TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 21, 1930: Babe Ruth hits 3HR in a 15-7 loss at Philadelphia. It marks his only regular season three-homer game as a Yankee, though he accomplishes the feat twice in the World Series and once at the end of his career with the Boston Braves.

May 21, 1923: Colonel Jacob Ruppert buys out Colonel Tillinghast L'Hommedieu Huston for \$1.5 million, taking sole control of the New York Yankees franchise until his death in 1939.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 22, 1963: In an 8-7, 11-inning win vs. the Kansas City A's, Mickey Mantle hits a "walk-off" home run off Bill Fischer that strikes the upper deck frieze in right field. It marks the second time in his career he hit the frieze.

May 22, 1930: The Yankees and A's combine for 33R in a 20-13 Yankees win at Philadelphia, which includes the third and final career three-home run game from Lou Gehrig. The total runs remain tied for the Yankees' franchise high, accomplished two other times (5/3/12 at Philadelphia in an 18-15 loss; and 6/3/32 at Philadelphia in a 20-13 win).

AT A GLANCE: Today the Yankees play the sixth game of a seven-game road trip to Arizona (went 1-2) and Oakland (2-0 thus far)... are now 2-3 against the A's this season... went 7-3 on their 10G homestand which was completed on Sunday (2-1 vs. Boston, 3-1 vs. Kansas City, 2-1 vs. Chicago-AL)... will have a day off this Monday before a three-game series vs. Toronto (Tues.-Thurs.) at Yankee Stadium.

▶ **Have won a season-high three straight games...** had six prior two-game winning streaks in 2016... last won three straight from 9/1-4/15 (2G at BOS; 1G vs. TB)... have won three straight road games for the first time since 9/1-14/15 (2G at BOS; 1G at TB).

▶ With a win today, would have their longest overall winning streak since taking four straight from 7/25-28/15 (all were on the road)... would also give the Yankees three straight wins against the A's, marking their longest win streak against them since a four-game streak spanning two seasons (8/25/11 at Yankee Stadium and 5/25-27/12 at Oakland).

▶ **Are 10-5 in their last 15G since 5/6, the Majors' third-best mark over the span (see chart above).**

▶ **Are 11-7 through the first 18G of scheduled games on 20 straight days (5/3-22),** matching the club's longest stretch of 2016 without a scheduled off day... because of a rescheduled game on 6/2 at Detroit, will also play on 20 straight days from 5/24-6/12... will play on 40-of-41 days from 5/3-6/12.

▶ **Have held a lead in 31-of-41 games this season (are 19-12 in those games)...** have come from behind in 11 of 19 wins.

▶ **Are in the midst of a stretch of 26-of-39 games on the road (12-12 overall; 7-3 at home, 5-9 on the road).**

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Friday, the Yankees won their second straight at Oakland, 8-3... **Yankees batters** had five extra-base hits (3 doubles, 2 triples) and reached base safely 19 times (13H, 6BB)... took a 5-1 lead with a five-run fourth inning... **LHP CC Sabathia** (6.0IP, 3H, 1ER, 1BB, 8K) started and earned the win, to improve to 3-2 this season... marked his 100th win as a Yankee, becoming the 17th Yankee to reach the plateau... also became the eighth pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1900) to win 100 games with two teams (also 106 w/CLE), joining Grover Alexander, Lefty Grove, Randy Johnson, Greg Maddux, Dennis Martinez, Mike Mussina and Nolan Ryan... **DH Carlos Beltran** (3-for-5, 3RBI) had 3 doubles, matching his career high (fourth time, first since 4/2/08 w/New York-NL at Florida)... **3B Ronald Torreyes** (2-for-4, 2R, 1BB) reached base safely three times and had a two-run triple in the fourth... **CF Jacoby Ellsbury** (2-for-4, 1BB, CI) had a two-run triple in the ninth.

C+C = CC: With his win on Friday at Oakland, **LHP CC Sabathia** (106 wins w/ Cleveland; and 100 wins w/ the Yankees) became the eighth pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) with at least 100 wins with multiple franchises joining, Grover Cleveland Alexander (Phillies/Cubs), Lefty Grove (Red Sox/A's), Randy Johnson (Mariners/Diamondbacks), Greg Maddux (Cubs/Braves), Dennis Martinez (Orioles/Expos), Mike Mussina (Orioles/Yankees), Nolan Ryan (Angels/Astros).

