

X-RAY REPORT

- + Oswaldo was signed by the Twins as a 16-year-old from Venezuela in 2007...his brother, Orlando, is an infielder in the Milwaukee Brewers organization, rated by *Baseball America* as the No. 8 prospect in the game entering 2016...his mother was a professional softball player in Venezuela.
- + He and his wife, Karla, have a daughter, Maria Fernanda (7), and a son, Oswell Daniel (1).

2015 SEASON

- + Played in 19 games (18 starts; 14-LF, 4-RF) with the Twins, batting .276 (16-for-28) with 2 HR and 8 RBI before landing on the 15-day DL with a right hip flexor strain on May 4...reinstated from the DL on June 3 and was subsequently optioned to Triple-A Rochester, where he spent the remainder of the season.
- + Made the Twins Opening Day roster for the second straight season and was their Opening Day left fielder.
- + Had a combined 14 HR in 98 games between the two levels...his 12 HR (in 79 games) for Rochester ranked third on the team...had 8 HR over a 13-game span from July 1-16.
- + Had a season-high 11-game hitting streak from June 28-July 9...hit .378 (17-for-45) with 6 HR and 13 RBI over that stretch.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- + Had 34 HR in 723 AB over the 2013-14 seasons with the Twins, including a 20 HR season as a 23-year-old (2014)...his 34 HR through his age-

23 season remain tied for third in Twins history (since 1961), trailing Tom Brunansky (80) and Kent Hrbek (40).

- + Had two stints with the Twins in **2014**...made their Opening Day roster for the first time but suffered a right wrist strain on April 9...reinstated and subsequently optioned to Rochester on May 14...recalled for the remainder of the season on May 26.
- + Ranked second on the Twins in homers (20), trailing Brian Dozier (23)...his 57 RBI ranked fourth on the team.
- + Had a career-high 10-game hitting streak from April 3-June 2 spanning two stints.
- + Recorded his first career grand slam on June 5 vs. MIL off Wily Peralta...it was the only grand slam hit by the Twins that season.
- + Was the second of back-to-back-to-back homers with Chris Parmelee and Eric Fryer in the 9th inning on Aug 3 at CWS, the first time the Twins did that since 2001.
- + Ranked among AL leaders for August in HR (7, tied for 4th) and RBI (23, tied for 6th)...had his first career multi-HR game on Aug 12 at HOU...homered in 3 consecutive games from Aug 17-19 vs. KC, CLE.
- + Had 13 HR and 35 RBI from Aug 3 through season's end...ranked third in the AL in homers over that span and tied for sixth in RBI.
- + Hit .249 (60-for-241) with 31 XBH (17 HR) vs. RHP compared to .198 (26-for-131) with 8 XBH (3 HR) vs. LHP.

