TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 19, 1998: The Yankees move 20 games above .500 (29-9) by coming from behind to defeat the Orioles, 9-5 at Yankee Stadium. New York scores six runs in the eighth inning, as Bernie Williams and Tim Lincecum each homer in the frame.

May 19, 1953: During a streak of three consecutive "walk-off" victories, Hank Bauer hits a two-run homer that scores Mickey Mantle in the bottom of the 11th inn. of a 4-2 win over the Tigers.

May 19, 1928: Six-time All-Star Gil McDougald is born in San Francisco, Calif. McDougald played all 10 of his Major League seasons with the Yankees (1951-60) and batted .276 in 1,336 games, appearing in eight World Series and winning five.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 20, 1979: Tommy John tosses a 2H, 2-0 shutout at Fenway Park (9.0IP, 0BB, 5K) to improve to 9-0 on the season. John would finally suffer his first loss of the season six days later at Cleveland.

May 20, 1948: Joe DiMaggio hits for his second of two career cycles in a 13-2 Yankees win at the White Sox, going 5-for-6 with 6RBI and 2HR.

AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees play the fourth game of a seven-game road trip to Arizona (went 1-2) and Oakland (tonight-Sun)...went 7-3 on their 10G homestand which was completed on Sunday (2-1 vs. Boston, 3-1 vs. Kansas City, 2-1 vs. Chicago-AL)...will have a day off on Monday upon returning from their trip before a three-game series vs. Toronto (5/24-26) at Yankee Stadium.

- ▶ Are 8-5 in their last 13G and 9-6 in their last 15G (since 5/4).
- ▶ Are 9-7 through the first 16G of scheduled games on 20 consecutive days (5/3-22), matching the club's longest stretch of 2016 without a scheduled off day...because of a make-up game rescheduled for 6/2 at Detroit, will also play on 20 straight days from 5/24-6/12...are scheduled to play on 40-of-41 days from 5/3-6/12.
- ▶ Have held a lead in 29-of-39 games this season (are 17-12 in those games).
- ▶ Have come from behind in 10 of their 17 wins in 2016.
- ▶ Are in the midst of a stretch of 26-of-39 games on the road (10-12 overall; 7-3 at home, 3-9 on the road).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Wednesday, the Yankees won the final game of their series at Arizona, 4-2...**RHP Nathan Eovaldi** (6.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 0BB, 5K) started and earned the win, tying his career low in hits allowed in a start (also 8/10/13 w/ Miami at Atlanta, 7.0IP, 1H, 3BB, 8K)...retired his final 18BF consecutively following a leadoff double in the first...**LF Brett Gardner** (2-for-5) gave the Yankees a 2-0 lead, hitting a two-run homer as the second batter of the game...**CF Jacoby Ellsbury** (3-for-3, 1 double, 2BB) reached base safely in all 5PA and drove in the deciding run on a sixth-inning single...marked his second game this season reaching safely five times (also 5/4 at Baltimore)...**C Brian McCann** (1-for-3, 1 double, 2BB) reached base safely three times...**RHP Dellin Betances** tossed a scoreless seventh (1.0IP, 2BB, 2K)...**LHP Andrew Miller** (1.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 3K, 1HR) allowed his second run of the year on a solo-HR...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** notched his fourth save in a perfect ninth (1.0IP, 1K)...threw the fastest pitch in MLB thus far his season (102.8 MPH) to Paul Goldschmidt (ball).

- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** allowed just 2H, marking their lowest total since 9/22/14 at Baltimore (1H)...was their first game allowing 2H-or-fewer and at least 2R since 4/9/02 at Toronto (allowed 2H in a 5-2 win).

EOVALDI EXPRESS: RHP **Nathan Eovaldi** allowed just one baserunner (leadoff double in the first) in 6.0IP in Wednesday's win at Arizona...retired his final 18 batters faced.

- ▶ Was the first Yankees pitcher to throw at least 6.0IP and allow one-or-zero baserunners since Mike Mussina's near-perfect game on 9/2/01 at Boston (9.0IP, 1H, 0R, 0BB, 13K).
- ▶ Is 4-0 with a 3.48 ERA (31.0IP, 12ER) over his last five starts.
- ▶ Is 3-0 with a 2.10 ERA (30.0IP, 7ER) in five career starts at Chase Field...his streak of five starts with at least 5.0IP and 2R-or-fewer is the fifth-longest by a visitor in the park's history.

GIVE 'EM 'ELL: Since 5/1, **CF Jacoby Ellsbury** is batting .400 (12-for-30) with 9R, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 3RBI, 5BB, 4SB, .500 OBP and a 1.100 OPS...over the stretch, leads all MLB centerfielders (min: 30AB) in OBP and is second in both BA and OPS.

