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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (66-83) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (78-71)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and six of the last seven games after losing nine of their previous 12 contests...are 66-83 (.443) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it is two games ahead of last year (64-85, lost game 150)...have clinched a losing record for the second consecutive season (went 68-94 last year)...this is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are in fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 127 of 164 days this year in fourth or worst (64 days in fourth, 18 days tied for fourth and 45 days in fifth).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their final homestand of the season tonight, a six-game stand against Houston (three games) and Texas (three games)...have lost each of their last three home games and are 33-42 (.440) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League...need one more win to match their home win total from last year...however, will finish with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years (went 34-47 last year)...it is just the fourth time it has happened in Oakland history (1977-79 and 1993-94)...are batting .239 (588-for-2465) and are averaging 3.64 (273 r in 75 g) runs per game at home compared to .258 with 4.62 runs per game on the road...have the fewest runs scored at home in the AL and the third lowest batting average...the runs per game at home are currently fourth fewest in Oakland history and the batting average is sixth lowest...have a 4.18 ERA (316 er in 681.0 ip) at home, which is currently the seventh highest home ERA in Oakland history...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (2-1), which tied for the seventh best road trip in Oakland history (min. six games)...it was their best since going 6-0 against Houston and Los Angeles (AL), April 5-11, 2013...are 33-41 (.446) on the road and have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years.

OFFENSE: The A's batted .311 (82-for-264) with 65 runs scored (9.3 runs per game) in seven games on the last road trip...the 65 runs are the A's most over a seven-game span since June 7-15, 2004 when they scored 75...however, have 615 runs scored for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and fifth fewest in the majors...hit 14 home runs on the trip after tallying four over the previous 12 games...have 403 walks, which is second fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...are on pace for 438 walks, which would be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978)...have a .306 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...have not finished with an on-base percentage under .309 since setting the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage with a mark of .302 in 1979...have 159 home runs, which surpasses the season total of 146 from each of the previous two years but is fourth fewest in the AL...Khris Davis has 40 home runs and Marcus Semien has 26 and their 66 home runs are the most by an A's duo since Frank Thomas and Nick Swisher had 74 in 2006...have the lowest slugging percentage (.398) and fewest hit by pitches (33) in the AL, rank second in fewest strikeouts (1046), tied for third in fewest stolen bases (47) and fourth in lowest batting average (.249) and fewest extra base hits (421).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 26 runs in the last eight games (24 er in 71.2 ip, 3.01 ERA) after yielding 57 runs over the previous eight contests (6.38 ERA)...have a 3.92 ERA (107 er in 245.2 ip) over the last 28 games and a 4.52 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.264) and the third fewest home runs allowed (168).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-0 with a 2.54 ERA (8 er in 28.1 ip) over the last five games...the four-game winning streak matches the longest of the season...are now 8-7 with a 3.51 ERA (52 er in 133.1 ip) over the last 25 games but are 41-62 with a 4.87 ERA (436 er in 805.1 ip) for the season...have the fewest innings pitched in the American League, the second highest ERA, second fewest wins and third most losses.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 92 errors, which is second most in the American League...rank fourth with 144 double plays...A's outfielders have 13 assists over the last 36 games after tallying 14 over the first 113 games.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's outscored the opposition 65-23 in seven games on the road trip (+42) after being outscored 60-26 (-34) in nine games on the last homestand...have a run differential of -89 for the season, which is second worst in the American League (Minnesota, -144)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182)...four of the A's last six wins have been by eight runs or more...had just four such wins over the first 142 games...are 20-36 (.357) in games decided by four or more runs compared to 46-47 (.495) in games decided by three runs or fewer...the wins and record in games decided by four runs or more are the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...are 23-24 (.489) in one-run games and rank fourth in the AL in one-run decisions (47).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have used 51 players for the season, which is tied for third most in Oakland history (used 52 last year and 54 in 2007)...that includes 19 rookies, which ties the 2012 and 2015 A's for second most in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...have employed 27 pitchers, which ties the 1915 Philadelphia A's and 1955 Kansas City A's for second most in Athletics history to the record of 30 set last year...12 of the 27 have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers in a season (2009, 2012, 2015)...a rookie pitcher has started 55 of the A's 149 games (36.9%), including nine of the last 13...the A's have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 17 games...have had at least four rookies in the lineup 21 times this year, including a season-high five six times (Aug. 5, 14 and 21; Sept. 13, 14 and 17)...the A's have made a total of 178 player moves in 168 days dating back to Opening Day.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the majors...are one of just three teams averaging under three hours per game (Kansas City and Toronto, 2:58)...are 5-4 in extra inning games and the nine games are currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (1974, 1975).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1646 games (61.0 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have lost the season series for the second consecutive season as they trail 6-10 with three games remaining...went 9-10 last year after winning each of the first four season series...have lost each of their last four games, which matches the A's longest losing streak against the Astros (third time)...are 4-2 in Oakland and went 2-8 in Houston...have won nine of the last 12 games in the Coliseum but have lost 10 of the last 12 at Minute Maid Park...lead the all-time series 46-33 (.582)...17 of the A's 33 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 25-13 in Oakland and 21-20 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis was named AL Co-Player of the Week today...hit his 39th and 40th home runs of the season yesterday to become the fifth player in Oakland history (Canseco, Giambi, Jackson and McGwire) and seventh in Athletics history (Foxy, Zernial) to hit 40 home runs...is the first since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000...his second home run yesterday was the 100th of his career...**Ryon Healy** has hit safely in each of his last nine games and is 18-for-38 (.474) with four doubles, three home runs, nine RBI, 12 runs scored and seven multiple hit games over that span...**Marcus Semien** has 26 home runs, which ranks second among ML shortstops (Story, COL 27) and fifth in Athletics history among shortstops

