguers with at least 5 seasons of 10+ home runs and 10+ stolen bases over the last 6 seasons (2010-15)...he was a finalist for the 2012 Rawlings Gold Glove for National League centerfielders...a native of Atlanta, Texas, Stubbs attended the University of Texas at Austin before being selected in the first round (eighth overall) by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2006 June draft...he was a member of the Longhorns' 2005 College World Series championship team, a squad which included former Ranger Taylor Teagarden.

2015: Signed to a minor league deal on 8/24, Stubbs joined the Rangers in September and served primarily as a pinch-runner and defensive replacement after a brief cameo as a starter in the outfield...combined to hit .195 (24-123) with 5 HR and 10 RBI in 78 games with Colorado and Texas... was 5-for-6 in steal attempts...fewest games in majors since rookie season with Reds in 2009 (42).

TEXAS: Had contract purchased from Round Rock (AAA) on 9/1 and went 2-for-21 with no HR or RBI in 27 games for the Rangers...had 5 starts (3 in CF, 2 in LF), including 3 starts in a 4-game span from 9/6-9...both hits came in span of 2 games on 9/19-20 vs. SEA, the latter a double off Felix Hernandez in that series finale...scored winning run on Mitch Moreland walk-off sac fly 9/15 vs. HOU, as Rangers overtook Astros for 1st place in the A.L. West...had a running catch, followed by a leaping collision with the wall in right-center, to end win on 9/29 vs. DET...the Ian Kinsler drive likely would have scored the tying and go-ahead runs, instead Texas snapped a 3-game losing streak...signed minors contract with Rangers on 8/24 and hit .222 (6-27) with a 2B and 3 BB in 7 G with Round Rock.

COLORADO: Batted .216 with 5 HR and 10 RBI in 51 games over 2 stints with the Rockies (Opening Day-5/19 and 7/2-8/11) before he was designated for assignment on 8/12 and unconditionally released on 8/22...opened the season with an 0-21 span before his 1st hit on 5/1 at SD (HR)...it was the longest season-opening hitless streak snapped with a home run since 2012, when MIL's Brooks Conrad opened the year 0-27...also played 38 games for Albuquerque (AAA) this season, batting .263 with 2 HR and 20 RBI.

POSTSEASON: Has appeared in 12 career postseason games, including 4 of 5 games for Texas in the 2015 ALDS vs. Toronto...had just one plate appearance in that series, striking out as a pinch-hitter in the 8th inning of Game 4 in Arlington...started all previous 8 NLDS games with Cincinnati in center, batting .179 (5-28) in Reds' series losses to Philadelphia (2010) and San Francisco (2012)...Cole Hamels posted a shutout for the Phillies to finish off the 2010 series sweep at Great American Ball Park, and Stubbs was 0-for-3 in Roy Halladay's perfect game to open that series...Reds lost final 3 games in the 2012 series against the Giants, but Stubbs hit safely in 4 of the 5 games in that series.

2014: Went to Colorado in an offseason trade with Cleveland that sent LHP Josh Outman to the Indians... played at least 130 games for the 5th straight season...set career highs in average (.289), on-base pct. (.339), slugging (.482), OPS (.821), and doubles (tied-22)...led Rockies with 113 games and 92 starts in center...his 15 HR were T2nd-most in any season (22-2010, 15-2011)...4th career season with 20+ steals...hit .306 (41-134) with team highs in HR (8) and RBI (tied-25) in the 7th-or-later, posting a .952 OPS in those frames...tied for club lead with 8 GW RBI (also Nolan Arenado)...had pair of walkoff hits: 8/17 vs. CIN (3-R HR) and 9/6 vs. SD (1B)...also had go-ahead solo HR 4/29 at ARI and go-ahead 2-R HR in 8th on 7/9 vs. SD...hit .391 (9-23) with 2 2B, a HR, and 6 RBI as a pinch-hitter...posted .328 (43-131) avg. w/ 7 HR and 17 RBI vs. LHP...**2013:** In his lone season in Cleveland, spent the majority of the year as the club's regular right fielder...was his first MLB playing time at a position other than center field...played 105 games in right (86 starts) and 43 games in center (38 starts)...owned a .978 fielding percentage with 6 assists overall...went 17-for-19 in steal attempts...notched 500th career hit on 7/9 vs. TOR...had 2nd career 4-hit game on 5/3 vs. MIN...did not play in the Wild Card game loss vs. TB...**2012:** Was a finalist for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award and was voted by National League managers as the 3rd-best defensive center fielder in the NL...the Reds went 47-7 when he scored a run...produced his 3rd straight 30-steal season...led the club and ranked T9th in the National League with 30 stolen bases...from 7/23-7/29 won his first NL Player of the Week Award (along with MIL's Carlos Gomez)...homed 3 straight games, 7/28-30 (for 1st time in his career), and hit 4 HR in 6 games, 7/24-30 (11 RBI)...was on the 15-day DL from 6/6-25 with a strained left oblique (only career DL stint)...suffered the injury while swinging at a pitch on 6/5 vs. PIT and missed 8 games before he went on the DL...3rd career multi-homer game on 5/21 vs. ATL (2-3, 2 HR)...**2011:** Ranked among N.L. leaders in games (T9th) and stolen bases (T2nd)...was the hardest player in the N.L. to double up (2 GIDP in 604 AB)...became the 1st Reds player with 40 stolen bases in a season since Deion Sanders had 56 in 1997...established

