OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-54) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (38-59)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won back-to-back games for the third time since the All-Star Break and are 6-3 over that span, which is the second best record in the American League (Los Angeles, 6-2)...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 16-13 (.552) since then...are 44-54 (.449) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the AL...are in fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 34 days in fourth, 13 days tied for fourth and 23 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have back-to-back walk-off wins for the first time since April 28-29, 2013...have three in the last five games and six for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League (Houston, 8)...are now 11-9 in games decided in the last at bat...won for the sixth time last night when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Texas for second most in the AL (Kansas City, 7)...eight of the A's last 12 games have been decided by one run and Oakland is 6-2 in those games...are 15-15 (.500) in one-run games for the season and rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (30)...have won each of their last two extra inning games (both in the last five games) and are 4-3 in extra innings for the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's will face a left-handed starting pitcher for the fifth time in the last eight games today...have lost 10 of their last 12 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher and have won 13 of the last 17 games when the opponent starts a right-hander...are 11-15 (.423) in games started by a lefty compared to 33-39 (.458) against righties...the mark against lefties is third worst in the American League.

SERIES NOTES: The A's have won two of the first three games of this series after winning each of the previous two series...have not won three consecutive series since 2014 when they won their first three after the All-Star Break (July 18-27)...have lost the final game in each of their last six series and 10 of the last 11...however, have won the first game in 10 of the last 12 series...for the season, are 19-13 in the first game of a series compared to 9-22 in the final game of a series.

STARTING PITCHING: Last night, Kendall Graveman tossed the A's first complete game since Aug. 7, 2015 (Gray vs. Houston)...it snapped a streak of 148 consecutive games without a complete game, which was the second longest such streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009)...A's starters have now gone at least eight innings in back-to-back games for the first time in over a year (May 25-26, 2015)...are 3-2 with a 4.89 ERA (27 er in 49.2 ip) and .286 (56-for-196) opponents batting average in nine games since the All-Star Break...are 27-41 with a 4.99 ERA (294 er in 530.2 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in highest ERA, tied for second in most losses and third in fewest innings pitched, fewest wins and fewest home runs (72).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.44 ERA (40 er in 104.2 ip) over the last 11 games but have a 4.64 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.268) and have issued the fourth most walks (310).

OFFENSE: The A's are 27-for-139 (.194) with eight runs score over the last four games...are batting .231 (149-for-6645) in July, which is the second lowest batting average in the majors (Milwaukee, .228)...have scored the third fewest runs in the American League in July (66) and are tied for the third fewest home runs (17)...for the season, the A's have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.305), the second fewest walks (250) and strikeouts (664) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.397).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone three straight games without an error to end their season-high streak of seven consecutive games with an error...have 64 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League...rank fourth in double plays (98)...A's outfielders have 11 assists, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 10).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 6-3 on this 10-game homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-1)...will play 20 of their first 29 games after the All-Star Break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 25-Aug. 14...are 23-29 (.442) at home for the season, which is the third worst home

record in the American League...leave following the game today for an 11-day, nine-game road trip to Texas (three games), Cleveland (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 21-25 (.457) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 9-5 since then...are batting .242 (417-for-1723) at home compared to .259 (419-for-1619) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL...have a 4.16 ERA (219 er in 474.0 ip) at home compared to 5.28 (234 er in 398.2 ip) on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 15-23 (.395) in day games compared to 29-31 (.483) at night...the day record is the worst in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...are batting .229 (287-for-1256) and averaging 3.39 runs per game during the day (129 runs) compared to .263 (549-for-2086) and 4.53 runs per game at night (272 runs)...the day batting average and runs per game are the lowest in the AL.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 16 (.313) with a walk and seven RBI...are batting .227 (17-for-75) with two doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI for the season...rank second in the American League in hits, RBI and plate appearances (77) and tied for second in extra base hits (5).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-10 (.333) on Sunday, which is the second worst record in the American League (Seattle, 4-11)...are hitting .348 (49-for-144) with runners in scoring position since June 27 and are batting .275 with RISP for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL...have scored 22 of their 34 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (64.7%)...the A's designated hitter has homered just once over the last 48 games (Khris Davis, June 17 vs. Los Angeles)...A's designated hitters have eight home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 21 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 21 players have combined to miss 942 games (44.9 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard, Triggs)...today is the 20th day the A's have had at least 12 players on the DL...prior to this year, have never had more than 11 players on the DL at one time...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's lead the season series 4-2 entering the final game today...have won the season series for the second time in the last three years and fourth time in the last six...have won two of three in Oakland after winning two of three at Tampa Bay in May...are 51-46 against the Rays dating back to 2005 after going 49-17 over the first seven years...all-time, the A's are 100-63 against Tampa Bay, which is the fourth best record