- + Hit .312 (24-for-77) with 7 2B, 5 HR and 18 RBI in 22 games for Rochester.
- + Split the **2013** season between Rochester and the Twins, including four major league stints... finished with 14 HR, most by a Twins rookie since Marty Cordova in 1995 (24)...ranked among AL rookie leaders in HR (first), SLG (.430, second), XBH (33, tied for second) and RBI (43, third).
- + Started the season with Rochester but was recalled on April 15, taking the roster spot of Wilkin Ramirez (paternity list) and made his major league debut that night vs. LAA...first career hit was a 2nd-inning single off Joe Blanton.
- + His first career homer came on April 23, 2013 vs. MIA (G1) off Jose Fernandez...at 21 years, 349 days he was the youngest Twin since Joe Mauer on June 6, 2004 (21.048) to hit his first career homer.
- + Had a 2-run homer on May 9 at BOS, his 22nd birthday...joined Buddy Lewis as the only players in franchise history to homer on their 22nd birthday (or younger)...Lewis did it for the Washington Senators as a 22-year-old in 1938 and as a 20-year-old in 1936.
- + Hit safely in a season-high 9 straight games from Aug 7-15, including homering in 3 straight games from Aug 9-10 at CWS.
- + His 6 RBI on Sep 22, 2013 at OAK tied a Twins rookie record (also Tony Oliva in 1964).
- + Started the **2012** season with Class-A Fort Myers...selected to the Florida State League All-Star Team and participated in the Home Run Derby...earned a promotion to Double-A New Britain on June 18.
- + Won the Sherry Robertson Award as the Twins Minor League Player of the Year...hit .320 (150-for-469) with a .388 OBP and 36 2B, 8 3B, 17 HR and 98 RBI in 124 games between the two levels...led Twins minor leaguers in hits and total bases (253), ranked second in doubles and RBI, fourth in runs scored (76), triples and avg., fifth in homers and sixth in walks (51).
- + Played for the World Team in the Futures Game in July at Kauffman Stadium, going 1-for-2 with a RBI double.
- + Named Twins Minor League Player of the Month for May, his second career monthly honor...hit .358 (39-for-109) with 4 HR and 18 RBI.
- + Recorded three grand slams for New Britain.
- + Ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 3 prospect in the Twins organization following the season...the publication had him as the No. 6 prospect in the Eastern League and No. 7 prospect in the Florida State League.
- + Split the **2011** season with Class-A Beloit and Fort Myers, and played in one rehab game with the GCL Twins...placed on the DL after 20 games with Beloit with a right UCL strain... reinstated and subsequently transferred to Fort Myers on June 26.
- + Had his second professional grand slam on Aug 8 at Palm Beach (Cardinals).
- + Added to the Twins 40-man roster in November...ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 5 prospect in the organization following the season.
- + Played two games with the Tigres de Aragua of the Venezuelan Winter League.
- + Spent the **2010** season with Rookie-level Elizabethton...led the Appalachian League in avg. (.375), OBP (.424), SLG (.672), RBI (51), hits (97) and XBH (97)... ranked second with 14 HR and 7 3B and third with 21 2B and 47 runs.
- + Named Twins Minor League Player of the Month for July...hit .376 (47-for-125) with 13 2B, 8 HR and 25 RBI.
- + Ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 9 prospect in the Twins organization following the season and the No. 3 prospect in the Appalachian League...named to Topps' Short-Season/Rookie All-Star Team.
- + Led the **2009** GCL Twins in games (44), hits (46), doubles (11) and SLG (.455) and ranked second in runs (20), RBI (24) and SB (8).
- + Played three games with the Tigres de Aragua of the Venezuelan Winter League...ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 18 prospect in the organization following the season.
- + In **2008**, spent his first professional season with the DSL Twins...hit his first pro homer on July 15 at DSL Cubs, and his first grand slam on July 31 vs. DSL White Sox...his 36 RBI tied for the team lead.

X-RAY REPORT

- + Converted to full-time relief work in 2016 with Triple-A Durham...named a 2016 International League All-Star prior to being selected to the major league roster...it was the second season he was named an All-Star in the minors: in 2013, he was named to the Midwest League mid- and postseason All-Star Team for Class-A Bowling Green.
- + At the time of his major league call-up, Floro had allowed only 78 walks in 526.1 IP in the minors—an average of 1.33 BB/9 IP.
- + Dylan was drafted twice by the Rays: in 2009 in the 20th round out of Buhach Colony High School (Atwater, Calif.) and in 2012 in the 13th round out of Cal State Fullerton.

2015 SEASON

- + Was a non-roster invite to major league spring training with the Rays, which remains his only big league camp to date...appeared in 3 games and was reassigned to minor league camp on March 15.
- + Spent the entire season with Durham and was in their rotation until mid-August, when he made his last 3 apps out of the bullpen...began the year 6-4 with a 3.01 ERA (74.2-IP, 25-ER) over his first 12 starts (through June 7), but after that went 3-7 with a 7.76 ERA (53.1-IP, 46-ER) in 10 starts until he was moved to the bullpen.
- + Made his Durham debut in the Bulls season opener, April 9 at Gwinnett (Braves), and tossed 6 innings of one-hit ball to earn a 1-0

victory...combined with Brandon Gomes and Juan Dominguez on a 3-hit shutout...earned International League Pitcher of the Week honors for the performance.