career highs in games (158), runs (92), hits (147), doubles (tied-22), walks (63), and stolen bases (40)...his inside-the-park home run off Jo-Jo Reyes on 6/17 vs. TOR was the first of his career and the 1st by a Reds batter at Great American Ball Park...**2010:** Became only the 9th player in Reds history to produce at least 20 HR and 30 SB in a season, 1st since Brandon Phillips in 2007...joined CWS' Alex Rios as only ML CF with 20+ HR and 30+ SB...led the team and ranked 7th in N.L. with 30 stolen bases...also led team with 6 triples, 135 starts in CF and 83 starts batting 7th in the order...in his last 24 games, hit .350 (28-80, 7 HR, 18 RBI) while the Reds battled for the division title...in the 8th inning of a 5-4 win on 4/9 vs. CHC, erased a 3-1 deficit with his first career grand slam (off Esmailin Caridad)...on 7/4 at CHC, became only the 25th player in Reds history to hit 3 homers in a game (30th time) and produced a career-best 5 RBI...his 12 total bases in that game were the most by a Reds batter all season, tying Jay Bruce's effort on 8/27 vs. CHC...**2009:** Was one of 8 Reds players to make his ML debut...promoted on 8/19, when Willy Taveras was placed on the disabled list, and finished the season as the club's starting centerfielder... after promotion, led the Reds in HR (8) and SB (10) while ranking 2nd in total bases (79) and runs (27), 3rd in hits (48) and T4th in RBI (17)...among all N.L. rookies, ranked T5th in both steals and outfield assists (4)...the Reds went 28-16 after he was promoted...in September, led the Reds in HR (5) and SB (7)...ranked 3rd on the club with 12 infield hits (Willy Taveras 28, Brandon Phillips 17)...hit a team-high 3 leadoff home runs and the Reds' only walk-off homer of the season... on 8/19 vs. SF, doubled off Barry Zito for his 1st career hit in his 3rd plate appearance...in the 10th inning of the 2-1 win on 8/20 vs. SF, hit his 1st career home run, a solo walk-off shot off Bobby Howry...at Louisville, tied for the International

League lead with 46 stolen bases...was an International League midseason All-Star...**2008:** Combined to hit .277 with 7 HR, 57 RBI and 33 stolen bases over 131 games for 3 different minor league affiliates...led Reds system in steals...began the season with High-A Sarasota, where he ranked 5th in the Florida State League with 27 stolen bases...received the Star of Stars Award as MVP of the FSL All-Star Game (1-3, 2-R HR)...promoted to Chattanooga on 7/9...promoted to Louisville on 8/12...played winter ball for Peoria in the Arizona Fall League...played in the AFL's Rising Star Showcase game...**2007:** At Single-A Dayton, led the Midwest League with 93 runs scored...played in the Midwest League All-Star Game (0-3).

PERSONAL/AMATEUR: Robert Andrew Stubbs...2003 graduate from Atlanta (TX) High School, where he was a high school All-America selection...was a 3-time All-American in baseball and 2-time academic All-American at the University of Texas, where he majored in business...led UT to the 2005 College World Series title...in 2006 shared Longhorns Co-Most Valuable Player honors...following the 2006 season was first team All-America, Big 12 Co-Player of the Year and one of 5 finalists for the Golden Spikes Award...in 2004, hit a game-winning, 2-run triple in the FISU II World University Baseball Championship game in Taiwan, earning Team USA the gold medal...batted .319 (22-69) as a freshman for that U.S. squad that featured future major leaguers Ryan Zimmerman, Troy Tulowitzki, and Alex Gordon.