BUCKLE UP: Over his last 6G (since 5/15), **RF Carlos Beltran** has 6XBH hits (4 doubles, 2HR) and 10RBI w/ a .364 BA (8-for-22).

▶ With his three-hit game on Friday at Oakland, ranks No. 100 all-time in hits (2,493), breaking a tie with Fred McGriff (2,490)... needs 2H to tie No. 99 Mickey Vernon (2,495).

▶ Leads the Yankees this season in games (41), HR (9), RBI (25), SLG (.517) and OPS (.806).

▶ Since 5/8/15, is hitting .287/.342/.513 (154-for-536) with 71R, 37 doubles, 28HR, 83RBI and 47BB in 150 games... in that span, is tied for fifth among AL outfielders in home runs, ranks fourth in doubles and ranks fifth in slugging, sixth in extra-base hits (65) and seventh in OPS (.855).

GIVE 'EM 'ELL: Since 5/1, **CF Jacoby Ellsbury** is batting .395 (15-for-38) with 10R, 4 doubles, 2 triples, 5RBI, 6BB, 4SB, .500 OBP and a 1.105 OPS... over the stretch, is second in MLB (min: 30AB) in OBP (Bryce Harper-.506), and eighth in BA and OPS.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU: **LHP Andrew Miller** turns 31 years old today (DOB: 5/21/85).

HEAD GAMES: 3B Chase Headley has reached base safely in a season-high 11 straight games since turning 32 on 5/9, batting .343/.410/.571 (12-for-35) with 6R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 7RBI and 4BB during the streak.

CONSTANT GARDNER: LF Brett Gardner has been on base 29 times in 18G in May (9 singles, 3 doubles, 3HR, 12BB, 2HP).

▶ Owns a team-best .382 OBP this season.
▶ Has walked 23 times so far in 2016 and is on pace for a career-high 91BB (current career high is 79BB in 2010).

WHAT'S LEFT: SS Didi Gregorius is batting .343/.378/.429 (12-for-35) with 3 doubles, 7RBI and 1BB vs. LHP this season, sixth-highest in MLB among qualified left-handed hitters.

▶ Has 6H in his last 11AB vs. LHP with 3 doubles and 7RBI.
▶ **Since 8/28/15, is batting .363/.414/.425 (29-for-80) with 5 doubles, 17RBI and 5BB in 89PA vs. left-handed pitchers...** prior to that date, had been a .186 (49-for-264) hitter vs. southpaws in his MLB career (294PA).

END GAME: In 18G since 5/3, **Yankees relievers** are 4-1 with a 2.29 ERA (55.0IP, 41H, 16R/14ER, 17BB, 64K, 5HR, .205 opp. BA)... marks the Majors' third-best bullpen ERA since 5/3 (Mets-1.70, San Francisco-2.28).

▶ Are 14-1 (.933) when leading after six, tied with six other clubs for third-fewest such losses...and are tied for the Majors' best win. pct. leading after seven (18-0, 1.000) and eight (18-0, 1.000).

▶ Have tossed at least 3.0 scoreless innings in a game 15 times this season, including six of the last 9G.

▶ **LHP Andrew Miller** has recorded 16-of-22 outs since 5/6 via strikeout (7.1IP, 7H, 2ER, 1BB, 16K, 1HR, 1HP).

▶ **RHP Dellin Betances** (50.0%) and Miller (49.2%) are first and second, respectively, in strikeout rate among MLB relievers.

FOUR SCORE: The Yankees have the Majors' best winning percentage when scoring four-or-more runs (.933, 14-1).

THREE HEADS ARE BETTER THAN ONE: The trio of **RHP Dellin Betances, LHP Andrew Miller** and **LHP Aroldis Chapman** have pitched in the same game four times this season (5/14-15 vs. Chicago-AL, Wed. at Arizona and Thurs. at Oakland), posting a 1-0 combined record with 4SV and a 1.46 ERA (12.1IP, 7H, 2ER, 2BB, 23K, 1HR) in those contests.

JOE GIRARDI, MD: Today at Oakland, **Joe Girardi** will manage his 1,500th career game... is 832-667 (.555) in 1,499 career games... owns a 754-583 (.564) record w/NYY (2008-pres.) and posted a 78-84 (.481) record w/FLA in 2006.

▶ **Among all-time managers with as many or more games managed (1,499), ranks 15th in career winning pct. and 12th among those who managed the majority of their games in the Modern Era (since 1900)...** all but two managers with better winning pct. are in the Hall of Fame.

