RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers suffered a 12-3 loss to the Athletics on Saturday afternoon at the Oakland Coliseum. Victor Martinez had a pair of hits, including a two-run home run, in the loss, while Ian Kinsler was 2x3. Warwick Saupold took the loss for Detroit after allowing five runs on five hits in 0.1 innings. Matt Boyd started for the Tigers and gave up three runs on six hits with seven strikeouts in 5.0 innings. The Tigers and Athletics play the rubber game of their three-game series this afternoon. Following today's game, the Tigers continue their West Coast trip with a three-game series at the Los Angeles Angels.

VMART STAYS HOT: Victor Martinez had two hits, including his seventh home run of the season, in yesterday's game. Martinez has now hit safely in six straight games and is batting .435 (10x23) with three runs scored, two home runs and seven RBI over the last six games. Since May 10, Martinez is hitting .391 (25x64) with five runs scored, one double, two home runs and 11 RBI in 16 games.

KINSLER PILING UP THE MULTI-HIT GAMES: Ian Kinsler had a pair of hits in yesterday's game to record his 20th multi-hit game of the season, which is tied for third in the American League. Kinsler is also tied for second in the AL with 61 hits and 41 runs scored, tied for eighth with 103 total bases, ninth with a .319 batting average and 10th with a .539 slugging percentage. Kinsler has hit safely in 17 of his last 19 games and is batting .354 (28x79) with 19 runs scored, six doubles, one triple, five home runs and nine RBI.

ALL ABOUT THAT BASE: Miguel Cabrera extended his streak of reaching base safely to 15 straight games yesterday with a walk in the sixth inning. Cabrera has posted a .462 on-base percentage over the 14-game streak. The streak is tied for the sixth-longest active streak in the American League.

MAYBIN'S HITTING STREAK SNAPPED AT 10 GAMES: Cameron Maybin went 0x4 in yesterday's game to end his hitting streak in 10 games. During the streak, which was tied for the longest in Maybin's career, he hit .528 (19x36) with 10 runs scored, one double, one home run, seven RBI and four stolen bases.

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE: The Tigers turned one double play in yesterday's game and have now turned 53 double plays this season. Detroit's 53 double plays are tied with Oakland for the second most in the American League, trailing only the Texas Rangers (67).

TIGERS TIDBITS: Matt Boyd tied a career high with seven strikeouts in yesterday's start...Ian Kinsler had a pair of stolen bases yesterday, marking the 16th time in his career and the first time since April 9, 2014 at Los Angeles (NL) that he has recorded multiple stolen bases in a game.

KINSLER LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY: Ian Kinsler has had success this season against lefthanded pitchers. Entering today's game, Kinsler is batting .439 (18x41) with two doubles, one triple, three home runs and eight RBI vs. southpaws. Kinsler's .439 batting average vs. lefties leads all American League hitters.

VMART, MIGGY ON THE MARK VS. OAKLAND: Victor Martinez and Miguel Cabrera have compiled

impressive numbers in their career against the Athletics. Martinez is hitting .350 (98x280) with 26 runs scored, 22 doubles, seven home runs and 33 RBI in 76 games vs. Oakland. Cabrera is batting .336 (81x241) with 47 runs scored, 17 doubles, 19 home runs and 61 RBI in 66 career games vs. Oakland. Martinez leads all active players with a .350 batting average vs. the A's, while his .406 on-base percentage ranks second and his .504 slugging percentage ranks eighth. Cabrera leads all active players with a .432 on-base percentage and a .643 slugging percentage, while he is second with a .336 batting average. Martinez enters today's game having hit safely in 15 of his last 16 games vs. Oakland, while Cabrera has hit safely in 23 of his last 29 games vs. the Athletics.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 1-1 on their current six-game West Coast road trip, which includes three games at Oakland (1-1) and three games at the Los Angeles Angels (May 30-June 1). Detroit has posted a 12-13 record on the road this season. The Tigers are hitting .263 (232x882) as a team on the road, while the pitching staff has a 4.62 ERA (214.1IP/110ER) away from Comerica Park.

ON DECK: The Tigers continue their six-game road trip tomorrow as they begin a three-game series at the Los Angeles Angels. The Angels won six of the seven meetings against the Tigers last season, including a four-game sweep at Angel Stadium.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Brad Ausmus is in his third season at the helm for the Tigers after being named the 37th manager in Tigers history on November 3, 2013.

- Enters today's game with a 188-183 (.507) record as the Tigers manager.
- Led the Tigers to a 90-72 record and a postseason berth in his first year as manager in 2014, joining Hughie Jennings (1907), Mickey Cochrane (1934) and Jim Leyland (2006) in accomplishing the feat.
- Became the 14th manager in Tigers history to have also played at the major league level for Detroit, joining Alan Trammell, Dick Tracewski, Billy Martin, Bob Swift, Billy Hitchcock, Fred Hutchinson, Mickey Cochrane, Del Baker, Bucky Harris, George Moriarty, Ty Cobb, Hughie Jennings and Bobby Lowe.
- Managed Team Israel in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.
- Spent 18 seasons as a catcher at the major league level with the Padres (1993-96), Tigers (1996, 1999-2000), Astros (1997-98, 2001-07) and Dodgers (2009-10)...made eight postseason appearances as a player, including two trips to the National League Championship Series and one to the World Series.
- Ranks third all-time among catchers with 12,839 putouts, while he is ninth with 15,840.2 innings played and 10th with 1,766 games started.

