LEADING OFF Happy Labor Day! Today the Angels play the fourth contest of a six-game (2-1) road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Oakland (Sept. 5-7)...**Angels have won seven of eight and nine of 11 games...**Halos have won six of last eight road affairs...Angels are 24-23 since the All-Star break.

SHOEMAKER UPDATE Matt Shoemaker was struck on the right side of the head yesterday in the second inning by a line drive off the bat of Kyle Seager...Readings of a CT scan showed a small skull fracture and small hematoma. Matt stayed the night at the hospital for observation. He is alert, speaking, interacting and doing well. He will see a neurologist today.

FIRST THINGS FIRST Albert Pujols made history Sunday with his first inning HR. Was Pujols' 134th first-inning HR, breaking an all-time record he shared with Babe Ruth and Barry Bonds...**When C.J. Cron followed Pujols with a HR, Angels became first team in modern MLB history (since 1900) with at least two home runs in the first inning in each of three consecutive games (ELIAS).**

LEAVE IT TO WEAVER Jered Weaver's 2.77 ERA in 36 career starts against the A's is his lowest among all teams he's faced more than 15 times.

TEAM PITCHING Since August 21st, the Angels lead the A.L. with a 2.84 ERA (114 IP – 36 ER)...Halo pitching staff has held opponents to three runs or less in 10 of last 13 games.

MR. MASH Pujols sits on 29 HRs and is seeking 30+ home runs for the 14th time in his career...Would be just the fourth player all-time with 14 30+ homer campaigns: Alex Rodriguez (15), Hank Aaron (15) and Barry Bonds (14)...**Would also be the first to accomplish the feat in 14 of first 16 seasons.**

YOUTH SERVED With Andrew Bailey's Angels debut Friday, have matched the A.L. record for most former Rookie of the Year winners to play for one team in a season with five (Pujols, Street, Soto, Trout). The 2000 Yankees also had five (Canseco, Gooden, Jeter, Justice, Knoblauch). MLB record is seven by 1997 Dodgers.

GAME OF CRON C.J. Cron is riding a career-long 11-game hit streak (.391; 18/46)...Since his return from DL (8/20), Cron is hitting .333 (19/57) with two doubles, a triple, four HRs, 11 RBI and eight runs scored...Has 28 RBI over last 22 games.

TROUT RECENTLY Mike Trout is batting .429 (21/49) with four doubles, a triple, four home runs and 11 RBI over his last 14 games...**Has logged five, three-hit games in last 10 affairs...**Seven of his last 10 hits have been for extra bases.

TWO PLAYERS EVER Trout's 106 runs are second in A.L...**Trout has now reached the 100-run plateau for the fifth consecutive season - just second player all-time to log 100 runs five times prior to their age-25 season (Alex Rodriguez).**

RBI MACHINE Pujols has 108 RBI (T1st in A.L.) reaching the century mark for 13th time (has done so three times as an Angel; 2012, 2014 & 2016)...**He leads A.L. with 48 RBI since All-Star Break and has 61 RBI his last 60 G...**Only four players have amassed 100 RBI in 13 different seasons: Alex Rodriguez (14 times), Jimmie Foxx (13), Lou Gehrig (13) and Babe Ruth (13)...Pujols is on pace for 7th season of 120+ RBI.

Vs. ATHLETICS LAA leads 2016 series 7-5...**Angels have a HR in 10 consecutive games vs. A's...**Angels have won 24 of last 36 overall meetings...**Halos have won seven of last eight at the Coliseum.**

HI, MY NAME IS... Angels have used 51 players this season (54 on active roster)...**Halos have used 13 starting pitchers this season...**Club records in each category are 54 players used (2014) and 17 different starting pitchers (1967)...**LAA has 19 different starting left fielders since 2015.**

ONLY ME With 27 HRs and 106 runs, Mike Trout is the only player ever to turn the 25 HR/100 run trick five times prior to his age-25 campaign.