HEAD GAMES: **3B Chase Headley** has reached base safely in a season-high 10 straight games since turning 32 on 5/9, batting .323/.400/.548 (10-for-31) with 6R, 1 double, 2HR, 7RBI and 4BB during the streak...has at least 1RBI in six of his last nine games, coming on the heels of a career-long 23-game RBI drought (4/8-5/9).

MAC ATTACK: **C Brian McCann** is batting .300/.397/.500 (15-for-50) with 5R, 4 doubles, 2HR, 10RBI and 7BB while reaching safely via H/BB/HP in 12-of-15G since 4/30.

- ▶ Ranks fourth among Major League catchers in OPS (.811).
- ▶ Has 10RBI in his last 12G (since 5/4).

WHAT'S LEFT: **SS Didi Gregorius** is batting .343/.378/.429 (12-for-35) with 3 doubles, 7RBI and 1BB vs. left-handed pitchers this season, sixth-highest in the Majors among qualified left-handed hitters.

- ▶ Has 6H in his last 11AB vs. LHP with 3 doubles and 7RBI.
- ▶ Since 8/28/15, is batting .363/.414/.425 (29-for-80) with 5 doubles, 17RBI and 5BB in 89PA vs. left-handed pitchers...prior to that date, had been a .186 (49-for-264) hitter vs. southpaws in his Major League career (294PA).

HIGH HEAT: Per FanGraphs' PITCHf/x, **Yankees pitchers** have averaged 94.0 mph on their fastball this season, the highest average velocity in the Majors.

- ▶ **Yankees starters** have averaged 94.2 mph on their fastball this season, also best in the Majors...the Yankees rotation features two of the five hardest-throwing starters in the Majors (min. 30.0IP), with **RHP Nathan Eovaldi** (96.7 mph) and **RHP Luis Severino** (95.5 mph) ranking second and fifth, respectively.
- ▶ According to MLB Statcast, **LHP Aroldis Chapman** has thrown the 13 fastest pitches in the Majors this season, topping out at 102.8 mph in the ninth inning on Wed. at Arizona (ball to Paul Goldschmidt).

END GAME: In 16G since 5/3, **Yankees relievers** are 4-1 with a 2.20 ERA (49.0IP, 36H, 14R/12ER, 17BB, 58K, 5HR, .203 opp. BA)...allowed 4ER in 4.0IP in Monday's loss at Arizona after posting a 1.62 ERA in the prior 13G...marks the Majors' third-best bullpen ERA since 5/3 (San Francisco-2.06, Mets-2.06).

- ▶ Have tossed at least 3.0 scoreless innings in a game 13 times this season, including four of the last 7G.
- ▶ Had a 16.2-inning scoreless streak snapped in Sunday's win vs. Chicago-AL.
- ▶ **LHP Andrew Miller** has recorded 15-of-19 outs since 5/6 via strikeout (6.1IP, 7H, 2ER, 1BB, 15K, 1HR, 1HP).
- ▶ **RHP Dellin Betances** (50.0%) and Miller (50.0%) are tied for first in strikeout rate among MLB relievers.

THREE HEADS ARE BETTER THAN ONE: The trio of **RHP Dellin Betances**, **LHP Andrew Miller** and **LHP Aroldis Chapman** have pitched in the same game three times this season (5/14-15 vs. Chicago-AL and Wed. vs. Arizona), posting a 1-0 combined record with 3SV and a 1.93 ERA (9.1IP, 5H, 2ER, 2BB, 18K, 1HR) in those contests.

STARRING ROLE: **2B Starlin Castro** has hit safely in 11 of his last 13 games (since 5/5), batting .280 (14-for-50) with 7R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 4RBI and 2BB over the stretch...from 5/5-13, joined Robinson Cano as the only Yankees second basemen since 2005 with a hitting streak of at least 8G.

- ▶ Has 14XBBH in 38G this season...had just 12XBBH in the first three months of 2015 w/ the Cubs (74G).

JOE GIRARDI, M.D.: On Saturday at Oakland, Joe Girardi will manage his 1,500th career game...is 830-667 (.554) in 1,497 career games...owns a 752-583 (.563) record with the Yankees (2008-pres.) and posted a 78-84 (.481) record with the Marlins in 2006.

- ▶ Among all-time managers with as many or more games managed (1,497), ranks 16th in career winning percentage and 13th among those who managed the majority of their games in the Modern Era (since 1900)...all but two managers with better winning percentages are in the Hall of Fame.