of any team against any opponent based on a minimum of 100 games...are 55-25 (.688) in Oakland and 45-38 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any American League team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .426 with runners in scoring position...**Khris Davis** ranks seventh in the AL in home runs (23)...**Ryan Dull** has a 0.69 ERA (2 er in 26.0 ip) over his last 25 games...**Marcus Semien** ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs (20) and fourth among AL shortstops in RBI (48)...**Danny Valencia** has five home runs against the Rays, which match the most ever in one season by an Athletic against Tampa Bay (Chavez and Durazo, 2004).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Dave Henderson, Mark McGwire and Mike Gallego each homer in the sixth inning of the A's 5-3 win against California...it is the third time in 1990 that the A's hit three homers in one inning...in **1999** Jason Giambi hits a pair of three-run home runs in a game at Kansas City and has six RBI...he hit a grand slam against the Royals the night before.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (2-4, 6.49 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his third stint with the A's this year...was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .250 opponents average in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...returned a second time May 17 and went 1-3 with an 8.34 ERA and .368 opponents batting average in five starts before returning to Nashville June 10.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed six home runs in 34.2 innings this year (1.56 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...the six home runs are a career high...four of the six home runs he has allowed this year have been solo shots...six of his nine home runs entering the season came with runners on base...five of his six home runs this year and 12 of 15 in his career have been hit by left-handed hitters.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA (10 er in 25.0 ip) and .261 (24-for-92) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 0-3 with a 13.97 ERA (15 er in 9.2 ip) and .468 (22-for-47) opponents batting average in three starts on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.44 ERA (7 er in 18.1 ip) and .219 (14-for-64) opponents batting average in three starts during the day compared to 0-3 with a 9.92 ERA (18 er in 16.1 ip) and .427 (32-for-75) opponents average in four starts at night...last year, he went 4-1 with a 1.52 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts during the day compared to 2-5 with a 4.72 ERA and .284 opponents average in 10 starts at night...his career numbers are 8-3 with a 1.98 ERA (18 er in 81.2 ip) during the day, 7-11 with a 4.98 ERA (68 er in 123.0 ip) at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .400 (26-for-65) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .270 (20-for-74) against right-handers...has surrendered five of his six home runs to lefties for a .677 slugging percentage (.351 vs. righties)...has yielded a .457 (16-for-35) batting average, .486 (2 bb) on-base percentage and .686 (2 2b, 2 hr) slugging percentage to hitters leading off an inning...last year, he yielded a .215 batting average, .277 on-base percentage and .290 slugging percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents are 8-for-15 (.533) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has allowed a .322 (19-for-59) batting average with two strikes...has a .298 (17-for-57) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup this year, .354 (29-for-82) after that.