THIS N' THAT Halos & Indians pitchers lead A.L. with 10 SHO in 2016...LAA has grounded into 131 double plays, most in MLB...21 pickoffs by Halo pitching leads MLB...**LAA batters have fewest strikeouts in MLB (820)...**LAA's 87 errors are 2nd-most in A.L.

PLAYER POINTS Trout has joined Frank Robinson and Eddie Mathews as the only players with five (5) 25-HR seasons prior to age-25 season...Eight of first 13 hits in 2016 for Nick Buss are XBH (6 2B, 1 3B, 1 HR)...Jose Alvarez has not allowed an earned run in each of last 12 appearances...Jett Bandy has thrown out 18 of 43 (42%) would-be base-stealers this season.

THE MANAGER In his 17th season, Mike Scioscia is the longest tenured manager in MLB and only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with a single club...His 17 years with the Angels matches Sparky Anderson (Detroit, 1979-95) for second longest tenure with an A.L. team (trailing only Connie Mack's 50 seasons with Philadelphia).

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

September 5

(1961) Lee Thomas became the first Angel to post three home runs in a game in the second game of a doubleheader at Kansas City (a 13-12 loss)...Thomas also set a then club-record with eight RBI and finished 5-for-5 in the game and was 9-for-11 in the doubleheader.

September 6

(1996) Darin Erstad hit his first career inside-the-park home run off Brad Radke in the Angels' 6-2 loss at Minnesota.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP JERED WEAVER

Is 2.2 innings pitched shy of reaching 2000 IP for career

- Making 27th start of the regular season and 13th on the road...Fourth start of 2016 vs. Athletics.
- **CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD:** Tossed six innings on August 3 vs. Oakland to pass **Mike Witt** (1965.1) for third place on the Angels all-time innings pitched list.
- **10 WINS 10 TIMES:** With victory in last start on Tuesday vs. Reds, reached 10 win mark for 10th time in career and joined **Chuck Finley** as the only pitchers in Angels history to do so...Also joins **CC Sabathia**, **Bartolo Colon**, **John Lackey** and **Justin Verlander** as only active pitchers to win 10 games, 10 times.
- **APPROACHING 2K:** Is 2.2 innings pitched shy of reaching 2000 IP for career...Will join **Chuck Finley** and **Nolan Ryan** as only pitchers to toss 2000 innings in an Angels uniform...Will also join **Justin Verlander** and **Felix Hernandez** as only active pitchers with 2000 innings pitched while spending entire MLB career with one franchise.
- **NO PLACE LIKE HOME:** Since 2009, leads the American League (min. 400 IP) with a 2.71 ERA (781 IP – 235 ER) at home...He ranks fourth in the Majors in home ERA in that span.
- **DAY AND NIGHT:** Is 5-2 with a 3.53 ERA (51 IP – 20 ER) in day games this season (eight starts), compared with a 5-9 record and 6.07 ERA (99.1 IP – 67 ER) in night games (18 starts).
- **WINNING THE WEST:** Owns a 49-37 career record and 3.31 ERA (772.1 IP – 284 ER) against A.L. West opponents...Since 2006, the 49 wins vs. A.L. West clubs rank second to **Felix Hernandez** (57).
- **A NEW MONTH:** Since 2006, is tied for second in A.L. with 23 wins in September (**Justin Verlander** – 30).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in last start on Tuesday vs. Reds after tossing 6.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on eight hits with no walks and five strikeouts...Carried shutout into 7th inning before yielding two-run homer to **Eugenio Suarez**.
- **WEAVE DON'T WALK:** Has yielded two-or-fewer walks in 22 of his 26 starts this season (tied for eighth most in A.L. this season)...Walked one-or-fewer batters in 16 of his 26 starts last season...His 11 starts with no walks in 2015 were second most in A.L.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In 36 career starts against Oakland, is 14-11 with a 2.77 ERA (237 IP – 73 ER)...In three starts vs. A's this season, is 1-0 with a 2.77 ERA (19.2 IP – 7 ER)...Tossed complete game shutout in first game against A's this season on June 19 at the Coliseum...**Since 2011, has gone 11-5 with a 2.35 ERA (145.2 IP – 38 ER) in 21 starts vs. Oakland...His 2.77 career ERA vs. Athletics is 10th lowest in MLB (min. 140 IP) since A's moved to Oakland in 1968.**
- **AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** Owns a 7-7 lifetime record and 3.59 ERA (125.1 IP – 50 ER) in 19 career starts at the Coliseum...Pitched shutout in first appearance at Coliseum.
- **MORE ON THE SHUTOUT:** Tossed complete game shutout on June 19 at Oakland, allowing just three hits and one walk with one strikeout on just 95 pitches...Marked 14th career complete game and eighth career shutout...Became first Angels pitcher to toss a shutout with one-of-fewer strikeouts since **Tommy John** on July 8, 1984 (Game 2) at Boston.
- **MR. 300:** His start on May 22 vs. Baltimore marked the 300th game (all starts) of his Major League career...He joins **Chuck Finley** (379) as the only players to make at least 300 starts on the mound in an Angels uniform...Since 1960, his 142 wins ranked tied for seventh most in the A.L. in a pitchers first 300 games with **Jack Morris**, **Dennis Leonard** and **Roy Halladay**.
- **CATCHING THE EXPRESS:** With victory on April 10 vs. Texas, Weaver passed **Nolan Ryan** (138 wins) for second place on the Angels all-time wins list...**Chuck Finley** is the Angels all-time leader with 165 wins.
- **1500 K'S:** Recorded the 1500th strikeout of his career on April 16 at Minnesota (**Miguel Sano** swinging in 3rd inning)...Became third player to record 1500 strikeouts in an Angels uniform, joining **Nolan Ryan** and **Chuck Finley**...Is one of five active pitchers to record 1500 strikeouts while pitching exclusively for one franchise in their career (**Matt Cain**, **Felix Hernandez**, **Clayton Kershaw** and **Justin Verlander**).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Has compiled a career regular season 148-92 record with 14 complete games, eight shutouts and a 3.54 ERA...**Owns the top winning percentage in franchise history at .617 (min. 100 decisions).**
- **ANGELS ALL-TIME RANKINGS:** Ranks second on the Angels all-time list in wins (148) and starts (317), and is third all-time in strikeouts (1573) and innings pitched (1997.1).