YANKEES at OAKLAND

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees and Athletics meet seven times (0-3) in 2016...begin a four-game set in Oakland tonight after they were swept in 3G in the Bronx from 4/19-21...are 5-15 in their last 20G and 8-21 in their last 29 meetings...had gone 29-7 in the previous 36 matchups prior to that stretch...the Yankees’ .620 winning percentage (1,026-628-5) against the Athletics franchise since 1914 is their highest vs. any AL opponent (min. 35G) in that span...**IN 2015:** Went 3-4 vs. the A’s, going 2-1 at home and 1-3 in Oakland...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have lost each of the last three season series (6-13 in 19G) but are 4-2-2 vs. Oakland over the last eight season series (since 2008)...marks their longest streak of season series losses to Oakland since losing three straight from 1971-73...the Yankees have not lost the season series to the A’s franchise in four consecutive years since dropping seven in a row to the Philadelphia Athletics from 1908-14...**AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** After winning a franchise-best nine straight from 7/5/10-7/19/12, are 2-12 in the last 14 road games vs. the A’s...have lost four straight series in Oakland in that span, their longest such streak since dropping 12 series in a row at the Coliseum from 8/26/85-5/1/91...are still 15-13 in their last 28G here...are 123-132 all-time at Oakland...**IN POSTSEASON:** The Yankees have won all three postseason series against the A’s (2001 ALDS, 3-2; 2000 ALDS, 3-2; and 1981 ALCS, 3-0).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP IVAN NOVA (2-1, 3.70 ERA)

RHP Ivan Nova is scheduled to make his third start of the season tonight at Oakland...the 29-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...is 1-0 with a 1.74 ERA (10.1IP, 2ER) in two starts this season after making his first six appearances out of the Yankees bullpen, going 1-1 with one save and a 5.14 ERA (14.0IP, 8ER)...returned to the Yankees' rotation in 2015 after missing the first 71 games of the season on the D.L. while recovering from "Tommy John" surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow, which was performed on 4/29/14 by Dr. James Andrews in Pensacola, Fla....finished fourth in 2011 AL Rookie of the Year voting after going 16-4 with a 3.70 ERA (165.1IP, 68ER) in 28 games (27 starts), the most wins by a Yankees rookie since Stan Bahnsen went 17-12 in 1968...made his Major League debut with the Yankees on 5/13/10 at Detroit...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 7/15/04.

LAST START: Made his second start of the season on 5/14 vs. the White Sox and earned his second win (5.2IP, 4H, 1ER, 1BB, 2K, 1HR)...induced 13 groundball outs and did not issue a walk until his final batter faced...allowed his only run on a solo home run to Todd Frazier in the fourth inning...has allowed just 1R in each of his two starts (1.74 ERA, 10.1IP, 2ER) and both have come via the home run.

OTHER START: Made his first start of the season in a 6-3 win on5/9 vs. Kansas City (ND, 4.2IP, 6H, 1ER, 1BB, 3K, 1HR)...allowed just a solo HR to Alex Gordon in the second...exited with a 5-1 lead with two on and two outs in the fifth, failing to qualify for the win.

- ✦ Marked his first no-decision *in a start* since 9/10/13...had taken a decision in 24 consecutive starts, the longest such streak by an AL pitcher since Toronto’s Roy Halladay took decisions in 26 consecutive starts from 6/30/08-5/17/09.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 1-0 with a 4.24 ERA (17.0IP, 8ER) in four career appearances (three starts) against Oakland...made a relief appearance vs. the A's earlier this season on 4/20, tossing a perfect ninth inning...is 1-0 with a 4.50 ERA (16.0IP, 8ER) in three starts against the Athletics and 1-0 with a 3.29 ERA (13.2IP, 5ER) in two starts at the Coliseum.

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-0 with a 1.74 ERA (10.1IP, 2ER) in two starts this season, allowing both of his runs via the home run...is 46-31 with a 4.34 ERA (624.1IP, 301ER) in 105 career starts and 2-3 with a 3.69 ERA (31.2IP, 13ER) in 13 career relief appearances...in 2015, went 6-11 with a 5.07 ERA (94.0IP, 53ER) in 17 starts after returning from the disabled list in June...held opponents to a .269 (99-for-368) average; LH .312 (59-for-189), RH .223 (40-for-179)...set a career high with 11 losses, recording a loss in seven of his final eight starts.

DECISIONS, DECISIONS: Took a decision in each of his 17 starts in 2015...was the first pitcher to receive a decision in every appearance and make at least 17 appearances since 1942, when Philadelphia-AL’s Lum Harris went 11-15 in 26 games (20 starts) and Chicago-AL’s Ted Lyons went 14-6 in 20 starts...was only the third Yankees pitcher with a decision in every one of 17-or-more appearances, joining Red Ruffing in 1939 (21-7 in 28 starts) and Clark Griffith in 1903 (14-11 in 25 games/24 starts)...was tied with Cleveland’s Carlos Carrasco, the Angels’ Garrett Richards and Washington’s Max Scherzer for the longest streak of starts with a decision in the Majors in 2015...marked the Yankees’ longest streak of decisions in starts to begin a season since Andy Hawkins took decisions in his first 24 starts in 1989...from 9/15/13-10/3/15, took a decision in 24 consecutive starts (9-15), the longest such streak by a Yankees pitcher since Hawkins’ 24-start streak...was the longest such streak by an AL pitcher since Roy Halladay took decisions in 26 consecutive starts from 6/30/08-5/17/09.