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** Lefty Grove wins his 30th game in a 2-1 win over Chicago...in **1954** the Philadelphia A's play the Yankees in their last game at Connie Mack Stadium...in **1972** Dick Williams uses a club record 30 players and 10 pinch hitters in the A's 8-7, 15 inning loss to Chicago...in **1974** Reggie Jackson collects three hits, including the 1000th of his career, in a 4-3 loss at Kansas City...in **1988** Dave Stewart wins his 19th as the A's defeat the Minnesota Twins 5-3 to clinch their seventh AL West championship...in **2000** the A's set an Oakland record by walking 15 times in a 7-4 win at Baltimore.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (1-0, 1.50 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville September 7 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...defeated Los Angeles (AL) in his Major League debut September 7 to become the 16th pitcher in Oakland history to win his debut...is the second this year (Overton)...became the 49th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the fifth this year (Manaea, Mengden, Overton, Alcantara)...is the seventh pitcher to make his first ML start for the A's this year (Neal and Triggs)...this marks the second time in Oakland history the A's had five pitchers start in their ML debut in one season...the other time was in 1978 (Conroy, Johnson, Minetto, Morgan, Wirth).

STARTING PITCHERS: Is one of 14 different starting pitchers the A's have employed, which is second most in the American League (Los Angeles, 15)...is scheduled to make his third start and all 14 of the A's starting pitchers have made at least three starts...this marks the first time in Athletics history the A's have 14 pitchers with three or more starts and the first time in Oakland history they have 14 pitchers with two or more starts...the A's are the first Major League team to have 14 pitchers make three or more starts since San Diego in 2009 (also 14)...they are the first AL team to do it since Texas in 2004 (15)...the 14 different starting pitchers are tied for second most in Oakland history (1977 and 2009) and are two short of the record (16 in 1983).

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in his Major League debut, a 4-1 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) September 7 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed two hits to become the first Athletics pitcher with more than six innings and two hits or fewer in his debut since Porter Vaughan on June 16, 1940 (7.0 ip, 2 h)...his 6.1 innings were the most by an A's pitcher in his debut since Rich Harden tossed 7.0 innings on July 21, 2003 at Kansas City...retired the side in order in each of the first three innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to retire at least each of the first nine batters he faced in his career (12, Jay Marshall in 2007; 9, Billy Taylor in 1994; 9, Dave Beard in 1980)...struck out Cowart to end the second inning for his first strikeout...allowed a leadoff single to Simmons in the fourth inning for his first hit...surrendered his only run on a leadoff home run by Cron in the seventh.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Kansas City last Tuesday...allowed three runs but only one was earned...is the seventh starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow one earned run or fewer in each of his first two Major League games (last: Vin Mazzaro in 2009)...allowed two unearned runs in the fourth inning when a two-out error by Marcus Semien was followed by a two-run single by Orlando...Escobar added a RBI single in the fifth and Cotton was relieved by Hendriks with two outs in the fifth and the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored four times in the eighth for the win.

MINORS: Began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and went 8-5 with a 4.90 ERA in 22 games, including 16 starts...was one of three players traded to the A's on Aug. 1 in exchange for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville where he went 3-1 with a 2.82 ERA in six starts...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record and a 4.31 ERA in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214), tied for the league lead in shutouts (2), tied for second in complete games (2) and tied for 10th in wins (11)...surrendered 20 home runs, which tied for fourth most...was 10-4 with a 3.94 ERA in his 22 starts compared to 1-2 with a 9.00 ERA in his six relief appearances.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, including .192 (38-for-198) against left-handed hitters compared to .229 (70-for-306) against right-handers...yielded 16 of his 20 home runs to righties...13 were solo shots...allowed a .198 batting average and .239 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .310 with runners in scoring position with Oklahoma City, .208 with Nashville.