- + Opposing lefty hitters batted almost 100 points better than righties (.353 to .254).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- + In **2014**, his first Double-A season, led the Southern League in innings pitched (178.2) and complete games (3) and tied for the league lead in starts (28) and shutouts (2)...tied for 2nd among Rays farmhands with 11 wins and ranked 9th in ERA (3.48).
- + Named the Rays Minor League Pitcher of the Month for June, going 3-1 with a 1.49 ERA (42.1-IP, 7-ER).
- + Following the season was tabbed by *Baseball America* as having the Best Control in the Southern League.
- + In **2013** was named Rays Minor League Pitcher of the Year and a Midwest League mid- and postseason All-Star for Class-A Bowling Green...tied for the Hot Rods lead with 9 wins...promoted to Class-A Charlotte in August and made his final 4 starts there.
- + Compiled a 1.77 ERA (137.1-IP, 27-ER) between both stops to set an organizational record (min. 130 IP), topping Matt Moore's 1.92 mark in 2011...Blake Snell topped it with a 1.41 ERA in 2015.
- + In his Charlotte debut on Aug 13 at Jupiter, threw his first career complete game (9 IP) in a 3-1 victory.

- + *Baseball America* tabbed him as having the Best Control in the Rays system in its Best Tools Survey following the season.
- + In **2012** made his professional debut with Short-A Hudson Valley...all 18 outings came in relief.



X-RAY REPORT

- + Jepsen is the fourth pitcher to have two separate stints with the Rays, returning after pitching for another organization in between...he joins Dan Wheeler, Trevor Miller and Grant Balfour.
- + He married the former Andrea Foisy on Nov 13, 2009...the next day he lost his wedding ring in the ocean and was stung by a jellyfish.
- + Born in Anaheim, he was traded from the Angels to Tampa Bay for a player who was born in Tampa (Matt Joyce).
- + Has a number of tattoos...his favorite is on his left arm in memory of his father, Randy, who passed away in 2003.

2015 SEASON

- + Led the American League with a career-high 75 appearances, and established career bests with a 2.33 ERA, 69.2 IP and 15 saves...traded from the Rays to the Twins on July 31 in exchange for minor leaguers RH Chih-Wei Hu and RH Alexis Tapia...after the trade, led the Twins bullpen with 10 saves and a 1.61 ERA (28-IP, 5-ER).
- + Ranked 6th in the AL with 24 holds...became the fourth pitcher since 2000 to record at least 15 saves and 20 holds in a season, joining PHI Tim Lincecum (2004), CHC Carlos Marmol (2009) and PIT Mark Melancon (2013).
- + Earned first save for Minnesota on Aug 21 at BAL while Glen Perkins missed time with neck injury and back spasms...became primary clos-

er with Perkins moving to a 7th- and 8th-inning role and went 10-for-11 in save opportunities from Aug 21 through season's end.

- + His victory on May 12 vs. NYY ended a streak of 112 appearances without a win...it was his first since June 27, 2013 at DET with the Angels.
- + Recorded a 1.27 ERA (35.1 IP, 5 ER) from July 7 through season's end, including a .167 opp avg. and 1 HR (Jed Lowrie, Sep 5 at HOU)...ranked 4th among AL relievers in ERA from that date through the end of the season.
- + Posted 16 consecutive scoreless outings (15.1 IP) from Aug 4-Sep 2, holding opponents to a .132 avg. with 3 BB in that span...the streak marked the third-longest of his career.
- + Was acquired by the Rays from the Angels for OF Matt Joyce on Dec 16, 2014.
- + Over the last two seasons (2014-15), his 149 apps rank 2nd in the AL to CLE Bryan Shaw (154).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- + Owns a career 2.95 ERA and .200 opp avg. (69-for-345) against AL East opponents entering 2016.
- + In **2014**, finished his seventh season with the Angels and recorded a career-high 75 SO and a career-best 1.05 WHIP...at the time, also established career bests with 74 apps, 65 IP and a 2.63 ERA.
- + Of the 19 runs he allowed, 16 came against Texas and Seattle...worked to a 0.54 ERA (50-IP, 3-ER) against the rest of the league.

