### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-22) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (17-22)

THURSDAY, MAY 19, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's swept a three-game series from Texas to start the homestand and have now won four straight, which is their second longest winning streak of the season...won six in a row from April 16-22...the sweep of the Rangers was the A's third of the season, but their first at home...have won five of the last six games after losing a season-high five straight and nine of the previous 10...are 6-10 (.375) in May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...have the third worst record in the American League in May...are 19-22 for the season, are in third place in the AL West for the second consecutive day, and trail first place Seattle by four games...last year, the A's were 14-27 after 41 games and trailed first place Houston by 12½ games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, seven days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's sweep of Texas to start the homestand was their first sweep in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...that snapped an Oakland-record streak of 40 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...are 3-0 on this seven-game homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (four games)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 13 of 16 games at home...will play all 16 of those games in the Pacific Time Zone as the three road games are at Seattle beginning on Monday...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 8-11 (.421) at home, which is the fourth worst home record in the American League...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (2-1) to conclude a stretch where they played 19 of 25 games on the road...are 11-11 (.500) on the road...are batting .265 (207-for-782) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (96 runs in 22 games) on the road compared to .230 (142-for-617) with an average of 3.58 runs per game (68 runs in 19 games) at home...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .282 (129-for-457) over their last 13 games, which has lifted their overall batting average to a season-high .249...have a .301 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...have the second fewest walks in the AL (99) but are tied for the third most intentional walks (7)...are tied for the fewest doubles (54), tied for the third fewest strikeouts (278) and have the fourth fewest extra base hits (106)...have hit 14 home runs over the last six games after hitting just six home runs over the previous 11 contests...have three four-homer games over the last six games after tallying just two games with four or more home runs over their previous 256 contests dating back to July 27, 2014.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 2.33 ERA (7 er in 27.0 ip) over the first three games of the homestand after posting an 8.40 ERA on the last road trip...now have a 6.52 ERA (100 er in 138.0 ip) in May, which is second highest in the majors (MIN, 6.71)...lead the majors in home runs allowed in May (29) and rank third in the American League in most walks (57)...have a 4.71 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL...have the fourth highest opponents on-base percentage (.332)...are tied for the second most home runs (53), have issued the fourth most walks (137) and have allowed the fourth most extra base hits (130).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 3-1 with a 3.68 ERA (15 er in 36.2 ip) and .236 (33-for-140) opponents batting average over the last six games and have tossed at least 5.2 innings in each outing...went 0-4 with a 19.29 ERA and .458 opponents average over the previous four games, tossing 3.2 innings or fewer in each appearance...the A's are the only Major League team that has not had a starter pitch more than seven innings...the last A's starter to pitch more than 7.0 innings is Sonny Gray on Aug. 22, 2015 (8.0 ip)...have a streak of 79 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: 77, July 18, 2008-April 18, 2009)...starters are 12-19 with a 5.17 ERA (135 er in 219.1 ip) for the season...have the second highest ERA in the majors (MIL, 5.48) and the third most losses (MIL and SD, 20).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 30 errors, which is the most in the American League and fourth most in the majors...have 14 un-

earned runs, which are fourth most in the AL...are tied for third in the AL in double plays (41).