2016 START-BY-START: He combined with Axford and Madson on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Houston **April 30** in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed three of the hits...faced the minimum over the first five innings as the only two base runners were erased on double plays...allowed only one base runner past first base when Correa doubled and went to third on a ground out in the seventh...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss in the night game of the day/night doubleheader at Baltimore **May 7**...walked a career-high tying four batters...retired six of the seven batters he faced over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.2 innings...then allowed four runs in the third on a Kim RBI ground out, a Jones RBI single and a Davis a two-run home run...allowed another run in the fourth inning when Schoop scored on a grounded into double play...had a no decision in the A's 8-5 win over Texas in Oakland on **May 17**...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed back-to-back home runs to Mazara and Beltre to start the fourth...surrendered one more run in the inning when Fielder scored on a double play...left after 6.2 innings with a 4-3 lead but Madson allowed two runs in the ninth before Davis hit a walk-off grand slam in the bottom of the ninth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss to New York (AL) **May 22** in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed solo home runs to McCann in the second and Ellsbury in the third...Oakland scored twice in the fifth to take a 3-2 lead and he was relieved by Axford with runners on first and second and two outs in the sixth...Axford allowed both of the inherited runners to score for the blown save...picked up his second win of the season in the A's 12-3 victory over Detroit **May 28** in Oakland...issued a career-high tying four walks...blanked the Tigers on three hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a wild pitch in the fifth inning...Oakland increased its lead to 3-1 before he allowed a two-run home run to V.Martinez in the sixth...the A's then scored five times in the bottom of the sixth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-2 loss at Houston **June 3**...allowed seven runs in just two-thirds of an inning...the runs were a career high and the innings pitched were a career low...became the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow seven or more runs in less than an inning, the first since Joe Blanton allowed eight runs in 0.1 innings against Tampa Bay on May 25, 2005...yielded a RBI single to Rasmus, a RBI ground out to Gattis, a

RBI single to White, a two-run triple to Kemp and RBI singles to Marisnick and Springer.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Milwaukee on June 8...allowed a RBI single to Gennett in the first and a Flores sacrifice fly in the second...retired the side in order in the third but then allowed a two-run single to Gennett in the fourth and was relieved by Dull after throwing 74 pitches in 3.2 innings...three Brewers pitchers combined to shut out the A's on three hits and no walks.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 1-5 with a 3.63 ERA in 12 starts with Nashville...the starts were the first of his career at the Triple-A level...surrendered just two home runs in 52.0 innings, an average of 0.35 per nine innings...however, issued 26 walks (4.50 per nine innings) and struck out just 36 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.38...allowed a .267 opponents batting average, including .236 (26-for-110) against right-handed hitters compared to .304 (28-for-92) against left-handers...yielded a .182 average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .180 with a 2.41 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Was 0-1 with a 2.04 ERA in four starts when he was recalled by Oakland the first time on April 30...picked up his only win during his second stint with the Sounds from May 9 to 16, allowing a run in 5.2 innings in a 7-2 win at Iowa on May 12...went 0-4 with a 5.02 ERA in seven starts following his June 10 option...including 0-1 with a 2.77 ERA over his final three starts...the Sounds were 5-7 in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than five innings in six of his 12 starts and never more than 6.0 innings...had three starts without a run and three more with just one...walked three batters or more five times

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He tossed just one inning in Nashville's 7-5 win at Albuquerque on Wednesday...tossed just nine pitches and faced three batters...David Dahl singled with one out but was thrown out attempting to steal.

SECOND TO LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He had a no decision in an 11-4 win at El Paso on July 15...allowed two runs in the first on a Nick Noonan RBI double and an Austin Hedges RBI ground out...Nashville came back with a run in the second but he allowed a RBI single to Taylor Lindsey in the bottom of the second to make the score 3-1...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings and he left with a 4-3 lead...Aaron Kurcz allowed a run in the seventh for the blown save but the Sounds scored seven times over the final two innings for the win.

RHP Daniel Mengden (1-1, 5.52 ERA): Is 0-2 with a 9.33 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in his four starts in July after going 1-3 with a 2.81 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in his four starts in June...is 1-0 with an 8.04 ERA in three starts at night compared to 0-5 with a 4.13 ERA in five starts during the day...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-0 A's loss to Houston last Wednesday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 5 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Texas, a start in the A's 5-1 loss earlier this year on June 16 in Oakland (6.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...began the season at Double-A Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 minor league starts overall.
