OAKLAND ATHLETICS (34-43) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (49-30)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and five of the last six games after going 4-13 over a 17-game stretch from June 3-22...are 21-31 (.404) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 34-43 (.442) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the fifth consecutive day and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is one-half game short of the season high...since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 16½ or more games before the end of June (1979 and 2001)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 20 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 4-5 (.444) in interleague play (1-3 vs. Milwaukee, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 2-0 vs. San Francisco)...have won four of the last five after losing each of the first four...after these two games with the Giants, the A's will host Pittsburgh (Friday through Sunday) and Chicago (Aug. 5-7) and travel to St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...went 11-9 (.550) against the National League last year...it marked the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 195-158 (.552) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 5-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and San Francisco (2-0)...it was their first winning road trip of six or more games since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4) and their best record on a road trip of four or more games since Sept. 10-15, 2013 (5-1)...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 6-1 over the last seven games...are 18-21 (.462) on the road overall...begin a five-game homestand against San Francisco (two games) and Pittsburgh (three games) tonight...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Milwaukee (1-1) and are 16-22 (.421) at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League...have a 3.92 ERA (149 er in 342.0 ip) at home compared to 5.44 (204 er in 337.2 ip) on the road...are batting .243 (295-for-1212) at home compared to .267 (370-for-1386) on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored six or more runs in each of the last five games (41 runs, 8.2 per game), which is the longest such streak by an A's team over the last three years...have homered in a season-high seven consecutive games (10 home runs total)...are batting .283 (157-for-555) with 89 runs scored over the last 16 games (5.6 runs per game)...for the season, have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.308), rank second in fewest walks (192) and fewest strikeouts (514) and third in fewest doubles (121).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-3 with a 3.13 ERA (24 er in 69.0 ip) over the last 12 games and have issued just 15 walks (1.96 per nine innings)...are 20-34 with a 5.01 ERA (229 er in 411.2 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League, are tied for the second fewest innings pitched, have the third highest ERA and are tied for third in fewest wins...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 128 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 262)...have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 12).

PITCHING: The A's have a 4.88 ERA (34 er in 62.2 ip) and .324 (85-for-262) opponents batting average over the last seven games...have a 4.67 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.272) and on-base percentage (.335) and third highest opponents slugging percentage (.440)...have allowed 25 home runs over the last 15 games and 96 for the season...46 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied for second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 57).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone four straight games without an error after committing a season-high tying three errors last Friday night

(fourth time)...have 13 errors in the last 15 games and 53 for the season, which is tied with Minnesota for the most in the American League...are tied for third in double plays (81)...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 7).

IN JUNE: The A's are 10-14 (.417) in the month of June and have clinched a losing record in the month for the first time since going 9-17 in 2011...the offense has struck out 146 times, which is the fewest in the majors...are tied for the fewest home runs in the American League (24), have the second lowest slugging percentage (.415) and the third fewest extra base hits (72).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost 10 of their last 14 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-13 (.409) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...are tied for the third most losses...are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra-inning games are tied for second fewest in the American League...all three extra-inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 57 consecutive home games without an extra-inning game...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history to a 74-game streak from May 29, 1970 to May 2, 1971...last played an extra-inning game in the Coliseum on Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL, a 5-4 win in 10 innings.

THIS AND THAT: The time of game last night was 3 hours and 53 minutes, which is the A's longest nine-inning game of the season...are averaging 3:17 per game over the last eight games after averaging 2:47 over the previous 12 contests...are averaging 2:58 for the season, which is tied for second shortest in the majors...the A's are 6-2 during this 20-game stretch without a day off...are batting .303 (87-for-287) with 53 runs scored (6.6 per game) over that stretch.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Sean Manaea from the disabled list today, leaving them with eight players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Parker, Sogard)...this marks the first time the A's have fewer than nine players on the DL since May 8 when they also had eight...have used the disabled list 16 times this year and players on the DL have combined to miss 712 games (44.5 games per stint)...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's lead the season series 2-0 after sweeping a two-game series in San Francisco on Monday and Tuesday...have clinched a split of the season series...in the previous 19 years of interleague play, the A's have won six season series, split nine and lost four...have lost 16 of the last 21 games in San Francisco but have won 12 of the last 16 contests in Oakland...the A's are 56-52 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 32-21 in Oakland and 24-31 in San Francisco...are 20-28 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Major League Baseball has made a scoring change in last Thursday's game at Los Angeles (AL)...in the second inning, credit Vogt with a RBI single instead of reaching base on an Escobar error...the A's allowed 11 runs last night and won, marking the 11th time in Oakland history in the A's allowed at least 11 runs in a game and won (last: July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota, 14-13)...the A's have had at least one player drive in three or more runs in each of the last six games...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 34 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-46 (.022) with runners in scoring position...**Marcus Semien** has a career-high tying 15 home runs...**Danny Valencia** is batting .327, which ranks fifth in the American League among players with 200 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1925** Bill Lamar extends his hitting streak to an Athletics franchise record 29 consecutive games...in **1990** Dave Stewart pitches the fifth no-hitter in Oakland history in the A's 5-0 win at Toronto...in **1996** the A's hit three home runs at California, giving Oakland 18 home runs in their last four games, which ties the American League record...in **2003** Eric Byrnes becomes the fifth player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle and ties an Oakland record with five hits in a 5-2 win at San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (2-4, 6.02 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the disabled list today...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton last Friday against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64 pitches)...was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts at the time of the injury...his ERA is sixth highest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

