OAKLAND ATHLETICS (57-78) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (76-59)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have a five-game losing streak, which matches their second longest of the season...the longest is a seven-game streak from June 3-11...are now 10-23 (.303) over the last 33 games and are a season-high 21 games under .500 at 57-78 (.422)...that is the second worst record in the American League and fifth worst in Oakland history after 135 games...it is the worst since 1997 (53-82, lost game 136)...are 24½ games behind first place Texas in the AL West, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2008 season 24½ games back...have not been more than 25 games back since Sept. 27, 1997 when they were 26 out...have a tragic number of three for elimination in the West and 11 in the Wild Card...have been in fourth place or worse in the AL West every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 60 days in fourth, 17 days tied for fourth and 35 days in fifth.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's currently have 28 players on the active roster...with Raul Alcantara and Jharel Cotton scheduled to join the A's on Monday and Wednesday to start and make their Major League debuts, the A's will tie the Oakland record for rookie pitchers used in a season with 12 (2009, 2012 and 2015)...nine of those 12 will have made their ML debuts this year...Alcantara and Cotton will be the 48th and 49th players to appear in a game this year, the 26th and 27th pitchers...that will tie the 1915 Philadelphia A's and 1955 Kansas City A's for second most pitchers in Athletics history to the record of 30 set last year...have made a total of 171 player moves in 154 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have lost the last two games by 14 runs and nine runs, marking the first time they have lost consecutive games by nine or more runs since Aug. 24-25, 2007 (12-2 and 13-4 at Tampa Bay)...have been outscored by 48 runs in five games against Boston compared to 72 runs in 130 games against everyone else...the season run differential is -120, which is second worst in the American League (Minnesota, -125)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182)...are 16-35 (.314) in games decided by four runs or more compared to 41-43 (.488) in games decided by three runs or fewer...the 16 wins by four runs or more are second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 15) and the winning percentage is the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...are 20-21 (.488) in one-run games and rank fourth in the AL in one-run decisions (41).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 27 runs in the last two games (23 er in 18.0 ip, 11.50 ERA) after surrendering just 25 runs over the previous nine contests (2.57 ERA)...the season ERA has risen .11 runs over the last two games to 4.61, which is second highest in the American League...have allowed 17 hits in each of the last two games, which marks the 10th time in Oakland history the A's have allowed at least 17 hits in back-to-back games (last: May 30-31, 2002)...have a .266 opponents batting average for the season, which is third highest in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: Daniel Mengden tossed 2.2 innings last night after Andrew Triggs tossed 1.0 inning the night before, marking the second time this year A's starters have gone fewer than three innings in back-to-back games...the other time was also against Boston on May 10 (Manaea, 2.2 ip) and 11 (Surkamp, 2.2)...starters have now tossed fewer than five innings 41 times this year, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52)...are 8-13 with a 3.86 ERA (62 er in 144.2 ip) over the last 26 games...have issued just 25 walks over that span (1.56 per nine innings), including 12 games with no walks...are 36-59 with a 4.98 ERA (404 er in 730.0 ip) for the season...have the fewest innings pitched in the American League and rank second in highest ERA, most losses and fewest wins.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .181 (46-for-254) with 19 runs scored over the last eight games (2.38 runs per game)...have scored 528 runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...have gone five consecutive games without a home run, which matches the longest streak by an A's team over the last five years...have 141 home runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the AL...have the lowest on-base percentage (.301) and slugging percentage (.394) and the second lowest batting average (.246)...have been hit by the fewest pitches (31), rank second in fewest walks (339) and fewest strikeouts (946), third in fewest extra base hits (376) and fourth in fewest stolen bases (44)...are on pace for 407 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest

walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage is .302 in 1979.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have back-to-back two error games and now have seven errors in the last five games...have 83 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...A's outfielders have 21 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this nine-game homestand against Boston (0-2), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland and are 30-38 (.441) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League...went 2-4 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-3) and have lost 14 of their last 18 road games...are 27-40 (.403) on the road...are batting .240 (538-for-2240) at home compared to .252 (591-for-2343) on the road.

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: The A's have lost 17 of the last 22 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 14-22 (.389) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the majors...Boston is second slowest at 3:12 (Arizona, 3:15)...A's pinch hitters are 3 for their last 32 (.094)...rank second in the American League in hits (20), RBI (13) and plate appearances (106) but are tied for last in walks (3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1464 games (54.2 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's have lost the season series for the second consecutive year as they are 0-5 entering the final game today...have gone winless against an American League team three times in Athletics history (0-11 vs. Baltimore in 1978, 0-7 vs. Cleveland in 1995, 0-6 vs. Cleveland in 1994)...have a nine-game losing streak, which is the A's longest against the Red Sox since dropping nine in a row from July 6, 2004 to May 11, 2005...have lost more than nine straight to Boston twice in Oakland history...had an 11-game streak from July 10, 1993-April 28, 1994 and a 10-game streak from Aug. 22, 1982-July 15, 1983...went 0-3 in Boston this year and are 0-2 in Oakland...have not been swept by the Red Sox in a three-game series in the Coliseum since Sept. 6-8, 2004...have allowed at least 11 runs and at least 15 hits in all five games this year...have been outscored 67-19 and have allowed an average of 13.4 runs per game...the A's will be first team in modern Major League history (since 1900) to allow an average of 10 or more runs per game against one team in a non-interleague season series...have allowed 74 runs in their last 43 innings against Boston dating back to the eighth inning on June 7, 2015...are 235-291 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 141-120 in Oakland, 93-170 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 877-1072 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has 34 home runs, which are the most by an Athletic since 2006 when Frank Thomas had 39 and Nick Swisher had 35...**Ryan Madson** has not allowed a run in his last nine games (10.2 ip) and is a perfect 5-for-5 in save opportunities over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1973** the A's defeat the California Angels 4-3 as Ken Holtzman wins his 20th game en route to a 21-13 season...in **2000** Mike Stanley is a perfect 5-for-5 with five RBI in the A's 10-0 win over Toronto...in **2002** the A's blow an 11-0 lead against Kansas City but Scott Hatteberg hits a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run in the bottom of the ninth inning for a 12-11 win, the A's American League record breaking 20th consecutive victory.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (10-9, 3.96 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 9-3 with a 3.36 ERA (41 er in 109.2 ip) over his last 17 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has eight wins dating back to June 23, which is tied for third most in the American League over that span.