ABOUT PELFREY: Pelfrey will make his 10th start of the season this afternoon at Oakland.

LAST TIME OUT: Pelfrey received his fifth straight no decision in his last start on Monday vs. Philadelphia. In 6.0 innings, Pelfrey allowed four runs on 11 hits with three strikeouts.

VS. OAKLAND: Pelfrey has made three career starts against Oakland and has a 0-3 record with an 11.05 ERA (14.2IP/18ER) and six strikeouts. Pelfrey has faced the Athletics once this season, taking the loss on April 26 after allowing five runs on nine hits with one strikeout in 6.2 innings.

ON THE ROAD: Pelfrey has pitched in 107 games, including 105 starts, on the road in his career and has a 26-45 record with one save, a 5.28 ERA (573.0IP/336ER) and 312 strikeouts. In four road starts this season, Pelfrey has a 0-2 record with a 4.87 ERA (20.1IP/11ER) and 13 strikeouts.

OAKLAND COLISEUM DEBUT: Today's start marks Pelfrey's first career start at the Oakland Coliseum. With today's start, Pelfrey has now pitched in 27 of the 30 current major league ballparks. The only current big league stadiums Pelfrey has not pitched in are Marlins Park, Safeco Field and Wrigley Field.

RECORD IN MAY: Pelfrey has made 43 starts in his career in the month of May and has a 10-16 record with a 4.43 ERA (249.2IP/123ER) and 135 strikeouts. In five May starts this season, Pelfrey has a 0-0 record with a 6.31 ERA (25.2IP/18ER) and 17 strikeouts.

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE: Pelfrey finished the 2015 season tied for the major league lead with 29 ground ball double plays. Pelfrey also ranked sixth in the AL with a 2.14 ground ball-to-fly ball ratio and 11th with 291 ground balls. In nine starts this season, Pelfrey has induced eight double play balls, which ranks tied for fourth in the American League.

LIMITING THE LONG BALL: Pelfrey allowed just 11 home runs in 164.2 innings last season. The 11 home runs allowed were the second fewest in the American League and tied for the fifth fewest in baseball.

REACHING A PAIR OF MILESTONES: Pelfrey reached a pair of milestones during the 2015 season. He appeared in his 200th career game on June 18 vs. St. Louis, while he made his 200th career start on July 9 vs. Detroit.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Pelfrey was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on December 6, 2015. He was originally drafted by the New York Mets in the first round (ninth overall) of the June 2005 draft.

ABOUT JV: Verlander will make his 11th start of the season tomorrow night at the Los Angeles Angels.

LAST TIME OUT: Verlander won his second straight start on Tuesday vs. Philadelphia, throwing 8.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, two walks and 10 strikeouts. The 10 strikeouts marked Verlander's 33rd career game with 10-or-more strikeouts and his third this season. Verlander, who also struck out 10 in his start on May 18 vs. Minnesota, has recorded back-to-back double-digit strikeout games for the fifth time in his career (last, September 23 and 29, 2013).

MOVING UP THE TIGERS RECORDS LIST: With his 8.0 innings pitched in Tuesday's game, Justin Verlander now has 2,176.1 innings pitched in his career, passing Earl Whitehill (2,171.1) for seventh in franchise history. Verlander's win on Tuesday was the 161st of his career, tying him with Dizzy Trout for seventh in club annals.

JV REACHES 2,000 STRIKEOUTS: Verlander struck out 10 batters on May 18 vs. Minnesota to reach the 2,000 career strikeout mark. Verlander, who now has 2,013 strikeouts in his career, struck out Eddie Rosario to end the fourth inning for his 2,000th strikeout. Verlander became the second pitcher in Tigers history to reach 2,000 strikeouts, joining Mickey Lolich, and the 76th in MLB history. Verlander is one of six active players to reach 2,000 strikeouts, joining CC Sabathia (2,610), Bartolo Colon (2,279), Felix Hernandez (2,195), Jake Peavy (2,145) and John Lackey (2,026).

VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS/AT ANGEL STADIUM: Verlander has made 14 starts in his career against the Los Angeles Angels and has a 5-6 record with a 3.68 ERA (95.1IP/39ER) and 76 strikeouts. In his one start vs. the Angels last season at Comerica Park, Verlander carried a no hitter into the ninth inning before allowing a leadoff double to Chris Iannetta. Verlander earned the win after throwing a one-hit shutout with two walks and nine strikeouts. Verlander has made six career starts at Angel Stadium and has compiled a 2-3 record with a 6.19 ERA (36.1IP/25ER) and 31 strikeouts.