YANKEES at OAKLAND

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees and Athletics meet seven times (2-3 thus far) in 2016...continue a four-game set in Oakland today after winning the first two games of this series and being swept in 3G in the Bronx from 4/19-21...have not taken three straight games from the A's since a four-game winning streak that spanned two seasons (8/25/11 at Yankee Stadium, and 5/25-27 at Oakland)...are 7-15 in their last 22G and 10-21 in their last 31 meetings...had gone 29-7 in the previous 36 matchups prior to that stretch...the Yankees' .621 winning percentage (1,028-628-5) against the Athletics franchise since 1914 is their highest vs. any AL opponent (min. 35G) in that span...**IN 2015:** Went 3-4 vs. the A's, going 2-1 at home and 1-3 in Oakland...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have lost each of the last three season series (6-13 in 19G) but are 4-2-2 vs. Oakland over the last eight season series (since 2008)...marks their longest streak of season series losses to Oakland since losing three straight from 1971-73...the Yankees have not lost the season series to the A's franchise in four consecutive years since dropping seven in a row to the Philadelphia Athletics from 1908-14...**AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** After winning a franchise-best nine straight from 7/5/10-7/19/12, are 4-12 in the last 16 road games vs. the A's...lost their previous four series in Oakland, their longest such streak since dropping 12 series in a row at the Coliseum from 8/26/85-5/1/91...are still 17-13 in their last 30G here...are 125-132 all-time at Oakland...**IN POSTSEASON:** The Yankees have won all three postseason series against the A's (2001 ALDS, 3-2; 2000 ALDS, 3-2; and 1981 ALCS, 3-0).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP MASAHIRO TANAKA (1-0, 3.51 ERA)

RHP Masahiro Tanaka will make his ninth start of the season on Saturday at Oakland...the 27-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest...took his fifth straight no-decision in his last start on Sunday vs. Chicago-AL (5.0IP, 8H, 4ER, 3BB, 7K, 1HR)...is one of six pitchers in the Majors still undefeated through at least 8GS this season (also Chris Sale, 9-0; Jake Arrieta, 8-0; Stephen Strasburg, 7-0; Cole Hamels, 4-0; and Colby Lewis, 3-0)...ranks seventh in the AL in WHIP (1.05) and eighth in BB/9.0IP ratio (1.75) and K/BB ratio (4.60)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in six of his eight starts this season...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 9-of-12 starts since 9/8/15, going 2-1 with a 3.14 ERA (77.1IP, 27ER) in that span...his 5.62 career K/BB ratio (326K, 58BB) is the second-highest (min. 300.0IP) in the modern era (since 1900)...in 2015, went 12-7 with a 3.51 ERA (154.0IP, 60ER) in 24 starts, becoming the sixth pitcher in Yankees history to win at least 12 games in both his first and second seasons in the Majors...led AL pitchers (min. 150.0IP) with a 0.99 WHIP in 2015...was acquired by the club via the posting system from the Rakuten Golden Eagles of Japan and signed to a seven-year contract on 1/22/14...contract extends through the 2020 season with an opt-out following the 2017 season.

LAST START: Took a no-decision on 5/15 vs. Chicago-AL (5.0IP, 8H, 4ER, 3BB, 7K, 1HR)...set a season high in hits and tied his season high in strikeouts and pitches (102)...walked three batters, exceeding his combined total over his five previous starts (2BB from 4/17-5/10)...marked his first start of the season that he left the game trailing.

DECIDING FACTORS: Is one of six pitchers in the Majors still undefeated through at least 8GS this season (also Chris Sale, 9-0; Jake Arrieta, 8-0; Stephen Strasburg, 7-0; Cole Hamels, 4-0; and Colby Lewis, 3-0)...is one of two pitchers this season to make at least five starts and record just one decision or fewer (Baltimore's Kevin Gausman is 0-1 in 5GS).

- ✦ His seven no-decisions are the most in the Majors among starting pitchers.
- ✦ Is unbeaten in his first eight starts and nine starts overall since 9/30/15...marks his longest unbeaten streak of his career (previous was 8GS from 4/4-5/14/14 when he went 6-0 in his first eight Major League starts).