WALKS AND STRIKEOUTS: Has walked two batters or fewer in 15 of his last 16 starts and has 18 walks in 103.2 innings over that span for an average of 1.56 per nine innings...has struck out five batters or fewer in each of his last 21 starts, which is the longest streak by an A's starter since Trevor Cahill had a 22-game streak from April 7-Aug. 1, 2009...has 63 strikeouts in 128.0 innings over that span (4.43 per nine innings)...for the season, is averaging 5.06 strikeouts per nine innings, which is third lowest in the American League...has walked one batter or fewer in 16 of his 26 starts...has issued 30 of his 40 walks to left-handed hitters.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in shutouts (1), tied for fourth in complete games (2), tied for fifth in opponents reaching on an error (8), ranks sixth in fewest pitches per game (90.8) and tied for eighth in opponents grounded into double plays (18).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-4 with a 2.88 ERA (23 er in 72.0 ip) in 11 starts at home compared to 5-5 with a 4.89 ERA (46 er in 84.2 ip) in 15 starts on the road...has the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League...has surrendered six home runs in 72.0 innings at home compared to 15 in 84.2 innings on the road.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 5-3 with a 3.34 ERA (23 er in 62.0 ip) in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 5-6 with a 4.37 ERA in 17 starts before the break...is tied for eighth in the American League in wins since the break...his five post-break wins surpass Sonny Gray's and Fernando Rodriguez' team leading total of four from last year.

SUPPORT: Has left with the lead in four of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco, July 29 at Cleveland)...is averaging 5.50 (67 rs in 109.2 ip) runs of support over his last 17 starts after receiving an average of 2.30 runs of support over his first nine starts...is 0-6 with two runs of support or fewer, 10-2 with three runs of support or more...is now 1-15 in 21 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 15-3 in 26 starts with three runs of support or more.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 3-2 with a 3.40 ERA in six starts in August after going 4-1 with a 2.68 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts in July...the July wins tied for third in the American League and were his most ever in a month...went 1-0 with a 4.33 ERA in five starts in June...was 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss tied for second in the AL...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his 27th start of the season today, which is an on-going career high...is in his second full season and has career highs in every category except losses (has matched his high in losses)...has a 1.38 ERA (4 er in 26.0 ip) in the first inning, 4.48 (65 er in 130.2 ip) after that...has the fourth lowest ERA in the first inning in the American League (min. 20 ip)...has walked just five batters to lead off an inning, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...went 1-2 with a 7.29 ERA over the first nine games (four starts) of his career through April 25, 2015, 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over a nine-start stretch from May 23-July 4, 2015, 1-11 with a 5.57 ERA over a 17-start stretch from July 10, 2015-May 24, 2016 and is 9-3 with a 3.36 ERA (41 er in 109.2 ip) over his last 17 starts.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...then lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...logged a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which fell one short of his career high of six...snapped his five-game losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30...tossed 8.0 innings July 9 at Houston, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...fired his second career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay on July 23 in Oakland...allowed nine hits, which were the most by an A's pitcher in a complete game since Mark Redman allowed 12 on May 13, 2004 against Detroit...had his career high six-game winning streak come to an end in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland July 29...compiled a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which

spanned 10 starts from May 30 to July 23...fired his third career complete game and his first shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 9-0 win at Chicago (AL) Aug. 19...became the ninth Oakland pitcher since 1987 to toss fewer than 100 pitches in a shutout, the first since Rich Harden on July 14, 2005 against Texas (80)...faced just one batter over the minimum to become the 13th pitcher in Oakland history to face 28 batters or fewer in a nine inning complete game (last: Dallas Braden, May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bay).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Houston last Tuesday...allowed a solo home run to Rasmus in the second and a RBI single to Bregman in the third to give Houston a 2-0 lead...McHugh shutout the A's on four hits in 6.0 innings and Graveman allowed his final run in the seventh inning on a Gattis home run.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Raul Alcantara (Major League Debut): Will be recalled from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow and will be making his Major League debut...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year and is the third A's pitcher to make his debut this year without any Triple-A experience entering the season (Mengden, Overton)...will become the 48th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the fourth this year (Manaea, Mengden, Overton)...will be the sixth pitcher to make his first ML start for the A's this year (Neal and Triggs)...started the season at Double-A Midland where he went 5-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts...was moved up to Triple-A Nashville July 21 and was a perfect 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA in eight starts...combined to go 9-6 with a 3.58 ERA in 25 minor league starts overall...walked 30 batters in 135.2 innings (1.99 per nine innings)...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 win in 11 innings last Monday against Iowa (5.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so).

- Allowed 15 runs on Friday, which was its most since it allowed an Oakland record 16 runs Aug. 25, 2011 at New York (AL).
- Has allowed 58-of-217 (26.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the American League and third best in the majors.
- Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (463.2) and fourth in strikeouts (443)...ranks third in most blown saves (18), most walks (163) and most wild pitches (28).
- First batters faced are 89-for-381 (.234) with 30 walks (.287 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.325), ranks third in on-base percentage and fifth in batting average.