- + His 74 appearances were 4th in the AL and his 65 scoreless appearances were 3rd in the majors behind PIT Tony Watson (68) and teammate Joe Smith (67)...Smith and Jepsen both surpassed the previous club record of 63 by Francisco Rodriguez in 2008.
- + Only three pitchers in AL history have had more appearances in a season and not earned a win: DET Mike Myers (88) in 1997, MIN Bob Wells (76) in 2000 and SEA/BOS Heathcliff Slocumb (76) in 1997.
- + His final regular season appearance with the Angels was his 315th, moving him past Mike Witt and into 5th place on the team's all-time list, where he still remains...his 245 scoreless appearances rank 4th in Angels history.
- + Limited opponents to a .192 (45-for-234) avg., 53 points lower than his previous best...righties hit only .167 against him, 9th best among AL relievers...opponents were 3-for-41 (.073) off him in July...allowed only one run in June and July combined (28 apps, 27.2 IP), a home run by TEX Shin-Soo Choo on June 21.
- + After allowing a career-high 5 runs in a 10-3 loss to Seattle on Opening Day, he pitched to a 1.96 ERA (64.1-IP, 14-ER) through the end of the regular season, including two separate career-high scoreless streaks each spanning 19 appearances.
- + Did not allow a run in 13 regular season apps (16-IP) vs. the AL's four other postseason clubs: Baltimore, Oakland, Detroit and Kansas City.
- + Had 11 consecutive hitless apps from May 7-June 5, longest stretch in the majors in 2014 and 2nd longest in club history behind a 13-game stretch in 2012 by Ernesto Frieri.
- + Tied the franchise record with 45 apps before the All-Star break (Francisco Rodriguez, 2008).
- + **POSTSEASON:** Was the only Angel to pitch in all 3 games of the ALDS vs. KC...took the loss in Game 2 when he allowed 3 runs in the 11th inning as the Angels lost, 4-1...surrendered a 2-run homer to Eric Hosmer.
- + Missed a total of 74 games in **2013** due to two trips to the DL...was out April 13-May 25 with a right shoulder strain, and his season ended on Aug 24 when he underwent an appendectomy... was the primary set-up man for Angels closer Ernesto Frieri.
- + Began the **2012** season with the Angels but was optioned to Triple-A Salt Lake on May 3 when the Angels acquired Frieri from San Diego...returned July 5 and remained with the Angels the rest of the season...following his recall was 3-1 with a 1.67 ERA (37.2-IP, 7-ER) in 40 apps...36 of those were scoreless.
- + Spent two separate stints with Angels in **2011** before his season was cut short due to a knee injury...made his third consecutive Opening Day roster...pitched in 5 of the first 8 games but was optioned to Triple-A Salt Lake on April 10 with an 0-1 record and 6.75 ERA (4-IP, 3-ER).
- + Recalled May 11 and made 11 apps in his second stint, going 1-1 with a 8.00 ERA (9-IP, 8-ER)...optioned back to Triple-A June 11...while at Salt Lake, suffered a right knee sprain and was placed on the DL on July 16...underwent arthroscopic surgery to evaluate his right knee Aug 31, effectively ending his season.
- + In **2010**, spent his first full season in the majors and finished 2nd on the staff with 68 apps behind Fernando Rodney (72)...served as primary set-up man for closers Rodney and Brian Fuentes...14 of final 15 outings were scoreless (0.64 ERA) to drop his ERA from 5.04 to 3.97.
- + Made his first career Opening Day roster in **2009** for the AL West champions...the Angels won 97 games that season, 2nd most in the majors behind the Yankees (103), who eliminated them in the ALCS.
- + Finished 5th among AL rookies with 54 appearances, tied for 2nd with 6 relief wins, and ranked 3rd with 17 holds.
- + Recorded his first career win on June 17 at SF, 4-3 over Tim Lincecum.
- + **POSTSEASON:** Made 5 postseason apps in the ALDS and ALCS...appeared in 3 games during the ALCS vs. NYY...was the winning pitcher in Game 5 of the ALCS when he tossed 0.1 IP to close out the 7th inning.
- + Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on Sep 7, **2008** and made his major league debut the next day at home vs. NYY...worked 1 inning and retired the side in order on 9 pitches while facing Derek Jeter, Bobby Abreu and Alex Rodriguez...made his second appearance two days later and again worked 1 inning vs. the same Yankee hitters, retiring all three, including A-Rod via strikeout, his first big league K.
- + Made the Angels postseason roster but did not appear in the ALDS vs. BOS.

PERSONAL & MISC.

- + Graduated from Bishop Manogue High School (Nev.)...as a senior was named 2002 Gatorade State Player of the Year...went 9-1 with 1 save and a 0.84 ERA for the Class 3A state champs... struck out 116 and walked 18 in 58.2 IP.
- + Said high school coach Charles Oppio: "Especially for our area, he's a once-in-a-life-time player. He was under the microscope all year, with scouts at every game, and he never

had a bad day. Most importantly, he did a great job of putting the team first."