ROAD TRIPPIN': Is making his fourth road start of the season...has taken a no-decision in each of his road starts of 2016 (4/12 at Toronto, 4/29 at Boston and 5/5 at Baltimore), posting a 1.83 ERA (19.2IP, 4ER) with 18K in those starts...in 13 road starts since the start of 2015, has completed at least 6.0IP in 11 of them and allowed 2R-or-fewer in nine.

- ✦ Is 12-6 with a 3.18 ERA (153.0IP, 54ER) in 23 career road starts...has a .240 career road opponents' BA (.221 at home).
- ✦ Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his last four road starts (since 9/18/15), posting a 2.10 ERA (25.2IP, 6ER).
- ✦ Went 5-3 with a 3.24 ERA (66.2IP, 24ER) and one complete game in 10 road starts in 2015...his .220 (54-for-246) opponents' average on the road was fifth-lowest in the AL (min. 225AB)...went 2-0 with a 0.89 ERA (20.1IP, 2ER) in his first three road starts, the first Yankees pitcher to throw at least 6.0IP with 1R-or-fewer in his first three road starts of a season since Dock Ellis (three straight) in 1976.

WINNING WAYS: Through 52 Major League starts, is 26-12 with a 3.21 ERA (341.2IP, 122ER)...his 326K through 52 career games are 16th-most in the Majors (and most by a Yankee) since 1913...his 315K were the most strikeouts through 50 career games by any pitcher in Yankees history...was one of six Major League pitchers since 1913 to record at least 25 wins and 300K through 50 career appearances.

- ✦ Was one of eight Yankees pitchers since 1913 to record at least 26 wins in his first 50 career games.
- ✦ Since entering the league in 2014, his .684 career winning pct. is tied for sixth among Major League pitchers (min. 30 decisions), trailing only Clayton Kershaw (43-11, .796), Jake Arrieta (40-11, .784), Zack Greinke (40-14, .741), Chris Sale (34-15, .694) and Gerrit Cole (35-16, .686).

OPENING ACT: Was one of four pitchers in the Majors this season to allow 2ER-or-fewer in each of their first six starts (7-Jose Quintana, Chicago-AL; 6-Taijuan Walker, Seattle; 6-Steven Wright, Boston)...since 2011, Michael Pineda (first nine starts in 2014) is the only other Yankees pitcher to begin a season with a streak of that length.

- ✦ Allowed exactly 2ER in each of his first five starts, matching the longest such streak by a Yankee since earned runs were officially kept in the AL beginning in 1913...also: Mel Stottlemyre (7/9-27/67) and Ray Fisher (7/1-25/13)...is tied with Chicago-AL's Fred Klages (6/14-8/23/67) for the longest such streak to begin a season by any AL pitcher in that span (Klages also made one relief appearance mid-streak).

SUPER 'HIRO: Has a 5.62 career K/BB ratio (326K, 58BB), the second-highest mark among all Major League pitchers (min. 300.0 career innings pitched) in the modern era (since 1900)...only Koji Uehara (7.80, 476K, 61BB), who has made all but 12 of his career appearances as a reliever, has a higher mark.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 2-0 with a 1.32 ERA (13.2IP, 2ER) in two career starts vs. the Athletics...today will mark his first career start at the Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum...has tossed at least 6.0IP and allowed only 1ER in each of his two starts against the A's.

2016: Ranks seventh in the AL in WHIP (1.05) and eighth in BB/9.0IP ratio (1.75) and K/BB ratio (4.60)...has a 12.9% swinging strike rate, fifth-highest in the AL (FanGraphs)...according to data from Brooks Baseball, opposing batters are hitting .119 (5-for-42) with 14K against Tanaka in at-bats ending with a splitter...has received 2R or support or fewer in five of his eight starts.

- ✦ Right-handed batters are batting .367 (11-for-30) in his last two starts after holding righties to a .164 (11-for-67) batting average in his first six starts of the season.

MAC-STOP: Has made 48 of his 52 Major League starts with Brian McCann as his starting catcher...the only other starting catcher he has thrown to in his Major League career is John Ryan Murphy, in four starts: 7/23/15 vs. Baltimore (W); 8/15/15 at Toronto (W); 9/2/15 at Boston (W); 9/18/15 at the Mets (L).

- ✦ Is 24-11 with a 3.26 ERA (306.2IP, 111ER) with McCann behind the plate...made his first 32 career starts with McCann, the longest career-opening streak in the Majors since the Dodgers' Chad Billingsley made his first 36 starts with C Russell Martin (credit: *Elias*)...has not pitched to Austin Romine.