Making 28th start of the season and seventh with Angels...Acquired from Minnesota on August 1st along with RHP **Alex Meyer** in exchange for LHP **Hector Santiago** and minor league RHP **Alan Busenitz**...Earned first win with Angels in last start on Wednesday vs. Reds after tossing complete game shutout and allowing just four hits with no walks and seven strikeouts...Marked 11th career complete game and fifth shutout...In five career games vs. Oakland, is 2-1 with a 4.09 ERA (33 IP – 15 ER)...In two starts vs. A's this season, is 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (12 IP – 8 ER).

#48 JOSE ALVAREZ (LHP) AGE: 27

- Has pitched each of last two nights, working one scoreless inning in each game.

- Earned save last night after tossing one perfect inning...Marked 90th career save and first since June 15, 2013 for Boston.
- Made Angels debut Friday night at Seattle and worked one scoreless inning.
- Signed with Angels as minor league free agent on August 12.
- Made eight relief appearances for Salt Lake and went 2-1 with a 2.00 ERA (9 IP – 2 ER)...Did not allow an earned run in seven of eight outings...Recorded 11 strikeouts while walking three.
- Began season in Philadelphia organization...Made 33 appearances for Phillies, going 3-1 with a 6.40 ERA (32.1 IP – 23 ER) with 33 strikeouts and 15 walks...Also appeared in five games with Triple-A Lehigh Valley, going 1-0 with one save and a 1.50 ERA (6 IP – 1 ER)...Released by Phillies on August 6.
- Set career-high with five strikeouts earlier this year on June 16 for Phillies vs. TOR.
- Had seven game scoreless streak (6.2 IP) for Phillies from May 17 – June 3.
- Named 2009 American League Rookie of the Year...Two-time A.L. All-Star (2009 & 2010)...Is one of five former Rookie of the Year winners to play for Angels in 2016.