ALMOST PERFECT: Came within one out of a perfect game for Nashville on Aug. 9 in a 3-0 win at Round Rock...retired each of the first 26 batters he faced before allowing a two-out triple to Doug Bernier...then struck out

Drew Robinson for his 12th strikeout of the game...it was his second complete game and shutout of the season...was named PCL Pitcher of the Week for the second time (also May 23-29).

THIS AND THAT: Was 9-4 with a 3.27 ERA in 21 games at night compared to 222 with a 7.84 ERA in seven games during the day...Oklahoma City was 7-9 in his starting assignments, Nashville was 5-1...tossed six innings or fewer in 18 of his 22 starts...walked two batters or fewer in 16 starts...had more strikeouts than innings pitched 15 times...hit .140 (3-for-20) with a run, triple, three RBI, a walk, eight strikeouts and a sacrifice hit with Oklahoma City.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed a complete game shutout in a five-inning rain-shortened 4-0 win over Memphis April 19...allowed two hits and one walk while striking out six...also picked up the win in his next start on April 24 at Iowa to improve to 2-1 with a 5.49 ERA...the pitched in relief in each of his next six appearances from April 29 to May 15 (1-2, 9.00 ERA)...returned to the starting rotation for good on May 23 at Fresno and went 3-0 with a 2.57 ERA and .144 opponents batting average over his first five starts following his return...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 23-29 after going 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA in two starts...surrendered just four hits in 10.0 innings and struck out 15...including 10 strikeouts in the game at Fresno...picked up the win in his first start with Nashville on Aug. 4 at Colorado Springs allowing one run in 6.0 innings in a 5-4 win.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 20th round of the 2012 draft and went 23-24 with a 3.77 ERA in 94 games, 59 starts, over his five seasons in the Los Angeles organization...was traded to the A's with Frankie Montas and Grant Holmes for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick on Aug. 1, 2016...is 26-25 with a 3.68 ERA in 100 games, 65 starts, overall...has 499 career strikeouts in 447.0 innings (10.05 per nine innings).

VIRGIN ISLANDS: Is the fourth pitcher in Major League history born in the Virgin Islands...is making his third career appearance today, which are the second most games pitcher in ML history for natives of the Virgin Islands...the leader is Al McBean, who went 67-50 with a 3.13 ERA in 409 games, including 76 starts, with Pittsburgh (1961-68, 70), San Diego (1969) and Los Angeles (1969-70)...the other two with one appearance each are Ellie Hendriks (1978 Orioles) and Akeel Morris (2015 Mets)...is the 14th player born in the Virgin Islands in ML history, the third Athletic (Jose Morales, 1973; Jerry Browne, 1992-93).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (6-9, 4.23 ERA): Combined with Axford, Hendriks and Smith on a four-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win at Kansas City last Wednesday (5.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 5 so) in his first start after missing 15 days with a strained left rhomboid...is now 4-5 with a 3.07 ERA in 13 games, including 12 starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (109), innings pitched (125.2) and games started (21) and tied for sixth in wins (6)...the strikeouts are tied for 10th most in Oakland history by a rookie...has a .170 batting average against left-handed hitters, which is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 125 or more innings (Kershaw, LAD .149)...is 0-1 with a 2.35 ERA (15.1 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in three career starts against Houston, all this year.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or less in 19 of its last 27 games... however, has allowed three runs or more in the eight other games for a 4.28 ERA (45 er in 94.2 ip) over that span (since Aug. 20).
- Has allowed 62-of-230 (27.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the third best percentage in the American League.
- Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (514.0), tied for third in strikeouts (493) and fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.309) and slugging percentage (.384)...is fourth in most blown saves (19) and most wild pitches (31) and tied for fifth in most walks (178).
- First batters faced are 97-for-420 (.231) with 32 walks (.283 on-base percentage)...is tied for the fewest first batter home runs in the AL (6), ranks second in slugging percentage (.324), fourth in on-base percentage and batting average and fifth in strikeouts (115).

- Has not allowed a run over his last six games and 7.1 innings...has not yielded an earned run in 18 of his last 20 games for a 2.18 ERA (5 er in 20.2 ip) dating back to July 26.
- Is tied for sixth among American League relievers in wins (6)...ranks third in most walks (29) and tied for sixth in most blown saves (6).
- Has allowed 11 of his 29 runs (5.1 ip, 18.56 ERA) over innings three through six...has a 2.77 ERA (17 er in 55.1 ip) from the seventh inning on.
- Has a .315 (17-for-54) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, including .393 (11-for-28) with RISP and two outs.
- Has not allowed a run in six games and 7.1 innings against the Astros.