FIRST THREE, LAST SIX: Is 2-3 with a 4.17 ERA (17 er in 36.2 ip) and .243 (34-for-140) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 0-1 with a 11.37 ERA and .382 opponents average over his first three starts.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Made his only career interleague start earlier this year, a loss on June 7 at Milwaukee (see eighth start below).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 4.54 ERA (20 er in 39.2 ip) and .257 (39-for-152) opponents batting average in seven starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 12.10 ERA (13 er in 9.2 ip) and .372 (16-for-43) opponents average in two starts on the road...has surrendered four home runs in 39.2 innings in Oakland, four in 9.2 innings on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .150 (6-for-40) batting average and two extra base hits (double, home run)...right-handers are batting .316 (49-for-155) with all seven of his eight home runs and 13 of his 16 walks...has an .895 OPS against righties, .477 against lefties...has a .208 (16-for-77) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .275 (19-for-69) the second time and .408 (20-for-49) after that...opponents are 18-for-36 (.500) with five doubles, three home runs and 14 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...has allowed a .455 (20-for-44) batting average, six home runs and 14 RBI to the opponents four and five hitters compared to .232 (35-for-151) with two home run and 17 RBI to all other spots in the order.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.00 ERA (6 er in 18.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 6.38 ERA (17 er in 24.0 ip) over innings three through five and a 12.27 ERA (10 er in 7.1 ip) from the sixth inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season and his career...the nine starts will be ranks fourth among American League rookies...yielded at least four runs in each of his first three starts to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston April 29 in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...allowed a leadoff home run to Gattis in the second inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second...allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth.

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 4...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...Marte had a RBI double, Cano a RBI single and Cruz a two-run home run...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford).

THIRD START: He had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston May 10...yielded a career-high eight runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings...allowed a lead-off home run to Betts in the first inning and Ramirez added a two-run homer...retired the side in order in the second but then allowed five runs in the third inning while recording just two outs...Pedroia had a RBI double, Bogaerts and Young had RBI singles and Shaw chased him from the game with a two-run double.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas May 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...had a 2-0 lead with runners on second and third and one out in the seventh inning...allowed a sacrifice fly to Stubbs and was relieved by Doolittle who got the final outing of the inning.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 21...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing the first four batters to reach base in the fourth inning...

yielded four runs in the fourth on a Beltran RBI single, a Hicks sacrifice fly and a Refsnyder two-run double...also allowed a RBI double to Castro in the seventh.

SIXTH START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Detroit May 27 in Oakland...shutout the Tigers on three hits over the first three innings but then allowed two runs in the fourth on a RBI double by Maybin and a RBI single by McCann...also allowed a leadoff home run to Castellanos in the sixth...left after six innings trailing 3-0 as the A's were shutout on three hits over the first eight innings.

SEVENTH START: He picked up the second win of his career in the A's 5-1 win over Minnesota June 1 in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters...shut out the Twins on four hits and a walk over the first five innings...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning...loaded the bases with no outs but got a sacrifice fly from Escobar before striking out Kepler and Centeno...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 5-2.

EIGHTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss at Milwaukee June 7 at Milwaukee...allowed five runs in a career-high 7.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Carter in the second inning and a three-run home run to Carter in the sixth...the A's were no-hit by Davies over the first six innings before Butler hit a two-run home run in the seventh inning...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the eighth with the A's trailing 5-2.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 14-5 win over Texas on June 13 in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain...went on the DL the next day...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the fourth...surrendered a solo home run to Choo, the final batter he faced.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Dillon Overton (1-0, 4.76 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday and made his Major League debut that day after just 53 minor league appearances, including 50 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 victory at Los Angeles-AL (5.2 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...became the 15th pitcher in Oakland history to pick up the win in his debut...tossed 108 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in his ML debut since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...became the third pitcher in Oakland history to allow three home runs in his debut...went 8-4 with a 3.01 ERA in 14 games, including 13 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in wins, ranked fourth in ERA and fifth in strikeouts (72) at the time of his promotion...went 7-0 with a 1.40 ERA over his final seven starts.