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's faced a left-handed starting pitcher in each of the previous four games...began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but then faced righties in 32 of the next 34 games...are 5-4 (.556) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-18 (.438) against righties.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's recorded their second walk-off win of the season Tuesday night (both home runs) to improve to 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the seven last at bat wins are tied with Seattle for the most in the majors...are 6-6 in one-run games...are tied for fourth in the American League in one-run wins and games...are 2-0 in extra inning games...are tied for second in the AL in most extra inning wins and fewest extra inning games.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 4-1 on Friday, which is tied with Baltimore and Washington for the best record in the majors...are 11-7 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday compared to 8-15 from Monday through Thursday...have been successful in 5-of-7 (71.4%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the seven challenges are tied for fourth fewest in the majors...A's pinch hitters are 7 for their last 17 (.412) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in hits (7) and plate appearances (30)...the A's are one of eight teams in the majors averaging under three hours a game (2:58)...the A's designated hitter entered the game defensively for the sixth time this year Sunday...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least six times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's added Josh Phegley to the disabled list Tuesday and now have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Sogard)...that matches the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1989...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have now used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. YANKEES:** The A's swept a three-game series in New York in April to open the season series...it was the first time in 10 series at the new Yankee Stadium the A's swept a series...it was their first sweep in New York since June 9-11, 2006 and that is the A's only sweep at New York over the last 22 seasons...have won each of the previous three season series and are 16-6 (.727) against the Yankees since the start of the 2013 season...that is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span (Texas, 14-10)...have won 21 of their last 29 games against New York, including 12 of the last 14 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 242-272 against the Yankees...that includes 132-123 in Oakland and 110-149 in New York...all-time, the A's are 783-1138 against the Yankees/Orioles.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Khrist Davis** has four home runs in his last two games, nine in his last 14, 12 in his last 25 and 32 over his last 91 dating back to Aug. 6, 2015...is tied for the American League lead in home runs this year (12)...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 15 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...**Josh Reddick** is now batting .375 (33-for-88) over his last 24 games after hitting .218 over his first 16 contests...**Danny Valencia** was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6 and is 15-for-33 (.455) with nine runs, six home runs, 12 RBI and five multiple-hit games in nine games since his return.

In **1971** Vida Blue tosses a three-hit shutout and Rick Monday and Reggie Jackson homer in the A's 3-0 win over Milwaukee...in **2004** Bobby Kielty homers twice and drives in four runs as the A's defeat Detroit, 6-2...in **2006** Dan Haren and Huston Street combine on a two-hit shutout as the A's defeat San Francisco, 1-0.

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (1-5, 5.84 ERA)**

**FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Is 0-4 with a 9.31 ERA (20 er in 19.1 ip) and .365 (31-for-85) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts...his current four-game losing streak is the second longest of his career to a six-game streak from July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016...has five losses for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...is now 1-10 with a 5.83 ERA (49 er in 75.2 ip) over his last 15 starts dating back to July 10, 2015...went 6-4 with a 3.20 ERA over his first 18 career games, including 13 starts.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed 10 home runs, which is tied for second most in the American League...has held left-handed hitters to a .224 (17-for-76) batting average, compared to .333 (24-for-72) against right-handers...however, has issued 10 of his 14 walks to lefties...last year he issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 0-2 with a 3.57 ERA (7 er in 17.2 ip) and .246 (17-for-67) opponents batting average in three starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 7.91 ERA (17 er in 19.1 ip) and .304 (24-for-79) opponents average in four starts on the road...has surrendered one home run in 17.2 innings at home, nine in 19.1 innings on the road.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received no run support in three of his seven starts and three runs of support or fewer in all seven of his starts...his season run support average is 2.43 (10 rs in 37.0 ip)...last year, he was 1-9 in 13 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 5-0 in eight starts with three runs of support or more...his career numbers are 1-13 in 17 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-1 in 11 starts with three runs of support or more.

**THIS AND THAT:** is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 0-3 with an 8.05 ERA (17 er in 19.0 ip) in four starts on four or five days rest compared to 1-2 with a 3.50 ERA (7 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts on six days rest or more...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle and is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts

**SIX-GAME LOSING STREAK SNAPPED:** Picked up his first win of the season April 20 at New York (AL), which snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to last year...that was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012...compiled a 5.04 ERA and .267 opponents batting during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from July 10, 2015 to April 12, 2016.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on two hits over the first five innings, but Mat Latos blanked the A's on one hit over the first six innings...the scored was tied at 0-0 when he walked Cabrera to lead off the sixth...Abreau followed with a two-run home run and Graveman left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning...walked Pujols to start the inning and Calhoun singled him over to third...Simmons then grounded into a double play and Graveman was relieved by Axford to start the seventh with the A's leading 3-1...Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Madson allowed two runs in the eighth and Doolittle surrendered two in the ninth.

**THIRD START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on April 20...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle...struck out a career-high eight batters on a career-high tying 111 pitches...allowed a one-out solo home run to Gregorin in the second inning, but that was the only run he would surrender in 6.1 innings of work...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit April 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits...surrendered single runs in each of the first two innings on a Cabrera home run in the first and an Aviles RBI single in the second...then yielded a three-run home run to Cabrera followed by a solo home run by Victory Martinez in the fifth and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

**FIFTH START:** Hewas the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle last Monday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the second consecutive start...the A's scored a run in the second inning and he blanked the Mariners on a hit and a walk over the first three innings...then allowed a RBI single to Lind in the fourth and two more runs in the sixth on a Seager RBI double and an Ianetta RBI single...yielded a one-out double

to Aoki in the seventh and was relieved by Rzepczynski who allowed Aoki to score.

**SIXTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-3 loss at Baltimore on May 8...yielded a career-high four home runs, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also allowed four home runs...the A's scored three times in the first but he allowed a two-run home run to Machado in the bottom of the first...allowed back-to-back home runs to Alvarez and Schoop in the second and a two-run home run to Trumbo in the third...left after 2.2 innings trailing 6-2.

**LAST START:** He lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 6-0 loss at Tampa Bay last Saturday...allowed a two-run home run to Miller in the third inning...also yielded two runs in the sixth inning on a Pearce sacrifice fly and a Kiermaier RBI single...Andriese shut out the A's on two hits, no walks and a hit batter.

**GRAVEMAN vs. NEW YORK:** Is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 12 so, 2 hr) in two career appearances, both starts...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 5-2 A's win at New York on April 20...struck out a career-high eight pitches...allowed a one-out solo home run, but that was the only run he would score in the fifth inning in his first appearance, a 5-2 A's win on May 28 of last year...allowed a solo home run, an RBI single to McCann in the fifth...was relieved by Abad with the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice off the hook and twice in the seventh

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 1-2 with a 4.73 ERA (26.2 ip, 25 h, 15 r, 14 er, 11 bb, 18 so) in six games, including five starts...allowed a .253 (25-for-99) opponents batting average...led the A's and ranked seventh in the Cactus League in innings pitched (26.2)...allowed three runs in 12.0 innings over his last two starts (3.00 ERA) after surrendering 12 runs in 14.2 innings over his first four games (11 er, 6.75 ERA).

**2015 RECAP:** The rookie right-hander went 6-9 with a 4.05 ERA in 21 starts over two stints with the A's before his season ended in late August due to an oblique injury...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...was brought back May 23 and went 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over his first nine starts following his return...then went 0-5 with a 5.82 ERA over his final eight starts beginning July 10...was placed on the 15-day disabled list Aug. 24 with a strained left oblique...tied for fourth among American League rookies in games started (21), ranked fifth in innings pitched (115.2), ninth in strikeouts (77) and tied for ninth in wins...had one of seven complete games by an AL rookie...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with Nashville...allowed one home run in 24.1 innings...held the opposition to a .213 batting average, including .118 (4-for-34) against left-handed hitters compared to .267 (16-for-60) against right-handers...allowed five runs in 5.0 innings in his first start for the loss...then went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA over his final three starts.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Sonny Gray (3-3, 5.84 ERA):** Is 0-3 with a 10.31 ERA and .329 opponents batting average over his last four starts...the losing streak is one short of his career high of four (Aug. 1-16, 2014)...has allowed at least four runs in each start, the first time in his career he has allowed four or more runs in more than two consecutive starts...went 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts...is 2-2 with a 4.10 ERA in four starts at home compared to 1-2 with an 8.35 ERA in four starts on the road...has a 5.84 ERA, which is fourth highest in the American League...also has the fourth highest opponents slugging percentage (.503), the ninth highest on-base percentage (.348) and the 10th highest batting average (.277)...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's win at Tampa Bay last Sunday (5.2 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 3 hr)...is 1-1 with a 3.43 ERA in three career starts against New York.

- The A's bullpen posted a 2.46 ERA over its first 28 games, yielded 34 runs over a seven-game span May 4-11 (9.79 ERA) and has a 2.20 ERA (4 er in 16.1 ip) in six games since then...has a 4.00 ERA overall, which is the third highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 141.2 innings, which are the most in the AL and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 13-of-70 (18.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 18.0%).
- Is 13-for-16 (81.3%) in save opportunities...the save percentage ranks second in the AL and the saves are tied for second.
- Is tied for the second fewest losses in the AL (3), is third in walks per nine innings (2.60) and strikeouts per walk (3.34), tied for fourth in opponents grounded into double plays (11) and fifth in strikeouts (137)...has the fifth highest opponents batting average (.248) and has allowed the fifth most home runs (17).
